

TOPICS

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the outgoing Editor of Topics, Kristy Boyle, for all her work over the past 10 years to bring community news and events to all residents in the Shire and surrounding districts through BT Times and Topics. Kristy has decided it is time to pass on the baton and Topics will now be fully produced by staff at the Tambellup CRC. We wish Kristy well for her next challenge!

FROM THE DECEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

- Council appointed Cr Monica Nazzari and Cr Carl Letter as the Shire's delegate and proxy respectively to the Tambellup Business Centre Committee.
- Council approved an amendment to previous planning consent provided to CBH for grain storage bulkheads constructed on Lot 2 Nardlah Rd subject to conditions.
- Council granted planning consent for the development of a carport/shed at Lot 542 Reilly Rd subject to conditions.
- Council granted planning consent for the use and development of a machinery shed at Lot 2535 Paul Valley Rd subject to conditions.
- Council agreed to make a contribution of \$500 in support of the Lions Cancer Institute 'Special Children's Christmas Big Day Out'.
- Council adopted the Strategic Community Plan 2018-2028 following the completion of a four week public comment period.
- Following consideration of a concept design provided, Council granted permission for the Tambellup Pavilion
 Advisory Committee to construct a playground at the Tambellup Community Pavilion.
- Council granted planning approval for the use and development of a caretakers dwelling on Lot 253
 Broomehill-Gnowangerup Rd subject to conditions.

WORKS

With most works staff taking leave over the Christmas and New Year period, the works program has been a little reduced, however those staff still working were able to cover day to day requirements, as well as make progress with ongoing jobs.

Construction works on Warrenup Rd and Pallinup Rd have been completed and are now ready to seal when contractors are in the area. A rocky outcrop at the intersection of Warrenup Rd and Tambellup West Rd has delayed work to improve sight lines at this site, however it is expected this will be resolved by the end of January, allowing works to continue. Line marking was completed on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Tambellup West Rd and Gnowangerup-Tambellup prior to Christmas, and the upgrade of the footpath on Garrity St from Tambellup West Rd to the Tambellup Hotel is nearing completion. Asphalting of the path and site clean-up was completed in January and replacement of trees removed will take place when the weather is kinder to new plantings. Contractors were also engaged to complete repairs to Tambellup West Rd near the Great Southern Highway intersection.

Parks and gardens staff have been dealing with seasonal tasks centred mainly on ensuring our ovals and public spaces are watered efficiently to cope with dry conditions. The extreme winds experienced late in January kept the maintenance crew running for a few days, responding to calls of trees on roads across the Shire. We thank you for your assistance in getting roads cleared.

The maintenance graders covered a wide area during December and January, with the following roads graded: Chillicup Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Nardlah Rd, Norrish Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Tieline North Rd, Beejenup Rd, Clinic Rd, Hillman Rd, Cemetery Rd, Morgan Rd, McGuire Rd, Nelson Rd, Spencer Rd, Reilly Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, North West Rd, Burridge Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Yetermerup Rd, Witham Rd, Saggers St.

CLEARING OF FENCELINES ON ROAD VERGES

Landowners are reminded that prior to clearing fence lines on land adjoining a road reserve, it is a legal requirement that the site is inspected by the Local Government. If you are contemplating fencing works along a road where clearing of vegetation will be required, please contact the Manager of Works on 0418 955642 to arrange for an inspection to be completed.

SHIRE STAFF CHANGES

We would like to welcome Justin Lennox to the Shire team. Justin, who commenced early in January in the position of Plant Operator/General Hand, brings a range of local government and industry experience to the works crew and has settled in well. Welcome Justin!

We also welcome Year 11 Katanning SHS student Cora Bliss, who will be commencing a Workplace Learning placement with Shire administration staff in February. Cora participated in Workplace Learning at the Shire in the second half of 2018 and as part of the 2019 placement she will complete a Cert II in Business. We look forward to teaching her everything we know!

We are also pleased to advise that advertising will close on 31 January 2019 for the appointment of a mechanical apprentice to the Shire, to work alongside and learn from our mechanic Sammy Oclarit. The new position was an outcome of the review of the Shire's Workforce Plan, along with the intention to take on trainees at various times within both the administration and works areas. We anticipate the position will attract a good number of applicants, and we look forward to welcoming a new staff member in the near future.

