The next Ordinary Council Meeting will be held on Thursday 20 June 2024 commencing at 4.30pm, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- The Council endorsed the Bushfire Risk Management Plan. The plan provides information that informs a structured approach to identifying, assessing, prioritising, monitoring, and treating bushfire risk. Once adopted the Shire is eligible for funding to implement activities that assist to address the risk. These activities will be developed in consultation with our Bush Fire Brigades, landowners, and other stakeholders.
- Requests from A Smart Start Great Southern and the Tambellup Community Resource Centre for financial assistance for program delivery were supported.

Thank you to all those appointed for your commitment to fire safety in our community.

- The Council supported a request from a resident for a new streetlight to be installed at the Journal /India St intersection.
- A revised design for streetscaping of Crowden St was endorsed by the Council. The amended design incorporates trees planted in nibs at the road edge, as opposed to in the centre of the road as proposed at the December 2023 Council meeting. Works are scheduled to commence in July.
- Advertising was undertaken recently for an independent community member to be appointed to the Shire's Audit and Risk Committee. The Council was pleased to endorse the nomination of Connie Witham to the position. We thank Connie for her willingness to assist.

TAMBELLUP CARAVAN PARK PROGRESS

The design for connection of services and site works is almost complete. Once these plans have been approved, costed, and endorsed by the Council, the Shire will be required to advertise this component for tender, and subsequently the commencement of works.

The construction of the Caravan Park is one of the Shire's highest priorities and we are still focussed on delivery of the first two cabins this year. Watch this space!

INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRESS

The warm, dry weather experienced through May hasn't been ideal for our farming community, however it has allowed us to resolve some outstanding road issues. The replacement of the culvert on Greenhills South Rd has been completed, with contractors doing a great job. Repairs to pavement failures on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road, Broomehill-Kojonup Rd have been completed and temporary repairs to failures on Tambellup West Road have been made. An engineer's report for the entire length of Tambellup West Road has been received and this will inform the extent of works required to be completed to fully resolve the issues.

The replacement of the roof on the Tambellup Hall and Lesser Hall was completed during May. Touch up painting to downpipes and the trim to match the roof will be completed in coming weeks.

The progress of maintenance grading around the Shire has slowed over the past couple of months due to construction works taking precedence. We are looking forward to having both maintenance graders back in action this month.

The lack of rain through autumn has impacted dam levels significantly, and our parks and gardens team is working hard to ensure our facilities can be maintained in a good condition until it does rain. The maintenance of reticulation systems is a priority, making sure the available water is used effectively.

