



Council Meeting Wrap-Up: 18 December 2025

The final Ordinary Council Meeting for 2025 was held on Thursday, 18 December, bringing another busy year for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup to a close. A wide range of items were discussed, covering planning, community facilities, governance, and financial management.

The meeting included updates on local facilities, such as the Broomehill Rest Stop reflecting the Shire's continued maintenance and oversight of key community assets.

As usual for the final meeting of the year, a comprehensive package of governance and reporting documents was presented. Council reviewed the Monthly Financial Report and Payments Listing for November 2025, ensuring transparency and sound financial stewardship heading into the new year.

Also received were the 2025 Auditor General's Report, the 2024–2025 Annual Report, updates to Council delegations, and new and updated policies such as the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Management Plan 2025–2027, and the Elected Member Training and Professional Development Policy. These documents help ensure the Shire continues to operate effectively, responsibly and in line with its statutory requirements.

The meeting closed with Council reaffirming its commitment to good governance, community engagement and ongoing improvements to local services and facilities. With planning reforms underway and several key operational documents now updated, the Shire is well-positioned for a productive year ahead.




Tambellup Caravan Park Nearing Completion

Exciting progress is being made at the Tambellup Caravan Park, with a range of works now underway as the project moves into its final stages. Staff are currently coordinating trades to complete important external tasks including boundary fencing, landscaping, paving, concreting, and the installation of balustrades and steps to the new cabins.

Inside the cabins, the Shire's works team has begun installing furniture and equipment, bringing the interiors close to their finished state. Behind the scenes, the online booking platform has now been fully set up and is ready to accept reservations when the park officially opens.

Accommodation charges were adopted as part of the 2025/2026 budget, with nightly cabin rates set at \$150 per night. Guests booking seven nights or more will enjoy a discounted rate of \$135 per night.

The Shire is continuing to work toward the cabins being ready for guests by the end of February 2026, and we look forward to welcoming our first visitors to the newly improved Tambellup Caravan Park.

Bushfire Season Update – Let's Stay Prepared!

To date, our volunteer bushfire fighters including farmer response units, Broomehill Central, and Tambellup VFES have responded to 11 fires across our farming community. One of these incidents, on 16 December, escalated to an Emergency Warning due to its location within a hobby block adjacent to the Broomehill townsite.

This serves as an important reminder: depending on a fire's location, emergency services may not have time to circulate alerts through media channels such as Emergency WA or the Telephone Warning System. If a fire starts close by, it could impact your property quickly.

Do not wait for a notification to leave your property if you are not prepared.

A big shout-out to our local farmer response units who gave up valuable time during harvest to assist our neighbours with the Mindarabin fire. Your efforts make a huge difference!

Take Action This Month – Bushfires Don't Wait for You to Be Ready!

Here are five practical steps you can take now:

- Do your Bushfire Reality Check:** Walk around your home, talk with your family, and identify areas for improvement. No action is too small.
- Update or create your bushfire plan:** Use the Emergency WA app to ensure your plan is ready for this season. Share it with everyone in your household.
- Connect with your community:** Share these tips with neighbours, friends, and local groups. The more people who are prepared, the safer we all are.
- Stay informed:** Monitor fire danger ratings and local alerts. Sign up for notifications on the Emergency WA app so you're always up to date.
- Reach out for support:** If you need help or resources, contact your local Community Preparedness Advisor or the DFES Community Preparedness Directorate <https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/hazard-information/bushfire/prepare>

Burning is prohibited on days where the Fire Danger Rating is 'High' or above unless authorised by a Fire Weather Officer.

Burning is Prohibited during the Easter period, dated 3 – 6 April 2026.

Keep Your Home Mozzie-Free This Summer

With warmer weather comes an increase in mosquito activity, and many people are surprised to learn that the biggest breeding grounds may be right in their own backyards. Mosquitoes only need a small amount of still water to lay their eggs, and they will use anything from fresh to salty water. Common hiding places include pot plant drip trays, ponds, pet bowls, old tyres, roof gutters and even items of rubbish that collect rainwater.

The good news is that you can significantly reduce mosquito numbers around your home by following a few simple steps:

- Remove standing water: Empty or throw away containers and rubbish that may hold water.
- Clean roof gutters: Blocked gutters create perfect pools for breeding.
- Refresh outdoor water: Empty, clean and refill birdbaths, stock troughs and pet bowls at least once a week.
- Maintain your pool: Keep swimming pools clean, filtered and free of leaf litter.
- Clear wading pools daily: Empty wading pools at the end of each day.
- Use fish in ponds: Fish help control mosquito larvae naturally.
- Cover large water openings: Fit mosquito-proof mesh to rainwater tanks, septic openings, wells and similar
- Trim vegetation: Keep the edges of dams and ponds free of dense plants, and mow lawns regularly to reduce mosquito resting sites.

By taking these steps, you can help protect your household and contribute to reducing mosquito numbers across the community.





Crowden Street/Henry Street Intersection Modifications

The Council has endorsed a streetscape upgrade for Crowden Street, which will include the planting of street trees, installation of street furniture, and alignment of the eastern end between Taylor Street and East Terrace. These works are intended to enhance the overall amenity of the area and provide a more welcoming pedestrian entry to the Tambellup Sports Ground.

As part of these improvements, the Shire is also reviewing the current traffic arrangements at the intersection of Crowden Street and Henry Street. Historically, Henry Street was the priority road into the town centre from Gnowangerup–Tambellup Road. Following modifications to the five-way intersection at Taylor Street / Henry Street / George Street, the eastern end of Henry Street was converted into a cul-de-sac; however, traffic signage at the Henry Street / Crowden Street intersection was not updated to reflect this change.

To better align the signage with the existing road layout and improve safety and functionality, it is proposed that Crowden Street be designated as the priority road, with give way signage relocated to Henry Street.

The streetscape plan for Crowden St showing the proposed modifications is available for inspection at the Shire Administration Offices, and on the Shire's website at <https://www.shirebt.wa.gov.au> under 'Shire Plans'.