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup has partnered with six shires in the region to secure State and Federal funding of almost \$12.6 million that will see 52 homes constructed across the region over the next twelve months. The Great Southern Housing Initiative will deliver key worker housing, independent living seniors units and Government employee housing in eleven communities, including Broomehill and Tambellup. The project is valued in excess of \$22.0 million.

The Shire has worked collaboratively with the Shires of Kojonup, Cranbrook, Jerramungup, Gnowangerup, Katanning and Kent to secure the external funding for the project, through the Federal Government's Building Better Regions Fund (\$10.0 million) and the State Government's Regional Aged Accommodation Program (\$2.6 million). The project has also required a significant cash and in-kind contribution from each of the partner Councils.

For the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, deliverables are as follows:

- · Four independent living units to be constructed in Broomehill
- . Two self-contained chalets to be located at the Broomehill Caravan Park
- Two key worker homes to be constructed in Broomehill
- One key worker home to be constructed in Tambellup
- Three Government employee homes to be constructed in Tambellup

Suitable blocks in each of the townsites have been identified, and Council will be embarking on the design and tender process in coming weeks. Several Shire houses have been earmarked to be sold once construction of the new homes is complete.

This project is a significant milestone for many of our smaller communities and will assist in bringing housing stock available for key workers and Government employees in particular to a higher standard than is currently available. The expansion of the Shire's independent living housing stock into Broomehill also provides local seniors with the option to downsize while still remaining within their community. We look forward to the commencement of construction.

BROOMEHILL INDEPENDENT LIVING SENIORS UNITS

As noted previously, one of the deliverables of the Great Southern Housing Initiative is the construction of four 2bedroom units suitable for independently living seniors, in Broomehill. It is intended that the units will be available on a rental basis. Eligibility considerations have not yet been finalised but are expected to include age (55/65 years+) and the ability to live independently, and means testing will apply to two of the units.

While the completion of construction is some way off, we are seeking expressions of interest from residents of the Shire who may be interested in occupying one of the new units. Allocation of units will be determined closer to completion, however if you, or someone you know, are interested, we encourage you to contact Pam Hull at the Shire on 9825 3555.

ANZAC TOWNSCAPE PLANS


Council has resolved to review the adopted townscape plans for the area around the ANZAC memorial in Tambellup.

Current plans allow for a minor relocation of the war memorial and redevelopment of the area with planter boxes and paving. These plans form part of the adopted Townscape plans.

The new plans are similar to the adopted plans, however, it is proposed to move the memorial a further 7 metres to allow for an expanded area for memorial services. The memorial will be located further away from the road edge, with an 'ANZAC Square' being developed between the road edge and the relocated memorial. The memorial will also located on a higher plinth or base. Planter boxes with rosemary and roses will be located on either side of the memorial, and a rising sun motif will be laid in the paving to better recognise the significance of the memorial. Sketches have been developed to conceptually show the changes.

Council is seeking public comment on the changes to the memorial space, and comment can be made until the end of February 2019. The adopted plans and the concept sketches are available from the Shire offices in Tambellup and Broomehill. HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

During summer, a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- Harvest Ban Hotline phone 9825 1042. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans
 and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you
 could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 9825 3555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you
 would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- Radio broadcasts ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle
 movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is
 available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely
 on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer contact details are noted above.
- And if all else fails make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

Located in Taylor Street Tambellup, Sandalwood Villas offers secure, contemporary accommodation for people aged 55 and over. Entry to the complex is via remote controlled, electronic gates. Each of the six villas has two bedrooms plus an office/study/craft room and an open kitchen/dining/lounge area with reverse cycle air conditioning. Two villas have a fully accessible bathroom and the remaining four have an ensuite to the main bedroom (with an additional access door) and a second, separate toilet and hand basin. Construction is of brick/fibro cladding and tin and a communal gazebo and garden is centrally located behind the entrance area.

DID YOU KNOW...

Speak to your children as if they are the wisest, kindest, most beautiful and magical humans on Earth,

For what they believe, is what they will become!

For children to be able to learn to listen, focus and follow directions as they grow, they need to develop their **proprioception** and **vestibular sense**.

