The biggest kids on the Shire team, Owen Kay and CEO Keith Williams, were on hand to road test the bespoke nature play equipment constructed recently at the Tambellup Community Pavilion, by James McLean of Southern Pole Structures. The two structures will form the centrepiece of the nature playground which is being planned by the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association with support from the Shire. There will be opportunity for the community to be involved in the construction of the playground, and we invite anyone interested in helping to contact TCPA President, Ray Squibb on 0407 984250.

FROM THE APRIL COUNCIL MEETING

A review of the 2018-2019 budget was presented to the April Ordinary meeting. The purpose of a budget review is to ensure that income and expenditure for the current year is monitored against the adopted budget and where variances have occurred, or are likely to occur, amendments are made to the budget if necessary.

Council resolved to establish a new Tourism and Economic Development Reserve with provisions set aside in 2018/19 to investigate development of a Caravan Park in Tambellup and a Holland Track Interpretive Centre in Broomehill. As both of these projects will not have commenced in 2018/19, setting the funds aside in a Reserve ensures availability of funding in future budgets for these projects.

Likewise, provision for a number of Building Maintenance items not expected to be expended by 30 June will be transferred into the Building Maintenance Reserve to ensure availability of funding in future budgets to complete the work required.

After reviewing revenue and expenditure throughout the budget, a surplus of \$25,200 was realised. Council resolved to transfer these funds into the Building Reserve for future use. This has achieved a balanced budget.

Council endorsed two key documents which were developed as part of the Integrated Planning and Reporting suite of documents. The Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 reflects the aspirations of the Strategic Community Plan and translates these into Council priorities and operations within available resources, and the Strategic Resource Plan 2019 -2034 incorporates long term financial and asset management planning and informs the Corporate Business Plan. These documents complement a range of documents and plans that have been developed to provide Council with information to enable sound decision making that reflects the community's aspirations. The Corporate Business Plan 2018-2022 is available to view on Council's website http://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/shire/publications.php or alternatively, is available at the Broomehill or Tambellup Administration offices.

Council considered an application submitted to Main Roads Western Australia (MRWA) requesting an amendment to Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) rating for local access at RAV 7, RAV 7.3, Tri Drive 4 & Tri Drive 4.3 for Tieline, Nardlah, Old Nardlah Roads and Kimberley and Darcy Streets. These streets provide access to and around the CBH sites in Broomehill. Council supported the request, with conditions, in part, with the exception of the amendment to the RAV for Darcy Street. Further clarification will be sought prior to making a response.

Council resolved to change the date of the May Ordinary meeting, from Thursday 18 May 2019 to Thursday 23 May 2019. The change was required due to the inability of the CEO to attend on 18 May.

WORKS

Councillors and staff completed the annual roads inspection during April. The inspection assists Councillors to become familiar with the condition of roads across the Shire, which is important in being able to make informed decisions in prioritising the works program for the coming year.

Easter and ANZAC day combined provided an opportunity for the works crew to take a few days off, before launching straight back in to the construction program. At time of writing, the 4km stretch of repair works on Tambellup West Rd, Warrenup Rd/Tambellup West Rd intersection and Morgan and McGuire Roads were ready for final trim grading and sealing by contractors

Prior to the Easter break, the maintenance graders were working on the following roads: Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Nookanellup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Holding Rd, Mattiske Rd, Bessen Rd, Wansbrough West Rd, Beejenup Rd, and Witham Rd.

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

The administrative aspects of this project continue to progress, with the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup recently awarding the tender for project management to Project Directors Australia (PDA). PDA will be responsible for liaising with all project partners to ensure the project is delivered on time and on budget. All Councils are now developing tender documentation for the construction of the independent living seniors units, and the design and construction of the key worker homes, and we are keen to see a good response to the tenders that will shortly be advertised.

GREAT SOUTHERN CENTRE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL EXCELLENCE

Council welcomed Dr Lenore Lyons, Executive Officer and Karl Hansom, Project Officer for the Great Southern Centre for Outdoor Recreational Excellence (GSCORE) to the Council meeting. Dr Lyons presented on the progress of the GSCORE Regional Trails Master Plan which is being developed to support the implementation of regionally significant and local trails over the next ten years. The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is a stakeholder in this project, and the presentation follows on from the Trails workshop that was held in Broomehill late in March. GSCORE is seeking input from trail users in the region, through an online survey https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/TrailSurvey – and your input is welcomed and valued.

