From Annie at the Post Office, Broomehill

Today it was very cold at 6am when I started sorting the Mail for the Post Office and after one hour it was still the same.

Now, sorting the mail involves using your hands without gloves on. This is because some of the letters are fond of each other and they like to stick together. If you wear gloves the letters can stay together and get into a PO Box or onto a shelf still attached – I don't mean glued, just very close!! Because of this, after about an hour, I have to clasp onto a hot cup of tea to warm my hands before continuing. Parcels are less problematic in this way and you can wear gloves for some of the process. We always hope that the results are satisfactory for you all.

The endless hours of seeding seem to have come to an end, or at least slowed down for a while. Last year at this time, Rick and I were so involved with mastering the running of the Post Office that we didn't notice how this part of the year affected everyone involved in farming. It reminded me of the TV series 'Larkrise to Candleford' where their lives, although set in the late 1800s, were similarly affected by the seasonal farming work.

We have seen a big increase in chocolate bar sales in the last month and one visitor suggested that it was connected to their long and intense hours of work.

We restocked the chockie bars today.

Gardening has become a focal point for us and pruning the hedge on the Journal St side took a lot more energy than we expected. We hope that it will come back well when it gets enough rain. We have been seeding and transplanting veggies and look forward to watching how they go. We are so inexperienced with this soil type it is a whole new experiment. We are really glad to have our flame weeder and hope to keep on top of most of our unwanted plants by using it on them as soon as they are noticed.

Planning for the Broomehill community contribution to the Bloom Festival continues. Talk to either of us at the PO if you would like to be involved. We hope to have a notice displayed with more details in the July issue of Topics.

Barna Mia Year 6 Ecology Camp

Gillamii has coordinated the Barna Mia Camp since 2009, giving multiple cohorts of Year 6 students from Cranbrook, Frankland River, and Tambellup Primary Schools the opportunity to experience the Dryandra Woodlands and its unique biodiversity. This year, for the first time, students from Broomehill Primary School also joined the camp.



On 9-10th April, 15 students travelled to Dryandra Woodlands National Park, between Williams and Narrogin, where more than 850 species of flora and fauna can be seen throughout the year. DBCA officers conducted a trapping activity setting traps in the afternoon using a mixture of peanut butter, sardines, flour and oil as a lure, which were checked very early the following morning very early.



That evening, students took part in a guided night walk through the enclosed Barna Mia fauna sanctuary. It was a hands-on, interactive, and memorable camp experience, with students seeing possums, chuditch, woylies, quenda, boodie, bilby and even an echidna!



This camp is made possible through generous donations from Entel Energy Flat Rocks Wind Farm, Bendigo Bank Tambellup-Cranbrook Branch, and Mount Barker Co-operative. It complements the ongoing Connecting Kids to Country environmental education program, which aims to foster positive environmental attitudes and increase knowledge and awareness among our future stewards of the landscape.





Ray Squibb Recognised with Great Southern Service to Sport Award

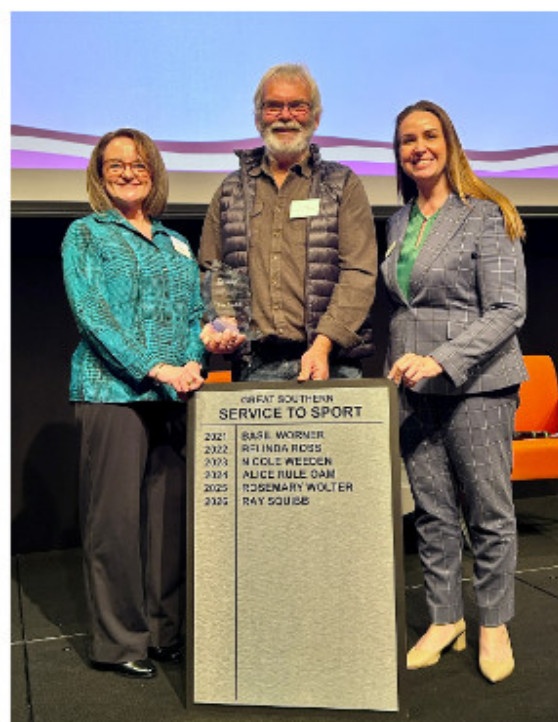

Road Safety Improvements Completed at Johnny's Creek

Important road safety upgrades at Johnny's Creek on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road are now complete, delivering meaningful improvements for all who travel through the area.

