LETTER TO THE EDITOR -**PLANNED TURBINES TOO CLOSE TO NEIGHBOURS BOUNDARIES**

We, the neighbouring landholders, are writing this letter in response to comments in last edition of the Kojonup News relating to FlatRocks Wind farm Project.

- Firstly let us say that the neighbours all generally support the need for alternative energy sources such as wind and solar to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels. Our concerns regarding the location of the turbines is not about the merit of renewable energy sources or money.\
- The frustration and anxiety shared by the neighbours to this project is caused simply by the effects of having turbines so close to boundaries and dwellings. To have around half of the proposed turbines located within 250 metres of neighbours boundaries is, we believe, totally unreasonable. Of further concern is that the process of locating the turbines has involved no discussion with the affected neighbours and has meant that neighbour's views and needs have never been considered.
- So why has this debate surfaced again at such a late stage is a question you might ask. In 2016 the development approval was renewed, and included at the request of the developers an addition to the conditions which the project needed to meet. This was to match those set by the JDAP in the Broomehill/Tambellup Shire thus “*harmonising*” the conditions across the two shires. The wording was taken from the EPA noise regulations which described that our boundaries were noise sensitive premises at which 35 decibels was the maximum allowable level of noise emissions at that location. In the layout planning of the turbines this important point appears to have been missed as the development conditions clearly stated that the turbines needed to be a minimum of 1 km from dwellings and sensitive premises. The solution for the developers was to either comply with the conditions and ensure the turbines were located 1km from neighbours boundaries or seek to have the wording deleted. Sadly, they chose the latter and on Nov 1st the Kojonup Shire councillors voted to delete the words “*noise sensitive premises*” and hence allow in the Kojonup Shire the project to proceed without shifting any of the turbines off of our boundaries.
- The Government Guidelines recommend a buffer zone from neighbours of 1km from boundaries and 1.5km from houses to ensure noise levels aren't too high on neighbours properties, instead the Shire ignored the Guidelines.
- There is still time for a resolution to this as the request by the developers to delete the same wording from the Broomehill /Tambellup shires conditions goes before the JDAP on Dec 6th. The neighbours' position is simple and matches the very outcome offered to other wind farm neighbours in WA. That is, to meet the Government guidelines which require - 1 km from boundaries and 1.5 km from houses. There is room within the Kojonup wind farm project area to relocate the turbines to meet the Government Guidelines. To locate the wind turbines in accordance with the Government Guidelines would keep the neighbours happy and would mean we could all enjoy the notion of being pro-active in the switch to renewables and continue to farm as we have in the past and wish to in the future.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN 2023-2033 'PEOPLE POWER'

At the November Council Meeting, 'People Power', the new Strategic Community Plan for 2023-2033 was adopted by the Council.

The premise behind 'People Power' is that we must do something extraordinary – otherwise we are going to be in the same position at the end of the ten year period, and the ten years after that. Our population will be declining, we may lose some more of our services, and we'll be left searching for answers. Therefore, it is now time to do things differently.

'People Power' acknowledges that while the Shire is here to support the community, if we rely on the Shire alone to achieve the goals within the plan, with its limited resources and workforce, we won't shift forward enough. Together, our community contribution can be extraordinary.

There is little doubt the final plan is something we can all be very proud of, however, the real work starts now! Let's get together and make a real difference.

TAMBELLUP CARAVAN PARK - A STEP CLOSER!

At the November Council meeting, the Council adopted the Business Case and Concept Design Plan for the new caravan park to be constructed in Tambellup.

The Council was presented with four concept design plans, of which option four was chosen (below).



There will be minor changes to the design, however, it involves the parking lot of the old bowling club being turned into self-contained cabins and workers accommodation. This is stage 1 and will commence in 2023.

The site of the bowling green and clubhouse will be the location of the more traditional 'caravan park' facility, housing powered and non-powered tent and caravan sites. It is envisaged that the old bowling clubhouse will be demolished and new ablution and camp kitchen facilities constructed. This portion forms stage 2 of the project and will be subject to future funding.

It is envisaged that the caravan park will be completed in at least 3 stages, as follows:

Stage 1(a) - 2023:

All civil and underground services for all of stage 1. Construction of one or two cabins. The current 48 hour rest area moves to bowling green site;

Stage 1(b):

Construction of the remainder of the cabins (note – this stage can be split into many stages); and

Stage 2:

Construction of caravan and tent sites and ablution facilities.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Ordinary Council meeting dates for 2023 were endorsed by the Council. The dates are:

- The Council nominated Cr Carl Letter as its representative to the committee of the Gillamii Centre.
- Further to the submission of an application by the proponents of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm to the Development Assessment Panel (DAP) seeking amendment to conditions of planning approval, the Council has authorised the CEO to submit a Responsible Authority Report to the DAP for consideration at an upcoming DAP meeting.
- The tender for the supply and laying of bitumen products for the 2022/2023 road sealing program was awarded to Colas Western Australia Pty Ltd. Further, the Council endorsed staging the Chillicup Rd construction job over two years 2022/23 and 2023/24, if budget restraints require.

BROOMEHILL MARKET DAY

Congratulations to the Broomehill Heritage Group on their staging of the market day held on 12 November. Although the weather was terrible, the day was well attended and had a great community feel. Well done!

