State Finalist

Kathryn Collins

Tambellup Primary School, WA

Nominated by: Sue Sheridan, Level 3 Classroom Teacher

Kathryn Collins, a Special Needs Education Assistant at Tambellup Primary School, is the Western Australia Finalist in the 2023 Australian Teacher Aide of the Year Awards.

Kathryn provides support in the Kindergarten, Pre-Primary, and the Year 1 room, and is making a significant positive impact at Tambellup Primary School.



Kathryn designs and implements physiotherapy, speech therapy and occupational therapy programs. She trials and collects data and maintains records for external staff to adjust provided programs.

Kathryn uses augmentative communication devices to meet the diverse language needs students, and has effectively implemented boundary training, so that the neurodiverse and Kindergarten children who are inclined to be flight risks, are kept safe.

An example of Kathryn's impact has been the complete transformation of an ASD student, whom Kathryn has worked with for the last three years to implement boundary training, keyword signing, toileting and explicitly teach academic skills and concepts.

"The progress this child has made in all areas has been outstanding. Fast forward to today and the student can use key word signing, communicate with visuals, use assistive technology, lines up with her peers on the bell, and is no longer a flight risk. She can complete given tasks independently, to the best of her ability," said Sue Sheridan, Level 3 Classroom Teacher.

Kathryn is a crucial member of the teaching team in the Early Childhood room and collaborates effectively with colleagues to support all children meet their learning outcomes, supports less experienced colleagues, and mentor new team members.

Kathryn has collaborated with the class teacher to design a timetable that is easy for everyone to follow, ensuring that it includes individual therapy time as well as explicit teaching of new skills, practise of previously learnt concepts and opportunities for students to work, play and interact with their peers. She has also set up individualised recording systems so that each child's development can be recorded.

As a result of Kathryn's input, students continue to make significant progress in all areas of their learning, and she has been the catalyst which has enabled children who have started school as non - verbal to be able to communicate with their peers and with the teaching staff, through the use of signing and verbal communication.

Kathryn continually strives to improve her practice through ongoing professional learning. She has undertaken online learning to further her understanding of Autism, Augmented and Assistive Communication, and Classroom Management and Positive Behaviours in Schools, and of restorative justice practises. Kathryn is currently the internal coach of the Positive Behaviours in School's team.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS – 21 OCTOBER 2023

The nomination period for the 2023 Council elections was open for an eight day period from 31 August 2023. Three vacancies were open for nominations through the expiry of terms for Cr White, Barritt and Penny. In addition, Cr Paganoni advised he intended to retire from Council following the October 2023 Council meeting, and as such, a fourth vacancy was created, for a two-year term.

Nominations for the four vacancies were received from incumbent members Michael White, Doug Barritt, Steve Penny, and new candidate Sara Robinson. At the close of nominations, and with no further nominations received. all four were elected being unopposed. A draw was conducted to determine each nominee's term. Michael White, Doug Barritt and Steve Penny were each elected for four-year terms, and Sara Robinson was elected for the two-year term. Our thanks and congratulations are extended to all for their commitment to our community. The new and returning Councillors will be sworn in at a Special Meeting of Council to be held on Thursday 26 October 2023 commencing at 4.30pm. Residents are welcome to attend this meeting to witness the swearing in ceremony.

We wish to congratulate Cr Paganoni on his successful term as a Councillor, commencing in 2013 and including two years as Deputy President and two years as Shire President. Mark's commitment included advocacy on behalf of the Shire on a number of regional committees, including the Great Southern Zone WALGA, Great Southern Development Assessment Panel and Great Southern Regional Roads Group. Mark's work with the Regional

Roads Group in particular contributed significantly to the level of Federal Government funding awarded to the Shire for road upgrades. We thank Mark for his time and effort spent working on behalf of our community and the wider region.



