2025-26 Works Program Underway

The 2025–26 Shire Works Program is off to a strong start.

Several key projects are already in motion, including:

- Tree pruning and culvert modifications on Tieline Road;
- · Excavation works underway on Tambellup West Road;
- · Grading completed on O'Neill Road;
- Bitumen patching across Broomehill–Kojonup Road and other key routes;
- · Erosion repairs finalised on Flat Rocks Road.

These improvements are part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining and enhancing local infrastructure for the benefit of all residents.

Year 12 Work Placement - Riley Thorn

Recently the Works team has had the pleasure of hosting Riley Thorn, a Year 12 student from the WA College of Agriculture Narrogin, as part of his work placement program.

This isn't Riley's first time working with the Shire. He previously completed a placement here and has continued to impress with his commitment and teamwork. The attached photos show Riley in action, working alongside the crew and contributing meaningfully to daily operations.





Budget Boost for Road Safety Projects

The Shire has secured new funding under the Regional Road Safety and Black Spot Programs, prompting a budget amendment endorsed at the September Ordinary Council Meeting.

A total of \$1.587 million has been awarded through the Regional Road Safety Program for upgrades to Broomehill–Kojonup Road, including shoulder widening, resealing, and audible line marking. These works will be delivered over two financial years and are fully grant-funded, requiring no Shire contribution.

Additionally, \$189,814 in external funding has been approved for two Black Spot Program projects. Safety improvements on Nardlah Road will include an asphalt overlay, rumble strips, and enhanced signage.

On Gnowangerup—Tambellup Road, upgrades at the Johnnys Creek floodway will involve culvert extension, approach widening, and new signage. The Shire will contribute one-third of the cost for these works.

These projects represent a significant investment in the local road network and will enhance safety for all road users.

PROJECT UPDATES

Crawford Street Basketball Courts

In response to strong community feedback, new floodlighting has been installed at the Crawford Street basketball courts. The improved lighting has already enhanced safety and usability after hours, encouraging more people to enjoy the space.

Additional seating will be installed in the coming months to further support community use.

New Caravan Dump Points

New dump points have been installed in both Tambellup and Broomehill. These facilities support regional tourism especially for self-contained travellers, and offer a more sustainable solution for wastewater disposal. They also help reduce pressure on existing systems and improve the overall visitor experience.



Tambellup Caravan Park Progress

A major milestone, with power now connected to the Tambellup Caravan Park site, progress can be made on a number of items that have been held up pending this connection.

We also received final approvals for the prefabricated laundry, with works commencing shortly.

Other components currently underway involve researching options and sourcing contractors for:

- · paving of vehicle bays;
- design and construction of steps and balustrading for the cabins; and
- · fencing and landscaping to define and soften the site

Final road construction has been on hold until weather conditions improve, but will commence when the ground stabilises.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD COMMENCES 1 OCTOBER 2025!

Spring is definitely here, and while everything is green at the moment, it won't be very long before it dries out – and with that, comes the increased risk of fire. TO REPORT A FIRE PLEASE CALL 000!

From 1 - 31 October 2025, residents wishing to conduct a burn are required to obtain a permit from their Brigade Fire Control Officer. Please note - permits will not be issued during this period for burning of logs, stumps or timber heaps.

The Prohibited Burning Period commences on 1 November 2025 and is in effect until 1 March 2026. No burning is permitted during this period.

All residents have an obligation to prepare their property prior to the fire season, to reduce the risk of fire. For more information please refer to the Fire Break Order 2025-2026, on the Shire's website at http://bit.ly/47Q5HKB.

Owners and occupiers should note, during the period 31 October 2025 – 15 April 2026:

- All Urban Land less than 4000 square metres all flammable material is to be reduced to a height of less than 50mm by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning or otherwise clearing
- All Urban Land exceeding 4000 square meters Clear a 2.5m wide firebreak by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning or otherwise clearing immediately inside all external boundaries of the land. Maintain all remaining flammable material on the land to a height of less than 150mm.

Townsite inspections will be carried out to ensure compliance with the Fire Break Order.

OFF-LEASH DOG PARK PROPOSAL - SURVEY RESULTS

Thank you to everyone who participated in the recent survey regarding the proposed off-leash dog park in Tambellup.

