

The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on Thursday 27 July 2023 commencing at 4.30pm, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

STAFF UPDATE



During June, we welcomed Marcelo Garcia to the team. Marcelo has taken on the mechanic's role and has been working with former mechanic Sammy Oclarit to become familiar with the Shire fleet and equipment. Thankyou Sammy for your willingness to assist in this regard.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council considered community feedback received in relation to the best use for Lot 61 Garrity St, and determined that the lot will be developed as a public space with low maintenance plantings and materials. The plans will also incorporate artwork panels which will be developed with community input. It is intended that the development of the site will be undertaken with community assistance. Thank you to those members of the community who provided feedback on this matter.
- The Council determined that a submission to the WA Planning Commission in relation to the part 17 application for Stage 1 of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm be adopted and forwarded to the State Development Assessment Unit. The submission is included as an attachment to the June 2023 Ordinary Council Meeting minutes, available on the Shire website.
- A request from Main Roads WA to support a change to the AMMS rating of Flat Rocks Road from Level 1 to Level 3 was endorsed.
- Minutes of all Council meetings are available on the Shire's website <u>www.shirebt.wa.qov.au</u>.

WORKS

The construction program has largely been completed prior to the end of the financial year. Works completed recently included the sealing of a section of Toolbrunup Rd, repair of failed sections, widening and sealing the shoulders on Tieline Rd, and the construction stage of the project to seal Chillicup Rd. Work continues on the sealing of a section of Warrenup Rd, where the clearing, formation and gravel carting has been completed. Sealing of this section, and also on Chillicup Rd, will be carried over to the 2023/2024 works program. A great deal of time has been spent in planning projects for the Council's consideration in the new budget, including preparation of road construction and maintenance programs, development of longer term footpath plans, depot improvement plans, parking design plans for the Broomehill Rest Bay and Recreational Complex car parks, plant replacement, and more. The budget is due to be adopted at the July Council meeting, and once adopted, those projects which were successful will be scheduled. More information about the budget will be included in the August Topics. Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads during June: Pallinup Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Gillespie Rd, Tieline North Rd, Thompson Rd, O'Neill Rd, Beejenup Rd, Wray Rd, Bignell Rd, South Batchelor Rd, Clayton Rd, Martinup Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Lehmann Rd and Cremasco Rd.

YOUTH GREAT SOUTHERN SUPPORT

Since May 2021, Albany Youth Support Association (AYSA) has partnered with the Shire and community to provide a part time youth worker service in Tambellup.

In 2022, the Shire and AYSA were fortunate to be granted funding from YOUTH Great Southern which supported the program. YOUTH Great Southern works with the community and service providers to identify and support at-risk youth. We were pleased to learn recently that our application to the YOUTH Great Southern Quick Grants Scheme was successful, and once again, YOUTH Great Southern will support the program into 2023/2024. These funds, together with a significant contribution from Tambellup Noongar Land Association, and ongoing support from AYSA, will see the program continue into 2024.

While we continue to chase a sustainable source of funding for this important program, we acknowledge the fantastic support of **YOUTH Great Southern** in funding the program delivery again in 2023/2024.

TRAILS PLANNING GRANT SUCCESS

While on the good news band wagon, the Shire has recently been advised that its application to the **Department of Local Government, Sport & Cultural** Industries (DLGSC) 'Trails Planning Grant' program was successful. The grant will fund 50% of the cost of developing a Trails Masterplan for the Shire. The Masterplan will include maps and information about our existing trails network, new trails that have been identified through previous consultation with the community but are yet to be developed, and the maintenance and signage requirements of each. Aside from documenting all our trails infrastructure in one place, it will also allow an action plan to be developed for existing and new trail development, which will ensure that future maintenance requirements are able to be scheduled and actioned. Many thanks to **DLGSC** for this support. The State Government, through the Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries, is a major supporter of trails development in Western Australia. Sport and recreation creates vibrant, inclusive and connected WA communities.

MOSQUITO MANAGEMENT IN YOUR BACK YARD

The Shire has commenced a baiting program on pools of water in the townsites, in an effort to get ahead of the mosquito problem this year. This work will be ongoing, and will take some time to show any impact. In the meantime, there are measures that residents can take at home to eliminate mosquito breeding areas:

- Remove any stagnant water around the house, sheds and yards so mosquitoes cannot breed.
- Change water in pet drinking bowls and birdbaths at least once a week, more so in warmer weather.
- Check rainwater tanks to ensure screens and lids are intact. This limits mosquito entry.
- Clean gutters and drains, so water can run freely.
- Cover trailers and boats. Turn wheelbarrows and kids toys over, to avoid water pooling.
- Keep gardens and lawns trimmed to reduce areas for mosquitoes to rest.

 If areas of driveways and yard have capacity to hold water, fill these with sand. Mosquitoes can breed in the tiniest pool of water.



Operate and Maintain Chainsaws Skill Set

This course covers the process of maintaining, preparing and operating hand-held chainsaws in a work environment.

These skills can be transferred to the homestead, are useful for home gardners and could lead to employment in parks and gardens or landscaping.

You will gain skills and knowledge in understanding the correct type of chainsaw for a particular task, how to use the chainsaw, maintain the chainsaw and store suitable personal protective equipment.