STAFF MOVEMENTS

We are pleased to welcome Pattie Farmer to the Administration team. Pattie has commenced in the newly -created Administration

Officer role – and to clarify conversations in the community, no, Coral and Megan have not left us! Pattie's position evolved following identification of a gap in our service delivery, and she will be providing administrative support to the Manager of Works, Works Team Leaders, CESM and Ranger. Welcome Pattie – we hope you enjoy your time with the Shire!

FROM THE SEPTEMBER 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

- A request for comment on the proposed transfer of Lot 78 Norrish St under the South West Native Title Settlement was considered. The Council supported the proposal.
- The Tambellup Youth Precinct Masterplan was endorsed. The Masterplan provides guidance for the future upgrade of facilities at the Youth Centre. Priorities for 2023/2024, in accordance with the budget, include:
 - Relocation of the existing building to the north side of the gravel car park area to better utilise the natural shade and grassed area;
 - Installation of a second building with compliant access alongside the relocated building to provide additional internal space and storage;
 - o Construction of a new undercover area to provide sheltered external space; and
 - Extension of the sealed court area to provide additional space for the skate park equipment off the court.

- The Masterplan is available on the Shire website <u>www.shirebt.wa.gov.au</u> under 'Shire Plans', or at the Administration Offices.
- The purchase and installation of new banner poles for Broomehill and Tambellup was approved. The design of the banner poles will enable staff to hang banners from ground level, eliminating the need for elevated work platforms or similar to be used. The existing banner poles will be removed.
- The Council accepted an invitation from WALGA to register as a RoadWise Council. Participation in this program provides opportunities for the Shire to influence road safety outcomes on the local road network through its role in building, maintaining and managing roads.
- Rates concessions were granted to the Tambellup Business Centre and Broomehill Village Co-operative.
- A development application for a house on Lot 393 (No. 83) Chillicup Rd was approved with conditions.
- A development application for a sea container (outbuilding) on Lot 123 (No. 3974) Paul Valley Rd was approved with conditions.
- A request to modify the conditions of an approved development application from CBH to reflect the construction details of silos at the Broomehill development site was approved (galvanised with a white lower cone).
- The draft Gordon River Walk Trail and Facilities Plan was endorsed for community consultation. More information is provided below.
- A request from an accredited Flora Collectors Licence holder to collect wildflower specimens from the Broomehill Recreational Complex and Boot Rock Reserve for the purpose of identification was approved.
- The draft Tambellup Railway Precinct Townscape Plan was endorsed for community consultation. In addition, the location for proposed new public toilets was endorsed, and with funds allocated in the 2023/2024 budget, work will commence on concept planning and design for these. More information is provided below.
- A review of the Delegations register was completed, with the revised document endorsed by the Council. Delegations are made to facilitate prompt business transactions and

- streamline the customer service functions of the Shire to ensure waiting times and delays are kept to a minimum.
- The Council approved a proposal for the purchase of Lot 8 and Lot 123 Norrish St (the old General Store) and authorised the CEO to negotiate with the owners in this regard. Funds for the purchase will come from the Building Reserve.

GORDON RIVER WALK TRAIL AND FACILITIES – DRAFT FIVE YEAR PLAN - COMMUNITY CONSULTATION OPEN

During the consultation for the Strategic Community Plan 'People Power' last year, the Gordon River was noted as a significant asset to the Tambellup community. To raise the profile of this asset to the broader community, a draft plan for the upgrade of the area and facilities has been developed, proposed to be implemented over a five-year period.

But – we need to know what you think.

The Plan is available for viewing at the Shire Administration Offices and the Tambellup CRC, or alternatively, on the Shire website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under 'Shire Plans'.

TAMBELLUP RAILWAY PRECINCT - TOWNSCAPE PLAN - COMMUNITY CONSULTATION OPEN

Draft plans for the revitalisation of the Railway Reserve in Tambellup have been prepared and are available for community feedback.

