

MOSQUITOES – FIGHT THE BITE!

In Western Australia, mosquitoes can transmit Ross River virus, Barmah Forest virus, Kunjin virus and the potentially fatal Murray Valley encephalitis virus. There is currently no cure and no vaccine for any mosquito-borne disease acquired in WA. The only way to prevent infection is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

Following on from the article in July's Topics about mosquito management in your backyard, the focus now turns to protecting yourself and your family from disease-carrying mosquitoes.

Firstly - around your home:

- •Maintain fly screens on windows, doors, vents and chimneys.
- •Provide weather stripping for gaps around doors and windows.
- •Use surface spray for outside the house.
- •Use plug in vaporisers or diffusers with repellent -treatment pads in enclosed external areas like verandas and decks - turn these off if area is vacant. Use of mosquito coils in outdoor areas can act as a deterrent.
- •Use of knockdown fly spray against visible mosquitoes in your home.

Consider adding plants to your garden that act as a repellent. Citronella, lavender, mint and basil can be placed in pots around outdoor living areas.


Secondly - the best way to protect from mosquito bites is to cover up.

•Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing. Mosquitoes are attracted to dark colours and can bite through denim.

- •Apply mosquito repellents containing Picaridin or DEET to areas of exposed skin according to the instructions on the packaging.
- •Dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs.
- •Cover strollers and baby carriers with mosquito netting.

Avoid being outdoors when mosquitoes are present.

As part of a broader management strategy, over the coming weeks the Shire will be baiting stagnant pools of water around the townsites. For more information in this regard please contact the Shire on 9825 3555.





VIETNAM VETERANS GRAVESITE COMMEMORATION

Vietnam Veterans Day will be commemorated on Thursday 17 August 2023 at the Tambellup Cemetery, commencing at 1.30pm.

2023 marks the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War.

A brief ceremony commemorating those killed in action will take place with the laying of a Poppy Tribute at the grave of former Tambellup resident, Pt. Brian David Waters of the 6th Battalion Royal Australian Regiment, who was killed in action in Vietnam on 17 February 1967.

ROE SET TO EXPAND UNDER DRAFT PROPOSAL

Member for Roe Peter Rundle MLA has expressed concern over the <u>2023 Proposed Boundaries</u>, which would significantly increase the Roe electorate area and include five additional Shires.

The changes follow <u>WA Labor's submission</u> to the WA Electoral Distribution Commission, just two years after their party voted to alter the structure of the Upper House, reducing regional representation.

Mr Rundle said the changes put forward by WA Labor are a direct attack on fair representation for people in the region.

"The Roe electorate covers 104,934 square kilometres already, with 41 towns, 16 local governments and 49 schools.

This proposal is set to increase Roe by more than 18,000 square kilometres as well as include the 5 Shires of Cuballing, Kondinin, Kulin, Wickepin, and part of the Shire of Plantagenet.

"These sweeping changes across WA electoral boundaries are yet another assault on the regions by Labor, reducing representation for regional people and increasing areas covered by their elected MP's.

"The privilege of serving in Parliament has never been lost on me. However, by expanding our electorate, we risk making it near impossible for our community to have equal representation.

"Our party remains united, and we encourage people to make a submission objecting to Labor's changes which limit regional voices."

Opposition Leader and Nationals WA Leader Shane Love MLA also slammed the changes.

"The proposed changes are nothing short of an assault on regional democracy," Mr Love said.

"There is a clear agenda from this Labor Government to employ unfair tactics to crack our communities apart.

"Regional voters deserve to have their voices heard, their communities kept intact, and their representation safeguarded.

Project Update - July 2023.

Construction Activities

We are pleased to announce the first turbine of Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 has been safely installed. Appropriately named "First Spinner", the turbine is currently in free wheel, with its blades pitched to the direction of the general prevailing wind (south-west) to catch minimal wind. The remaining 17 turbines continue to be progressively installed.

The installation of underground cabling on the Warrenup Road section is complete, with a total of 45km of electrical cabling laid to date. Around 80 personnel are currently working on the project site. Wind turbine components continue to be transported via trucks from Bunbury Port. About a third of component deliveries have arrived at site so far, with the remaining loads expected over the next six weeks. A reminder that Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 is an active construction site on private land, therefore access is not permitted without prior permission and a formal safety induction.

Productive Saltland Pasture for Southern WA

IN-KIND SUPPORT HAS BEEN PROVIDED BY DPIRD, CSIRO, HOST AND CORE PRODUCERS, THANK YOU TO ALL WHO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED.

PROJECT UPDATE

In Spring last year 4 sites, totalling 66 hectares, were established with perennial salt-tolerant pastures in collaboration with 3 host farming families. There are two additional sites to be established in August this year, bringing the total area to 150 hectares.

The sites are located throughout the Broomehill-Tambellup and Cranbrook shires, ranging from valley floors to areas further up the landscape in the transition zone of productive to salt affected soils. The motivation of producers to develop these areas into salt-tolerant pastures systems is to use both surface and ground water to manage the site's local salinity, while keeping the areas as productive paddocks, part of their various livestock enterprises.



On the 23rd of June 2022 a group of local producers and Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) staff, hosted by Gillamii, spent the day visiting the sites to workshop ideas for pasture establishment. The aim of the workshop was to utilise the knowledge of Gillamii's producers, experienced in productive saltland pastures, and connect them with the new PDS producers, aided by expertise from DPIRD. The group discussed the best pasture mixes, site design and establishment plan, tailored to local conditions and based on producer experiences. Salinity (EC), pH, elevation as well as indicator species had been analysed prior to the workshop to provided information to support decision making on the day.

