SHIRE SHORTS

May 2023

An Annual Electors Meeting will be held on Thursday 18 May, commencing at 3.00pm at the Tambellup Council Chambers. All residents are welcome to attend.

The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday 18 May 2023 commencing at 4.30pm, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

STAFF UPDATE

We are pleased to welcome Leigh Smit, who commenced on the works crew during April. Leigh will be working with the construction team, on the grader.

Recruitment of a mechanic is being finalised, and we anticipate our new staff member will commence during May.

FLAT ROCKS WIND FARM

Prior to the April Council meeting, Councillors and senior staff were provided with a tour of the wind farm site, to better understand the scope and scale of the project. With only a handful of bases left to be constructed, it was a timely opportunity to inspect the work that has gone into the footings of each tower before concreting, and then the finished site ready for turbine installation.



Councillors were also able to inspect the condition of Warrenup Rd, which receives large volumes of traffic while the project is under construction.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council considered a request for public acknowledgement of war service for those men and women who returned from various conflicts. Presently the Honour Rolls are located in our Town Halls, which are not readily available to the public. Staff will investigate alternative options.

- The recommendation from the Bush Fire Advisory Committee for appointment of Bush Fire Control Officers for the 2023/2024 fire season was endorsed. We thank the following volunteer personnel for their contribution to fire prevention in our Shire:

- Broomehill East Brigade	Josh Holmes
- Broomehill West Brigade	Brant Dennis
- Broomehill Central Brigade	Andrew Webster
- Tambellup East Brigade	Chris Rumble

- The Shire's Ranger, Stephanie Swain, and CESM, Cindy Pearce, were also appointed as Bush Fire Control Officers.
- With the introduction of the new *Work Health and Safety Act 2020*, impacts on the Shire's duty of care to volunteers have been considered. The Council endorsed amendments to the existing *Policy 6.2 Appointment of Bush Fire Control Officers*, to include minimum standards for training for all volunteer bush fire brigade members. More information will be communicated to the brigades in the near future.
- The Council endorsed the new Public Health and Wellbeing Plan 2023-2027. This Plan has been developed to comply with State Government requirements in association with the introduction of the *Public Health Act 2016*.
- The Council adopted a Roads Hierarchy, which is a strategic document that will assist in determining minimum maintenance standards for each category of road, identify where capital works are required, and assist in prioritising projects for the annual works program.
- The Roads Hierarchy, and Public Health and Wellbeing Plan are available for viewing on the Shire's website, <https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council/your-council/shire-plans.aspx>
- A development application to allow water discharge into Lot 536 Nardlah Rd was approved with conditions.
- Two development applications for farm shed on Lot 5043 White Rd and Lot 5761 Eureka Rd were approved with conditions.
- Fees and charges relating to Broomehill Caravan park cabin rental were reviewed. From 1 May 2023, the following charges will apply:
 - 2 bedroom cabin
 - \$140.00 per night (up to 6 nights)
 - \$125.00 per night (7 nights or more)
 - 1 bedroom cabin
 - \$120.00 per night (up to 6 nights)
 - \$105.00 per night (7 nights or more)

The existing cabin bond of \$200, and discount on bookings exceeding 28 days will be removed.

- In-principle support of future cycling infrastructure projects was provided by the Council, to allow for identified projects to be incorporated in the Department of Transport's Great Southern Cycling Strategy 2050.
- The Annual Report for 2021/2022 was adopted. An Annual Electors Meeting will be held on Thursday 18 May 2023, in the Council Chambers commencing at 3.00pm.
- The minutes for the Bush Fire Advisory Committee meeting held on 22 March 2023 were received.
- Minutes of all Council meetings are available on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au.

WORKS

As we get near the end of the financial year, a number of construction projects are scheduled for completion. Sealing on sections of Tieline Rd, Tambellup West Rd, Warrenup Rd, Toolbrunup Rd and Chillicup Rd will be undertaken early in May. Please observe signage in place on these roads as works progress, and drive to the conditions.

We were pleased to receive some positive feedback about the excellent presentation of the Broomehill Recreational Complex grounds and oval for the cricket grand final held in March. Our parks and gardens team spends a great deal of time maintaining our sporting facilities, and managing these requirements along with those of the numerous parks, gardens and public spaces that are under the shire's management can take some juggling. Well done team, and congratulations to the Broomehill Cricket Club on their win!

ANZAC DAY

Attendances at our community-led Anzac services appear to be increasing each year, and this year not even the prospect of inclement weather seemed to impact numbers.

In Broomehill, Cr Doug Barritt read from the diaries of Walter Stewart who farmed at 'Malludup' on Pallinup Rd.

During World War I Mr Stewart served with the 19th Light Horse Regiment, before transferring to the 1st Squadron of the Australian Flying Corps. His diary was from his time spent serving in Palestine in 1916/1917,

The address delivered by the Tambellup CWA focused on those who were left behind to carry on – the women of our community, the establishment of the Women's Land Army, the community fundraising efforts to support a variety of war-related causes, and of course, the need for farming women to continue farming. The theme continued with Andrew Bradshaw performing his original song 'Can You Imagine' – a poignant moment for those attending.

