Congratulations to Dr Paul Genoni for jointly winning the 2019 Prime Minister's Literary Award for Non-fiction.

He was presented with the prestigious award in Parliament House by the Prime Minister, Mr Scott Morrison in October.

Paul co-authored with Tanya Dalziell the book "Half The Perfect World – Writers, Dreamers and Drifters on Hydra, 1955-1964" The book is about a community of expats from around the world who all call Hydra their home and includes several great Australian writers. FROM THE NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

• Council endorsed the dates for Ordinary Council meetings for 2020, as follows:

20 February 19 March 16 April 21 May 18 June 16 July 20 August 17 September 15 October

19 November 18 December (Friday)

All meetings are scheduled to start at 4.30pm, in the Tambellup Council Chambers unless otherwise advertised. Members of the public are welcome to attend any meeting of Council.

- Council agreed to renew the lease agreement with Great Southern Community Financial Services Ltd for the occupancy of 36 Norrish St Tambellup.
- Council granted planning consent to G Carter for the use and development of Lot 23 India Street Broomehill for advertising signage, subject to conditions.
- Council agreed to amend the 2019/20 Budget to increase operational expenditure for the Broomehill Museum by \$16,000 to undertake internal painting, repair flooring and installation of internal and external electrical power outlets. A transfer from the Building Maintenance Reserve of \$16,000 will fund this maintenance.
- Council considered a request to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) rating for sections of Beejenup Road, Birt Road, Bridge Street, Curnow Road, Donald Street, Gillespie Road, Norrish Road, North West Road, Nymbup Road, O'Neill Road, Peter Valley Road and Stirling Access Road to a RAV category 4. Council also considered a request to amend the RAV rating for sections Beejenup Road and Eureka Road; Broomehill-Kojonup Road, Fairfield Road, Flat Rocks Road, Heron Road, Journal Street, Marshall Road, Ngopitchup Road, North Nookanellup Road, Old Broomehill-Kojonup Road, Punchmirup North Road, Tieline North Road, Toolbrunup Road, White Road and Yetemerup Road to a RAV category 7. Upgrading the RAV Ratings on these roads will allow for a better connected network where the minimum RAV Rating within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup will be RAV 4 (excluding 3 minor access roads to private property). The roads proposed to be amended to RAV 7 will provide for future freight transport and harvest periods in conjunction with the newly introduced Harvest Mass Management Scheme (HMMS). This allows continuity of the RAV Network from neighbouring shires and direct pathing through the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup. Council will advise Main Roads WA that it supports the requests subject to conditions, with any upgrades or improvements required to the roads to be approved by the Shire, and constructed to Shire and Main Roads standards.
- Council considered submissions received for the construction of the Broomehill Central Fire Brigade building and determined to award the tender to RM Smith & Sons.

WORKS

Sealing on Flat Rocks Rd, McGuire Rd, Morgan Rd, and patches on Broomehill-Kojonup Rd and Tieline Rd was completed in November. The construction crew has moved over to Pallinup Rd, where preparations are well underway for stabilising of a 4km section prior to sealing. Clearing has been completed, culverts have been extended or replaced where required, and all gravel has been carted to the site. People travelling on Pallinup Rd are asked to proceed with caution and observe traffic direction on site.

Sand, gravel and rocks have been supplied to the various housing sites in both towns, and sand has been stockpiled in Broomehill prior to the start of the construction of the new fire station.

Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads through November: Chillicup Rd, Etna Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Beejenup Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Marshall Rd, Palomar Rd, Ngopitchup Rd, Simpson Rd, Birt Rd, Warrenup Rd, Witham Rd, Parnell Rd, Moore Rd, Grahams Well Rd, Komani Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Crosby Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Hilder Rd.

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

Work on the six houses and four independent living units continues, with great progress being made. Of the houses in Tambellup, it is anticipated that two will be completed by the end of December, and the remaining two by the end of January. In Broomehill, it is anticipated the houses on the University Block will be completed in February, and the independent living units should be complete by the end of January. We appreciate the efforts of all the contractors, trades and other parties in assisting us to meet the stringent timeframes set down in the funding agreements.



CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Friday 20 December 2019** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Thursday 2 January 2020**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period. Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 20 December 2019. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on **Thursday 26 December** and **Thursday 2 January**. The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on **Thursday 26 December and Thursday 9 January**. Contractors have requested that bins be put out earlier than normal, as they may be running early.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Summer is here, harvest is underway, and a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- **Harvest Ban Hotline phone 98251042**. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- Radio broadcasts ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer contact details are noted above.
- And if all else fails make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

EMERGENCY WA

Emergency WA (<u>www.emergency.wa.gov.au</u>) is the State's official website for community warnings and other emergency management information for bushfires, storms, cyclones, floods and other emergency situations. The site provides real time updates on emergency warnings and incidents across the state, as well as information on preparing and recovering from and emergency situation. One to bookmark!

With the end of school Term on the 19th December, the groups will go into recess for the summer holidays and resume in Term One in 2020.

We want to thank our fabulous volunteers for their splendid work during 2019. We are so fortunate to be part of this wonderful community, and the care and kindness around Lynthia's illness and then her passing has helped us as we adapt to her loss.

November was a busy month for Tambellup Police. We received numerous reports of Burglary and Damage relating to incidents within the Tambellup Town site. Sadly two of these incidents were at the old Tambellup Train Station where three and then a further eight windows were smashed. In addition to this we recovered a vehicle that was stolen from the rear of the old Tambellup General Store, and seized a quad bike in accordance with the 'Hoon' legislation.

