The official banners carry a design called 'Snake Nest' by indigenous artist Darryl Dempster (Snake Nest © Darryl Dempster/Copyright Agency 2025).

We were delighted to collaborate with local artist and former Shire employee Patricia (Pattie) Farmer on the design of the Shire banners. During Pattie's time with the Shire, she developed a design that reflected our two towns and the connections between them. Administration staff shirts proudly carry Pattie's design, and elements have been incorporated into the banner design.





2024-25 WORKS PROGRAM WRAPS UP STRONG

As we close in on the end of the financial year, our 2024–25 Works Program is almost complete — and what a productive year it's been across the Shire's roads and infrastructure!

From reseals to road widening, here's a snapshot of the key upgrades that have been delivered to improve safety, connectivity and driveability across our region: **Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road** – Surface correction complete for a smoother ride

Broomehill-Kojonup Road - Major failure repairs and surface improvements now done

Warrenup Road - A fresh two-coat seal applied to 4.5km of road

Tie Line Road – Widened to support safer traffic flow Tambellup West Road – Resealed and refreshed

North Terrace - New asphalt overlay laid

Taylor Street - Asphalt overlay completed

Nymbup Road – Gravel sheeting and culvert upgrades wrapped up

Crosby Road – Vegetation slashed and gravel patching completed

We thank our works crew and contractors for their efforts — and the community for your patience during construction. These upgrades are part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining safe and reliable infrastructure across the Shire.

FIRING UP AT THE GORDON RIVER RECREATION AREA

There's something sizzling at the Gordon River Recreation Area — and it's not just the scenery! We're thrilled to announce the installation of a brandnew electric BBQ under the gazebo, ready and waiting for your next sausage sizzle, family picnic or lazy Sunday cook-up. Whether you're stopping by for lunch or planning a casual get-together, this space is shaping up to be one of the Shire's favourite spots to relax and unwind.

Recent sealing works have made access easier and cleaner, with more finishing touches — including final seal and line marking — set to roll out in the coming weeks.

As the area becomes more popular, we kindly ask everyone to do their bit: give the BBQ a quick clean when you're done and pop any rubbish in the bin. That way, it stays welcoming for the next visitor.

It's your space — enjoy it, respect it, and make the most of this fantastic community asset.



EMBRACING CUTTING-EDGE ROAD TECHNOLOGY

We have recently implemented an advanced road mapping system that integrates robotics and artificial intelligence to enhance road safety and asset management. This innovative approach allows for the geospatial mapping of all road assets and the identification of defects, hazards, and potential safety risks across the entire network.

By leveraging AI-driven analysis, the system provides real-time, accurate data, enabling informed decision-making without the usual time constraints. The data collection, completed in just four days using vehicle-mounted sensors, captures comprehensive footage of road conditions. This information is then processed to identify issues such as potholes, surface deterioration, cracking, edge drops, faded line markings, and signage problems.





We have already utilised this data to generate comprehensive audits, including signage, footpath, curve and channel, and pavement and line marking assessments. Traditionally resource-intensive, these audits can now be produced swiftly, allowing for proactive maintenance and improved road safety outcomes.

NEW RULES FOR RAINWATER TANK INSTALLATIONS Planning to install a rainwater tank connected to your house?

In addition to local Planning Approval and a Building Permit, new State regulations now apply to plumbing work.

From 10 February 2025, only individuals with a Restricted Plumbing Permit (Rainwater Storage) can legally connect a tank to a dwelling.

You can either:

- ·Hire a licensed plumber with the permit, or
- ·Apply for your own permit if you wish to do the work yourself.

Permits are free to obtain at this stage but must be applied for by 10 February 2026.

Applicants must:

- · Complete a short training course
- Provide evidence of two previous installations
- Submit a National Police Check



What's a produce swap you might ask? The idea is that people bring in their excess produce, and everything is swapped. No money changes hands. So at home, you might have too much of this or not enough of that. Fruit dropping all over the ground etc... bring it to the swap! We all met at 10 am outside the Broomehill op shop. With tables & gazebo set up we all laid our produce on the table and started swapping.

No produce? No problem, just bring something swappable, like empty egg cartons or pots, seedlings, plants cuttings, preserves etc......









Produce swaps have been happening around the country for a while now, city and rural. Not a new thing. Covid knocked a few on the head for a while but we are out the other side now and there's no time like the present.

Produce swaps address food wastage, cost of living crisis, and social isolation, and they're free.

A big thanks to everyone who came along to this year's Community Crop Seeding Day on the 2nd of May!

We got 250 hectares in the ground, seeded to Jurien lupins.

This year, we also set up a couple of trials: a wetter trial at three rates (0, 2, and 4L/ha), and a variable rate cropping fertiliser trial across four rates (0, 30, 60, and 90 kg/ha). We'll be keeping a close eye on the results and will share updates at future community days, so stay tuned and we'll see you out in the paddock again soon.

The legendary Tambellup CWA ladies were back in action, dishing up one of their famous lunches that hit the spot. Later in the day, we fired up the bonfire, had a few beers (cheers to Stirling Ag), and tucked into some top-quality WAMMCO lamb chops, cooked to perfection by Daz from Sheep Logistics. Massive thanks to all those who donated their time, machinery, and inputs, we couldn't have done it without you. Events like this remind us what a great community we've got out here. Thank you to the Shire and others for their work around the shed, something we will continue to improve for future events.

Wishing everyone all the best as seeding wraps up – bring on the rain!




