The next Ordinary meeting of the Council will be held on **Thursday 16 November 2023 commencing at 4.30pm**, at the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS – 21 OCTOBER 2023

Following the recent Local Government elections, new and returning Councillors were sworn in by Trevor Prout JP at a Special Meeting of Council held on Thursday 26 October 2023. Cr Michael White, Cr Doug Barritt and Cr Steve Penny were elected unopposed for four year terms expiring in 2027. With Mark Paganoni announcing his retirement from the position mid-term, a fourth vacancy was created. Cr Sara Robinson was elected unopposed for the remaining two years of this vacancy.

Nominations for President and Deputy President were called at the meeting, with the result that Cr Michael White was elected Shire President, and Cr Doug Barritt was elected Deputy Shire President.

STAFF MOVEMENTS

It was with regret that the Shire President accepted the Chief Executive Officer's notice of resignation during October. Anthony has accepted a position at the Shire of Plantagenet to be closer to home, and will be finishing at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup in January 2024. Council will now commence a recruitment process to fill the CEO vacancy.

FROM THE OCTOBER 2023 COUNCIL MEETINGS

The October Ordinary Council Meeting had a heavy governance flavour, with the Bush Fire Brigades Standard Operating Procedures and Policy Manual reviewed and endorsed, minutes from the Bush Fire Advisory Committee and Local Emergency Management Committee meetings received, the Broomehill Cemetery Five Year Plan adopted and a draft local planning policy relating to applications for wind and solar farms endorsed for public comment.

The Council considered an item making recommendations for actions to be taken in response to long overdue rates debtors.

Following the close of the tender period, the Council accepted a quote from WesTrac for the purchase of a new Cat 140 grader and trade of the existing 12M grader. A quote from Colas for a full bitumen service for the 2023/2024 road construction program was also accepted.

MARKYT COMMUNITY SCORECARD

An important opportunity to let the Shire know what you think! The Shire is once again participating in the Markyt Community Scorecard process, along with the Shires of Katanning, Kojonup, Cranbrook, and Plantagenet. The Community Scorecard, which is being coordinated by independent research organisation Catalyse, provides community members with an opportunity to rate the Shire's services and facilities, and to share information about community needs. This information assists with future planning.

How can you access the Community Scorecard?

- An email has been circulated by Catalyse director Lisa Lough to those members of the community who have provided their email details to the Shire – please keep an eye out for this.
- Hard copy surveys have been mailed to residents holding a post box in Broomehill and Tambellup. Additional copies are available on request.
- The link to the survey will be promoted through the Shire’s social media and website.
- Posters containing QR code links to the Community Scorecard are on noticeboards and shop windows in both towns.

CORPORATE BUSINESS PLAN – HOW ARE WE TRACKING?

The Corporate Business Plan 2023-2027 provides a framework that supports the delivery of community aspirations contained in the Strategic Community Plan ‘People Power’. At the October Ordinary Council Meeting, the quarterly progress report for July-September 2023 was presented.

There are 120 actions scheduled for commencement or completion in the 2023/2024 financial year. The following table illustrates progress to the end of September:

It is pleasing to note we have been able to complete some actions in the first three months of a four year plan! These range from the adoption of various plans and strategies including the Youth Precinct Master Plan, Roads Hierarchy, Public Health Plan, Broomehill Caravan Park Master Plan, to the launch of the online booking system for the Broomehill Caravan Park and the hosting of the first two community breakfast events.

BUSHFIRE SEASON IS HERE!

November has arrived, the vegetation is drying off, and on 1 November 2023, the Prohibited Burning period commences.

- **From 1 November 2023 until 14 March 2024 no fires are to be lit.**
- **To report a fire – call 000. This is the most efficient way of getting assistance.**
- **Have you prepared your family and your home for the fire season?**
- **Go to <https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/hazard-information/bushfire/prepare>**

Residents are reminded of their obligation to minimise the risk of fire on their property. In particular, on townsite and urban land, the height of any grass on the lot must be no higher than 150mm. Property inspections will be undertaken early in November, and owners of non-compliant properties will be requested to undertake works to reduce the hazard. Project Update – October 2023.

Construction Activities

Thirteen turbines have been erected with the remaining five on track to be completed before the end of the year. We are awaiting two blade deliveries from Bunbury Port this week, which will be the final delivery for the project.

Electrification is due to commence in late November. Rotors will start to move in a stop-start fashion during December 2023 and January 2024 as we test them to verify all the safety and control systems, as well as to comply with the grid requirements from AEMO and Western Power.

We expect to reach the stage of blades constantly turning by the end of February 2024, for completing the grid compliance tests with AEMO and Western Power by early April 2024, after which the project will be operational, and we will commence the noise monitoring program. The noise monitoring program will be conducted in accordance with the approved Noise Impact Mitigation Management Plan, and we expect the initial campaign to last about six weeks in order to capture the different wind conditions (i.e. directions and speed).

Community Activities

The Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 Open Day on October 11th was a great success, attracting more than fifty visitors to view the construction progress of the 18 turbines.