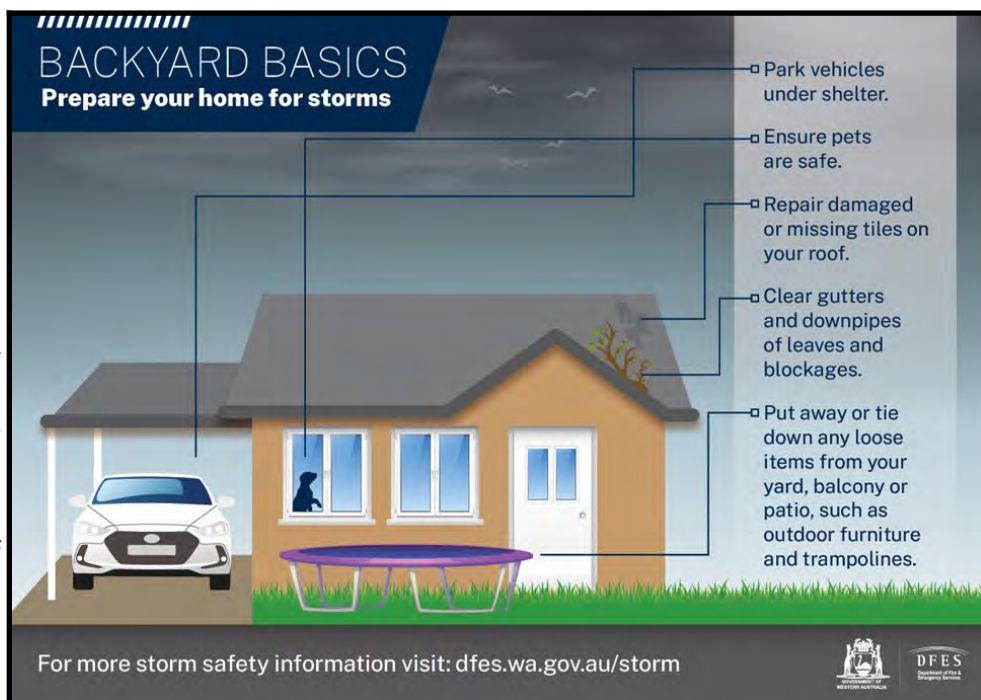

We also extend our congratulations to the Tambellup Community Resource Centre, on hosting one of the few Taste Great Southern events to be held in the northern part of the region. Chef Guy Jefferys from Kitchen Community took those in attendance on a journey through his philosophies on creating food with a sense of time and place, and prepared some fantastic dishes which were accompanied by local cheeses, wines and chocolates.

Chocolate Self-Saucing Pudding Recipe

Here is the recipe that Mel used at the May Soup and Sweets for those who were interested -

Prep **05m** | Cook **40m** | Serves **8**

Ingredients (8)

- Melted dairy spread, to grease
- 150g (1 cup) self-raising flour
- 240g (1 1/2 cups, lightly packed) brown sugar
- 50g (1/2 cup) cocoa powder
- 125ml (1/2 cup) skim milk
- 40g reduced-fat dairy spread, melted
- 500ml (2 cups) boiling water
- Reduced-fat ice-cream, to serve

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 180°C. Brush a 1.5L (6-cup) capacity ovenproof dish with Melted dairy spread, to grease to lightly grease.

Step 2

Combine the 150g (1 cup) self-raising flour, half the 240g (1 1/2 cups, lightly packed) brown sugar and half the 50g (1/2 cup) cocoa powder in a medium bowl. Add the 125ml (1/2 cup) skim milk and 40g reduced-fat dairy spread, melted and stir until well combined. Pour into the prepared dish.

Step 3

Sift the remaining sugar and cocoa into a bowl. Sprinkle pudding with sugar mixture. Gently pour in boiling 500ml (2 cups) boiling water.

Step 4

Bake in oven for 35-40 minutes or until a cake-like top forms and a skewer inserted halfway into the centre comes out clean. Remove from oven and set aside for 5 minutes to cool slightly. Serve immediately with Reduced-fat ice-cream, to serve.

The Lions Cancer Institute (LCI) will be providing a free Skin Cancer Screening in **Tambellup** on **Sunday 16th June 2024**. This free service provides for the early detection of skin lesions and where a lesion is identified a referral is made to your GP for further investigation. The LCI is a project of the Lions Clubs of Western Australia. Since early 1990's LCI has been providing full body skin screening clinics throughout Western Australia, with an emphasis on Screening the remote and rural areas of the state.

From humble beginnings the Volunteers of LCI have screened over 80 000 patients and our records show that with the annual rate of referrals to a GP is in the order of 27% (21,600) and lesions suspected of being life threatening are at 6% (1260). Early detection of lesions will save lives and lessen the need for invasive surgery.

LCI's screening program is supported by qualified volunteer Dermatologists, Plastic Surgeons, Dermoscopists and GP's.

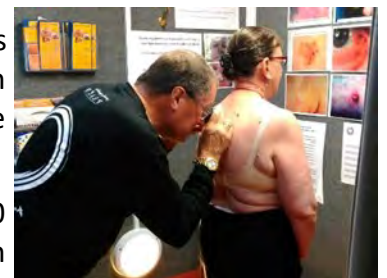

Labor's live export betrayal will not be forgotten at the ballot box

The Federal Labor Government has finally announced their impending sentence for WA's live sheep export industry.