The workshop attracted a small but enthusiastic crowd, who identified a number of potential trails that could be developed in the Shire. Two trails have been selected for inclusion in the Regional Trails Master Plan – a series of looped trails in and around the Broomehill townsite, and the West Broomehill Postie Run drive trail, the plan for which has already been developed to implementation stage. The identification and inclusion of these two trails in the Regional plan will provide documented support for the project in the event the Shire should seek external funding for the implementation phase.

The Shire is now looking for assistance from members of the public to map a proposed route for the Broomehill townsite loop trails – this will involve walking the route. If you are interested in being involved, your assistance would be greatly appreciated! Please contact Pam Hull at the Shire for more information.

ROAD SAFETY DURING SEEDING OPERATIONS

It's that time of the year again when a lot of heavy machinery will be moving around the Shire. Farmers, your licensing concession on tractors, self-propelled sprayers, spray equipment etc, contains conditions which may include the requirement to only travel on roads between sunrise and sunset, may require a flashing light, and may need to have an "over width" sign attached. In the event of an accident involving other road users, if conditions of your license are not complied with, motor injury insurance will not apply and penalties may be incurred. For more information please contact licensing officers at the Shire Administration offices.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Council elections will be held in October 2019, with three positions becoming available.

BUDGET 2019/2020

Council is about to commence preparation of the 2019/2020 annual budget. As part of that process, community and sporting groups are invited to submit requests to Council for consideration in the budget. Written submissions should be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer, 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup by the end of May.

ANZAC DAY

Our community supported local ANZAC services once again this year, with excellent turnouts noted at each. In Broomehill, the moving early morning service was conducted by members of the community, with Kym Crosby delivering the address. The service was followed by a cooked breakfast for all in attendance. In Tambellup, the Lions Club hosted the service, with the address being delivered by Michael White. Michael reflected on the service histories of servicemen named on the Tambellup War Memorial through three campaigns, and Andrew Bradshaw's moving rendition of 'And the Band Played Waltzing Matilda' brought a tear to many an eye, highlighting the futility of war. Morning tea was provided by the Tambellup CWA following the service, with Trixie Hampton being named as the winner of the Anzac Bikkie Bakeoff for 2019.

Many thanks to all involved in the organisation of both services.

Congratulations to the Broomehill P&C and students on the magnificent effort in collecting rubbish on the roads leading into the Broomehill townsite and around town on 7th April. We hear a good time was had by all – well done to all involved!

HOW'S YOUR MOBILE RECEPTION???

The Federal Government has recently announced the opening of Round 5 of the Mobile Black Spot Program, with \$80 million committed for investment into mobile telephone infrastructure to improve mobile coverage and competition

across Australia.

The Shire has in the past advocated for the installation of new mobile base stations in the Shire, to address gaps in coverage, however we are aware there are still areas where reception is poor. Mobile network operators have until July to submit their application to the program, so now is the time for the Shire to advocate for people living and working in areas of the Shire who are experiencing poor coverage. If poor mobile coverage affects you, we encourage you to provide your details to the Shire to support this advocacy. Please contact Pam Hull at the Shire for more information.

STREET LIGHTS

Have you noticed street lights in your area are not working? Western Power has provided an online option to enable easy reporting of faulty street lighting:

https://westernpower.com.au/power-outages/report-a-faulty-streetlight/

When you open their page, enter Tambellup or Broomehill as the location and a map of the town and all street lights will appear.

Click on the street light/s that aren't working and it prefills the street information (you can select more than one light in the same report), fill in the rest of the info on the right hand side and click on submit.

DID YOU KNOW???

The Shire has subscribed to the online reporting tool **Snap Send Solve** – making it easier for residents to report local issues directly to the Shire, or other service providers including the Water Corporation, Telstra, Australia Post and NBN.



The platform operates via a free app **Snap Send Solve** that can be downloaded to your smart device, and allows for photos of the issue to be uploaded, the location identified and your notes and contact details to be included. When you hit 'send', the report is forwarded to the Shire's main office email address (or other organisation contact where applicable), where it is forwarded for actioning. TAMBELLUP VOLUNTEER FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICE

While the Unit operates quietly within the community (sirens not withstanding!) and sometimes it feels like we don't do much, a review of the past 12 months which was considered at the recent Annual General Meeting indicates otherwise.

