

The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on <u>Thursday 15 June 2023 commencing at 4.30pm</u>, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

STAFF UPDATE

It feels like we have been in a constant recruitment cycle for the past few months, but it seems we are not alone – each of our neighbouring shires, and those a little further beyond, are also recruiting heavily for various positions. While local government is not able to compete with mining remuneration in particular, we are able to offer all the benefits that come with working close to home, having great hours and working environment, modern equipment, plenty of opportunity for skills development and a great team!

We extend a warm welcome to Charmaine Williams, who joined the Shire during May in a casual capacity, working with the Parks and Gardens team.

And finally - congratulations to Tash Korthuis, who has accepted the opportunity to expand her local government administration experience by taking on the Governance and Executive Assistant role.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Annual Electors Meeting was held on Thursday 18 May prior to the Council meeting, with a small
 attendance of three residents, Councillors and staff. The Annual Report, which included the President's Report and Financial Report, was adopted, and no matters of concern or otherwise were raised.
- The Council was pleased to support a request from the Tambellup Aboriginal Progress Association for a • financial contribution to assist with costs related to sending teams to participate at the NAIDOC Netball Carnival in Perth in July.
- The draft Fire Break Order for 2023/2024 was adopted. This will be circulated to the community early in the new financial year.
- The Council has approved the purchase and installation of signage indicating restricted and prohibited fire periods. The signs will be installed at the front of the Broomehill Central Brigade Fire Station, and on the Tambellup Railway Reserve.
- The Council considered a request for comment from the Department of Planning Lands & Heritage's Aboriginal Cultural Material Committee in relation to a proposal to add the Carlecatup Creek to the Register of Places and Objects. The Council was unable to provide feedback

due to an insufficient time period and insufficient information provided.

- A planning application for an agricultural shed on Lot 5994 Pallinup Rd South was approved with conditions.
- The Council was invited to provide comment on a new planning application (Part 17 Application) for Stage 1 of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm, to be considered by the Western Australian Planning Commission. This item will be considered at the June 2023 Council meeting.
- A request from Main Roads WA Heavy Vehicle Services to support the change to Accredited Mass Management Scheme ratings on sections of Ngopitchup Rd, O'Neill Rd, Nymbup Rd and Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd was supported.
- The Council considered an application from CBH to expand two existing open bulkheads on Lot 2 Old Nardlah Rd. Due to the majority of elected members declaring an interest in this item, Ministerial approval was obtained to allow a quorum to be present to debate the matter. Councillors voted to approve the application, with conditions.
- The Council endorsed the draft of a five-year upgrade plan for the Tambellup Cemetery. The plan will be circulated for community feedback through June 2023, and will be considered for adoption at the July council meeting.
- A five year upgrade and improvements plan for the Broomehill Caravan Park was adopted.
- The draft Corporate Business Plan 2023-2027 was presented for adoption. The Corporate Business Plan is derived from the Strategic Community Plan 'People Power', and includes actions that will be implemented over the next four years that will assist in achieving the community outcomes of 'People Power'.

WORKS

The mild conditions during May were not necessarily conducive to the district's seeding program, however were ideal to allow the sealing program to be completed. Sealing works were completed on Toolbrunup Rd, Tieline Rd and Tambellup West Rd, and work on Warrenup Rd is progressing in anticipation of sealing being completed before 30 June to round out the construction program. Chillicup Rd has been prepared ready for seal, and a decision on whether this is able to be achieved this financial year will be made in coming weeks.







Operate and Maintain Chainsaws Skill Set

This course covers the process of maintaining, preparing and operating hand-held chainsaws in a work environment.

These skills can be transferred to the homestead, are useful for home gardners and could lead to employment in parks and gardens or landscaping.

You will gain skills and knowledge in understanding the correct type of chainsaw for a particular task, how to use the chainsaw, maintain the chainsaw and store suitable personal protective equipment.

Project Update - May 2023.

Construction Activities

The concrete of all 18 wind turbine foundations has been poured and backfilled with soil. All civil works, including the internal road network, are nearing completion.

The transportation of wind turbine components is intended to commence end of May. It's intended for around four oversize tower components to be delivered per day. This is scheduled to occur Monday to Friday, leaving the Port of Bunbury in the morning and targeted to arrive at the project site before 12noon. We are committed to road safety and all loads will travel in accordance with relevant permit requirements. We acknowledge and apologise for the inconvenience encountering oversize loads may cause. Please refer to the transportation route via the QR code below.



Turbines will be erected in a staged approach, targeted to commence from around June onwards. During the first stage, the lower sections of the tower will be

installed using a Liebherr LTM1750 Crane. The second stage occurs after the lower sections of the tower have been grouted, using a Liebherr LG1750 Crane. This will involve installation of the upper sections of the tower, the nacelle, hub and three blades.
