FROM THE MAY COUNCIL MEETING

Council endorsed the appointment of Brigade Fire Control Officers and Fire Weather Officers for the 2019/2020 fire season. These appointments are made on an annual basis by the individual brigades, which are then endorsed by the Bush Fire Advisory Committee for recommendation to Council. We thank these people for their commitment to ensuring the safety of their community.

Council endorsed the 2019/2020 Firebreak Order and Information booklet. This booklet contains important information relating to fire prevention which applies to all residents, whether you are in town or on a farm. The booklet will be distributed to all households by mail in July. A copy of the booklet will also be available on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under Our Shire/Publications and Archives.

Council considered planning consent for the development of a shed at Lot 404 McGuire Rd, and a carport at Lot 716 Carmody Place. Both applications were approved, subject to conditions.

Council supported an application from the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association for an extension to the area of its Liquor Licence over the weekend of the upcoming Great Southern Hockey Carnival in July.

Council determined to accept a quotation from H & H Architects for the provision of Architectural Design, Tendering and Contract Management services for the Independent Living Units to be constructed in Broomehill.

WORKS

With the end of the financial year in sight, programmed and funded construction works are being finalised. The 4km stretch of repairs to Tambellup West Road has been sealed, and the intersection of Tambellup West Rd/Warrenup Rd has also been sealed. Signage and some earthworks are required to complete this project. We thank everyone for their patience while these works were implemented.

Works underway at present include Flat Rocks Road reconstruct and seal a 3km section, failure repairs on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, and works to seal sections of McGuire and Morgan Roads. It is anticipated all works will be complete during June.

Councillors completed a roads inspection earlier in the year, and from this recommendations will be made for construction and maintenance projects for the 2019-2020 budget.

The maintenance graders were busy predominantly across the southern half of the Shire during May with the following roads graded: Pallinup Rd, O'Neill Rd, Beejenup Rd, Palomar Rd, Ngopitchup Rd, Birt Rd, Warrenup Rd, Wray Rd, Grahams Well Rd, Komani Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Yetermerup Rd, Hankinson Rd, Batchelor Rd, Bridge St, Donald St, Hodgson Rd.

Despite the dry autumn conditions to date, the ovals are in relatively good condition and we have had some good feedback from winter sporting teams. During May, both ovals were dethatched and aerated, and then fertilized and treated for lawn beetle infestation. We are looking forward to some good winter rains in the near future to promote the growth of the turf.

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

The housing project is progressing, with the tender for the design and construction of six key worker homes being advertised in the West Australian on 25th May. Tenders close on 19th June, and once Council has awarded the tender we anticipate works will commence shortly thereafter. The locations of the new houses have been finalised, as follows:

Lot 5 Lathom Street

Lot 12 Leven Street

Lot 8 Taylor Street

Lot 384 Parnell Street

Lot 22 Taylor Street (2 dwellings)

Council has accepted a quote from H & H Architects for Architectural Design, Tendering and Contract Management services for the Independent Living Units. With the approval of the Department of Planning Lands and Heritage, four Independent Living Units will be constructed on the south east corner of the Broomehill Caravan Park site (Janus St/Javelin St). An Expression of Interest flyer was mailed out to all residents late in May, if you or someone you know is interested in potentially renting one of these units, on completion or into the future, we would encourage you to complete and return the form on this flyer for recording.

PENSIONER RATES REBATES

All pensioners are reminded that in order to claim the Pensioner Rebate in 2018-2019 the amount due on your rate notice needs to be paid (in full) before 30 June, 2019. If you think you may be eligible for a rebate and require further information, please contact Erryn at the Shire. If you haven't registered as a pensioner please do so as soon as possible. We will require a copy of your pension card.

BE A RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNER

Dog owners are reminded of the requirement to securely contain your dog to your property, and that dogs must be on a lead when in a public area. Wandering dogs are creating significant issues in the community, and owners will be fined if dogs are captured and impounded. Please be a responsible dog owner!