Proprioception is knowing where different body parts are without looking. It helps your child move their body effectively.

 When a child does not have good proprioception they may avoid touch, be a picky eater, appear lethargic or clumsy, have difficulty running, jumping and climbing, kick, bite, hit or chew on fingers, clothing or pencils.

A child's vestibular sense provides them with information about where their body is in relation to the surroundings.

 When a child does not have a good vestibular sense, they may fidget, get frustrated, have poor balance and fall over, become aggressive, get too close to people and struggle with focusing and listening

ACTIVITIES WHICH CAN HELP TO DEVELOP THE PROPRIOCETION AND VESTIBULAR SENSE

- Carrying and Lifting Boxes
- Jumping on a trampoline
- Kneading playdough
- Animal walks

- Having a massage or a bear hug
- Chewing on crunchy foods apples, carrots
- *Swinging
- *Hanging upside down
- *Balancing on a beam or a pool noodle
- *Climbing

Tambellup, you are a rare kind of generous

PETER CAREY & ROSE DUCKETT

Thank-you friends and neighbours for your extraordinary gift

FOREWORD:

This story is about the privilege of living in a small community where support and loyalty at our time of adversity was breath-takingly extraordinary.

It began on Sunday 2nd December. Peter was driving to one of his paddocks to begin the first day of harvesting Canola. It's a 15km drive away from the house. But he never made it.

He'd smashed into the back of a huge chaser-bin, which was being towed behind a tractor some 6kms away, on Nymbup Road. Peter was alive, but was trapped inside the ute, which had come to a stop in the bank of the roadside ravine. Help was on its way and farmers were already arriving at the scene.

The narrow road had been cordoned off by a police car with lights flashing, behind which was an ambulance and many utes. A dramatic and busy scene for such an isolated, gravel road in the middle of nowhere. Familiar faces were all around, including the focused volunteer ambulance crew who in normal times are friends; it brought a lump to my throat.

A couple of those friendly faces approached, their voices quiet, respectful. I held my breath as their arms embraced and began to fear the worst. Instead they were shielding the visual impact of seeing Peter's crumpled body trapped inside the ute. The VFES crew meanwhile, were busy planning how to carry Peter's heavy body up the side of the ditch to the level roadside. All so surreal.

It didn't make sense that he could possibly slam straight into the back of a highly visible chaser-bin on an empty stretch of road. The police calculated that he was travelling at high speed at the point of impact. The ute had then bounced off the bin and speed down the ravine, coming to a stop in the damp earth near the trunk of a tree. He was lucky to survive and furthermore, without a single scratch on his body.

Peter never speeds on unmade roads, friends in fact have a smirk about it, so we were all convinced that he must have fallen unconscious before hitting the bin.

The police then explained that when a person falls unconscious sitting behind the wheel of a car, their feet automatically push forward and line up with their legs, explaining the speed of the ute on impact.

The ambulance raced Peter to Katanning Hospital. After hours of tests we were told that his kidneys had totally collapsed, that he would ve been unconscious before the accident happened and without help, he simply would have died within three hours. He'd have to fly to Perth via the Flying Doctors for urgent dialysis treatment. I promised to stay at the farm and somehow get the harvesting done but typically, as farmers do, Peter stubbornly insisted on not even changing out of his work clobber to put on his hospital gown, as he had crucial work to do and wasn't going anywhere! Justin Taylor, who'd driven me to the hospital, came to the rescue and forcefully insisted "farmer-to farmer" that Peter was indeed going to Perth, no negotiation! The plane flew out just on dusk.

COMMUNITY:

Alone in the waiting room, and unbeknownst to me, Justin planned how to get Peter's harvesting done for him by calling in the community to help.

It was almost dark by the time we drove back to Tambellup. As we passed the farm, we spotted in the distance Justin's brother Cam, driving Peter's tractor, harvesting! I couldn't believe my eyes; Justin sat beside me, grinning. There are simply no words to tell you what that moment felt like!

Under the leadership of Jarrod Thorn, the men put together all their years of experience and organized a suitable day to muster their mighty harvesters and equipment, and make one mammoth effort to harvest the entire Canola crop in a matter of hours!.... Hours? How could that be possible? Amazing! I called everyone, the "Mighty Angels".

