The next Ordinary Council Meeting will be held on <u>Thursday 25 July 2024 commencing at 4.30pm</u>, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

A small agenda was presented to the Council for consideration at the June 2024 Ordinary Council Meeting.

- The planning application for the development of short-term accommodation for the Tambellup Caravan Park was considered. Public comment on the proposal is sought, closing 10 July 2024. More information is available in this edition of Topics, and on the Shire's website at www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under 'Public Notices'.
- The Council was pleased to support a request from the Broomehill Playgroup for a financial contribution towards the installation of an air conditioner at the Playgroup building.
- In response to the federal Minister for Agriculture's introduction of the Export Control Amendment (Ending Live Sheep Exports by Sea) Bill 2024, the Council have unanimously voted to oppose the federal government's plan to end live sheep exports by 1 May 2028. More information, including the Shire's media release, and links to an economic impact assessment report and the submission provided to the Standing Committee for the Inquiry into the Bill, is available at www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under 'Public Notices'.

TAMBELLUP CARAVAN PARK PROGRESS

The planning application relating to the development of the Caravan Park is out for public comment until 10 July 2024. We are currently working with suppliers and the Council to finalise the cabin design and procurement, and to have at least two cabins on site by the end of the year. Watch this space!

TAMBELLUP COMMUNITY PAVILION – SOLAR PANELS COMPLETE

Another step along the road to sustainability has seen a solar system installed at the Tambellup Community Pavilion recently. It is anticipated that the new 26 kilowatt system comprising 64 solar panels on the roof of the facility will reduce the power bill by around 50% while also offsetting around 34 tonnes of carbon emissions each year.

We thank Enel Green Power Australia for their support of this project.

MOSQUITO MANAGEMENT

It's rained a little, and even the smallest amount of pooled water provides a breeding ground for mosquitoes. To get ahead of the game this year, here's a few tips to eliminate mosquito breeding areas:

- Remove any stagnant water around the house, sheds and yards so mosquitoes cannot breed.
- Change water in pet drinking bowls and birdbaths at least once a week, more so in warmer weather.
- Check rainwater tanks to ensure screens and lids are intact. This limits mosquito entry.
- Clean gutters and drains, so water can run freely.
- Cover trailers and boats. Turn wheelbarrows and kids toys over, to avoid water pooling.
- Keep gardens and lawns trimmed to reduce areas for mosquitoes to rest.
- If areas of driveways and yard have capacity to hold water, fill these with sand. Mosquitoes can breed in the tiniest pool of water.

Dogs off Lead Fact Sheet





What are the legal responsibilities for dog owners?

In Western Australia, the *Dog Act 1976* administers dog owners legal obligations when it comes to the control of dogs. Walking your dog in public is outlined in Section 31 of the *Dog Act 1976*. This section defines:

- That all dogs must be walked on a lead when in a public place (approved dog exercise areas are exempt)
- That a person must be capable of controlling the dog being walked
- That the dog's lead does not exceed a length of 2 meters

Where can I walk my dog off lead?

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup does not currently have any designated off leash areas as prescribed under the *Dog Act 1976*.

However, dogs can still be walked off leash outside of the gazetted townsites (prescribed rural leashing areas exempt).

For more information on dog control requirements, exemptions and information on exercise areas, please contact the Shire Ranger on 9825 3555.

My dog is well behaved off lead. Do I still have to comply?

A common response to Rangers when speaking to dog owners walking their dog off lead is 'My dog doesn't leave me, he knows how to walk off lead'.

This can be similar to saying 'I'm a good driver, I don't need to wear my seatbelt'. Despite any training your dog may have, it is still a legal requirement to walk your dog on lead in public.

Having your dog on a lead can also protect them from a variety of different scenarios, such as a driver not paying attention or other roaming dogs. Other people walking near you may be afraid of dogs, and do not wish for your dog to say hello to them.

A lead is considered as your dogs 'lifeline', keeping them safe and with you at all times.

These laws are designed to protect dog owners, dogs, other animals and members of the public.

What are the penalties if I do not comply?

Owners can be issued with an on-thespot fine of \$200 or face a maximum penalty of \$5,000 for walking their dog off lead in public.

Straying Stock Fact Sheet





Overview

Straying stock refers to farm animals that wander away from their designated areas; such as paddocks or yards, and onto roads or other public areas. This poses a significant risk to both the livestock and the public, particularly drivers.

What are the dangers?

- Traffic Accidents: Livestock on roads can cause serious accidents. Drivers may not see the animals in time to stop or swerve, leading to collisions.
- Damages: In addition to damage to vehicles if struck, roaming livestock can also damage neighbouring fences or crops when straying into other properties.
- Financial Loss: Farmers can face financial losses due to the death or injury of livestock and potential liability of accidents caused by their animals.

What are the legal implications?

Under Section 484 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960, it is an offence for an owner of livestock to permit their stock to stray. This can incur an on-the-spot fine of \$200.00 per head.

Under the Highways (Liability for Straying Animals) Act 1983 livestock owners may find themselves liable for any injuries, deaths and damages caused by their straying livestock.

Why do livestock stray?

- Inadequate Fencing: Poorly maintained or insufficient fencing can allow stock to escape easily.
- Broken Gates: Gates left open or damaged can provide an exit for stock.
- Natural Curiosity: Livestock may wander in search for food, water or mates
- Predators: Livestock may break through fencing if threatened by natural predators, such as dogs.
- Weather Events: Storms and other natural events can damage fencing, allowing livestock to stray.

As a livestock owner, what are my responsibilities?

- Regular Maintenance: Regularly inspect and repair fencing and gates to ensure they are secure.
- Perimeter Checks: Conduct routine checks of the properties perimeter to identify and issues and weak points.
- Grazing Movement: Rotate grazing areas and provide adequate resources within enclosures to minimise the desire for livestock to roam
- Compliant Fencing: All properties in the Shire must comply with the Shire of Broomehill Tambellup Fencing Local Law 2020. This local law defines minimum standards of boundary fencing depending on the properties zoning.