You will also carry out routine checks and maintenance on a chainsaw, apply appropriate chainsaw techniques, cutting methods according to manufacturer's specifications and documented low risk work procedures; assess and minimise environmental impacts of chainsaw use; maintain records of chainsaw training and certification, risk assessment and use.

On successful completion of this course, students will receive a statement of attainment for the following nationally accredited unit AHCMOM213 Operate and Maintain Chainsaws

Changes to SLWA Inter-Library Loan System

From 1 July 2023, libraries are changing the way they fulfil user requests for items not held in their own collection. Instead of using the inter-library loans service as the first port of call, libraries will utilise more environmentally sustainable and cost efficient ways of accessing items for library users.

Instead of seeking to borrow an item via inter-library loan, libraries will now access items not in their own collection in the following ways:

Accessing the item electronically via eresources - For example, this may be an ebook or eaudio book through BorrowBox or Libby. If the item is not available electronically, a request to purchase the ebook can be made by the library

If electronic format is not available or appropriate for the user, then libraries should purchase a print copy - The item can then form part of the library's collection and can be enjoyed by other library users.

If neither of these options are available or suitable, then the item can be requested via inter-library loan -For example, items that are out of print or expensive to purchase may be borrowed from other libraries via interlibrary loan.

These changes are being made to provide a more sustainable library service to the WA community. Significantly increasing freight costs and the environmental impact of transporting readily accessible materials around the state are no longer a viable or responsible use of public money.

We appreciate library customers may have questions or feedback about these changes. This can be directed in the first instance to your local public library.

The Southern WA Library consortium is looking at alternative courier systems, to continue borrowing from other Consortium Libraries. As a consortium with a one card system, patrons have been able to return books from any consortium library to any of the other consortium libraries and we have then sent them to their home libraries through the Inter Library Loan courier system.

Due to the above changes the Broomehill and Tambellup Libraries are currently unable to do this and we request that for the time being you return items you have borrowed from another library, be returned to that library.

Connecting Kids to Country: Year 6 Barna Mia Camp

Gillamii has co-ordinated the Barna Mia camp since 2009, seeing multiple cohorts of year six students from Cranbrook, Frankland River, and Tambellup Primary School experience the Dryandra Woodlands and the biodiversity it has to offer. Students travel to the Dryandra Woodlands National Park, where more than 850 species of flora and fauna can be seen throughout the year. This camp compliments the on-going Connecting Kids to Country environmental education program, which aims to support positive environmental attitudes and increase knowledge and awareness within our future stewards of the landscape. This camp was generously supported by South Coast NRM through the Federal Government's National Landcare Program, The Community Bank Tambellup/Cranbrook and the Mt Barker Co-Op.

On the 5th of April, twelve year six students from Cranbrook, Frankland River and Tambellup Primary School, teachers, Gillamii staff eagerly made the journey to the Dryandra Woodland for the overnight camp. The group was introduced to Marty from DBCA who was a wealth of knowledge and took the students through native fauna trapping and monitoring activity. Our first task was to bait and set the 6 cage traps and learn about fauna monitoring, as well as biodiversity and threats to our native fauna. Following dinner, students headed to the Barna Mia Sanctuary for the nocturnal tour where students learned about the importance of the woodlands to our first nations people, and the threats facing wildlife before heading into the sanctuary to see the friendly natives up close. It is safe to say both the adults and students enjoyed the experience of seeing these often elusive natives, especially fauna that is extinct on the mainland. An early wake up the next morning saw Marty and the group of students head back into the woodlands to see if their trapping was successful. Luckily we had a skilled bunch of conservationists, and we caught 3 Brushtail Possums and one Woylie. Marty showed the students how wildlife biologists process fauna and capture important data, before learning how to safely release the animals into the wild. It was a great trip, sweetened by coming back home for the Easter

holiday.

Construction Activities

The last of the civil works are underway, including the installation of underground cabling on Warrenup Road (details below).

Wind turbine components continue to be transported via trucks from Bunbury Port to site. About a third of component deliveries have arrived and the installation of the first full tower is complete.

Temporary closure of Warrenup Road

A traffic permit has been granted to close parts of Warrenup Road in stages to allow for the installation of reticulation cable underground. We anticipate the stretch of road between O'Neill Road and Grahams Well Road will be closed for an estimated 7-9 day period between 25thJune – 3rd July, and the stretch of road between Grahams Well Road to Ngopitchup Road closed for an estimated 4 day period between 4th – 7th July. This will not impact the Broomehill West school bus route.

Dates may be subject to change due to local weather conditions or other considerations. We aim to keep the local community informed of any changes; please contact us if you have any questions.

- All dogs in Western Australia over the age of 3 months must be registered with a Local Government in addition to being microchipped under State Legislation (Dog Act 1976)
- This includes farm working dogs, who receive a working dog registration discount
- You can register your dog for different terms at different rates; 1 Year, 3 Years or Lifetime
- Pension Concession Card holders receive a 50% discount on all registration fees

Why must my dog be registered?

- Registration assists Rangers in reunification of lost dogs back to their owners
- Provides a legal form of ownership to the dog
- Assists Local Governments in identifying statistics and traceability of dogs in the area
- Above all else, is a legal requirement for dog ownership

What are the penalties if I don't comply?

Owners can be issued with an on-thespot fine of \$200 or face a maximum penalty of \$5,000 for not registering their dog

How much does it cost to register a dog?*


