Support for Reinstatement of the Tambellup–Gnowangerup Rail Line

A joint letter from the Tambellup and Gnowangerup community cropping groups



Dear Chairman, CEO and Board,

Re: Reinstatement of the Tambellup/Gnowangerup rail line and upgrade of the Gnowangerup receival site

I write on behalf of the Tambellup Community Cropping Group and the Gnowangerup 360 Community Cropping Group regarding a matter of significant strategic importance to grain growers across the Great Southern region.

Our two groups have commenced lobbying the State Government in the event it resumes control of the State's rail network, with a view to reinstating the Tambellup/Gnowangerup rail line. We believe this represents a generational opportunity to restore efficient bulk freight infrastructure to a region that has, for too long, borne a disproportionate share of grain freight on its road network.

The case for rail reinstatement

The closure of the Tambellup/Gnowangerup line has shifted the entire freight task onto local and regional roads. The consequences are well understood by every grower, ratepayer and road user in our region:

- Accelerated deterioration of local government and Main Roads assets, with rehabilitation costs ultimately borne by the community.
- Increased heavy vehicle movements through townships, with associated safety, noise and amenity impacts.
- Higher cartage costs for growers, compressing on-farm margins at a time when input costs continue to climb.
- Reduced freight resilience during harvest peaks, wet weather events and road closures.

Reinstating the line would directly address each of these issues, while restoring a more cost-effective and lower-emissions freight pathway to port.

The role of the Gnowangerup receival site

For rail reinstatement to be viable and sustainable, the supporting receival infrastructure must be capable of handling the tonnage required to underwrite the business case. To this end, our two groups are championing CBH to upgrade the Gnowangerup receival site so it can accommodate a tonnage profile that makes both the rail upgrade and the site investment commercially viable over the long term.

We recognise this is a significant capital commitment. However, we believe the combined catchment of the Tambellup and Gnowangerup zones, together with reasonable assumptions about future cropping intensity and yield trajectories, supports a strong investment case.

We would welcome the opportunity to work with CBH's network strategy team to share local data, grower intentions and catchment modelling that may assist that assessment.

Timeline and next steps

We appreciate that any decision of this magnitude must align with CBH's broader Network Strategy and capital planning cycles, as well as with the State Government's posture on rail ownership and investment. Our request at this stage is twofold:

1. That CBH formally engage with our two groups, and with relevant State Government stakeholders, on the case for coordinated rail and receival site investment in the Tambellup/Gnowangerup corridor.
2. That the Gnowangerup receival site be considered for upgrade within CBH's forward capital program, on a timeline that aligns with a realistic window for rail reinstatement.

Regional benefit

Beyond the immediate freight efficiencies, we believe this investment would deliver enduring benefits to the Great Southern: stronger grower returns, safer roads, reduced ratepayer burden on local governments, lower transport emissions, and a clear signal that the region's grain industry has a long-term future supported by fit-for-purpose infrastructure.

We would value the opportunity to meet with you and the Board, at a time convenient to CBH, to discuss this proposal in further detail and to outline how our groups can support the work ahead.

This year, the deadline to have your property prepared is **15 October 2026**. By then, firebreaks and other fire prevention work need to be in place and properly maintained.

Free courses helping (Great Southern) cancer patients cope during and after treatment

Cancer Council WA is encouraging people affected by cancer in the Great Southern region, including carers and family members, to explore its free Life Now programs, which are helping participants across WA find connection, calm and practical ways to cope during and after treatment.

Mindfulness facilitator Karen Haddon, who has been delivering Life Now mindfulness and meditation courses since 2022, said the programs provide a safe and supportive space for people navigating the challenges of cancer.

“Mindfulness helps us identify the start of emotional spirals more easily and provides us with the inner resources to support ourselves during these difficult times,” Ms Haddon said.

“People are using the practices while they are in scans, waiting rooms or waiting for phone calls from oncologists. They can practice with their eyes open and nobody else even knows they are doing it.”

Ms Haddon said participants often feel relieved to be surrounded by others who understand what they are going through.

“By week two, participants often say they feel like they are in a room full of other people who know what it’s like. They say they do not have to pretend, do not have to put on a brave face, and can simply be themselves,” she said.
“There is no expectation that people show up at their best. They can show up however they are, and they will be welcomed into the group.”

Life Now offers a range of free programs including mindfulness, meditation, yoga, Tai Chi and exercise programs for people affected by cancer.

Cancer Council WA Life Now Program Coordinator Annika English said the program is designed to introduce mind-body practices in a safe and supportive environment and empower people to manage their physical and mental wellbeing.

“Our evidence-based Life Now courses offer physiological, psychological and social support to people affected by cancer and their primary carers,” Ms English said.

“We know that people with cancer who exercise regularly have fewer and milder side effects from their treatment.”
