In the lead-up to International Women's Day 2023, we spoke to Linley Valley Pork's Research and Development Manager, Dr Megan Trezona, about her studies, career, and advice for women looking to enter production animal science.

"I had an interest in animals from a very young age, and I grew up in an agricultural region that happened to be a big pig-producing area," Dr Trezona said.

After graduating in agricultural science, Dr Trezona planned to study veterinary science. However, advice from a university lecturer saw her pursue a postgraduate degree in animal science.

"I was offered a scholarship from the Pork Research and Development Corporation, which I accepted," Dr Trezona said.

"Following on from my master's degree investigating seasonal variability in pork carcass composition, I joined the workforce at a time when meat science was emerging as an important focus for animal production.

"Another opportunity presented itself to develop a project to understand fat metabolism and deposition in growing pigs, which led to a PhD."

Dr Trezona said her advice for women who were looking to build a career in production animal science was about holding the line.

"I worked hard and persevered to get my degrees," she said.

"In my first attempts to enter the industry, I faced some barriers, but each time, I would remind myself how much I wanted it and pushed on."

Dr Trezona said to build a network and a reputation in the industry, it was important for women to seize the opportunities presented to them, as this provided the pathway to create their own opportunities.

"Put your hand up and get involved – even if you don't think you have the experience to contribute," she said.

"Get out of your comfort zone, join a scientific committee, and take on a role even if it is not directly related to your job.

"It will allow you to learn and build your networks."

Dr Trezona said mentors played an important role in women's success and development in the industry.

"CM Farms Senior Farm Manager Jorge Chorrez is one of those people who has been an excellent source of support," she said.

"I have an introverted nature and tendency to work alone – it was Jorge who encouraged me to seek further external training, which enabled me to become a better communicator and people manager.

"I really appreciate that guidance."

Speaking about career highlights, Dr Trezona said the one of the accomplishments she was most proud of was supporting research programs within the Western Australian pork industry.

"We are bringing the Craig Mostyn Group to the national research table where we contribute to, influence and benefit from pork industry research at a national level," she said.

# 'PEOPLE POWER – PROGRESS' COMMUNITY BREAKFAST



Thank you to those residents of Broomehill and Tambellup who turned out to the Community Breakfast held on 17 March at the Tambellup Community pavilion. This was the first of our informal community update events, with the next one being planned for Broomehill in August. Keep an eye out for more information!

The event provided an opportunity for the community to hear (and ask questions) about the progress of initiatives that are underway in our Shire, including the Heritage Precinct in Broomehill, the development of the Tambellup Caravan Park, the Municipal Inventory review, the status of the new Town Planning Scheme, and the upgrade of the Youth Precinct in Tambellup.

The Strategic Community Plan 'People Power' was developed by an external consultant, who listened to what the community said during community sessions in September 2022. As a result, the initiatives in 'People Power' reflect those conversations, and central to all the discussions was that Broomehill-Tambellup was 'A region driven by community spirit'.

Implementation of the initiatives will require the community and Shire to work together.

### STAFF UPDATE

Sammy joined the Shire in 2014 as our first full time mechanic, and aside from providing his expertise, he shared with everyone a healthy dose of his sparkling personality and his love of karaoke! Sammy will still be around for a while working in a casual capacity until we are able to recruit a new mechanic. All the best to Sammy and Rachel and their family for their adjustment to the FIFO life.

Two vacancies were advertised during March, to fill the Executive Assistant and Mechanic positions.

### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council supported the proposed transfer of land located within the Pootenup Townsite, under the South West Native Title Settlement.
- The Council was unable to consider a matter presented by CBH in relation to site drainage in Broomehill, due to elected members declaring an interest in the matter, and a subsequent lack of quorum. This matter will be revisited at the April council meeting.
- Planning approval was granted, with conditions, for the construction of a lean-to addition to the existing building at Lot 57 Bridge St.
- Planning approval was granted, with conditions, for the development of an outbuilding and water tank(s) on Lot 402 McGuire Rd.
- Delegated authority was granted to the CEO to deal with a number of planning approval processes, in order to streamline the planning application process for some proponents.
- A proposal to extend the paved footpath on Journal St between the Museum and India St was approved.
- The Council received two written submissions in relation to the proposed demolition of the old butchers shop at Lot 9 (50) Norrish St. Following discussion, the Council approved the demolition of the building.

- An amended Staff Housing policy was adopted.
- The Council considered and adopted the annual Budget Review. The Budget Review is available for perusal at the Administration Offices and on the Shire's website.
- The 2022 Compliance Audit Return was adopted prior to forwarding to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries.
- The Council received the Operational Risk Summary Report dates December 2022.

### **WORKS**

Road construction jobs on Tieline Rd and Toolbrunup Rd, and surface corrections on Tambellup West Rd are continuing. Contractor availability has presented challenges, however we anticipate sealing works will be underway in May. Gravel has been stockpiled for the reconstruction of a section of Warrenup Rd, and roadside pruning of this section has been completed.

