STAFF MOVEMENTS

FROM THE FEBRUARY 2024 COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council endorsed the Department of Transport's *Great Southern Cycling Strategy 2050* a long term aspirational strategy that will assist with planning the delivery of safe and interconnected bicycle networks and associated facilities locally and regionally, aimed at getting more people out of cars and on to bikes. The actions within the strategy were developed in consultation with the community.
- An application from the WA Planning Commission for a boundary realignment between Lot 1 Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd and Lot 2 Cremasco Rd was supported.
- An application from the WA Planning Commission for the amalgamation of Lots 5 and 6 Crowden St was supported.
- A planning application for the development of a second dwelling on Lot 2 Great Southern Highway was approved with conditions.
- The Corporate Business Plan quarterly progress report for the period October-December 2023 was received. The report is available on the Shire's website <u>www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council/your-council/</u> <u>shire-plans.aspx</u>
- The Council endorsed recommendations from the Audit and Risk Committee, including the adoption of the Business Continuity Response Plan and Procedures, receipt of the Audit Concluding Memo and Auditor's report for 2022/2023, adoption of the Compliance Audit Return 2023, and acceptance of the Annual Report for 2023.

RAILWAY PRECINCT TOWNSCAPE PLAN CONSULTATION

Feedback from the community consultation process was provided to the Council at its informal briefing session prior to the February Council meeting. Councillors took the opportunity after the meeting to walk through the site to better understand the comments and concerns raised and will work with the architects to ensure that the concept design results in an outcome that represents the community, and is practical and appealing for residents and visitors to Tambellup.

As residents will understand, it is important to plan once and plan well for a project of this nature and scale. As the design stage progresses, there will be opportunity for community groups to participate, to inject a local flavour to the site, and we look forward to collaborating. Updates will continue to be provided along the way.

TAMBELLUP CARAVAN PARK – PROGRESS UPDATE

The design process for services (power, water, sewer) to the site is ongoing with the relevant authorities. As reported in the December Topics, the Tambellup Community Cropping Group has donated two cabins to be installed at the caravan park. The order and delivery of these will coincide with completion of the civil works.

While Stage 1 is projected to be completed by December 2024, it is pleasing for the interim to see so many visitors are currently taking advantage of the 48-hour free rest stop on the former bowling club carpark to break their trip and explore our part of the world!







Gastroenteritis 'gastro'

Gastroenteritis is a common condition that affects the <u>gut</u> (the stomach and intestines) and is often highly infectious. It is also known as 'gastro'.Gastro is triggered by infection that causes inflammation of the lining of the digestive system. It can cause vomiting, diarrhoea, stomach pain and nausea. Gastro is not usually serious, but it can lead to dehydration. Milder forms can be managed at home by drinking fluids. However, older people, young children and those with a weakened immune system are at risk of developing more serious illnesses.

- Gastroenteritis ('gastro') is a common and often highly infectious condition that affects the stomach and intestines. It can cause vomiting and diarrhoea.
- · Babies under 6 months should always be seen by a doctor if they have gastro.
- · Gastroenteritis is treated by drinking fluids and doesn't usually require medication.
- Reduce your risk of catching or spreading gastro by washing your hands well after using the bathroom, changing nappies or handling food.
- Children should not return to school and adults should not return to work until 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea and/or vomiting.






