FROM THE ANNUAL ELECTORS MEETING

The Annual Electors Meeting to receive the 2020/2021 Annual Report was held on Thursday 15 September, following the Ordinary Council meeting. The meeting was attended by one elector.

A number of queries and issues were raised by the elector for Council's consideration and response, including: acquisition of new assets; publishing of Public Question Time detail in Topics; Tambellup Caravan Park signage; location of, and improvements to, the Tambellup Youth Centre; antisocial behaviour at the Tambellup Pavilion; the delivery of the current Strategic Community Plan; line marking on Tambellup West Rd; vehicles being parked on road reserves for long periods; the use of Reserve funds vs loans; promotion of the review of the Shire's Municipal Inventories; Vietnam Veterans Day; and damage to the plaques at the Avenue of Friendship in Tambellup.

All matters were considered by the Council, and a response will be provided to the elector. All residents are reminded that minutes of all Council and Council Committee meetings are available for perusal at the Shire Administration offices and Tambellup CRC, and also online at https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council-meetings/

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Cr White acknowledged the passing of former Councillor Kym Crosby and extended condolences to the Crosby family. The following matters were considered by the Council at the September 2022 Ordinary Council meeting:

- The annual review of the Delegations register was completed. Delegations are made to facilitate prompt business transactions and streamline the customer service functions of the Shire to ensure waiting times and delays are kept to a minimum.
- A review of Policy 3.1 Purchasing Policy was completed with amendments being endorsed in-principle. The Council's endorsement of clause 3(d) as a draft regional price preference policy will be advertised for comment in accordance with the *Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996*.
- The Council determined that the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage be advised that the Council wishes to acquire lot 61 Broomehill by taking on the management of the land as a Reserve. Lot 61, on Keith St, is the site of the old well and formerly the Alpha Hall, both of which were significant in the early years of Broomehill.
- A request for a rates concession from the Broomehill Village Cooperative was unable to be considered due to four members of Council declaring an indirect financial interest, as shareholders. The approval of the Minister for Local Government will be sought to enable the matter to be referred to the October 2022 Council meeting for consideration.
- A rates concession for the Tambellup Business Centre for 2022/2023 was granted.
- The Council received the minutes of the Great Southern Roads Working Group meetings held on 21 June 2022 and 19 August 2022.
- The Council considered and approved the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 Construction Management Plan, noting Appendix A did not form part of the approval. Approval was granted for Enel Power to commence the establishment of the temporary site facilities and construction of roads prior to the clearing of all preconstruction conditions. The request to commence earthworks and trenching for electrical installation was not approved, with a number of conditions still to be met.

WORKS

Chillicup Rd reconstruction and sealing is the first construction project to be commenced for the new financial year. Gravel has been stockpiled for this project, and new culverts ordered.

Weed control spraying has been completed on all sealed roads in the Shire, and vegetation pruning has been completed along Paul Valley Rd.

Maintenance grading was carried out on the following roads during late August and September: Punchmirup North Rd, Peringillup East Rd, Peringillup West Rd, Nookanellup North Rd, Warrenup Rd, Holding Rd, Crosby Rd, Beejenup Rd, White Rd, Witham Rd, Old Broomehill Kojonup Road, Brassey Road, Hankinson Rd.

JOURNAL ST WORKS

The works at Journal St are all but complete, and we hope you'll agree, the end result really lifts the intersection and looks fantastic!

The Holland Track Interpretive Centre next door to the museum is progressing, and content for the three interpretive panels at the gazebo and additional panels that will create a town heritage walk is being compiled. Future plans for the museum buildings and grounds will see this area becoming a defined heritage precinct in Broomehill.



STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW

Thank you to all those community members who attended our community engagement sessions held over 12-14 September, we appreciate your time and input. The information gathered at these sessions will inform the new Strategic Community Plan, and the Corporate Business Plan (the action plan) will come from this. We are anticipating the draft Strategic Community Plan will be available for public comment following the October 2022 Council meeting. Copies will be available at the Shire Administration Offices, and the Tambellup CRC, as well as on the Shire website.

MUNICIPAL INVENTORY REVIEW

As previously advised, the Shire is undertaking a review of its Municipal Inventories. A Heritage Consultant has been engaged by the Shire to re-assess places already listed on the separate inventories for Broomehill and Tambellup that were prepared in the late 1990s. The new Heritage List will include places on the basis of the assessment of the cultural heritage significance.

Do you know of a site that has heritage significance to Broomehill or Tambellup? Place nominations from community members are welcome, and information provided will contribute to the project before recommendations are made to Council.

Interschool Carnival


Broomehill Primary School won the Interschool carnival at Kukerin this term as well as the Jolly Jogger relay event. A terrific end to Terrific Term Three!

An update from the committee...

The Tambellup Community Cropping Group was established in 2013 with the ambition to help support and grow the Tambellup Community. The group comprises of a dedicated collective of community members who, each year, volunteer their time to establish a crop, supported by farming families, individuals and local business. The profit each year goes directly back into the community through locally developed projects, driven by the people of Tambellup.

To date, the group has put in over 1000 hectares of crop and invested the profits in various projects, such as the Tambellup Community Pavilion infrastructure and sporting groups, CWA and the local

Cooperative, which led to the purchase of the 124 Deli (supplying daily essentials, fresh fruit and vegetables and providing takeaway food services).

Looking forward, the TCCG has committed \$150,000 in partnership with the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup towards a Tambellup Caravan Park to help attract and support more tourism and semi permanent workers into town. Further funding has then been committed towards an electronic sign for the display of local community events, tourism information and emergency messaging. Lastly, the cropping group is currently consulting with community stakeholders to purchase a community bus. "Our whole community would benefit from having access to a bus. Having access to a bus opens a plethora of educational opportunities for our students and wider community".

The community crop is an enormous volunteer effort between the local community, industry and government and the group would like to acknowledge all the individuals, organisations and businesses that have contributed to each crop over the last 10 years. Cranbrook farmer Sam Lehmann has been hosting a series of projects that are focussed on forage shrubs and filling feedgaps. But can his 'edible shelter' be used to manage heat stress and improve lamb survival? Come for a look to see if this applies at your place:

- Hear how Sam Lehmann is managing his ewes during lambing and filling feed gaps
- See the new research site just after planting the legumes and shrubs
- Hear about the results from the recent lambing-in-crops experiment
- · See some of the nifty tech that monitors sheep behaviour and internal temperature
- Walk through a site investigating the next gen forage shrubs for sandy/saline soils
- Join us for a wrap up and casual discussion at the Cranbrook Sports Club

You are invited to join Sam, a couple of fellow farmers who are learning new ways to provide shelter for ewes, and the research team from CSIRO, Murdoch and UWA - to see just how much has changed in five years.

This is an all-weather event – we walk the paddocks irrespective – talking as we go - with wrap-up discussions and hospitality to follow at the Cranbrook Sporting Club. This field tour is part of the collaborative shade and shelter project and is proudly supported by WALRC and Gillamii.





The rating is your prompt to take action to stay safe. You need to stay informed and know what the FDR is for your area each day.




KNOW THE BUSHFIRE ALERTS AND WARNINGS