WORKS

Work has continued on Chillicup Rd, where the reconstruction of a section of road will be completed prior to sealing in 2023/2024. Gravel carting has commenced from a gravel pit near the Peringillup West Rd/Greenhills South Rd intersection, and motorists travelling in the vicinity are asked to exercise caution, particularly with harvest traffic using the same route.

Our dam water levels are looking particularly good for the upcoming summer (when it gets here!) with late rains adding to a reasonable winter. Reticulation systems at Shire facilities have been tested and repairs made where required to ensure our water resources are used efficiently. The ovals are looking fantastic!

With staff numbers reduced due to illness, unfortunately the maintenance grading program has slowed considerably during November. We understand the impact harvest traffic has on our gravel roads, and ask for patience as we address this. In the meantime, we encourage all residents to exercise caution and drive to the conditions.

STUDENT WORK PLACEMENT

We were pleased to host WA College of Agriculture Narrogin student, and local resident, Summer Thorn, for a two week work placement during November.

Summer, who is completing her Year 11 studies, spent the two weeks working with Shire mechanic Sammy Oclarit, in the workshop and in the field, as well as spending some time with the Parks and Gardens team. Well done Summer – it was a pleasure to have you on board!



WHATS HAPPENING AT THE BROOMEHILL MUSEUM?

Keen eyed residents will have noticed the new interpretive panels installed at the gazebo next to the Museum. The three panels, which look fantastic, provide a wealth of information about the initiation of the Holland Track from Broomehill to Coolgardie by John Holland and his party in 1893, and current day travel through this area. Still to come is the new signage for the townsite heritage trail. The Shire is working closely with the Broomehill Heritage Group and researchers to interpret just some of Broomehill's history, and we look forward to having this in place early in the New Year. Watch out for more information about an opening event!

Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 23 December 2022. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas/New Year period.

Rubbish Collection:

There will be no change to the kerbside rubbish and recycling collection schedule. Please note the Waste Transfer Stations in Broomehill and Tambellup will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

Harvesting over Christmas and New Year:

Harvesting and the carting of grain is banned on Christmas Day. This does not restrict the movement of vehicles across paddocks, however if it is determined that weather conditions on Christmas Day will be hazardous, a Harvest and Movement of Vehicles Ban may be imposed. This will be communicated through usual channels – via text message, and the Shire's Harvest Ban Hotline (phone 9825 1042).

There are no automatic bans proposed for Boxing Day or New Year's Day, however conditions will be monitored. Please check the Harvest Ban Hotline for updated information.

Plan ahead: Stay connected in a disaster

While telecommunications providers prepare for natural disasters, no form of communications technology is 100% resilient in an emergency or natural disaster.

The infrastructure that makes our communications work such as mobile phone towers/ base station can be directly damaged or experience interrupted power supply during a natural disaster.

This can happen quickly and without power, your home phone, internet modem, laptop or mobile phone may not work.

Think about how you will communicate if your mobile, landline and internet services are not available.

To help you prepare for an unexpected outage follow these steps:

- Include a portable radio with a spare set of batteries in your emergency kit so you can stay up to date with emergency information.
- Keep your mobile charged and have a backup power source, like a battery pack.
- Have a paper copy of contact details for your family and friends, so if you get access to a phone (such as a pay phone), you can call them.
- Have some cash on hand, as EFTPOS or ATMs may not be working if there is a natural disaster.
- If you get caught in a natural disaster and telecommunications services are not available, you can monitor your local and commercial

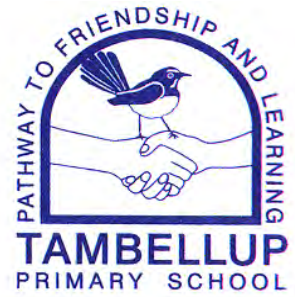
radio and television stations, as well as local emergency service websites and social feeds for up-to-date warnings and information.

- Prepare an emergency plan and communicate with loved ones about your plans before you have to act on them.
- Follow advice from emergency services personnel on the ground and Emergency Alert phone messages if received from them.
- The system depends on telecommunications networks.
- If these are unavailable in a disaster, you may not get a warning.
- If you're concerned for your safety, don't wait to be told to evacuate –prepare and leave early.
- Do your part to stay safe and stay connected until you're back online. Having a plan in place keeps you and your loved ones safe, informed and connected.

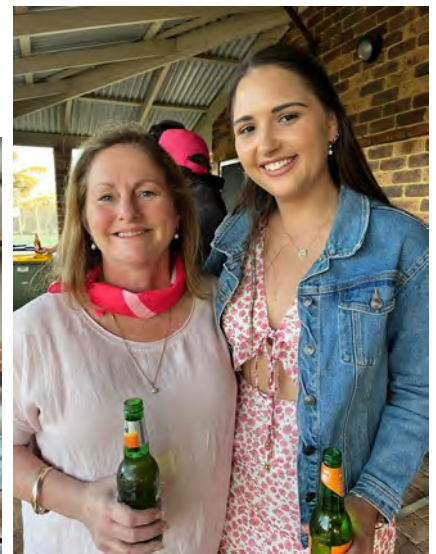

8. The Coordinator has the right to withdraw membership privileges for any non-compliance with the outlined conditions.
9. Any grievance of these conditions may be made in writing to the Chairperson who will investigate.
10. The Tambellup CRC Management Committee reserves the right to alter the Conditions of Membership and withdraw or change any of the services and equipment. Notice of such change will be via the notice board within the Tambellup CRC.