Shire staff were required to attend to an oil spill on Pootenup Rd. Sand was spread over the oil to minimise the risk of a slippery road surface.

Repairs have been made to standpipes on Cemetery Rd, Greenhills North Rd, Tambellup West Rd and Crawford St.

### CHRIS COLLARD - 'ABORIGINAL WARRIOR'

We were pleased to welcome 1999 World Kickboxing Champion, Chris Collard, to Tambellup on 16 March. Chris is a Noongar man from Perth who had a difficult journey to adulthood, however through perseverance and commitment, has forged a successful pathway through life, through sport. Chris presented his story and worked through some goal setting activities with a group of our young people, and a documentary of his journey, 'Aboriginal Warrior' was screened. Chris then conducted a boxing workshop with the enthusiastic participants.

Chris hopes to inspire others with his story, and show that you can achieve whatever you want in your life.





Project Update - March 2023.

### **Construction Activities**

The construction of wind turbine foundations in the Shires of Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup is ongoing. Sixteen foundations have been excavated, with the remaining two commencing soon. The concrete for nine wind turbine foundations has been poured. Each foundation has approximately 68 tonnes of steel reinforcement and approximately 680 cubic metres of concrete. Approximately 19 kilometres of underground cabling has been installed to date.

Three additional meteorological masts have been erected in the northern part of our project site to gather wind data. Two are expected to be installed for less than six months with the third for approximately two years. The first shipments of wind turbine components have been unloaded at Bunbury Port. These are expected start arriving on site from the end of May.

### Community Activities

We welcomed eight residents from Springhaven Lodge for a brief visit to the Community Information Centre, before venturing out for a drive past the construction site. The visitors

were curious to learn how the energy is generated and stored, where the turbines components are sourced and what skills the wind farm project brings to our region.

The year 7-10 students at Kojonup District High School are the latest group to name two more turbines in the Flat Rocks Wind Farm. Congratulations to Milly Webb and Oscar Fisher for their winning names "Sir Winderton" and "Maverick". Each student wins a \$50 local business voucher, a STEM wind turbine making kit and their year group receives a \$500 Officeworks voucher to purchase classroom resources.

### **Community Fund**

We are working on the design of the Community Fund for the Shires of Broomehill-Tambellup and Kojonup. It's intended to include two funding rounds annually. Details will be launched on our project website in the upcoming weeks.



# A short history of meat supply & commerce in Tambellup 1920s - 1959

The earliest recorded Butcher's Shop in TA was in the 1920s established by Mr Norman Saggers (Minnie Saggers' father) on the block between the current G & T Motors & Mrs Helen Wills' house on Garrity St. (referred to as The Butcher's House by townsfolk). Oral history suggests an earlier butcher's shop (more information needed) in Garrity St around 1913, south of the current RSL Hall, in what then became Trathan's Saddlery prior to Trathan's moving over the railway line to Norrish St next to the current CRC building. Mr Saggers shop was constructed of bricks made by Saggers & Taylor brick makers at their brickworks beside the Gordon River on the Main West Rd. The meat was sourced locally & sold under the signage "Cash Butchers".

1930s Mr Vic Slee took over the business & ran it until after WWll. Mr Joe Marsh, having left the army in Victoria & moving to TA, ran the shop until 1957. Mr Marsh possibly worked for Mr Slee prior to his ownership. At this time TA was consuming 3 steers, 3 pigs & up to 20 sheep a week. All slaughtering was done at the slaughter yards on land near what was Newing's piggery. Slaughtering was done on Mondays & Thursdays as there was no refrigerated storage. The shop was open on Saturday mornings until lunchtime. It was common for townsfolk to go to the shop each day & childhood stories of being sent to the butcher's shop before school to pick up sausages or chops for the day were common. All meat was sourced locally.

1957 Bush & Sadlers, butchers from Gnowangerup, bought the Garrity St shop & traded there until purchasing a block of land over the railway line on Norrish St, the current Butcher's Shop. Mr Pedrocci, an Italian builder was commissioned to build a new shop. The block had been the site of the first TA hotel & then a boarding house run by Mrs Mary Potter (nee Cousins daughter of Mr Jack Cousins). Mr Pedrocci made the cement nicks on site & carpentry was completed by local tradesmen. All equipment was moved from Garrity St & cold storage was installed. The shop opened on Saturday 7th November 1959. Oral history records it was a very busy day as it was also Miss Roma Driver's & Mr Robert Baxter's wedding.

The former butcher's shop on Garrity St remained for many years & had uses including being converted into a house & at one time housing a boxing training area.

Further oral history recording transportation of meat by train to & from TA, advent of prepared/cured meats, development of machinery, sale of premises & development of the famous "Mock Chicken Legs" available at the museum.