The results to stem from the stated incidents –

- Two juvenile females charged with Aggravated Burglary and multiple counts of Criminal Damage
- One juvenile male charged with Reckless Driving
- Two juvenile males charged with Disorderly Behaviour
- Three adult males charged with Trespass and one charged with Steal Motor Vehicle
- One adult male charged with No Authority to Drive and Possess Drug Paraphernalia

If you are reading this and have children in town, please remind them how serious the offence of Criminal Damage is -

Criminal Damage, section 444 of the Criminal Code, is essentially a wilful damage (intended consequence), as opposed to Unlawful Damage, section 445 of the Criminal Code, where damage occurs without there being any intention for the damage to occur. Criminal Damage is listed as a Schedule 2 offence in the Young Offenders Act, which basically means police <u>cannot</u> caution for the offence. It will be a date with the magistrate if one of your kids smashes a window with a rock for example.

There has been keen interest from external agencies like the Department of Education to work proactively with us to help reduce the risk to young people and the wider community in Tambellup. We have submitted several risk concerns through to the Department for Communities, Education and Housing and we seek public support to let our fellow agencies know we need their help to move forward. Education has been very supportive and are currently working to tackle truancy.

We're issuing rare, but well deserved merit awards to the most improved young person, boys and girls, in Tambellup each month. If you'd like to nominate someone, let us know!

I just wanted to update local residents on the crash that occurred just north of Tambellup on 24 October. Local resident Kevin DAWSON is making a slow but steady recovery, which is great news!

I wish to wrap it up by sharing some of my family history with you, and at the same time thank local resident Elizabeth HAMS for reminding me where I came from. My Great Grandmother was Dorothy MOIR who married my Great Grandfather Captain Forrest HUMBLE. Dorothy, born at Cape Riche was the last daughter of John MOIR and Amelia COOPER. I've generally had more focus on the history of the HUMBLE family, but have discovered that the MOIR's and their descendants are prominent in this part of the world. According to Elizabeth I'm no doubt related to many people in and around Tambellup and throughout the wider Great Southern. Well who'd of thought!!

Tambellup Volunteer Fire & Emergency Service

Aside from attending incidents, either as the primary responder or in support of surrounding brigades, members take the opportunity to brush up on the skills required. Recently, we made short work of a wreck in the backyard of G & T Motors – with all members having a go on the tools. It's quite amazing that a tool such as the parrot beak cutters, that can slice through metal like butter, and produce such raw results, can do it so quietly! But – all the better for assisting people trapped after a motor vehicle crash. We also combined with the Gnowangerup SES to conduct a night exercise, in stabilising a rolled vehicle using hand winches and searching for 'casualties' who had wandered away from the vehicle. Training scenarios are developed to be as realistic as possible, and vehicles and casualties are put into a variety of positions and locations to encourage members to consider the best approach. Aside from the learning aspect of these sessions, they are also good fun and an opportunity to get to know our neighbours better – after all, these are the people we will most likely work alongside at a live incident.

DFES has a new volunteer recruitment campaign underway at present – you may have seen the 'Get Behind the Frontline' ads on TV in recent weeks. The focus of the campaign is that behind every operational team there is a crew made up of operational and non-operational volunteers who keep the brigades and units running. This is an important message as it's acknowledged that not all volunteers wish to be on the frontline. 
Year 4 Fed Cup Excursion

Water Supply in a Bushfire This information could save your life.

If you plan to stay and defend your home you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. Scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure and cuts to electricity. Experience shows that when there is extreme demand water supply and pressure are at risk.

Farmers and researchers sharing knowledge on productive grazing systems for saltland

Gillamii Centre, based in Cranbrook have begun to revitalise farmer interest in productive grazing of saltland across the agricultural regions. Early in 2019 Gillamii group received State NRM funding for a 3-year partnership project to provide extension and some targeted research activities with all other grower groups in the agricultural region. The project is entitled: Regenerative farming systems for saline landscapes in WA.





The project has in-kind support from research and development officers from DPIRD and CSIRO at both an organisational and technical capacity.

A number of activities are under way including the completion of the first in a series of seven interactive hands-on practical 1.5-day workshops targeting farmers and grower group advisers.

The first workshop run as a 'pilot', held in mid-October 2019, and hosted by Gillamii at the Cranbrook Sports Club. Farmers from across the Great Southern and from Bindi-Bindi in the north to Jerramungup in the south participated and provided excellent feedback on the knowledge gained. The workshop 'trainers' included DPIRD and CSIRO researchers sharing new knowledge with the practical experiences of local farmers and visiting existing improved saltland pasture systems.

Farmer participants reported their priorities were primarily to optimise plant water-use and vegetative cover on their saltland and as such reduce the further impact of salinity. They reported that the improvements in grazing productivity on saltland were secondary though important.

As a learning activity, participants worked in groups and visited a local farm where they applied the saltland mapping techniques with the new knowledge from the research to plan the revegetation of a 1000-hectare salt affected portion of the farm.

Each group then presented their proposal to the farmer and the research team, which enabled a greater understanding of the practical implementation as well as providing some excellent technical input for the future restoration of the farm itself.

As a direct result of the workshop, first steps have begun to revegetate the 1000-ha local study site, also formulation of some local trial works, and further similar workshops are being developed for 2020 in Jerramungup and Esperance.
