STAFF MOVEMENTS

We recently farewelled mechanical apprentice Braydon Baynes who left the Shire early in January. Braydon has transferred his apprenticeship to a new employer in Albany, and we wish him well. In the same week, we welcomed Rebecca Crosby to the Administration team. Rebecca has been appointed to the Rates/Finance Officer position and has quickly adapted to her new role. Welcome Bec!

Ricky Riley has taken a period of leave from his position of Construction Team Leader, and Steve Ryan and Darryl Pickett will share this position in the interim until staffing requirements have been determined. Thanks Steve and Darryl for your willingness to step up.

FEBRUARY 2020

FROM THE DECEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

Council resolved to establish a short term lending facility through the WA Treasury to assist with cash flow pending receipt of milestone funding for the Great Southern Housing Initiative.

Council considered designs and plans for the display of memorabilia at the Tambellup Community Pavilion, and supported the implementation of the project by the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association, subject to there being no major changes to the designs and plans submitted.

WORKS

The majority of the works crew took the opportunity over December and January to take annual leave, with a small crew left on duty to man the fort. Watering was a priority, and some extreme temperatures over the Christmas period put some areas of parks and gardens under stress. Some remediation work to the ovals and lawn areas will be completed in coming weeks.

Prior to the Christmas break, a number of jobs were completed, including cement stabilising of a 2km section of Pallinup Road, and sealing of sections and patches of Flat Rocks Road, Broomehill-Kojonup Road, Maguire Road, Tie Line Road and Morgan Road. With the housing project ongoing, sand, gravel and other building materials have been delivered to the various sites as required, including 1800m3 of sand to the Broomehill independent Living Units. The construction crew has now moved across to Toolbrunup Rd, where clearing and stabilisation of patches is being completed in preparation for resealing later in the year.

The parks and gardens crew (and our townsites) will benefit from the completion of a new greenhouse at the Tambellup depot, which was constructed by Sammy Oclarit and Braydon Baynes in between mechanical tasks. The greenhouse has been fitted with reticulation to ensure plants on hand are able to be maintained in the best condition prior to planting out.

Police investigated a number of incidents of vandalism late last year, with graffiti occurring at the public toilets on Norrish St and at Diprose Park. CCTV footage was provided to Police who were able to identify and charge the offenders.

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

We are pleased to report that two houses in Tambellup are complete and have been handed over from the builder to the Shire. Lot 384 Parnell St has an impressive façade that spans the width of the lot, with plenty of living space, easy care gardens front and rear, and a family sized area of lawn. This home will be leased to the Department of Communities for government employee housing, and we are certain future tenants will enjoy living there.

17 Taylor St has also been handed over to the Shire. This home is designated shire staff housing, and also incorporates plenty of living space, low maintenance landscaping to front and rear, and an environmentally sensitive design. We congratulate the builder, RM Smith and Sons, on a quality construction.

The remaining two houses in Tambellup and two in Broomehill are nearing completion and are a credit to the contractors and their trades.


The Independent Living Units in Broomehill are virtually complete, with landscaping and paving being completed at the moment. We anticipate handover by the end of January, and again, congratulate the contractor on their work.

The final part of the project for Broomehill-Tambellup is the construction of two cabins at the Broomehill Caravan Park, for short term accommodation. The tender for this project was advertised through December and closed on 23 January, and we anticipate it will be awarded early in February.

With completion of the units now on the near horizon, we are again calling for expressions of interest from any senior who may be interested in renting a unit. Two of the units comprise 2 bedroom/2 bathroom, and the other two comprise 2 bedroom/1 bathroom/2 toilets and a hobby room. Each unit will have a secure private courtyard area and vehicle parking, and will be set within landscaped gardens. PROHIBITED AND RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED burning period** ends on **14 FEBRUARY 2020**. No burning is permitted until this date. Please note seasonal conditions may see this date extended – more information will be made available if this is the case.

From **15 FEBRUARY 2020** until **15 APRIL 2020** we will be in the **RESTRICTED burning period**. During this period you are required to obtain a permit before lighting any fires, and all conditions on the permit must be complied with. The lighting of fires is **prohibited** over the Easter weekend.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Summer is here, harvest is underway, and a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- **Harvest Ban Hotline phone 98251042**. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- **Radio broadcasts** ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.

Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer – contact details are noted above.

And if all else fails – make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated! EMERGENCY WA

Emergency WA (<u>www.emergency.wa.gov.au</u>) is the State's official website for community warnings and other emergency management information for bushfires, storms, cyclones, floods and other emergency situations. The site provides real time updates on emergency warnings and incidents across the state, as well as information on preparing and recovering from and emergency situation. One to bookmark!



Tambellup Police wish everyone a belated Happy New Year as we head into 2020 with a positive outlook and energised approach. We hope that 2020 is a better year for Tambellup than what 2019 was.

Toward the end of last year we preferred the following charges -

Male juvenile - 2 x Trespass, 1 x Stealing, 4 x Criminal Damage

Adult female – 1 x No Authority to Drive

All of the juvenile charges stated relate to property damage offences in Tambellup. As previously stated this type of behaviour is completely unacceptable and will be fully dealt with by police at every opportunity. We again request all members of the community, whether in Tambellup Broomehill or those residing on farms, to take all reasonable steps to secure and protect your assets, as it is better to prevent than respond.

Firearm theft continues to be a high priority for WA Police as instances continue to rise. Firearms are a very sought-after commodity for drug dealers and criminals more broadly, who easily exchange them for cash and or drugs. Random firearm cabinet checks will occur in February so we ask that you ensure your cabinets comply with the Firearm Regulations. It is all good and well to have your cabinet compliant, however if your house or shed is poorly secured in the first instance allowing easy access to the cabinets, then it may be all for nothing. Criminals seem to be bolder and more desperate than ever in their efforts to steal firearms. One recent instance in mid-January was where an offender used an angle grinder at night in a built-up area in Boddington attempting to steal firearms. Fortunately, a neighbour knowing that the residents were away quickly called police who attended and scared the offender before they were successful in their attempt. Unfortunately, the offender quickly fled and was not captured. Rarely are stolen firearms recovered by police as they're traded very quickly.

Police again request anyone with information about the sale or supply of prohibited drugs to contact us, or to call Crime Stoppers to remain anonymous. We will act; however we need satisfactory and specific information. Rumours and ineendo don't give us grounds to execute a search warrant for example, and to be honest that's probably a good thing.

At the time of writing this a serious crash is unfolding in Changerup (near Kojonup). I don't know the circumstances or causal factors of the crash, but I'm listening to the radio communication and know that at least one person has lost their life. I will never stop reminding everyone just how important it is to drive safely, respecting your passengers and other road users. Sadly, the most dangerous place to be is on the road, and it is incumbent on all of us to do the right thing. Police will be organising a Blue Light Disco for the youth in February so watch this space.



CELEBRATING OUR COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS!


International Thank a Volunteer Day is held on 5 December each year, with many organisations holding celebratory events on that day.