The area in focus extends from the Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road railway crossing to the Old Station Masters House (Museum), and also incorporates the full extent of Crowden St from Norrish St to East Terrace. Again – we'd love your feedback.

Copies of the draft plans are available at the Shire Administration Offices and Tambellup CRC, or alternatively, on the Shire website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under 'Shire Plans'. It is also proposed to display large format copies of the plans at the 124 Store with feedback forms available.

Feedback is invited and your suggestions are welcome. These can be provided in writing to the CEO, Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, 46-48 Norrish St Tambellup 6320, or emailed to mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au.

These plans presents a significant and long term upgrade to the Tambellup town centre, and as such, we would like to capture the views of as many people as we can.

To facilitate this, the consultation period will be open until 31 January 2024.

Two community information sessions will also be held, providing the opportunity to discuss the detail in the plans with Shire staff and the architect. These are proposed for Wednesday 18 October, at 2.30pm and 6.00pm, at the Tambellup Community Pavilion. No RSVP is required, all welcome!

FROM THE RANGER'S CORNER CAT AND DOG REGISTRATIONS

Cat and dog owners are reminded registrations expire on 31 October each year. If your pet's registration is due to expire this year, please keep an eye out for your renewal in the mail – these will be sent early in October.

KEEPING POULTRY IN THE TOWNSITE



Did you know that there are regulations surrounding the keeping of poultry and pigeons in our townsites? These regulations are set out in Division 4 of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Local Law 2020 – Keeping of poultry and

pigeons. For example, residents can keep up to twelve (12) poultry and pigeons on any lot of land without the approval of the Shire. If you wish to house more, you can apply for approval with the Shire.

However, if you wish to keep Roosters, Goose or Ganders, Turkeys, Peacocks or Peahens or any gamebirds (such as Emus or Ostriches) you must apply for approval with the Shire. All poultry are required to have an enclosure and be contained on the property as defined in Clause 5.4.3 of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Local Law 2020.

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1.



Project Update - September 2023.

Construction Activities

Major civil and electrical works are complete. Around 90% of wind turbine components have been transported to site, with deliveries expected to finish by mid-October.

Nine turbines are full erected, seven partially erected, and the remaining two are to commence in the coming weeks. The tower installation phase is likely to finish in approximately three months.

The commissioning phase is on track to start in December 2023, when the substation on Tambellup West Road is expected to be energised. Blades will begin turning and generating electricity, one tower at a time, from December onwards.

To kick us off here is a biscuit recipe from my childhood

Milo Biscuits

Ingredients

- 125g Soft Butter/Margarine
- 1 cup Castor Sugar
- 1 Egg
- 1 ¹/₂ cup Self Raising Flour
- ¹/₄ Milo Powder
- ¹/₂ Choc Chips/Sultanas (optional)

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 160 degrees celsius (fan forced) and line two flat baking trays with baking paper. Set aside.
- 2. Cream the butter (which has been softened to room temperature) and sugar by using a electric mixer until pale and creamy
- 3. Add the egg and beat until well combined
- 4. Add the Milo and self raising flour and mix to combine . Add the choc chips/sultanas
- 5. Roll the mixture into tablespoon-sized balls and place onto the prepared trays (leaving a gap to allow for spreading). Press the balls down slightly.
- 6. Bake for 15 minutes. Allow to cool on the trays for 10 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.



Reprinted from Trove - Southern Sentinel Paper (Mt Barker) 17 June 1954

We thought you may be interested in reading an early residents recollections of what was available in Tambellup in the first decade of last century.

TAMBELLUP JOTTINGS

Tambellup Pioneers: Mrs Temby's Story

This week we had a lady among our old pioneers, Mrs. Temby who is away at the moment, otherwise perhaps I could have obtained more details as it only needs 2 women to get together to recall events which happened in the past.