At the August 2025 Ordinary Council Meeting the survey results were reviewed and while there was general support for the idea, feedback indicated the facility would be used only occasionally, and concerns were also raised about the suitability of the proposed location at the Tambellup Sports Ground.

Based on this feedback, Council has decided not to proceed with the development of an off-leash dog park at this time.

We appreciate the public's input and constructive feedback, which will help guide future planning and decision-making.





The Journey of Owen Saggers: From Wanderer to Pioneer Brickmaker - A talk given by Dr Genevieve Milnes on the Celebration of 100 Years for the Agricultural Hall in Tambellup at the Festival of Small Halls, August 23 2025.

My name is Genevieve born Saggers, and I am one of 22 grandchildren of Owen and Vida Saggers, pioneers to Tambellup. I am sharing a part of my family history because it was my grandfather who made bricks for the Agricultural Hall, both in the original section in 1907 and in the later addition in 1925.

To give you context, in November 1871 Josiah Norrish applied to lease 4,000 hectares in the vicinity of the Tambellelup Springs. Josiah died in 1884 leaving his wife Ellen and their two sons (and daughters) to run the property. In April 1888 the railway line had reached Broomehill and in 1889 the first passenger train had left Albany. Tambellup was still an unattended siding. But by January 1898 there were 15 applications to take up land in Tambellup which was gazetted as a townsite in 1899, and it is believed that Owen was one of these.

Owen Alexander Saggers was born on January 18, 1868, in Alexandra, Victoria, nestled near the majestic Snowy Mountains, the 6th of 14 children born to Robert Saggers (born London), and Johanna Carlyon of Cornwall, who were married in Victoria in 1857. The genealogy of the Saggers family is available tonight going back ten generations, kindly provided to me by a contact in Ancestry. Owen, as a young man, possessed an adventurous spirit that would carry him across much of Australia. Legend tells of his remarkable journey at age twenty, when he walked the vast distance from New England in New South Wales all the way to Brisbane, Queensland, before taking a boat to Kilfera, Sydney. As young man he got himself into some scrapes but his wandering ways soon led him to station work in New South Wales, where he joined a crew of twenty men in the lucrative but demanding business of rabbit control. Their monthly haul of 5,000 rabbits earned Owen fifty pounds—substantial money for the time. Eventually seeking new opportunities, he made his way to Melbourne and rented a farm at Goulburn, Victoria, where at the age of 25 he married Vida Lydia Nicola Trevaskis, aged 21, in 1883, daughter of John Trevaskis who started life in Cornwall and worked in the tin mines until the age of 23 when he came to Australia, and Mary Dunstan, also born in Cornwall. Vida Trevaskis, my grandmother was the 4th child born to John and Mary Trevaskis in Daylesford. The first two children dying of diphtheria at ages two and four and two more of their children dying at 2 months and 4 years old. The Trevaskis family remained in Kyabram and are buried in the Presbyterian section of the Kyabram cemetery. During Owen's time at Goulbourn he had plenty of time to court Vida and while there, he contributed to the ambitious 100-mile water channel project that carried water from Warrangal Basin to Echuca.

The call of the West proved irresistible, and Owen set his sights on Western Australia. After reaching Adelaide, he purchased boat tickets for the journey across the Great Australian Bight, but quickly discovered he was a terrible sailor. With characteristic determination, he tore up the tickets and chose the overland route instead.

In Trove, according to the Coolgardie Miner, on the 28th April 1954 reported Owen Saggers as saying, "I arrived in Tambellup with my wife and child in 1898, having previously spent some time in Albany and Denmark. Mr and Mrs Taylor and five children made the trip at the same time.' Indeed, Mr E Bunce wrote in the Southwest Advertiser on the 6th May 1954, 'Within a few months of our arrival (the Bunces), Mr and Mrs Taylor and children and Mr and Mrs Saggers and one child arrived. From 1897 to 1900 the following had arrived: Mr and Mrs Charlie Davis and child, the Threadgold Bros., Parnells, Hams, Aylmores, Hodby, father and sons, Jack Trevaskis, Dawsons, Trathams, Temby's and McDonald, Patrick O'neill and, I think, Flowers. Mr H.T. Bessen and family and a few others arrived between 1900 and 1903.

