#### SHIRE SHORTS March 2023

The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday 16 March 2023 commencing at 4.30pm, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### AN INVITATION TO THE COMMUNITY!

As part of the Council's commitment to the new Strategic Community Plan 2023-2033 'People Power', the first biannual community 'People Power – Progress!' event will be held on Friday 17 March 2023 at the Tambellup Community Pavilion.

This informal event starts at 7.30am, includes breakfast and provides an opportunity for the Council and staff to present to community members about the initiatives outlined in the new Strategic Community Plan, and for the community to have a general catch-up. The Plan provides plenty of opportunity for community involvement, and we'd love to see the community turn out to hear what's going on and consider how they might like to be involved.

This event will be rotated between Broomehill and Tambellup, and will be held six monthly. More information to come!

#### STAFF UPDATE

During February we farewelled two members of staff, in Annie Richardson and Bevan Skinn. Annie, who has been with the Shire for a little less than two years, has left us to take on alternative employment without the travel component! Bevan and partner Lara are making the sea change, relocating to Esperance to take up a new position. We wish Annie, and Bevan and Lara, all the best in their next endeavours.

A late welcome to Gifford Eades, who joined us late in January as a casual on the works crew.

#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

• A request from the Redress Coordination Unit of the Office of the Commissioner for Victims of Crime to plant a memorial tree to commemorate survivors of childhood institutional abuse, was supported by the Council. The tree, along with a plaque, will be planted in the park bounded by Saggers Street and Koreng Close, Tambellup.

- The Council committed to the ongoing participation with Great Southern Treasures for a further three year period.
- The Council provided feedback to the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage in relation to proposed transfer of land parcels under the South West Native Title Settlement.
- The Council's consideration of a matter relating to the development of rail loading infrastructure and rail siding in Broomehill was deferred due to the majority of Councillors declaring a financial interest. Ministerial approval is required to be obtained for the matter to be considered at a future council meeting.
- The Review of Shire of Broomehill Town Planning Scheme No. 1 and Shire of Tambellup Town Planning Scheme No. 2 Report was adopted by the Council, for forwarding to the WA Planning Commission for consideration and approval. This is the first stage of the preparation of a new, single Town Planning Scheme for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup.
- A request from Enel Green Power (Flat Rocks Wind Farm) to access required road reserves, and give support to a clearing permit application for the clearing of vegetation on a single section of the road reserve was supported.
- The Council endorsed an amendment to the roadworks program to schedule the next section of works on Warrenup Rd during this financial year, from the southern end off Tambellup West Rd, to the northern section (between South Nookanellup Rd and O'Neill Rd). This will reduce the risk of delays caused by the construction of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm.
- It was determined that the 2023 Local Government Election would be conducted by the Electoral Commission as a postal election.
- The Council resolved to proceed with the sale of 30344 (lot 45) Great Southern Highway, Broomehill which has rates arrears of three or more years, and to recover the outstanding balance of rates from the proceeds of sale.

#### **WORKS**

There was great excitement at the Depot during February, with the Shire taking delivery of a new CAT138 loader. After being given the tick of approval, the new loader was deployed to Tieline Rd.



Works commenced during late January and February on Tieline Rd, where clearing was completed to enable widening of the gravel shoulders, repairs to failed sections and reseals. Clearing on Tambellup West Rd was also completed, with resealing planned for March. A section of Warrenup Rd has had vegetation pruning completed, with gravel stockpiled for upcoming reconstruction works.

The Maintenance crew has been working at the Broomehill Recreational Complex, where shaping of the oval surrounds was completed to allow water to drain away more effectively and reduce pooling on the oval. A sand embankment has also been constructed at the front of the new cricket pavilion.

Mowing and reticulation repairs have been the order of the day for the Parks and Gardens team. In order to maintain our public open spaces and garden areas, we have many, many metres of water pipe and reticulation lines, and a keen eye for faults and breakages is required.

Congratulations to the Broomehill Heritage Group members, who recently completed the replacement of the roof on the old machinery shed. It looks great! We can't wait to see what else you are planning for this area.



The CRC popcorn machine popped away & the delicious ice creams & sorbets made the day.







#### Project Update - February 2023.

#### **Construction Activities**

The construction of wind turbine foundations in the Shire of Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup is ongoing. Eleven foundations have been excavated, with the remaining seven in progress. The concrete for four wind turbine foundations has been poured. Each foundation has approximately 68 tonnes of steel reinforcement and approximately 780 cubic metres of concrete.

Approximately 14 kilometres of underground cabling has been installed to date.

#### **Local Roads**

The increase in use of Warrenup Road is having an impact on the road condition in some parts. To mitigate this, a thorough maintenance plan, including regular grading and watering, is underway.

#### **Project Approvals**

The relevant Development Approvals for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm have been obtained from the Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup Shire Councils. The Approvals set out conditions that must be complied with in undertaking the development. The conditions cover construction, operation, decommissioning, and administrative matters.



#### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I am writing in response to the call for public submissions concerning the proposed demolition of the former Butchers Shop in Norrish St, Tambellup.

I would like to record my opposition to the proposal and thank you the shire for the opportunity to voice my concern.

My reasons for retaining the building stem from my interest in my community and the preservation of local history and heritage buildings. I see this as an opportunity for the Shire to initiate a change in the town and unlock the potential we have in retaining an existing, serviced building in a prominent position on the main street.

I note the deterioration of the building and the presence of asbestos but these can be overcome with renovation and replacement.

#### Reasons to retain building -

- Accurate in the historical layout of the town from 1960 onwards
- Very visible position on the main street. Renovation would bring vibrancy and colour.
- Provides an opportunity to do something positive ie. Investing in the visual landscape of the town
- Opportunity to repurpose an existing building into a pop-up/business space attracting investment and employment to the town.

#### Possible steps in improving the premises –

- 1. Remove existing roof and replace with Colorbond sheeting.
- 2. Replace front window and door. Improve security by replacing exterior windows and existing back door.
- 3. Remove front overhang. Replace with verandah posts and skillion roof similar to the verandah outside the CRC
- 4. Upgrade exterior lighting.
- 5. Chip back front plaster, clean and seal original brick facade
- 6. Design and complete a mural on the northern exterior wall. The mural could reflect the building's former use or the themes of Tambellup history e.g., transport, original vendors on the main street, items sold/purchased in the town.
- 7. Remove all debris from around the building.
- 8. Repaint building in an eye-catching colour/colours. Include signage on the verandah
- 9. Revamp footpath area with paving, seating, and plants/large pot plants, consider a shade tree.
- 10. Advertise for a tenant.

#### Why bother when it is easier to demolish?

I believe we need to start with what we've got and turn a negative into a positive. Towns that value their built heritage add a sense of pride to those who live there and make the town more visually appealing to those who visit. Repurposed buildings can contribute to the 'feeling' of a town especially if they are colourful and well cared for. We have the opportunity to do this with the Butcher's Shop.

While in 2023 a 1960 building may not be considered 'heritage', to the children of today it is already 60 years old. Buildings from this period are fast becoming classics (a style known as Mid-Century Modern) examples of which we have many in Tambellup. It is these buildings that, over time, add the 'layers' to a town's history and accurately represent its' changes.

I ask that the Shire consider these points and *Be the Change* Tambellup needs. Bring the Butcher's Shop back into use and make it a positive, visual endorsement that our town is worthy of investment.

#### Who knows?

Restoring the Butcher's Shop may be the catalyst for other exciting projects to emerge and add a new layer to our town in the future.