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

With Kanopy, Tambellup and Broomehill library patrons will have access to more than 30,000 Films, For Free!

The popular on-demand video streaming service Kanopy is available for free. Tambellup and Broomehill library card holders can access Kanopy and sign up to start streaming films on demand instantly by visiting: https://tambellup.kanopy.com/

After signing up and creating an account on Kanopy, you will only have to enter your library barcode - no pin.

You will have 4 credits (or watch 4 film/documentaries) per month, which is reset on the 1st of every month.

Community Resource Centre You then have 72 hours to watch or re-watch a film from the time you start to watch a film.

To access the OPAC go to the website https://broomehill-tambellup.spydus.com/cgi-bin/spydus.exe/MSGTRN/OPAC/HOME. Please find a simple step by step process below on how to search and place a reservation. This allows you to reserve items at your local library but also through the OPAC you now have access to loan other regional library items if they are available, this also now includes Junior, Audio and video materials.



How to reserve an item on the Broomehill-Tambellup OPAC

To access the OPAC go to the website https://broomehilltambellup.spydus.com/cgi-bin/spydus.exe/MSGTRN/OPAC/HOME

STEP 1

- The website home page will be showing the new arrivals for both Broomehill and Tambellup's collections.
- On the left hand side there is a panel that allows you to look through specific materials.
- You can also log in now using your Borrower ID which is your Library barcode, the password is your Library postcode.
- Once logged in you can than check your current loans or any requests that you have already made, also by logging in now any reservation you place will be automatically reserved to your account.
- In the search field you can search for any topic, or if you know what title you want click on Advanced search which allows to search a specific title, Author and format.

- Once you have searched an item it will come up, if Broomehill-Tambellup doesn't have the item you are searching for click "Try search in the Great Southern Consortium Catalogue" This will bring up any surrounding Regional Libraries that have a copy of what you are looking for
- · Click on the title you want to reserve
- · Once the title you want comes up click "Place Reservation"

 If you not already logged into the OPAC site you will be prompted to log in at this stage

 Once logged in, it will come up showing your account and the item you want to reserve. You will not need to change anything, unless you want to collect the item at a different library, if so click change location. Once completed click on the icon "Place Reservation".

 Once you have placed the reservation it will now show that you have completed it. before exiting the website please click on logout.

If you already have a Zinio account, go to step 4, otherwise navigate to the RBDigital website to create an account: www.rbdigital.com/wapldmc

- 1. Select 'Create New Account'.
- 2. Choose your Library.
- 3. Enter in your library card number and select 'Next'. Enter in your details.
- Once you have completed the setup of your account, go to the App Store (Apple) or Play Store (Android) and install the RBDigital app.
- 5. Open the app and select "Australia" as the country then enter in your email address. Tap Next.
- Search for and select State Library of Western Australia as your library and then enter in your password. Tap Next.
- Select Magazines from the menu to browse for new issues to checkout.
- 8. Select Checkout to download a magazine issue, and OK to confirm.
- 9. Select Read to download and read the magazine issue.
- 10. To view all issues on loan, select Checked Out from the menu.
- 11. There are no expiry dates for magazines. To delete a magazine issue simply select the 'X' in the top-right corner of the cover.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mental Health First Aid Course

Tambellup Health Centre in partnership with Rosalie Kickett (Aboriginal Mental Health First Aid Consultant) will be running this course in Tambellup.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mental Health First Aid course will teach participants how to assist an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person who may be experiencing a mental health problem or crisis until appropriate professional help is received.

The course is based on guidelines developed through the expert consensus of Aboriginal people with fived experience of mental health and is delivered by an Aboriginal person.

Mental health problems covered in the course include- anxiety and depression, psychosis and substance use

Mental health crises covered in the course include suicidal thoughts and behaviours, self-injury, panic attacks, traumatic events, psychotic states, aggression and behavior from alcohol or other drugs.



What is the format? This is a 2 day course. Participants must be prepared to attend both days