So, we know that, in 1898, at the age of 30, Owen arrived in Tambellup with his wife Vida and their baby, Owen Jnr, having lost their first baby, Cedric, back in Tongala, and then having spent time in both Albany and Denmark. Significantly, he wasn't alone in this venture—traveling with them was Samuel William Taylor, who brought his wife and five children. The two men had formed a partnership in Albany, where they had learned the art of brickmaking together. Samuel's journey west had been prompted by personal tragedy: he had lost both his own farm and his father's farm during Victoria's devastating financial crisis, forcing him to seek new opportunities in Albany's brick manufacturing trade.

When the Saggers and Taylor families arrived in Tambellup, they found a frontier settlement of remarkable simplicity. The community consisted mainly of railway workers—Italian gangers living in camps under the supervision of Mr. Polletti, who had constructed himself a modest three-room hut from railway sleepers. A few surveyors had pitched their tents nearby, and Mr. Bunce Senior lived in a tent while managing the pumping station. Apart from the long-established Norrish family, these were the only inhabitants of what would become a thriving town.

The railway infrastructure was minimal—no waiting room, no goods shed, just an additional line for shunting trains. When the new arrivals found themselves short of food, they attempted the local custom of stopping the daily train to Katanning by placing a lighted candle on the main track. The train driver, however, was unimpressed by this method and simply threw a piece of coal at them as he passed. Fortunately, the Italian gangers came to their rescue with food supplies until the next day.

Life in early Tambellup was challenging. Fresh water had to be carted in drums from the 94-mile camp by horse, then purified with ashes. Adding to their difficulties, one of their horses was poisoned soon after arrival, while the other broke its leg. Despite these setbacks, both men had secured land grants through the Western Australian Land Company. Owen selected his plot along the Gordon River, while Samuel claimed 104 acres. By 1899, they had turned to farming, with Owen proudly harvesting twelve bags of wheat from his first crop. Owen and Vida first lived in makeshift accommodation then they moved to a newly built brick house closer to the river in 1918 which I believe is Mystic Park. At one stage Owen boarded the train to go to Albany to buy a rooster but bought a horse rooster (!) and had no money left for the train (and the freight!) so he set out on the 90-milee journey back to Tambellup on horseback. Owen worked on the first bridge driving piles for 5/- an hour, working 8 hours a day, often waist deep in water.

He said, 'In the year 1900 I was appointed land guide. I then had a horse and sulky and by this method I was able to show the early settlers around. I marked out all the roads leading to Tambellup and had them placed on the map so that people would know where roads were. Some of those who came here but are not here now were the Lilford Bros., Hodby Bros., Gemeiner Bros., the Daddow Damily and Mr Abernethy'

He goes on to say, 'I was also appointed to represent Tambellup district at the Road Board meetings. A Progress Association was formed with Mr Shaw, the Baptist Minister as secretary and myself as president. We made application to Broomehill for a separate road district.

In 1902 Owen was appointed as a Land Agent for the district, and mapped out the area, showing 30 families recorded as farming in the district. He was elected to the Broomehill Roads Board that year. You can read this in the Tambellup Heritage Survey spanning the years 1917 to 1994.

'I moved that they raise no objection to us having a separate board at Tambellup. This motion was carried and eventually a separate board was arranged.

Owen established his brick-making operation near the Gordon River, where he built a substantial kiln for firing. The process began with clay preparation in a 'pug mill'—a circular pit about 1.8 meters deep with a central pole. Clay was carted to this mill, where a horse walked in endless circles, mixing the clay to the perfect consistency. Once ready, the clay was shovelled into wheelbarrows and transported to a trestle table, where skilled hands shaped it into bricks using wooden moulds.

The firing process required Owen's complete dedication. His kiln, measuring 6 meters by 9.1 meters, demanded constant attention for three full days. Owen would camp by the river during this crucial period, maintaining the fire

with specially cut logs that fitted the entire length of the kiln. The final day was the most demanding, requiring an intensely hot fire to achieve the desired brick colour—a process that meant stoking the fire every two hours without fail.

