#### CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

Please note the Shire offices will close at 12 noon on Tuesday 24 December 2024 and reopen at 9.00am on Monday 6 January 2025. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period. A skeleton Works team will remain to attend urgent matters over the Christmas/New Year period.

Visitors to the Broomehill Library are encouraged to consider their holiday reading needs and call in early!

#### **RUBBISH COLLECTION - NO CHANGE**

The kerbside rubbish and recycling collection will be conducted on Thursday 26 December as normal. It would be appreciated if bins could be out early, as the collection may be a little quicker than normal. Please note the Waste Transfer Stations in Broomehill and Tambellup will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

#### HARVESTING OVER CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR

- Christmas Day harvesting and the carting of grain is PROHIBITED
- Boxing Day a Harvest-only ban is automatically imposed.

These measures do not restrict the movement of vehicles across paddocks, however, if it is determined that weather conditions on Christmas Day or Boxing Day will be hazardous, a Harvest and Movement of Vehicles Ban may be imposed. The next Ordinary Council Meeting will be held on Thursday 19 December 2024 commencing at 4.30pm, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Please note this date has changed. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

It's been a busy few weeks in the Shire, with several projects completed.



In Tambellup, shade sails have been installed in Diprose Park over the junior play area, just in time for summer.



The new retaining wall at the Broomehill Recreational Complex in front of the Cricket Pavilion has been completed and new grass will be laid shortly.



New speed indicator signs have been installed on Great Southern Highway Broomehill and Tambellup. The smiley face that these signs display reinforces positive driver behaviour, reminding drivers to slow down as they pass through our towns. This in turn increases safety for pedestrians and other road users.



The tender for site works and connection of services to the Tambellup Caravan Park site has been advertised, closing 13 December 2024. We anticipate these works

will commence during mid to late January. In the meantime, demolition works to remove asbestos from the former bowling club building have been completed. The Shire will carry out the remaining demolition works in coming weeks, along with removal of the trees on the former 48-hour rest stop site.

Maintenance grading is progressing, with most of the unsealed roads in the Shire having had at least one grade. The recent rain, while not particularly welcomed by our farming community, provided ideal conditions for grading. Bitumen repairs have been completed on Tieline Rd.

The parks and gardens team has commenced mowing of Unallocated Crown Land blocks to reduce the fire hazard in the townsites. This work is funded by the Department of Fire & Emergency Services. We also welcome our newest employee, Levi Palmer, who joined the parks and gardens team early in November.

#### SAVING THE PLANET - ONE DEVICE AT A TIME!

Thanks to the support of Warren Blackwood Waste, we

are now able to accept e-waste for recycling at the Broomehill and Tambellup Waste Transfer Stations. Specially designated bins have been provided for this purpose – so now's the time to clear out all those superseded computers and devices, old printers, monitors, LED and LCD televisions, VCR and DVD machines, fax machines, telephones, data storage devices, and computer accessories! Batteries related to these devices will also be accepted.

#### WEST BROOMEHILL POSTIE RUN GEOCACHE TRAIL

We are excited to announce the launch of the West Broomehill Postie Run Geocache Trail!

'What???' you may ask? At its most basic, geocaching is a treasure hunt — on a huge scale! Geocaching is an outdoor recreational activity, in which participants use a Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver or mobile device and other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers, called geocaches or caches, at specific locations marked by coordinates all over the world. The first geocache was placed in 2000, and by 2023 there were over 3 million active caches worldwide.

Geocaches have been located at sites in the Shire for many years, but a long-term project to capture and interpret the history of the West Broomehill Postie Run has provided an opportunity for the Shire to combine new-age technology, outdoor recreation, trails and our heritage in one neat package (or 23 tiny packages to be precise!) that is the West Broomehill Postie Run Geocache Trail.

The West Broomehill Postie Run has been in active operation for over 100 years. The geocache trail tells the stories of the families, communities, business and farming from the early days of Eticup and then the Broomehill community.

