Ada Brown (nee Jeffrey)

9th April 1934 — 13th December 2022

Ada's parents Alex and Hannah Jeffrey emigrated from England and arrived in Tambellup in 1929, along with Lorna (Burridge), their eldest child. Five years later, Ada was born in the Tambellup hospital. Her sister Vera (Bradshaw) was born between Lorna and Ada, while Bob (Jeffrey) was the youngest.

Ada attended school in Tambellup until she was 14 years. She left school on a Friday in October 1948 and started work at the Tambellup Road Board office, which Ada enjoyed for near on 4 years.

A change in employment came when Ada took up a position working for Mr Bielby, who owned the Ballidu Trading And Agency in Ballidu, where she worked in the office and behind the counter. Ada

loved living and working in Ballidu.

In 1955 Ada travelled home to celebrate her 21st Birthday. Sadly this would be the last time Ada would see her father, as he passed away on 27th April. So Ada left her friends and employment in Ballidu and came back to Tambellup to be with her Mum. My Lyall was running the Tambellup Farmers Co-op and Ada was fortunate enough to get employment there, as her Mum's boarder was leaving town and it was his job Ada stepped into..

During Ada's time at the Co-op, the Cranbrook Co-op joined the Tambellup Co-op to be known as the Stirling Co-operative Ltd. Once a month, Ada would travel to the Cranbrook office to do office work.

Ada's future sister-in-law Dot also worked at the Co-op, where they became friends and Ada would often visit out at the farm.

Tennis, Hockey and local dances played a huge part in Ada's social life.

Ada married Sonny Brown on 10th November 1962 at the new Tambellup Methodist Church.

Ada moved out to the now very familiar Brown house where she had spent a lot of weekends. Sonny and Ada had two boys, Graeme and Kevin. The four of them lived in the original Brown house on "Glenora".

Over the years, Ada was involved with her Church, the Tambellup Flower Show and the Tambellup Bowling Club. Searching for old bottles became a passion in her spare time.

In 2001, Ada lost Sonny after 38 years of marriage. Ada continued to live on the farm until 2012. At this time, she decided to move into Tambellup and live at the Seniors Units where she lived for 5 years.

Unfortunately dementia started to develop, so Ada moved back to the farm with Graeme and Colleen, before moving to Bethanie Waters nursing home in Port Kennedy, near Kevin and Tonia.

Ada's Grandchildren were her pride and joy, but sadly her dementia never allowed her to know her Great Grandchildren.

A private service was held in Kevin and Tonia's garden to farewell Ada.

Graeme and Kevin along with their families would like to extend their thanks and appreciation to Ada's Friends and Acquaintances for their friendship and respect shown to their mum during her life and upon her death

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council considered a report prepared by heritage consultant Laura Gray, regarding the heritage value of the former Butchers Shop at 50 Norrish St Tambellup, and the future of the building. The Council resolved to undertake community consultation, inviting written submissions on the proposal to demolish the building. See elsewhere in Topics for more information.
- A Five Year Plan for the development of the Broomehill Heritage Precinct (area around the Broomehill Museum), prepared in consultation with the Broomehill Heritage Group, was endorsed by the Council.
- The Council adopted a new Risk
 Management Policy, following a review of
 existing framework and procedures by staff.
- A number of confidential reports relating to the Flat Rocks Wind Farm development application were considered by the Council, including the Noise Impact Mitigation Management Plan, Landscape Plan, Development Layout Plan and Construction Management Plan.
- Approval was granted for the CEO and Shire President to execute an agreement with the proponents of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm for

access to road reserves for installation of underground cabling. This approval was granted subject to satisfactory checks of final plans and documentation.

Cr Steve Penny and Cr Michael White were pleased to represent the Shire at the Broomehill and Tambellup Primary School Awards evenings. Our congratulations to Matilda Boyle, on being awarded the Broomehill Primary School Citizenship Award, and to Hannah Hull, who received the Tambellup Primary School's Nurse Turner Snowy Wilson award for 2022.

WORKS

The works crew commenced their Christmas shutdown on Friday 23 December, with most staff taking leave until mid-January. Prior to Christmas, works at Chillicup Rd progressed with gravel sheeting and stabilising completed.

The maintenance crew completed pot hole patching and gravel repairs on various roads including Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Heron Rd and Martinup Rd.

The Shire is collaborating with the Shires of Gnowangerup and Katanning and the Department of Health, to better manage mosquito populations



around the shire. While fogging has been undertaken on a number of occasions during spring and early summer, baiting of pools of water has also commenced. This method provides a better outcome for other insects in the environment, and hopefully will negate the need for fogging in the future.

IT'S STILL BUSHFIRE SEASON

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period is in place until **14 FEBRUARY 2023** inclusive. No burning is permitted prior to this date.

The **RESTRICTED** burning period applies from **15 FEBRUARY 2023** until **15 APRIL 2023**. During this period a permit to light a fire is required. Please contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer for more information – details are available at

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage One – Monthly Project Update

Construction Activities

The construction of wind turbine foundations in the Shire of Kojonup is currently underway. Six foundations have been excavated with two more in progress. The batch plant is operational, with the first major concrete foundation pour planned for early February.

Approximately three kilometres of underground cable has been installed.

Some blasting on areas of private property within the approved project area are planned for the first half of February. All relevant details have been provided to the local Shires.

Local Roads

Due to the increase in local traffic in the area, Warrenup Road (south of the main access through to Tambellup West Road) is graded and watered regularly to suppress dust and will continue to be monitored and maintained as required.



Do you own a swimming pool? An important reminder for pool owners.

Maintenance of Gate Hinges in Private Swimming Pool Safety Barriers



Swimming pool safety barrier gates are one of the most common means of unsupervised access to the pool area for young children.

Please maintain your swimming pool gate latches and hinges to ensure you have a compliant safety barrier in place at all times.

The most important elements of compliance for pool gates are:

- a) Does the gate close by itself from any open position, including from resting on the latch?
- b) Is the self-latching device working properly?
- c) Is the gate secure when closed?
- d) Does the gate open outwards, away from the pool area?
- e) Is the latch release mechanism, either:
 - At least 1.5 metres above the ground; or
 - Located on the inside of the gate, at least 15cm below the top of the gate and shielded so no opening greater than 1cm occurs between the top of the gate and radius of 45 cm from the latch.