She had promised me a more detailed account but I was absent from Tambellup for a week or two and when I returned she had left for Adelaide- so I must let it go as it is. Here is Mrs. Temby's story:' I arrived here in Tambellup on February 13 in the year: 1900. I was then Miss Hilda Tratham and I made my first home with my sister, Mrs. Charlie Temby, and her hus-band. They had already settled here and Mr. Temby had opened a blacksmith's shop, — near where the RSL building now stands. Mr. Bunce Snr., was living here and he was employed by the Railway Dept, and pumped water for the railways from the pump pool 2 or 3 days a week. He would then go down to Mt. Barker and pump there for a few days each week. His two Sons, Ern and Fred were already settled on a farm a few miles out. Mr. and Mrs. Groves. Snr., were also living here on their, farm at Toolbrunup, and Mr. Hardy Snr., and his two sons, Fred and George, arrived soon after I did and selected. the property recently bought by Mr. Herbert from | Mr Knipe. There was also Mr and Mrs. Polletti, living near where the barracks are now and they were a very hospitable couple who did all they could to make new-comers welcome and to help anyone in need. Mr Polletti was the ganger and he forked for 7/- a day, and when Federation came there was great rejoicing because he got a rise of 1/- per day. With such a rise he felt he was a millionaire. Mr. and Mrs. Polletti also had a small property where they kept cows and pigs and for special occasions they would kill a pig or a calf. All stores came from Broomehill or Albany until Sundar Singh, an Indian, started coming here by van from Cranbrook. Later he opened a shop where Mr. H. Simpson has his office and r storeroom. This shop was a great blessing to the people settled here and Sundar Singh was an interesting character and he became a well-known figure, with his white turban, which he always wore with his European clothes. Later Mr. N. Phillips opened a general store where the Co-op now stands.

Before the school was erected here the children used to go to Broomehill by train. It was about 1903 when a school was opened here at Tambellup and the first teacher was a lady teacher, Miss Lee. Miss Lee was followed by Miss Wilson. After Miss Wilson left the new headmaster was a man, Mr Walters. He was a very enthusiastic gardener, and while he was here he sent to Holland for a bag of bulbs for the school garden and during his stay the Tambel-up school won a second prize at the Royal Show for a collection of flowers from a school garden. He also ar-ranged for a party of school children to go to Albany to see the American Fleet in 1908. My father, Mr. Trathan Snr., arrived a few months after I did and he opened a saddlery business. At that time there was no post office and the letters were tied to a hook and passed to the guard as the train went through. Later on an un official post office was open-ed by my two brothers J. E. & G. W. Tratham. This was done in an honorary capacity. The first sports meeting was held on the reserve between the RSL building and the Pump pool. This was a function that attracted visitors from far and wide. In the evening there was a dance in the goods shed. The original building is still in use, and in the early days was in great demand for dances and concerts, church, etc. Quite often a train would do some shunting or let off steam at the critical moment. Later there was a waiting room built then the church services were held

there. In those days Mr. O. Saggers used to ride or drive to Broomehill as the representative of the Tambellup district to the road board meetings. I can recall him arriving home from Broomehill on horseback driving a cow and carrying a calf on the front of the saddle, having driven the cow all the way on a road that had quite a lot of poison on either side.

One of the days that stands out very vividly in my memory was when we entertained a party of English officers of the Royal Navy who were spending the day in Tambellup while their boat was in Albany. These men had been on a shooting expedition organised by Mr. Owen Saggers. Whilst they were waiting for their train, Mr. Saggers brought them to our home. The train, which was due at about 6 in the evening, was several hours late, and the problem of entertaining 12 men with only 6 cups was one never to be forgotten. Apart from that the evening proved very interesting, as these men had many stories to tell of all the places where they had been and the people they had seen. One incident which still amuses me, when one of the officers in a very superior manner asked me: "Had I ever been to Albany?" To which I answered "Yes." Then he asked me "Had I ever been to Perth?" My answer to that question was "No." The final question was, "Had I ever been to school?" Is it any wonder that I can remember when the Royal Navy visited Tambellup so many years ago.