Visitors got up close to the giant turbine components on ground level and asked questions of our harness-clad technicians and engineers. They were then given the opportunity to view a complete turbine from the base, while enjoying a coffee and cupcakes from Megacinos.

It was fantastic to see so much genuine interest from the community in learning about this local renewable energy project. People collected pamphlets, marvelled at progress photos, touched samples of bolts and cables and discussed the many opportunities developments like these provide for rural communities.

Presidents Report 2023

Once again the Broomehill Heritage Group has had a busy year.

In November 2022 we held a Market day in the Museum Grounds which was well patronized. The information panels for the 'Holland Track Interpretive Centre' were installed and have proven to be very popular with visitors.

The Town Walk Trail Panels have been installed around town, although there are still 2 to be placed. Once again, there has been a positive response from both locals and visitors alike.

We are getting very positive feedback from visitors and locals about the landscaping. Now that the plants are established and flowering, the area is looking very inviting. Also having 2 sides of the fence removed and making the yard more accessible to the public has added to the interest.

ANZAC day this year was very well attended. There were around 60 people plus children who took part in our sit down breakfast. Thank you to Doug Barritt for being the MC for the day.

In May we held the Broomehill Antique & Collectors Fair . This year the hall was almost full with vendors. Both vendors and visitors alike were very impressed with the weekend. We will have the Fair again next year at the same time.

The Roads Board Shed has been a major focus this year. We were able to re-roof it with new tin, put in gutters, down pipes and drains.

We had a big clean out of the shed and began relocating items from the Shire Depot shed.

We purchased a sea container to use as secure office/storage space. This will enable us to use the back room of the museum for further displays. The sea container has been placed in the middle of the shed. The display items will be placed around it to enable everything to be viewed easily. We still need to paint the inside, install the lino, shelving and power points.

Our tractor 'Hanna' has been positioned on the Broomehill-Gnowangerup road as part of the Horse Power Highway. It is not yet on the information list for the Highway as we haven't supplied any information for it. Thank you to the Gnowangerup Men's Shed for the restoration of the tractor.

The 'Heritage Footpath' was an amazing success with 122 brick pavers being ordered. Once again there has been lots of positive feedback about it. Stage 2 is now open for orders.

The students from Broomehill Primary School came to visit in August and many of them were able to find their family bricks.

The Museum itself has been very well patronized this year. Having the door open makes all the difference.

As usual I ask that everyone try to encourage others to join the Broomehill Heritage Group, even if only to help out with Busy Bees.

I would like to thank the Broomehill Heritage Group Committee, the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire, the Tambellup CRC and the community in general for their work and support in the last 12 months.

Community Bank Tambellup Cranbrook will be 25 years in 2024, A little history on your local Community Bank

History: Community Banking was first established in June 1998 in the Victorian towns of Minyip & Rupanyup. Small country towns were losing their banking services and an enterprising businessman, David Matthews, contacted Bendigo Bank to see if they would fill the void. Robert (Rob) Hunt, General Manager of Bendigo Bank viewed the establishment of a Bendigo Bank Branch as being too difficult however, negotiations were started to partner with the community in providing banking services. The rest is history, as Community Banking was established.

In 1998, the Tambellup Shire co-ordinated public district meetings to try and establish some form of Banking at Tambellup. Vicki Brown of Tambellup approached Jan Pope of the Cranbrook Shire to see if Cranbrook was interested in a joint venture of Banking which would be in Partnership with Bendigo Bank. They co-opted Mr Max Trenorden, MLA in the WA Court Government and he went East to approach Bendigo Bank regarding them coming to WA. The response was positive and in March, 1999, Mr Russell Jenkins, Mr Simon Cornwell and Mr David Matthews came to WA and along with Mr Trenorden visited some 20 communities who were interested in establishing Community-owned branches of Bendigo Banks in Western Australia.

Four Communities were prepared to establish a Community Bank, with Tambellup Cranbrook being a mirror of the original Community Bank in Victoria with, in fact, similar populations and farming activities.

Tambellup Cranbrook Community Bank of Bendigo Bank was now a reality.

The Steering Committee was Chaired by Mr Greg Mengler, Secretary Mrs Jan Pope, Treasurer Mrs Vicki Brown. The committee was made up of Mr Peter Jefferies, Mr Brian Taylor, Mr Campbell Taylor, Mrs Marvina Hull, Mr Adrian Bridge with attendance by Mr Simon Cornwell and Mr Russell Jenkins of Bendigo Bank. Mr Jenkins was a Director of our Board in the early stages of our Company being established before resigning and his position being filled by Mr Simon Cornwell. The Steering Committee saw the Community Banking process as an opportunity to harvest funds for our community that would have, under existing banking practices, been lost to our community.

Operating Principals of Tambellup & Cranbrook Community Bank Branch of Bendigo Bank:

The core Principal of the establishment of the Community Bank was three-fold.

- ◆ To provide the Communities of Tambellup and Cranbrook with a viable and secure Banking service.