#### **TOTAL FIRE BANS**



A Total Fire Ban (TFB) is declared on days when fires are most likely to threaten lives and property. This is because of predicted extreme fire weather or when there are already widespread fires and firefighting resources are stretched.

On a Total Fire Ban

Day, it is illegal to light an open-air fire or conduct any activity that could start a fire.

## Who we are

The Tambellup Community Cropping Group was formed in 2013 with the goal of supporting and strengthening the Tambellup community. Made up of a committed group of local volunteers, the organisation sees individuals come together each year to establish and manage a crop, with backing from local businesses. The profits generated from the crop are reinvested directly back into the community, funding projects that are developed and led by the people of Tambellup.

# Reflecting on the past

Between 2017 and 2023, a range of community-focused projects in Tambellup have received funding and support from the Tambellup Community Cropping Group. Notable contributions included a startup donation of \$5,000 to the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association (TCPA) in June 2017, followed by several other grants for the pavilion's development, including \$15,528 from Sheep Drive funds and \$50,000 to

support the fitout of the pavilion. Other organisations supported during this period include the Tambellup Golf Club, which received \$10,000 for ceiling funding and the Tambellup Co-op, which was granted \$50,000 for shares. In 2020, the Country Women's Association (CWA) was awarded \$5,000 for roof funding, while TCPA also received \$10,000 for playground development. In 2023, \$4,400 was put toward two defibrillators, and the Gillamii Centre received two separate \$1,100 donations for the Barna Mia School Camp.

# Looking to the future

This year has been no different, with over \$615,000 of crop income reinvested into community initiatives and assets. The TCCG extends its thanks to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for agreeing to defer the purchase of two cabins for the Tambellup Caravan Park to the 2024-25 financial year, enabling the valuable projects outlined on the next page to receive the necessary support this year.





# COMMUNITY, CARBON & CONSERVATION PROJECT WRAP UP

# Understanding & Learning

PROJECT REVIEW & FIELD WALK

Since its inception, the Community, Carbon & Key insights Conservation project has been focused on empowering farmers to take leadership roles in their own carbon farming initiatives. Both Gillamii and North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources (NSPNR) recognised the importance of understanding each landholder's experiences, insights, and learnings before the conclusion of the 3-year State NRM funding, which supported project development, protective fencing, and community education. As the project moves forward, it will continue for another 27 years through a private partnership between Native Carbon and each landholder.

The first three years of the biodiverse carbon revegetation project involved site and wholefarm redesign, securing regulatory approvals, establishing biodiverse revegetation, erecting protective fencing, and conducting community education. The project balanced the complexities of setting up a carbon farming venture-such as family succession, project registration, and discussions with agribusiness lenders-with the practical tasks of establishing and protecting revegetation. Early on, it became clear that no two farming enterprises are the same, and this diversity had to be acknowledged and respected at every stage of development. For this reason, Gillamii and NSPNR prioritised understanding each landholder's journey during the first three years, identifying successes, challenges, and areas where further support was needed. This was achieved through on-farm visits, site reviews, and informal interviews with landholders.

Key motivations for participating in the project were not solely centred on generating ACCUs, but rather on enhancing aesthetics, protecting special areas, and increasing native birdlife. Key challenges included establishing the revegetation, sourcing contractors (e.g., fencing), and managing the increased workload. Concerns raised by landholders included plant density for carbon reporting in less successful areas, ongoing pest and weed management, and the potential risk of plantation loss due to factors like waterlogging or fire. The most beneficial outcomes so far have been the beautification of marginal areas, the return of birdlife, improved salinity management, and the support provided to initiate large-scale revegetation and fencing efforts. Further support was requested to better understand project reporting, particularly how ACCUs are generated and accessed by individual landholders, whether for sale or for use within their own operations.

## Where to next

The Community, Carbon & Conservation project marked the first carbon farming collaboration for Gillamii, NSPNR, and the six participating farming families. Unlike traditional landcare plantings, the project sites have a formal 27year lifespan, with each landholder partnering with Native Carbon Pty Ltd, and the first carbon reporting period set for 2026. During informal interviews, landholders expressed an interest in exploring future carbon or emission reduction projects within their operations but were keen to see the current project achieve its carbon and biodiversity goals first.