In just four short years, an industry worth \$100 million will be heartlessly ripped from regional WA, leaving farming families, transporters, livestock agents, feed suppliers, wool buyers, livestock vets, and regional communities in dire straits.

Make no mistake, this decision will have lasting ramifications across regional WA, and despite the Premier's rhetoric, the impacts of this decision are already being felt.

And it has already become abundantly clear the \$107 million promised support package will not meet the current and future needs of the industry in WA, with just \$64 million set aside for sheep producers, the supply chain, and regional communities.

The remaining 40 per cent of the support package is existing Federal funding for ongoing programs like Austrade, rural counselling, and "funding to review the standards and guidelines for land transport of sheep."

This last remark is particularly ominous for WA and suggests Federal Labor will not only be content with banning the live shipping trade but is also clearly considering making changes to the transport of sheep to the Eastern states – the last market left available to WA producers doing it tougher than ever.

Anthony Albanese, Federal Agriculture Minister Murray Watt, and the Federal Labor Party have utterly sold out regional WA in exchange for shoring up support in inner-city electorates where they are increasingly struggling to remain relevant.

And the abject betrayal that has emerged from this decision – that an entire industry was traded to secure a sneaky backroom preference deal with the Animal Justice Party – truly demonstrates Labor has turned its back on the agriculture sector.

The same Animal Justice Party who boasts they will come for the live cattle export industry next, want to ban the use of 1080 baiting to stop feral foxes, ban the shooting of pest animals, and end horse and greyhound racing.

This fringe political party and their radical ideology saw them attract just 0.6 per cent of the vote at the last Federal election – yet even those slim pickings have proved irresistible to a desperate Labor Party.

Meanwhile, the hard working farming families and the agricultural communities and industries, which generate hundreds of millions of dollars for Australia's economy, and which employs thousands of regional Australians has been left devastated.

Since the Federal Labor Government announced their intention to ban live export in 2011, The Nationals WA have been proudly standing alongside the industry.

We have been calling for Labor to rethink their decision, to put sense before ideology, and to put the livelihoods of regional families, businesses and communities ahead of a few votes from radical activists.

The Federal Government have been emboldened by the support they receive from their WA Labor counterparts. Premier Roger Cook and his Agriculture Minister Jackie Jarvis have been complicit through their complacency.

While the WA Labor Government may claim they have been advocating for the industry, this is nothing but a lie.

This week, following the Federal Government's betrayal of WA, agricultural organisations lined up to condemn Federal Minister Murray Watt.

Yet when I asked Premier Roger Cook if he would do the same, he instead told State Parliament: *"We know that Murray Watt has the best interests of the industry at heart."*

For more than a decade, since the Federal Government announced their intention to ban live export back in 2011, WA Labor has sat silent.

Now, when we are literally playing for sheep stations and support is needed more than ever. The Premier has lost his spine and lined up behind his Federal colleagues.

Freedom of Information Requests made by The Nationals exposed there was absolutely no communication between the offices of the Premier,

our State Agriculture Minister and the Federal Agriculture Minister Murray Watt during a crucial decision making period last year.

No letters, no emails, no phone-calls, not even a text message. It is a complete and utter disgrace.

But our State Labor Government didn't just sit their silent, they laughed in the face of the industry.

When the Nationals asked questions in Parliament, Labor members responded by making animal noises and loudly bleating across the chamber.

And on the eve of the Federal Government's announcement of the live export ban, WA Labor Party MPs released a committee report exposing their anti-agricultural agenda.

A report into alternative proteins lambasted WA's livestock industry, pointing the finger at agriculture as the source of all our worldly problems – from cancer to climate change, and even drawing links between eating meat and toxic masculinity.

While the report could be dismissed as ideological drivel, it also offers a terrifying insight into the true values of the WA Labor Government.

A Labor Party who are utterly opposed to agriculture,

in any shape or form, and who are totally disconnected from regional WA and reality.

