MOSQUITO SEASON

In Western Australia, mosquitoes can transmit Ross River virus, Barmah Forest virus and Kunjin virus, as well as the potentially fatal Murray Valley encephalitis and Japanese encephalitis viruses (JEV).

The most effective way to prevent infection is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

- **Cover Up** – wear long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can.
- **Repel** – apply an effective insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide), picaridin or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus (OLE, also known as PMD) evenly to exposed skin.
- **Clean Up** – remove, empty or cover water-holding containers. Keep your grass short to stop mosquitoes hanging around your home

As part of a broader management strategy, the Shire will be baiting stagnant pools of water around the townsites. For more information in this regard please contact the Shire.

Birt Family TA ANZAC Day Address given by Anne Birt

First, a little background on the Birt family. If you travel 19.5 kilometres out the Tambellup West Road, off to the right you'll see Birt Road. The farm on this corner was 'Borderdale', established by Charles and Rosalind Birt, my grandparents. Charles and Rosalind raised five children on 'Borderdale' – Barbara, James, Peter, June and Philip.

James, or Jim to Tambellup residents, was the first to enlist in the Royal Australian Air Force, in 1941. He was 19 years of age and had been working on 'Borderdale'. James commenced his training in 1941 at Pearce; however, he spent his first few months studying and filling sandbags and digging trenches! It was during this time that Japan entered the war, so sandbags and trenches were probably seen as essential.

Flying training for James commenced when he moved to No 9 Elementary Flying Training School RAAF Cunderdin in 1942. Records show that at that time there were 42 officers, 500 airmen and 51 aircraft stationed there. In late 1942 he moved to No 4 Service Flying Training School RAAF Geraldton. His early training was on Tiger Moth and Anson aircraft. He qualified at the end of 1942.

Dad told us of one of Uncle Jim's 'adventures' during training and I recently asked him to confirm: Was it true he'd "buzzed" Tambellup on a flight from Pearce to Albany? He explained that he had flown low over 'Borderdale' and, when he saw there was no car in garage, realised the family must be in town so he flew low and "buzzed" Tambellup. We're not sure who was most surprised, his flight crew, or the residents of Tambellup as a Beaufort Bomber flew low over the town. His flight crew may have been getting training in low level flying; however, it seems Grandpa was having to put all his diplomacy skills into action to stop one of the locals from reporting Uncle Jim. Uncle Jim also told me that on that trip the crew decided to see how high a Beaufort Bomber can fly before stalling or falling apart. The answer – 25,000 ft, or 7.6 kilometres!

While researching this talk, his son, John, told me another training story. While he was stationed at Pearce, the RAAF were looking for targets on which they could practice their bombing raids. A group of volunteers agreed to be a target, at Beaufort Inlet at the mouth of the Pallinup River. The bomber crews then dropped smoke and flour bombs on the volunteers. One of the volunteers they 'bombed' was his farming neighbour, Mick Hilder!

In 1943 he moved to airbases in Victoria to commence navigation training and continue bomber training. The Beaufort Bomber was an Australian built plane from a British design; a twin-engined torpedo bomber with a crew of initially three, then later modified for four. One of the training exercises they had was against a French destroyer in Jervis Bay, NSW. The destroyer had been removed from active service and was being used for torpedo practice. The destroyer was able to avoid all of Uncle Jim's torpedoes. He said he would stick to flying the plane and his crew could do the 'bombing'.

From there it was into active service in New Guinea where he joined No 100 RAAF Squadron, being first stationed at Milne

Bay and then Goodenough Island off the north east coast of the New Guinea mainland. Flying from bases in eastern New Guinea, No 100 Squadron flew reconnaissance patrols, convoy patrols and anti-shipping and bombing missions against the Japanese. His logbook shows 43 sorties with 9 strikes during 6 months in 1943. For the boy from Tambellup one of his strongest memories of Milne Bay is that it rained every afternoon and with mesh laid runways, there was nothing but mud!

Between 1944 and 1945 he moved between 14 Squadron back home at Pearce and No 8 Communications and 100 Squadron in New Guinea. No 14 Squadron was a maritime patrol squadron. His logbook details 37 sorties patrolling for submarines out of Geraldton and Pearce. James said patrolling when it was rough seas meant they didn't see much, he did however spot one US sub, but no Japanese.

