



Boosting Bushfire Preparedness Across the Shire

We're thrilled to share that our Shire has received \$35,185 in Bushfire Mitigation Funding, marking our first-ever allocation under this program!

This funding is a major step forward in protecting our towns and rural areas from the growing threat of bushfires. With it, we'll be rolling out high-impact works such as:

- · Clearing and maintaining critical firebreaks
- Targeted fuel reduction along priority road reserves
- Improving emergency access routes

These actions are more than just tick-box compliance. They're about making sure our community is safer, our emergency responses are faster, and our Shire is better prepared for future fire seasons.

In a region like ours, where vast distances and limited resources can challenge rapid response, proactive mitigation is everything. This support gives us the tools to reduce risk, protect homes and lives, and build long-term community resilience.

We look forward to putting it to work for the safety of everyone who lives, works, and visits here.



H5 Avian Influenza (Bird Flu) Alert

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) is on high alert for the highly pathogenic H5N1 strain 2.3.4.4b. While Australia currently remains free of this virus, the risk is rising due to migratory wild birds entering the country.

What's at risk?

Wild birds, farmed poultry, pet birds, and even some mammals may be affected.

What to look for:

- · Sudden death
- · Loss of coordination
- · Breathing difficulties in birds
- · Neurological and respiratory signs in mammals

What about humans?

The risk to people is very low. Cases are rare, typically mild, and there is no evidence of human-to-human transmission.

What to do if you see something:

If you work with or observe wildlife and notice any of these signs, do not touch dead or sick animals.

Instead:

- Take a photo
- · Record the exact location
- Report it immediately to DPIRD or the Emergency Animal Disease Hotline on 1800 675 888

Stay alert, report what you see, and help protect our wildlife and agricultural industries.

Thanks to the commitment of our Works team and support from the Regional Road Group and Roads to Recovery program, a wide range of vital upgrades have been delivered across the Shire. These works improve safety, extend road life, and support better access for residents, visitors, and freight.

Completed projects include:

- Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road Pavement repair and reseal
- Broomehill-Kojonup Road Pavement repair and reseal
- Warrenup Road Gravel reconstruction and seal (multiple sections)
- Tieline Road Shoulder widening, asphalt intersections, reseal
- Tambellup West Road Reseal
- North Terrace and Taylor Street Asphalt overlays
- · Nymbup Road Gravel sheeting
- Pallinup Road New construction and seal
- Crosby Road Gravel sheeting across several sections

We understand that the **firearms licensing** process for primary producers is frustrating and complicated. While the CRC is not an expert in this area and cannot guarantee a successful outcome, we are happy to **assist** where we can. If you need help setting up a MyID or registering on the portal, **please book a time with the CRC**.

Make sure to bring the following documents with you:

- a completed storage statement,
- · your firearms licence,
- · certificate of title or rates notice,
- · a form of ID or driver's licence,
- · firearms ID card,
- · PIC number/card,
- · and photos of your gun cabinet.

We will be offering this assistance **free of charge** until Monday, 11th of August. After this date, a \$15 fee for service will apply as we become more familiar with the process.

Please contact the CRC for further details or clarification about what to bring.

We still have vacancies in our upcoming **AusChem accreditation course**. If you are required to handle chemicals safely as part of your work, this course is for you. It provides essential knowledge and skills to help you manage risks associated with chemical use

and understand your responsibilities regarding duty of care, quality assurance, and environmental management.

This is a comprehensive two-day course, but if you only need a **refresher**, the CRC can organise that for you as well.

In addition, we still have **two spots left** in the **Photography workshop** with incredible Albany-based nature photographer Nev Clarke. You can view his stunning work on Instagram at @nevclarke_artphotography.

August brings with it the much-anticipated return of the Festival of Small Halls! 

This course will provide you with the knowledge and skills required to manage risks associated with chemical use, and to understand your obligations in the areas of duty of care, quality assurance and environmental management.

Participants will learn on a practical level how to improve their integrated pest management programmes, to better choose the right chemical for the job and to apply it more accurately. The course is designed for people who will be spraying chemicals without supervision.
