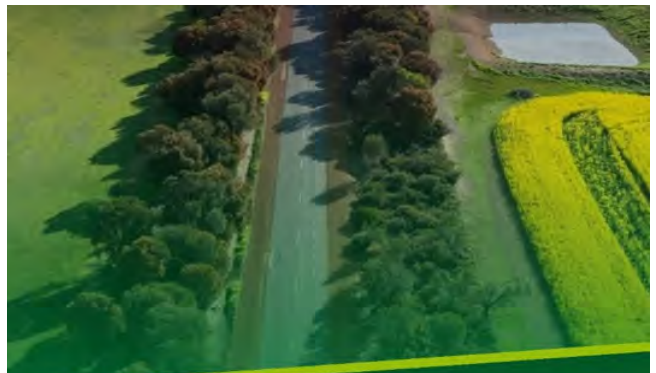
Community Emergency Services Manager

Stay Warm, Stay Safe This Winter

As temperatures drop and heaters, electric blankets and fireplaces become part of our daily routine, it's important to remember that winter also brings an increased risk of house fires.

Many home fires can be prevented by taking a few simple precautions. Whether you're using an electric heater, wood fire or reverse-cycle air conditioner, a little extra care can help keep your household safe throughout the colder months.

| ✓ Make sure everything is at least a metre from the heater. | ✓ Check your heaters once a year. Worn out electrical cords or plugs should be replaced immediately. |
| ✓ Never leave children unsupervised near heaters. | ✓ Always plug heaters directly into permanent power points and never overload power points and power boards. |
| ✓ Only use heaters that meet approved Australian standards. | ✓ Turn off electric blankets before going to bed. |
| ✓ Never leave heaters unattended or on overnight. | |

Winter Fire Safety Tips

Keep heaters clear. Maintain at least one metre of clearance around all heaters and keep flammable items such as clothing, curtains, bedding and furniture well away.

- Never leave heaters unattended - Turn heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed, and never leave children unsupervised near heating appliances.
- Use heaters safely - Ensure heaters meet Australian safety standards and plug them directly into a wall power point. Avoid using extension leads or overloading power boards.
- Check smoke alarms - Test your smoke alarms regularly and replace batteries when needed, even in hard-wired smoke alarms with battery backup.
- Take care with electrical appliances - Charge phones, tablets and other devices on a hard, non-combustible surface and avoid leaving them charging once fully charged.
- Keep power boards clean - Don't overload power boards, keep them free from dust and never place items on top of them.
- Be alert in the kitchen – Never leave cooking unattended, as kitchen fires remain one of the leading causes of house fires.
- Clean your dryer lint filter – Remove lint after every use to reduce the risk of fire.
- Turn off electric blankets before going to sleep and inspect them regularly for signs of wear or damage.

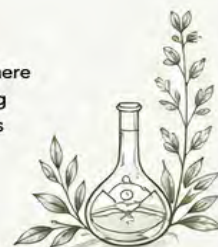


BOTANICAL DISTILLING WORKSHOP

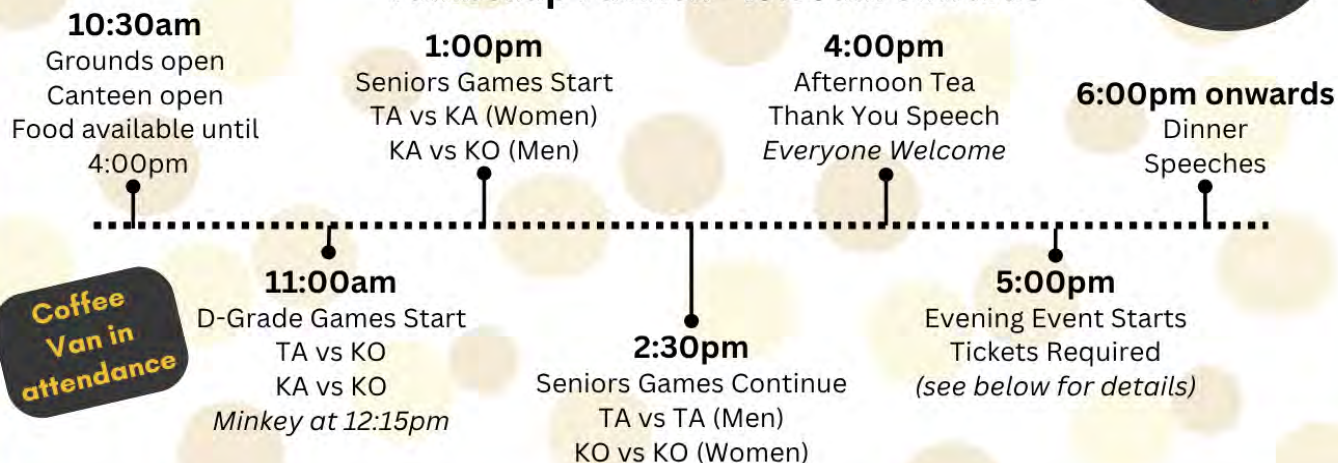

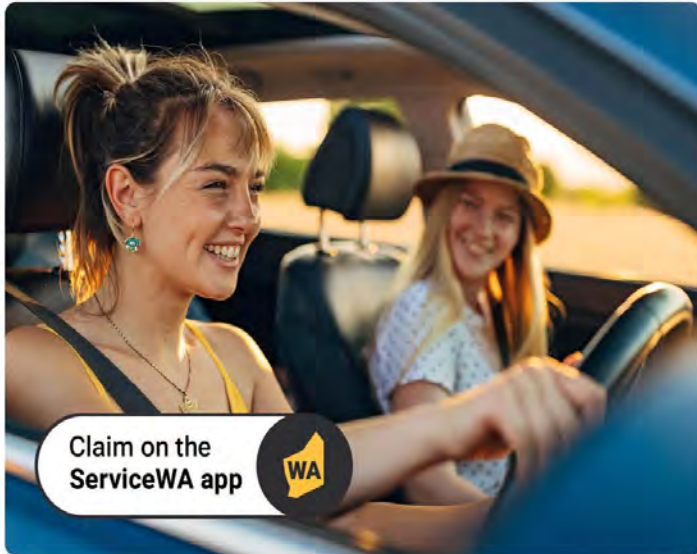

What is the Census?

Every five years, the Census counts every person and household in Australia.

It helps us understand how Australia is changing, and what we need now and in the future. It asks questions about your age, ancestry, what languages you speak and what you do for work.

If you know where you'll be on Census night, you can fill out the Census as soon as you get your instructions.

Your answers are private and protected by law. We need to hear from everyone, because every answer matters.

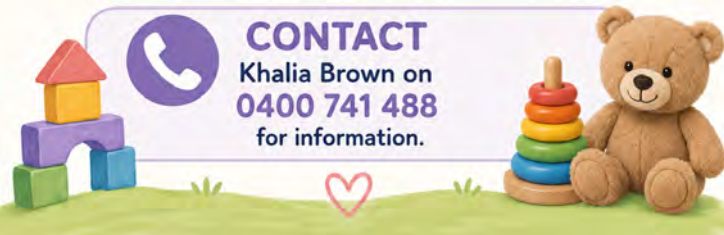
