
Anyone wanting a baby Oak tree, please get in touch as we have a few of them doing their own thing at the moment!

- Improved lighting around the Town Hall and Holland Park, highlighting their heritage and inviting community spirit.
- Well-lit paths into and around the Caravan Park, ensuring safe and easy access for visitors and locals.

This upgrade isn't just about lights—it's about creating a vibrant, safe, and inviting atmosphere that celebrates the beauty of Broomehill and the warmth of our Shire. Whether you're strolling through the gardens, heading to an event at the Town Hall, or enjoying a quiet evening walk, the new lighting makes every moment feel a little more magical.





### **Little Street Libraries in Broomehill**

Two new Little Street Libraries are now open at Holland Park and the Broomehill Caravan Park.

Funded through a recent community grant, these mini libraries make it easy for everyone to enjoy free books in our public spaces. Take a book, leave a book, or simply stop by for a browse during your walk or stay.

### **Tambellup Caravan Park Update**

Progress continues steadily on the Tambellup Caravan Park project, with several key milestones already achieved.

Construction of the laundry building is well underway, and site works are nearing completion. The internal roads have now been sealed and kerbed, with only the installation of bollard lighting remaining. Final commissioning and handover of the site are expected in the coming weeks.

While significant progress has been made, there are still a few tasks to complete before the cabins become operational. These include:

- · Paving the car park areas
- · Installing steps and balustrades for the cabins
- · Erecting perimeter fencing
- · Completing landscaping and reticulation
- Fitting out the cabins and laundry

Development of the online booking platform is also progressing well and will follow the same format as the existing Broomehill Caravan Park system, ensuring a smooth and familiar experience for users.

Once complete, the new facility will offer a comfortable and welcoming space for visitors, helping to showcase our community and support local tourism.



### Safer Roads Ahead for Broomehill-Kojonup Road

We're pleased to share that the Broomehill-Kojonup Road is set to receive a major safety upgrade, thanks to funding from the Safer Roads Grants via Main Roads WA.

A total of \$1.6 million has been allocated across the 2025–26 and 2026–27 financial years, with 100% of the funding provided externally. An additional \$150,000 may also be secured for signage improvements.

The upgrade will cover approximately 30 kilometres, stretching from the Broomehill townsite to the Shire boundary.

Planned improvements include:

- · Widening the sealed shoulder by 0.5 metres on each side
- Installing audible lines on both edges and down the centre of the road
- · Adding white edge lines on both sides
- Improving road signage
- Extending several culverts
- · Tree pruning where necessary
- Patching of worn and potholed areas

These enhancements will significantly improve road safety and driving conditions for all users, making travel through our region safer and more reliable.







## PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD COMMENCES 1 NOVEMBER 2025!

The Prohibited Burning Period commenced on 1 November 2025 and is in effect until 1 March 2026. No burning is permitted during this period.

### **Stand-Alone Power Supply Systems Firebreaks**

Property owners with a Stand-Alone Power Supply are reminded to maintain a 2.5-metre firebreak immediately outside the enclosure for the upcoming fire season.

Creating and maintaining this break helps reduce the risk of wildfire damage to your power system. This can be achieved by spraying vegetation or cultivating the soil to form a mineral earth break.

## **Shipping Containers**

The Shire has noticed an increase in shipping containers being placed on properties across Broomehill and Tambellup. This impacts the look and feel of our towns and rural areas.

Local Planning Policy No. 1 – Sea Containers (<a href="https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/documents/217/local-planning-policy-no-1-sea-containers">https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/documents/217/local-planning-policy-no-1-sea-containers</a>) outlines when and where containers can be placed. Planning approval is required in most cases.

Over the next month, the Shire will focus on container compliance. Property owners are encouraged to review existing containers or contact the Shire's Development and Regulatory Services team for advice before placing new ones.






## CORNER SHOP MUSEUM INC. Station Master's House

We continue to get positive feedback not only from visitors (comments in book), but from locals as well who have watched the transformation over the years.



- · and most importantly have lots of fun.




## Teacher: Caroline Sprigg






