The next meeting of Council will be held on <u>Thursday 17 October 2019 commencing at 4.30pm</u> in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### **LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS – 19 OCTOBER 2019**

The nomination period for the 2019 Council elections opened on 5 September and closed on 12 September 2019. Nominations for the three vacancies were received from incumbent Cr Michael White, and new candidates Steve Penny and Doug Barritt. At the close of nominations, all three were elected unopposed for a four year term expiring in 2023. Congratulations are extended to Michael, Steve and Doug for their commitment to our community. The new (and returning) Councillors will be sworn in at a Special Meeting of Council to be held on Monday 21 October 2019 at 4.30pm. Residents are welcome to attend this meeting to witness the swearing in ceremony.

Retiring Councillors Scott Thompson and Garry Sheridan did not seek re-election this year. Both Scott and Garry were inaugural Councillors of the new Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup in 2008, and since that time have performed their roles, as Councillors and subsequently Shire Presidents, in an exemplary manner. As the organisation has grown and matured, both have worked extremely well with their fellow Councillors and staff, to achieve great outcomes for the Shire and our communities. We sincerely thank Scott and Garry for their service to their community and the wider region and wish them well.

#### FROM THE SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

Council granted rates concessions to the Tambellup Golf Club and the Tambellup Business Centre for the 2019/2020 financial year. The Tambellup Golf Club provides a facility that is available to all members of the community, and is used regularly throughout the year by both Club members and non-members. The club is the only sporting organisation within Broomehill-Tambellup that has Shire rate levied against it. The Tambellup Business Centre is a not for profit organisation that provides storage and office facilities for businesses as well as start-up assistance for new businesses. The Business Centre is unique in this area and is managed by a volunteer committee made up of local and regional members, on which Council currently holds a position. Rubbish charges are still payable by both organisations.

Council approved a request from the Tambellup Family Playgroup Inc. for the use of the Tambellup Infant Health Clinic at no cost, and will enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the group to formalise this arrangement.

Council granted planning consent for an application lodged by Lotterywest for the use and development of Lot 15 (28) Norrish Street for signage

Council granted planning consent to PEP Home Improvements for the use and development of Lot 63 Garrity Street, Tambellup for the installation of a shade sail.

Council granted planning consent to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for the use and development of Lot 22 Taylor Street Tambellup for two Grouped Dwellings, and for the use and development of Reserve 6730 Lot 9 Morgan Road Broomehill for four Grouped Dwellings, in accordance with the submitted plans. Council also granted planning consent to the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup for the use and development of Lot 8 Taylor Street Tambellup, Lot 384 Parnell Street Tambellup, Lot 5 Lathom Street Broomehill, and Lot 12 Leven Street Broomehill for single dwellings in accordance with the submitted plans. Council acknowledged that under the Town Planning Schemes, planning consent was not required for the single dwellings or the grouped dwellings on Reserve 6730 (Broomehill Caravan Park) however this was granted for transparency and consistency.

Council considered and supported a proposal to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle Network Rating of Morgan Road and Janus Street to RAV Network 4 subject conditions.

Council considered and supported a proposal to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle Network Rating of Tambellup West Road to RAV Tandem Drive Concessional Network 7.3 subject to conditions.

#### WORKS

A break in the weather early in September allowed for the treatment of the excavated site at Lot 22 Taylor St to be completed, and the backfill, compaction and carting of sand to the site for building pads was finished by mid-September, which allowed the building contractors to start work. During this process, the works crew was also carting sand to the building site in Broomehill for the construction of the independent living units. Work has commenced to reconstruct and seal a four kilometre stretch of Pallinup Rd. This is a Roads to Recovery

funded job. Roadside vegetation clearing has been completed along Toolbrunup Rd. This is a Roads to Recovery

The rain received during August and September provided optimum conditions for maintenance grading. Roads graded during September included: West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, North Greenhills Rd, Norrish Rd,

Etna Rd, Batchelor North Rd, Thompson Rd, Palomar Rd, Marshall Rd, Fletcher Rd, Bignell Rd, South Batchelor Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Nymbup Rd, Pootenup Rd, Bessen Rd, Brown Rd, Peter Valley Rd.

The parks and gardens crew completed a 'backyard blitz' on the gardens surrounding the Broomehill Recreational Complex building to freshen them up before the Complex's 30<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration held on 13<sup>th</sup> September. Staff were pleased to receive positive feedback on their efforts, and will be completing this area in coming weeks with installation of new reticulation.

The townscaping program has recommenced in Tambellup, with new paving being laid on Norrish St. The new pavers are a mocha colour, and complement the surroundings. Kerbing replacement along the section from Crowden St to Henry St will be completed in coming weeks.

#### RESTRICTED ACCESS VEHICLE NETWORK CHANGES

The Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Network is a system which is governed by Main Roads WA, to control and monitor heavy vehicle access on roads across the state. This is to ensure that heavy vehicles are only utilising roads that are appropriately constructed to ensure the safety of all road users. The Shire is often asked to provide comment on proposals to amend the RAV of particular roads in the Shire, to meet the needs predominantly of the agricultural sector in moving grain, stock and other commodities around the Shire. Support or otherwise is only provided after staff have carried out an assessment of the road in question, and consideration by Council.

Over the past six months a number of roads in the Shire have had their RAV rating amended, as per the table below. More information can be found on the Main Roads website, however all residents should be aware the configuration of heavy vehicles using these roads, particularly through harvest, may have changed with a resulting increase in traffic. Please drive with caution at all times.

#### **MOSQUITOES**

And they're back! Mosquitoes are always an issue in our Shire during spring and early summer. Residents are advised that a mosquito fogging program will commence in the townsites before the end of September and will be carried out as weather conditions allow.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health has advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self-draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.

#### GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INTIATIVE

The final building contracts were signed during September, with the tender for the construction of the two houses in Broomehill awarded to Countryside Homes. Work will commence on site at the University block in coming weeks.

Work on all other houses is proceeding well, with no major issues reported. In Tambellup, contractors are using the old Bowling Club to be able to stay onsite, and in Broomehill, the Shire has granted permission for the contractors working on the Independent Living Units to locate a couple of accommodation units at the Broomehill Caravan Park. These arrangements have significantly cut travel times and costs for the workers, for the Shire's benefit.

All houses are well progressed. The photos below were taken midway through September, and a significant amount of work has been completed since then. The Lot 22 Taylor St site was handed over to the builders immediately after the backfill of the excavation was completed, and concrete pads were laid within the week.

#### COMMUNITY PERCEPTIONS SURVEY RESULTS

In March and April this year residents of the Shire were invited to participate in the Community Scorecard, a survey which was aimed at benchmarking community perceptions around the Shire's performance across many areas of operation. The survey was mailed to all households in the Shire, and was also available for completion online.

The results of the survey have been collated and analysed by Catalyse Pty Ltd, an independent company providing strategic planning and research services. The responses were measured in two ways – by community perception (using a 5 point scale from excellent to terrible) and by Catalyse Pty Ltd industry standard (vs state, vs region).

118 responses were received (33% of households in the Shire, and a little over 10% of population). In summary:

Council discussed the results at the September Council meeting. It was noted that the focus areas were also raised as priorities at community consultation workshops in 2018, which informed the development of the Community Strategic Plan 2018-2028. These issues have been factored into the Shire's 2018-2022 Corporate Business Plan, with actions assigned.

The Community Scorecard report provides an in depth view of the community's satisfaction with Council services, and provides a benchmark for reporting progress towards the outcomes of the Strategic Community Plan. The report will be available on the Shire's website for anyone interested in viewing.

#### NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup wishes to advise all residents that a section of Norrish St, Tambellup will be closed to all traffic on **SATURDAY 5 OCTOBER 2019**, for the purpose of the staging of the Tambellup Community Markets. The section which will be closed is from Crowden St (at the Post Office) to Henry St (at the Ambulance Centre), with the closure in effect from 7.00am – 2.00pm on this day. #### RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are reminded the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2019**. From this date you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires, and all conditions of the permit must be complied with. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager, Cindy Pearce. Contact details for Brigades are as follows:

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2019**. No burning is permitted from this date until **14 FEBRUARY 2020**.

### BUSHFIRE HAZARD REDUCTION – RESIDENTIAL, SPECIAL RURAL AND RURAL RESIDENTIAL LAND

All landowners in the Residential, Special Rural and Rural Residential zoned areas of the Shire, are reminded of the need to comply with the following requirements of the Fire Break Order:

#### 1.0 LAND ZONED RESIDENTIAL, TOWN CENTRE, INDUSTRIAL (Townsite land)

During the period from 31st October 2019 to 15th April 2020 inclusive you shall have firebreaks in the following positions:

**1.1** On land which is 4000 square metres (one acre) or less in area, you shall remove all flammable material from the whole of the land, except live standing trees.

#### 1.2 Land which exceeds 4000 square metres

On land which is 4000 sq metres (1 acre) or more in area, clear firebreaks not less than 2 metres completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land. The height of all grass on the land is to be less than 150mm in height.

#### 2.0 LAND ZONED RURAL RESIDENTIAL/SPECIAL RURAL (Townsite and Suburban areas)

During the period from 31st October 2019 to 15th April 2020 inclusive you shall have firebreaks in the following positions:

**2.1** Clear firebreaks not less than **2 metres** completely surrounding and not more than **20 metres** from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land.

Minimise fire hazardous material to the satisfaction of the Chief Fire Control Officer by stocking, slashing or other means. The height of all grass on the land is to be less than 150mm in height. Properties will be inspected and orders may be issued.

Over the past few years the management of a number of Special Rural and Rural Residential blocks by owners/ occupiers to comply with this requirement has resulted in less than satisfactory outcomes. This year the Shire will be conducting inspections to ensure all Special Rural and Rural Residential zoned properties comply and maintain compliance throughout the required period. The Shire has power under the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to issue infringements and/or have the work required undertaken by a contractor at the owners expense if compliance is not achieved. We encourage all owners with land in Special Rural and Rural Residential areas to assess what they need to do to be compliant, undertake these works and monitor their land for bushfire hazards during the fire season. Residents are reminded that all dog and cat registrations are due for renewal on <u>31 October</u> each year. Notification will be sent to owners of dogs and cats with registration expiring in 2019. Payment for re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. It is important to get your dog or cat registered and microchipped – this lets us reunite your family pets with you if they become lost. Fine motor skills involve the use of the small muscles that control the hand, fingers, and thumb.

They help children perform important tasks like feeding themselves, grasping toys, buttoning and zipping clothes, writing and drawing..

Activities to develop your little ones fine motor . . .

- Place grated cheese or carrot, cooked rice or past on a plate and allow them to use their fingers to pick it up to eat.
  - Use eye droppers to transfer coloured water from one plastic container to another.
  - Thread macaroni, large buttons or cut up straws onto a pipe cleaner.
  - Write your child's name on a piece of paper and have them stick self adhesive spots on it.
  - Use tweezers to sort different coloured pom poms into dishes.
  - Cut a 5 cm piece off the end of a pool noodle. Squeeze it together with finger and thumb and then let go. Have races to see how far it can be flicked,
  - Clip pegs around the edge of a plastic ice cream container.
  - Build towers with blocks.
  - Put rubber bands around the base of a muffin tin.

#### **Building the Broomehill Recreational Complex**