The Tambellup School was opened in 1903 of which Owen was the first President of the Parents and Teachers Association. He put down a tennis court at the school. He also put down the first cricket pitch with Mr Bob White and cleared the reserve for a football club. Colonel Birt and Owen spent some time getting the snags out of the pool in front of the boatshed to make it a safe swimming place. An orchestra was formed in 1905 and by 1906 farmers were carting bricks, made by Owen, to build the Agricultural Hall. The hall was opened in 1907 and it was considered, and I quote, 'One of the finest on the Great Southern Railways'. The building featured "Federation Free Classical single storey rendered brick building with symmetrical façade displaying many characteristics of the Federation Academic Classical style"

A lot was going on in Tambellup in the following 7 or 8 years and it wasn't until around 1910 or 1911, some twelve years after their arrival in Tambellup, the two friends Samuel and Owen, decided to revive their brickmaking partnership. They had kilns with 3 fires in what was known as Saggers Paddock. They also had the Saggers Brickworks at the Moree property. Their enterprise proved successful, selling 1,000 bricks for two pounds and ten shillings. Owen and Samuel made bricks for the co-op store, the first post office, and several houses in the town. His son Syd commented: 'My father told us that in the early days he would go on a property, find suitable clay, set up his pugmill, make, stack, and burn, a kiln of bricks for twenty-five shillings a thousand. I remember in 1910 when the bricks were made for the Tambellup Hotel, 80,000 of them. Billy Taylor got the contract 2/0/6 pounds a thousand delivered on the site. He beat his father's tender by sixpence a thousand. Father (Owen) and Mr Taylor had agreed to work together if either got the contract so the bricks were made in our yard. The holes you can still see near the road on the way to the river. I remember too, on the third night of the firing of the kiln, when the flames were expected to be three feet or more through the top, everyone was there to see the sight. All except me. I went to sleep on Billy Taylor's bed in the hit he had built and missed the thrill, much to my disappointment.

By 1914 The Tambellup Roads Board took over the management of the Agricultural Hall.

By 1917 there were a total of 3 motor vehicles in the district.

1918 Owen said, 'During WW1 I was chairman of the Roads Board and President of the Repatriation Committee, the Agricultural Society, and the Boat Club'. He was

also a Justice of the Peace for 36 years.

Before the Boathouse's establishment in 1921 local dances were held at the Saggers Shearing shed. Owen supplied the music. He played 3 tunes each on the violin, the accordion and the tin whistle. One tune was for a barn dance, one was a waltz and one a polka.

In 1919 the Spanish flu' swept through Tambellup and 5 people died and many were very sick.

1921 The annual regatta at Saggers Pool on New Year's Day was organised by Owen and Vida.

Owen's bricks became the foundation of Tambellup's growth, used in constructing many of the town's important buildings, including the additions to the hall in 1925, the hotel, and post office. The Clay Pits /Brickworks are mentioned in the Municipal Listings, as is Mystic Park (the Saggers Homestead in Russell St), and the Shearers Quarters on Saggers Property.

In 1926, as I follow my grandfather's activities, he constructed a 9-hole golf course on his property and played the first game. This is listed in the Municipal Listing.

His second preoccupation according to his son Syd, was schooling sheep dogs, kelpies and border collies. He competed in endless sheepdog trials and won many prizes.

In 1939 120 people enlisted for WWII, including my father, John Saggers.

By 1946 there were 100 children in the Tambellup School.

In 1948 at the age of 80 Owen played in a cricket match in Tambellup, refusing services of a runner between stumps.

I was born in 1952 and over the years attended many New Year's Day events at Saggers Pool on the Gordon River.

In 1963 my aunt Minnie Saggers was planting trees on the oval and received an MBE for services to the community.

Through determination, skill, and partnership, Owen Saggers had transformed from a young wanderer and a bit of a lad into a respected craftsman and pioneer, helping to literally build the foundations of a new community in the Australian bush. There were many other ventures and achievements made by my grandfather for Tambellup and he is a legend in our family history. He had twelve children, 3 died early, nine lived on to make their homes around WA, including my father Stanley John Victor Saggers of Kendenup. Most of you will know of Miss Minnie Saggers tree planter, of the Methodist Church, Roy Saggers who did the post run for Tambellup, and Mrs Connie Tomney who lived out her days here in Tambellup. And of course, Owen who went away to WWI, Syd the Methodist minister, Cliff the dairy farmer at the Lower Kalgan, and Reg the policeman and part owner of Kendenup Stores. Thank you for this opportunity to speak about my grandfather Owen Saggers.

Our fairly neglected garden has currently full of birds and bees and blossoming trees. The early morning birdsong is magnificent if you can wake up early enough to enjoy it!