This initiative has provided Gillamii and NSPNR with valuable insights into the complexities of developing, establishing, and managing carbon farming projects. It highlighted both the opportunities and risks of privatised environmental projects for farming families and the agricultural industry. Whether in carbon farming, natural capital, or renewable energy, these emerging fields offer different pathways for landholders as the industry undergoes its transition.

The key takeaway from this project is the need for centralised, neutral, and publicly accessible support for the agricultural sector as the Australian Government moves forward with its Net Zero Plan and associated targets. This support should be available at the farm level and address complex factors such as rural community longevity, succession planning, and catchment management. Recognising this need, Gillamii and NSPNR will focus future efforts on information extension, support services, and education, rather than directly delivering on-the-ground carbon projects. We believe our role is best suited to helping landholders navigate and implement their own private projects.

#### **KEY LEARNINGS**

MLA PDS PROJECT L.PDS.2203

Producer Demonstration Site (PDS) A 1 & 2 are part of six demonstration sites involved in Gillamii's current MLA Project, "Productive Saltland Pastures for Southern WA." The objective of this PDS Project is to enhance members' knowledge and skills in establishing, managing, and understanding the benefits—such as profitability, productivity, and sustainability—of salt-tolerant forage systems on land moderately affected by salinity.

On September 12, 2024, both sites were established after applying Glyphosate at a rate of 2L/ha. Site 1 was direct seeded with a mix including Chicory (3kg/ha), Cocksfoot (2kg/ha), Panic (3kg/ha), Tall Wheat Grass (10kg/ha), Balansa Clover (3kg/ha), and Puccinellia (2kg/ha). Site 2 featured an understory of Tall Wheat Grass (10kg/ha) and Puccinellia (2kg/ha), along with a saltbush seed mix direct seeded in dual alleys using a Niche Seeder.

Seeding of the saltbush alleys took place on September 12 and 17, following 24.4mm of rain at the site during that time. The sites were then left to establish, with grazing deferred for at least six months.

However, a challenging summerautumn period in the region, along with several contributing factors, resulted in the unsuccessful establishment of both PDS 1 and 2. On April 12, 2024, both sites were inspected in preparation for the annual summer-autumn biomass and nutritional sampling, but sampling could not be conducted due to the absence of established pasture and fodder species, as well as a high percentage of bare ground. After reviewing the sites and discussing with the Project's core producers, we identified multiple factors that affected the establishment, particularly at site 2, with minimal saltbush germination.

#### SITE PREPERATION



Ideally, a scarifier should have been used (instead, a knife point seeder was employed), along with an additional spray to further clear the site before seeding. This would have helped reduce competition and allowed the niche seeder to effectively create mounds.

#### INSECT CONTROL



Insect activity and damage was observed on the 12th October, predominantly at Site 2, 1 month after establishment. Ideally, an insect spray should of been conducted.

#### SPECIES ESTABLISHMENT



Species establishment would likely have fared better with the absence of summer rains if they had been properly established, but many pasture sites in the region that were established late in 2023 experienced similar issues. Site 1 was grazed during the first spring-summer period, which ideally should have been avoided, to allow the pastures to adequately establish.

#### SUMMARY

The successful establishment of saltland pastures in the Great Southern depends on various factors, some of which we can manage and others we cannot. Essential elements include effective site design, preparation, and environmental conditions like rainfall, weed competition, and insect pressures. Although the summer-autumn period of 2023-34 was challenging for many perennial sites in the region, improved site preparation and management could have improved the establishment chances for PDS A 1 & 2. Revitalizing marginal land is labor-intensive and costly, so it should receive inputs comparable to those for annual crops and pastures, especially since successful establishment can lead to 5-30 years of grazing value. There is hope that Site 1 may have regenerated this winter-spring period if weed competition is minimal and grazing is minimized. Monitoring will occur again in March 2025 to determine whether either site can be used as is or if reseeding is needed.