The outcome of these workshops were 4 different site designs and species mixes, two comprising of pastures with pre-established saltbush, one to be direct seeded with saltbush alleys and a pasture understory and the remaining to be planted with saltbush seedlings in alleys with a volunteer pasture understory,







Since establishment last spring, all sites have had successful establishment and survived the first and very dry 2022-23 summer-autumn period. The two complete pasture sites had such successful establishment that they were grazed twice within the first 6 months of establishment. The remaining two sites with juvenile saltbush require stock to be excluded for the first year to allow proper establishment of the fodder

As part of this project both pasture and livestock parameters are being monitored (2022-2027) to demonstrate the key benefits of these systems. Parameters include: soil organic carbon, biomass (summer-autumn period), pasture nutrition (summer-autumn period), grazing days, live-weight gain and cost-benefit analysis. Please see following page for how the sites are progressing. Measurements are been taken during the summer-autumn period each year.

A field walk is planned for spring this year, with two more field walks throughout the project as the sites develop and producers and their livestock fully utilise the sites. These field walks will showcase the pros and cons of the different systems as well as be an opportunity to discuss how the sites perform on paper vs real farmer accounts of practical management and utilisation.

Sub-surface Catchments: Drought Demonstrations

FDF Project: FDF-MU37-P1

IN THE LOCAL CATCHMENT, FARMERS HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTING SUB-SURFACE PERFORATED PIPING TO DRAIN AWAY EXCESS WATER IN WATERLOGGING (OR SALINE) PRONE AREAS OF THEIR PROPERTIES. IN RECENT YEARS A FEW PROGRESSIVE FARMERS HAVE UTILISED THIS SYSTEM, TRADITIONALLY USED FOR DRAINAGE, TO INTERCEPT SUBSURFACE WATER BEFORE IT REACHES THE SHALLOW, SALINE GROUNDWATER TABLE, REDIRECTING IT INTO THEIR DAMS, INCREASING ON-FARM WATER SECURITY AND HELPING REDUCE THE IMPACTS OF PROLONGED WATERLOGGING AND SALINITY. THE SUB-SURFACE DRAINAGE COSTS ROUGHLY \$10,000/KM AND CURRENTLY, THERE IS NO MONITORING IN PLACE TO DETERMINE THE FLOW RATE, TOTAL FLOW, WATER QUALITY AND RESPONSE TO RAINFALL OF THIS DRAINAGE, THEREFORE THE VALUE OF THE FRESH WATER BEING CAPTURED IS UNKNOWN: MANY FARMERS ARE STILL USING THESE SYSTEMS SOLELY FOR DRAINAGE, POTENTIALLY FORGOING A HIGHLY VALUABLE AND LIMITED RESOURCE.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Supported by the Future Drought Fund, Gillamii in collaboration with 4 local farmers will utilise pre-established sub-surface drainage systems to establish a monitoring network to measure the flow rate, total flow, response to rainfall and water quality at the 4 sites. The outcome of this manitoring will be to inform the local grower network of the potential opportunity to capture fresh sub-surface water, building increased drought resilience.



Project Monitoring Site: Map of sub-surface drainage

Drainage Downunder is the highly skilled and professional business that installed all of the sub-surface drainage being monitored as part of this demonstration project. Drainage Downunder was contracted by the project landholders to install the drainage outside of the scope of this demonstration, completely privately funded.

Drainage Downunder's constructions consist of a trenching machine that digs, lays pipe and backfills all in the one action. The specialised laser-regulated trenching machines are purpose-built in the United Kingdom and provide total grade control of subsoil drainage construction. The drainage incorporates a controlled depth of permeable hard-cap limestone aggregate over laser-graded slotted drain coil placed up to 2.4 metres in depth. This drains cause minimal paddock disturbance and can be cropped over etc., virtually invisible on the surface

PROJECT MONITORING

Farmbot was established in Sydney in 2014 and is a leading Australian Agtech company. Their Saas Platform gathers data points via their unique IoT device that puts Farmers "in the know" on their water assets with near real time reporting on water levels, trends and alerts anywhere in the world.

The sensors below will be set up near/in the end of the 4 outlet pipes near the edge of the dams.

The Farmbot Monitor is the remote monitoring device that integrates with Farmbot's range of wired and wireless sensors to allow real time remote monitoring and access to data. This will be installed on a star picket near the edge of the dam with wires covered with a protector to stop livestock damage.



Flow Sensor

Reports litres-per-minute flow rates. To be attached at the outlet of the pip, with an additional 30cm of pipe to be added at the end before it discharges into the dam.



Rain Gauge

The Rain Gauge sits within 2 metres of the Farmbot Monitor, is selfinstallable and immediately operational. It is a self-emptying tipping bucket rain gauge, Compare daily, weekly, monthly and yearly rainfall. See the last 24 hours, MTD, YTD and Rolling 90 days.



Software & System

Login online or on your phone to see real time data. This will be publicly available for to the community to view on the Farmbot software via the Gillamii website.



Monthly Water Sampling

Water samples to be taken from the pipe outlets each month and posted to CSBP for their standard analysis to determine water quality (spray water and stock water).