Congratulations to the Broomehill Heritage Group, Tambellup Lions Club and Tambellup CWA on their organisation of such memorable services.

ROAD SAFETY DURING SEEDING OPERATIONS

It's that time of the year again when a lot of heavy machinery will be moving around the Shire. Farmers, your licensing concession on tractors, self-propelled sprayers, spray equipment etc., contains conditions which may include the requirement to only travel on roads between sunrise and sunset, may require a flashing light, and may need to have an 'over width' sign attached. In the event of an accident involving other road users, if conditions of your licence are not complied with, motor vehicle injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred. We encourage all road users to be patient if you encounter heavy machinery being transported on our roads. For more information please contact Jacinta or Megan at the Shire Administration offices.

Every year, approximately 1200 people are killed and another 44,000* are seriously injured on Australian roads. Traffic injury is the biggest killer of Australian children under 15 and the second-biggest killer of all Australians aged between 15 and 24. These numbers are growing every year but are preventable if we choose to Drive So Others Survive!

Did you know that if you are taking your dog for a walk, it must be on a lead at all times unless in a prescribed off lead exercise area?

This law is in place to protect other members of the public and your pet from injury.



Q: Why is it best to walk my dog on a lead?

🐕 It's a great good neighbour policy, as it prevents your dog from trespassing on the neighbour's property during your walk. It also keeps your dog from jumping on people you encounter, ensuring that your dog has the chance of being properly introduced.

🐕 Improved companionship. A well trained and lead-obedient dog is a pleasure to walk with.

🐕 Walking your dog on a lead will prevent the spread of disease. It is less likely that your dog will be exposed to Parvovirus or other diseases. A leashed dog can be restrained from sniffing the droppings of other animals.

🐕 A lead is commonly referred to as "Your Pet's Lifeline," protecting your pet from traffic and unrestrained animals. Accidents or animal bites are greatly reduced when responsible dog owners obey the law.

🐕 It's a great way to reward your dog. Your dog will immediately respond with a wagging tail the moment he or she sees you holding the lead.

🐕 It's a great identification tool, symbolizing that the dog has an owner if you become separated during an outing, as a finder will see the lead and identification tag attached to the dog's collar to find you.

🐕 It's a great relief to wildlife, by keeping your dog from chasing them.

Q: Where should my dog be on a lead?

In all public places, including footpaths, roads and verges, car-parks, fuel stations, rest areas and playgrounds that are not dog prohibited areas

Q: What is the penalty for walking my dog off lead in a public place?

By committing a dog off lead offence, you are liable for a \$200.00 penalty. This is an offence under Section 31 (3) of the Dog Act 1976.

Q: Where can my dog go that is off lead?

At any prescribed off lead exercise area. These are signed as such and usually include the town oval or designated parks. If you ever are unsure, please contact the Shire Ranger on 9825 3555

Project Update – April 2023.

Construction Activities

The construction of wind turbine foundations in the Shires of Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup is ongoing. All foundations have been excavated. The concrete for 16 wind turbine foundations has been poured. Approximately 26km of underground cabling has been laid.

The 180 Vestas wind turbine components have arrived at Bunbury Port where they'll be stored until they're delivered to site from late May. Oversize road transportation will be used to transport the wind turbine components approximately 250 kilometres via Coalfields Highway, Albany Highway and Warrenup Road to the project site. It's expected to take around three months for all deliveries to reach the project site.

Community Activities

Our Community Liaison Officer (CLO) visited Tambellup Primary school to share interesting facts about the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 with year PP-6 students. Kids were keen to contextualise the 200m tip height of the turbines, which we discovered are as tall as four Leaning Towers of Pisa, four Olympic swimming pools or fifty African elephants! We also welcomed Councillors and staff from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for a tour of the construction site this month.

Community Fund

The Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 community fund valued at \$75,000 per year across the Kojonup and Broomehill-Tambellup Shires will be launched on May 1st. Round 1 will close on 31st May with successful applicants awarded in June.

Round 2 will run from 1st September – 31st October 2023, with successful applications awarded in November.

Application to update Project Determining Authority

Enel Green Power has submitted an application for the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 project to the WA Government State Development Assessment Unit. The purpose of the application is to transfer authority for administration and management of conditions of approval of the project to the WA Planning Commission (WAPC). The application is no different to what has previously been approved by the Shire of Kojonup and the Regional Joint Development Assessment Panel on behalf of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup. The total number and type of wind turbines and all associated infrastructure and equipment are the same.

On the basis that the development approval being sought remains identical, the application does not impact or change the construction method or current schedule. Establishing the WAPC as the determining authority is consistent with planning reform currently underway in the State. It comprises of a pool of highly experienced technical experts, highly suitable for administering and managing conditions of approval during the life of a project.