Paddocks were allotted for each team and road trains and trucks were booked to pick up the grain continuously.

Quite accidentally, I was told about a surprise, which was also happening behind the scenes. Fiona Thorn and Vicki Green had decided to have a huge cook-up, and provide everyone with delicious country fair! I was breath-taken by their generosity and goodwill. No words can be found to thank them enough!

There was a sense of excitement in the air.

Peter in the meantime was not travelling well; he suffered a huge seizure soon after arriving in Perth. This dangerously delayed preparing him for dialysis. And worse, all the delays had enabled the kidney's toxins to continue spreading and had begun to affect his brain. The future looked precarious.

His adult children who live in Perth rallied round him, taking turns at the hospital almost round the clock, I commuted back and forth every few days while holding the fort at home. Constantly in touch, we all worked as a well-oiled machine.

When the harvesting plans were all in place I then raced to Perth for a few days and told Peter that it was all happening at the farm. He was so ill, but this extraordinary news was the best gift, he was simply overwhelmed. The stress lifted from his shoulders, it gave him the courage to fight on. How generous country neighbours are prepared to be for a mate in trouble.

Bad weather however held back the first harvest attempt, so another day had to be arranged. This presented a bit of a challenge as the farmers now needed to begin their own harvests. Jarrod came to the fore yet again, and worked with everyone to fix a new date. So the equipment rumbled in and it began.

Being in Perth once more, I wasn't able to describe to Peter what was happening in his paddocks. But there for us again were the mighty "Tambellup Angels"; photos continuously arrived describing every adventure. The line-up of the five harvesters, tractors and chaser bins looked somewhat like the farming section at the Royal Show!

There was a real sense of camaraderie - an unusual opportunity of getting together as a community with a mission. Admiring each other's harvesters was a great beginning to the day before heading off to their allotted paddocks. And just as planned, the bulk of the crop was indeed harvested on that one day!



GOOD NEWS: At the hospital, Peter's dialysis treatments had begun and his condition quickly improved. A biopsy was taken and the doctors said that the result had surprised them. Peter's kidneys weren't diseased at all; instead they'd collapsed because he was allergic to a prescription drug, Naprosyn, a commonly prescribed non-steroid drug for pain & inflammation. It had been gradually poisoning the body until his kidneys collapsed, thus causing him to fall unconscious behind the wheel. They concluded therefore, that his condition was "potentially reversible".

A somewhat controversial and radical treatment was offered to him. A large quantity of Steroids to be administered while followed by smaller doses for the next 3 months. If it worked, he would be able to fully recover without ever needing dialysis again. If it didn't dialysis every other day, would become his way of life.

He underwent this treatment and it has completely worked thus far. So Peter managed to walk out of hospital, just before Xmas, a free man. Now, apart from quietly recuperating, which doesn't suit this obstinate farmer one little bit, there's a new future ahead. Time to walk forward - so look out!

This has been a truly humbling experience for Peter and I. Being members of our small Tambellup Community is such an honour, a powerful bond; never taken for granted.

Note: Peter says that it was so comforting to see these people, friends, dressed in their uniforms, so centred, while professionally carrying out their duties. It's one of the only memories he has of that day.

"Have just returned from a paddock where the Green's family harvesters and bins had turned up as a surprise, to give it one last shot to finish harvesting the wheat crop for us before Xmas. Just astounding!

Brett Green drove, together with Brian Taylor and Bob Devlin using Peter's equipment. All looking weary, faces sooty with dust - it'd been a long day. (Peter & Bob share-cropped the wheat; he too, must be mightily relieved it's all but over)


Peter sat under a tree in the paddock, watching. I've brought him home to rest.

How amazingly re-energising it is, to see genuine community here again; there's real joy in the air. So nice, when everybody's busy preparing for their Xmas's.

Xmas Eve tomorrow and our harvesting will truly be over! Can't believe it! What a relief! Hearts of gold; we'll always remember. Peter can finally rest easy and just concentrate on getting better. Sleep tight little Tambellup, a job well done!"

A small crowd attended the Australia Day flag raising ceremony at the Tambellup Bowling Club.


Wendy Bradshaw won the meatpack at the spider. Her blue bowl rolled unheeded through the chaos to finish very close to the jack.