Next year, WA voters will have a chance to send a signal to the Labor Party, with State and Federal elections set to occur in 2025.

WA farmers, regional communities, and the hardworking men and women involved right across the supply chain will have their opportunity to vote for their future State and Federal Governments.

I am certain Labor's betrayal of regional WA and our agricultural sector will not be forgotten at the ballot box.

Project Update – May 2024

Commissioning Activities

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 (FRWF1) project is in the last stage of commissioning, with all the Wind Turbine Generators (WTG) currently able to generate. The Noise Monitoring Campaign is ongoing in accordance with the approved Noise Impact Monitoring Management Plan (NIMMP) and it is expected to be completed in the month of June, after which the results will be submitted to the relevant authorities.

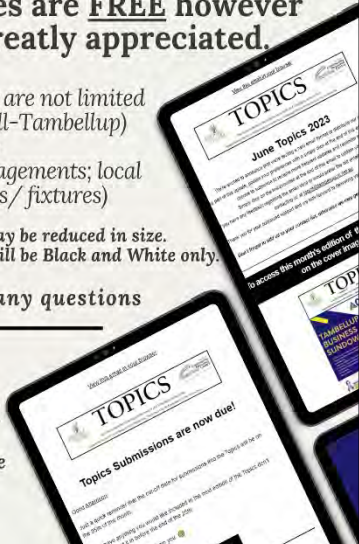

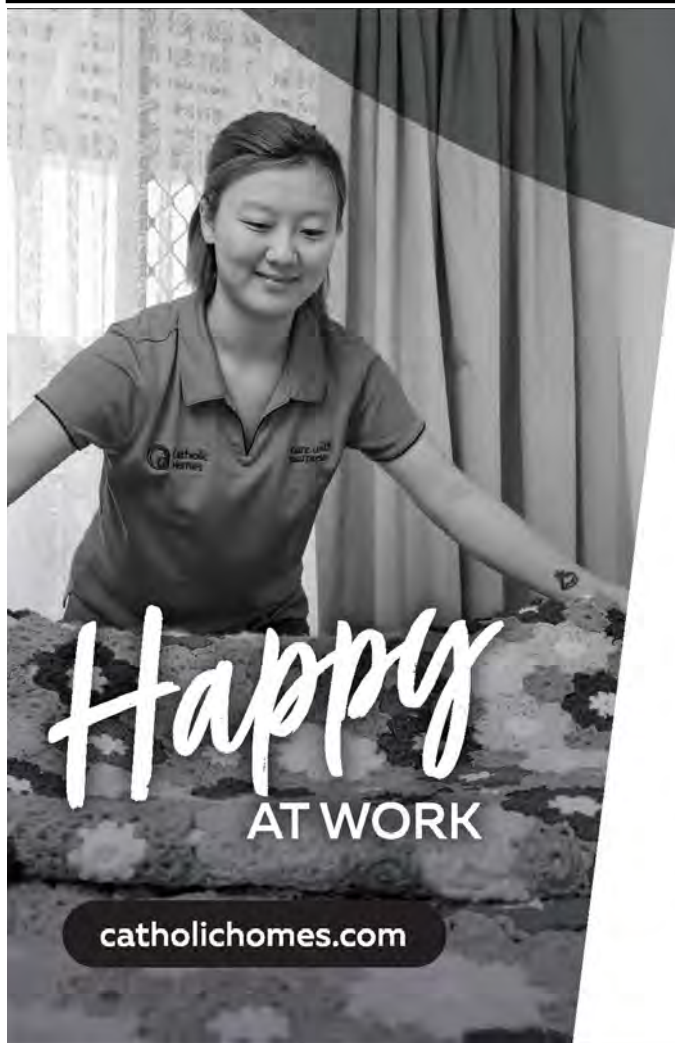

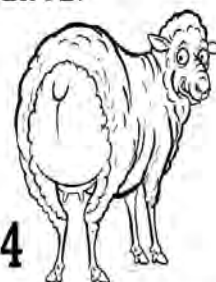