In New Guinea he spent a lot of time either calibrating radar stations, which involved flying back and forth on various set courses following the instructions of the navigator, ferrying around the 'top brass', patrols or making strikes against villages, their role being to precision bomb Japanese soldiers hiding in caves on the sides of the mountains. He did not fly in the battle for the Philippines, but did see the flotilla being assembled by the Americans and was 'gobsmacked' by its size.

James' records show that in three months in 1944, he flew 165 hours as the Captain of a Beaufort Bomber and 2 hours as 2nd pilot on a Catalina. I asked him why 2 hours in a Catalina? He told me Catalinas were used to rescue 'downed' crew from the sea. After one of those rescue missions, James had asked the pilot if he could fly with him back to Port Moresby, and sit up front! Those 2 hours were the time it took the Catalina to fly around the coast because they didn't have the capacity to fly the direct route over the mountains.

His records indicate he was "an above average pilot, reliable and very competent," and show a total of 1,600 hours of service flying time, flying on 98 operations, both day and night. The RAAF worked a roster of intensive flying ops and then weeks of downtime, sometimes back in Australia, before they did it all again. In 1943 his Squadron leader said "he will be an excellent flight commander in an operational squadron" so it is not surprising he acted as Squadron Leader and was asked to study to be promoted to Squadron Leader. In 1945 the commanding officer said he was "a competent officer who shows balance and judgement beyond his age" (he was 23 yrs of age). James' final sortie was 15 July 1945. He was on leave at the time the Atomic bombs were dropped on Japan.

Flight Lieutenant James Coombe Birt, named after his Uncle from the First World War, was discharged in 1945, returned to Tambellup and joined his father and brother Phil on 'Borderdale'. He married Jean, had 4 children, has 8 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren and at 103 years of age is living in Como.

He's our family hero!

TAMBELLUP ANZAC DAY SERVICE

Once again the Tambellup Lions Club in conjunction with the Tambellup CWA and the Shire held the ANZAC service at the war memorial in Tambellup.

A good crowd assembled to hear the ANZAC Day address presented by Anne Birt recounting her families involvement in WW1 and WW2

Bob Stewart, revisiting Tambellup with other members of the Peel sub branch of the Military Brotherhood MMC, read the ODE

Winton Nazzari recited the poem "ANZAC " by Jessie Pope and then Andrew Bradshaw sang his own song "Tail Wind".

The crowd adjourned to the CWA rooms to partake in morning tea and consume a huge variety of ANZAC biscuits whilst awaiting the announcement of this years winner of the Anzac biscuit bake-off.

This years judging was officiated by Bob Stewart, and the winner for the second year in a row was Elle Sprigg . Congratulations Elle and thanks to all those who entered the competition.

BROOMEHILL ANZAC DAY DAWN SERVICE

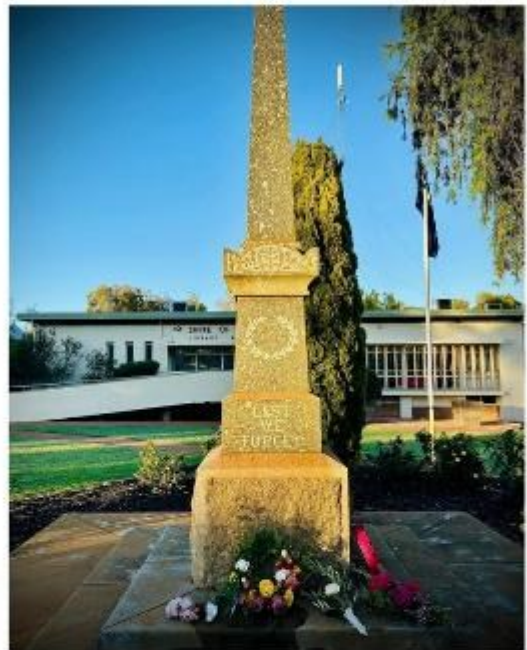


The community gathered in solemn reflection at this morning's ANZAC Day Dawn Service

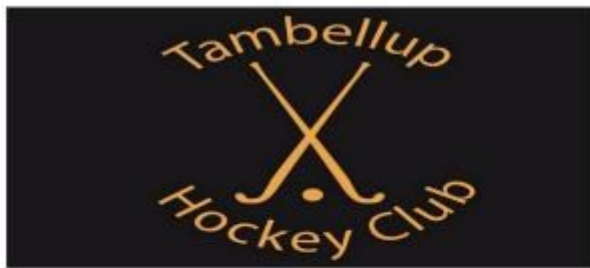
