The Board would like to thank them both for their years of service to our community and to also thank them and their staff for keeping the doors open in the last few months while the long



drawn out process of forming a cooperative took place.

A new beginning took place on Sunday morning the 24th of March when the new lessees commenced business. The Board, Shareholders and wider community would like to welcome Parminder Singh and his wife Gagandeep Kaur along with Parminder's sister Amandeep Kaur and her husband Gurwinder Singh. Gurwinder, Armandeep and their daughter will be living in Tambellup and will be responsible for the day to day running of the store. Welcome to Tambellup and we wish you all the best in your new business venture.

The Board would encourage everyone to support the 124 Tambellup Store and all other Tambellup businesses. Remember shopping local is in our best interest as a town. The next meeting of Council will be held on <u>Thursday 18th April commencing at 4.30pm</u> in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE MARCH COUNCIL MEETING

Council welcomed three visitors to the March meeting: Justin Taylor and Nick Lockyer from the Tambellup Cooperative Ltd, and Nicki Polding representing the Tambellup Noongar community.

Council considered a request from the Tambellup Cooperative Ltd to allow the new proprietors of the Tambellup Deli to lease a unit at the Sandalwood Villas. Approval was granted, subject to conditions. It was noted that four Councillors declared a financial interest in the matter and were ineligible to participate in discussion. As this would have left Council without a quorum to determine the matter, approval was sought and granted by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries for three of the four Councillors to participate. Cr White, as Chairman of the Tambellup Cooperative Ltd, declared an impartiality interest and left the meeting while the matter was determined.

Council considered a proposal from the Tambellup Noongar community for support to establish an independent alternative learning centre at the former Tambellup Bowling Club. While Council supported the proposal in-principle, members determined the long term future of the Bowling Club required further consideration.

Council considered an application for planning consent for the development of a weigh bridge and hut, staff amenities and internal sealed roads on Lot 2 Nardlah Road, Broomehill. All Councillors declared a financial interest in this item and approval was sought from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries for approval for Councillors to participate. All Councillors except Cr Thompson and Cr Holzknecht (apology at the meeting) were granted the required approval. The application for planning consent was approved with conditions.

Planning consent was granted for development of a shed on Lot 6080 Beejenup Rd, subject to conditions.

Council agreed to make a contribution of \$500 towards the Tambellup Under 16 Netball Team's upcoming Eagles Netball 2019 UK Development Tour.

Council considered a request received by Main Roads WA to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) rating for Toolbrunup, North Stirling and Pallinup South Roads. Council will recommend to Main Roads that the request for the RAV rating on Toolbrunup and North Stirling Roads to be amended to RAV Network 7 be approved with conditions. Council will also recommend that South Pallinup Rd be amended to RAV Network 7 without conditions.

WORKS

Well, what an impact the rain during March had! Paddocks are showing a green tinge, some have been worked over already, and dam levels have increased slightly. Unfortunately the rain brought the road construction program to a halt – with Warrenup Rd (Tambellup West Rd to Albany Hwy) prepared and ready for sealing the decision was made to close the road after the rain to minimise damage by traffic. Sealing of this section and the intersection at Tambellup West Rd has now been completed and both sections are open to traffic. Sealing on Pallinup South Rd was also completed during March. The next stage of the construction program will see sections of Morgan Rd, McGuire Rd and Flat Rocks Rd prepared for sealing, and repairs to a 4km section of failed road surface on Tambellup West Rd.

With the Ute Muster and Markets being held in Broomehill on 23rd March, maintenance staff were on hand to assist with the myriad of tasks required to assist in making these events successful – including filling the creek in Holland Park! Bevan and Justin are a multi skilled pair, and they undertake a wide range of tasks across many areas of operations including footpath repairs, pot hole patching, signage and guidepost maintenance, culvert repairs, grave digging, assistance with Parks and Gardens operations, building maintenance – the list goes on.

The maintenance graders have been working predominantly in the northern part of the Shire, with the following roads being graded: Punchmirup North Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Washington South Rd, Warrenup Rd, Green Rd, Wandoo Rd, Moore Rd, Holly East Rd, Parnell Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Beejenup Rd, Pallinup South Rd, Eureka Rd, Toolbrunup Rd.

Mowing and maintenance of the ovals is ongoing, particularly with the rain in the past couple of weeks and warm days promoting growth. Repairs to solenoids has been completed, and both ovals have been sprayed for black beetles. In Tambellup, use of treated water on the oval has been finalised for this season, and dam water is now being used to reticulate the grass.

STAFF UPDATES

We welcomed Andrew Meyer to the works crew in March. Andrew will be working in a part time casual capacity assisting the Parks and Gardens crew while Lara Hugill is on parental leave.

We were also pleased to welcome William Gonzales to the team. William is working with Derek and Larry in Parks and Gardens on Thursdays, and is keeping them on their toes!

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

The administrative requirements of the project have commenced, with the tender for Project Management services on behalf of all participating Shires being advertised during March. The tender closes on 1 April, and the contract will be awarded following Council's consideration of the submissions at the April Council meeting. Design and specifications for the houses and independent living units are being developed, and will be advertised for tender in the next couple of months.

Council met during March to consider the locations for construction of the Broomehill and Tambellup houses. The following lots were selected for development:

Broomehill Independent Living Units:

Four 2x1 units to be constructed at Reserve 6730 Lot 368 Morgan Road – this is the Broomehill Caravan Park site and the units will be constructed at the southern end of the lot. Council will request the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage to modify the Management Order for Reserve 6730 to add Seniors Housing as a permitted use of the Reserve.

Key Worker Accommodation:

One 1x1 chalet and one 2x1 chalet to be constructed at the Broomehill Caravan Park

One 4x2 dwelling to be constructed at Lot 6 Latham Street Broomehill

One 3x2 dwelling to be constructed at Lot 12 Leven Street Broomehill

One 3x2 dwelling to be constructed at Lot 8 Taylor Street Tambellup

Government Regional Officers Housing:

One 4x2 dwelling to be constructed at Lot 384 Parnell Street Tambellup

Two 3x2 dwellings to be constructed at Lot 22 Taylor Street Tambellup

The timeframe for the completion of this project is quite tight, and we look forward to seeing building activity in both towns in the near future. Funding for the project has been secured through the Federal Government's Building Better Regions program, the State Government's Regional Aged Accommodation program and participating local governments.
