FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING

Prior to the February Council meeting, a Citizenship Ceremony took place. Shire President Cr White conferred citizenship to Broomehill residents Michael and Kiri-Ana Gilfedder. It's always a pleasure to be part of these ceremonies, and we extend our congratulations to Mike and Kiri-Ana on this special occasion.

The February Council meeting provided an opportunity for the Council to review its Business Continuity Response Plan. This plan provides a framework that, when implemented, can help prevent, minimise and recover from disruption to the Shire's operations. A disruption can be a major emergency that impacts the community more broadly, e.g. fire, flood, pandemic, or more localised, such as an extended internet or



power outage. This type of planning has broad relevance to all businesses in the community. For more information about steps you can take to ensure your business continues to operate during outages, emergencies and natural disasters go to https://business.gov.au/guide/continuing-your-business.

The quarterly progress report for the Corporate Business Plan 2024-28 was received. The full status report can be viewed on the Shire's website at https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council/your-council/shire-plans.aspx under Corporate Business Plan 2024-2028.

The Annual Electors Meeting was held following the Ordinary Council Meeting. Thank you to those community members who took the time to attend. Matters raised included the hazard presented by grassy verges in the Broomehill townsite, and the Shire's ability to reduce red tape and minimise delays in processing planning, building and environmental health approvals. These matters have been taken on board for further consideration and action.

Copies are available for perusal at the Shire Administration Offices and Tambellup CRC. Documents are available in other formats on request, if required by people with disability.

The next Ordinary Council Meeting will be held on <u>Thursday 20 March 2025 commencing at 4.30pm</u>, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

EXTENSION OF THE PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

With conditions being extremely dry, the Prohibited Burning Period for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup has been extended by 14 days from 3 March 2025 until midnight on 17 March 2025 inclusive. No fires are to be lit during this period.

The **Restricted Burning Period** will commence on 18 March 2025 subject to seasonal conditions, and extends through to 15 April 2025 inclusive. During this period, you are required to obtain a permit to burn prior to lighting any fires.

Permit holders are urged to exercise extreme caution and comply with all conditions of the permit.

STAY PREPARED FOR THE REMAINING BUSHFIRE SEASON

The risk of bushfires remains significant, with hot, dry, and windy conditions expected over the next three months. It is essential to have a bushfire plan in place, along with maintaining fire breaks, trimming branches, and cleaning gutters.

Bushfires can start suddenly and without warning. To survive a bushfire, you must be ready to make your own decisions. The single biggest killer is indecision. It's important to understand your risks and plan what you'll do to keep safe when a bushfire threatens your life or home.

My Bushfire Plan https://mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au/ is a bushfire preparedness tool, providing you with one place to prepare, store, print, share, and update your bushfire plan any time, from any device.

If you live in a bushfire-prone area, you need to understand bushfire warnings before a fire threatens your home. There are three warning levels which move up and down to reflect the risk to your life or property.

NATIVE VEGETATION CLEARING

Native vegetation is protected under the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (Act). All clearing of native vegetation is prohibited unless a clearing permit is granted by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) or the clearing is for an exempt purpose, as defined under the Act or the *Environmental Protection (Clearing of Native Vegetation) Regulations 2004* (Clearing Regulations).

An application form must be submitted to the Shire for approval. Failure to seek approval in writing will result in the Shire reporting the unauthorised clearing to DWER and penalties may apply.

Clearing Permits

Clearing of native vegetation is illegal without an approved permit from DWER unless an exemption applies. Information about clearing permits and exemptions including the referrals process, public comments, environmentally sensitive areas, guidelines and more is available at https://www.wa.gov.au/service/environment/environment-information-services/native-vegetation-clearing-permits

Frequently Asked Questions

When do I need a clearing permit?

Before you commence filling out an application form for a clearing permit, you should check whether the clearing could be carried out under an exemption. Under the Act, clearing of native vegetation will require a permit from the DWER unless the clearing is for an exempt purpose. An exemption is a clearing activity you can undertake without a clearing permit.

Note that exemptions within the Clearing Regulations do not apply within environmentally sensitive areas as described in the *Environmental Protection (Environmentally Sensitive Areas) Notice 2005*.

There are a number of exemptions from the requirement for a clearing permit that apply to landholders for everyday activities. Please refer to the DWER publication 'A guide to the exemptions and regulations for clearing native vegetation'

If a valid exemption does not apply for the purpose of proposed clearing, a clearing permit is required.

Can I clear along a fence line on my property and/or on Crown land?

Item 10 of Regulation 5 of the Clearing Regulations provides an exemption for clearing along a fence line of, or within, a property to the width necessary to provide access to construct or maintain a fence, provided that the clearing, combined with other limited exempt clearing on the property, does not exceed 5 hectares in the financial year in which the clearing takes place.

This exemption applies to the owner of the property on which the clearing is to take place. Exemptions will not apply in environmentally sensitive areas, along waterways, or where known threatened flora or fauna habitat exists.

Item 11 of Regulation 5 of the Clearing Regulations provides an exemption for clearing between private property and Crown land (e.g. a road reserve), provided that the clearing on the Crown land is no more than 1.5 metres from the fence.

This exemption applies to the owner of the land on which the clearing is to take place, therefore the written approval of the owner of that Crown land (e.g. the local government authority in the case of a road reserve) must be obtained prior to undertaking the clearing.