Key improvements include:

- Widening of road approaches to provide safer passing and manoeuvring space

A strong sense of community was on show at the 2026 Seeding Day, as the Tambellup community came together to sow this year's canola crop. Following a reschedule due to windy conditions on Tuesday, Wednesday delivered ideal weather, providing a clear and calm autumn day. The day began early, with an impressive line-up of red, blue, green and yellow as both demonstration and farmer-owned tractors, bars and carts rolled into action. The property quickly came to life, reflecting the scale of the operation and the strength of local support. Volunteers were also hard at work on the ground, removing old fence lines and installing the new community crop sign. Standing at over two metres high, the sign is hard to miss and well worth a drive past.

A delicious lunch was again provided by the Tambellup CWA and shared with students from Tambellup Primary School, who attended to see firsthand how a community crop operates. Their involvement added another valuable dimension to the day, helping connect the next generation with local agriculture and community initiatives.



As seeding wrapped up, everyone gathered to reflect on a successful day's work. Nibbles were provided by Tambellup Daycare, with burgers prepared by the Lions Club, and refreshments supplied thanks to Nutrien Stirling Ag, Elders Cranbrook and Sheep Logistics.

This year also marked an important milestone, with TCCG celebrating \$1 million generated and reinvested back into the community. The result is a strong foundation for future projects and continued community benefit. Here's to timely rain, healthy crops and a successful growing season ahead for everyone.

Fire Break Notice

Changes to requirements for 2026 - 2027



Did you know?

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Fire Break Notice has been adopted for the 2026-2027 fire season, and the date that properties must comply with has changed. The revised date is now **15 October 2026**, and inspections on properties will commence from this date.

What are the requirements?

Urban Land (Land inside a Townsite)

All urban land, regardless of size or how the land is zoned:

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) of 20m surrounding all buildings must be established. An APZ is a reduced fuel load zone; and requires the removal of flammable material by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning, chemical spraying or otherwise clearing. Living, standing trees, remnant vegetation, maintained gardens and lawns are exempt from an APZ.

All urban land 4,000m² or less

All flammable material is to be reduced to a height of less than 50mm by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning, chemical spraying or otherwise clearing.

All urban land exceeding 4,000m²

Clear a 2.5m wide firebreak by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning, chemical spraying or otherwise clearing immediately inside all external boundaries of the land. Maintain all remaining flammable material on the land to a height of less than 150mm.

Rural Land (Land outside a Townsite)

All Rural land, regardless of size or how the land is zoned:

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) of 20m surrounding all buildings must be established. An APZ is a reduced fuel load zone; and requires the removal of flammable material by means of ploughing, cultivating, scarifying, burning, chemical spraying or otherwise clearing. Living, standing trees, remnant vegetation, maintained gardens and lawns are exempt from an APZ.

I can't physically install a firebreak. What now?

If you think it is impractical to install a 2.5m wide firebreak on your townsite property over 4,000sqm, you may be eligible for a firebreak variation order.

An example of impractical installation may include thick remnant vegetation, rocky outcrops or the layout of the land. By obtaining a variation order, you may be required to meet other certain Fire Hazard reduction methods not outlined in the Fire Break Notice.

Firebreak variation orders are only valid for one year and must be applied for annually. To apply, please contact the Shire before **15 September 2026**.