Since March 2018, the Unit members have:

- Attended and provided support at local incidents as required. Numbers of incidents were low, which is always a good thing, but member turnout has been excellent.
- Provided personnel and appliances to support Level 3 regional incidents, including the Albany fires, the Bremer Bay fire prior to Christmas, and the successful land search at Mt Trio in December. Generally speaking, deployment to regional incidents requires a commitment of more than one day, so we thank those who turned out.



- Completed a bucket load of training and exercises, including:
 - Fire Extinguisher
 - •Intro to Structural Firefighting/Pump Operators course
 - •Thermal imaging camera awareness
 - •Intro to Fire/Bush Fire Fighting
 - Land Search Team Member
 - Field Radio Operator
 - •Water Bomber reload
 - •Incident Reporting
 - Paddock burn exercise in conjunction with Broomehill Central brigade
 - •Hydrant servicing in Tambellup the Water Corporation has recently increased the number of hydrants in the townsite from five to about 18, and the Unit is responsible for servicing these.
 - Vehicle and equipment checks
 - Night search exercise with Gnowangerup SES

• And other stuff:

- Unit members attended the international AFAC conference which was held in Perth in 2018
- Two members are sitting on the Emergency Services Volunteer Association committee, which looks after the interests of all VFES Units in WA
- The unit held an outdoor community movie night to raise funds for St John Ambulance, a Community BBQ/Road Ribbons for Road Safety event at the Fire Shed, and assisted with Santa's visit to kindy and playgroup
- DFES Volunteer Employer Recognition Awards were awarded to G & T Motors, PEP Building Improvements and Hully's Spraying Service in recognition of their support of volunteer employees. DFES recognises the impost on businesses when employees who are volunteers are required to respond to an incident during work hours, and appreciates this support.

The major project for the year has been the extension of the Fire Shed to allow the new truck, light tanker and trailers to be housed under cover. This commenced in September 2018, and is very nearly complete, although we have not yet moved back in. At this point we would like to thank Trevor and the Business Centre committee for allowing the Unit to utilise the Business Centre as its base while the renovation is being completed.

The Unit AGM was held on 14th April, and once again, all positions were filled. Thanks to all members for their ongoing support and commitment through the year. SMALL LAND HOLDERS

WATER FOR FIRE FIGHTING PURPOSES
HELP US TO HELP YOU

Volunteer Fire Fighters are urging all landowners in Special Rural lots to make sure they have a provision of water for fire fighting purposes. This could make the difference in saving your home from a bushfire or reducing the impact of a structure fire if it was to occur.

Fire Fighting appliances carry limited water and once this has been exhausted then it needs to be refilled. If there is a tank available this will reduce precious time.



We suggest you have 20,000 ltrs of water on hand for fire fighting purposes that is easily accessible to a fire appliance and that it has a 2 inch Camlock connection and/or easy access from the top.

ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES.

If your smoke alarm isn't working properly, it won't warn you and your family of a fire in your home!



Is it time to change your battery?

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on your type of smoke alarm. If you do need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on the 1st April Smoke alarms powered by:

- 9V AKALINE BATTERY require you to replace batteries every year.
- 10-year NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year.
- MAINS-POWERED SMOKE ALARMS have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage.
 Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacing.
 Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery.

After replacing the battery

Always test that your smoke alarm is operating by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone.

Things you should know...

- Not all smoke alarms need their batteries replaced.
- Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a **Green** "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- Test your smoke alarm every month by holding down the test button until you hear a loud tone.
- All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years. If you do not know how old your smoke alarm is, it's time to replace it.














Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mental Health First Aid Course

Tambellup Health Centre in partnership with Rosalie Kickett (Aboriginal Mental Health First Aid Consultant) will be running this course in Tambellup.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mental Health First Aid course will teach participants how to assist an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person who may be experiencing a mental health problem or crisis until appropriate professional help is received.

The course is based on guidelines developed through the expert consensus of Aboriginal people with lived experience of mental health and is delivered by an Aboriginal person.

Mental health problems covered in the course include- anxiety and depression, psychosis and substance use problems.

Mental health crises covered in the course include suicidal thoughts and behaviours, self-injury, panic attacks, traumatic events, psychotic states, aggression and behavior from alcohol or other drugs.



What is the format? This is a 2 day course. Participants must be prepared to attend both days.



Who can attend this course? Any community member or service provider.

Location- Tambellup Community Resource Centre

Cost- FREE. Morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea will be provided.