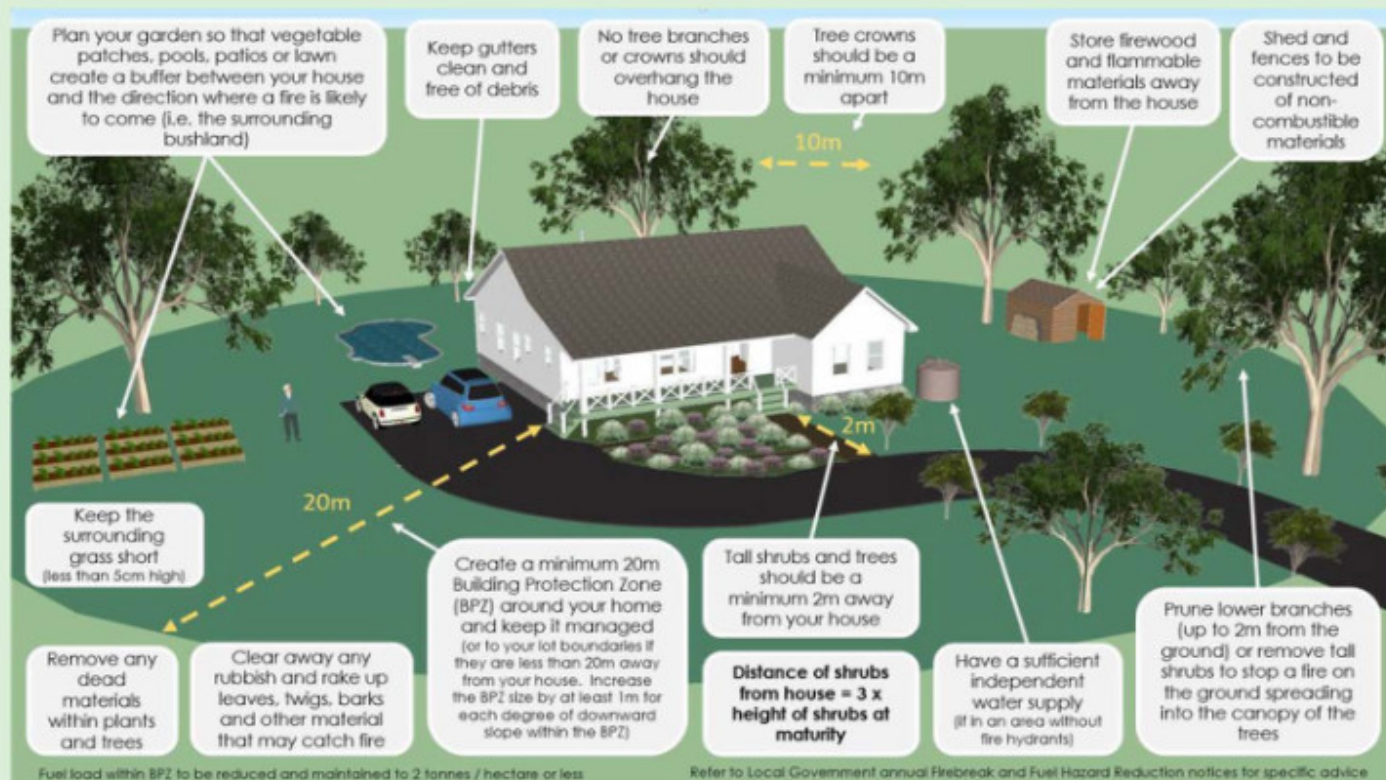

What are some APZ guidelines?



Where should I install my firebreak?



Your 2.5m wide firebreak must be installed on the inside boundary of your property.

If you have an obstacle on the inside boundary (such as a tree or rock outcrop) you can deviate around the obstacle and install the firebreak as close to the inside boundary as the land allows.

If your property contains internal fenced sections (such as paddocks), the firebreak is only required around the outer boundary of the property, not around each individual paddock.

The firebreak must be clear of all flammable material, be able capable of stopping a slow burning fire, and be maintained until 15 April 2027.

Across 40,000 Square Kilometres, Southern Agcare Offers a Lifeline

How Southern Agcare Supports Rural Mental Health

For more than three decades, Southern Agcare has quietly become a lifeline across the southern reaches of Western Australia—offering something both simple and profound: someone to talk to.

In a region spanning over 40,500 square kilometres and covering 15 shires—from Newdegate to Denmark—this community-owned service delivers free, confidential counselling to rural people, by rural people. It's a model built on trust, local understanding, and the belief that no one should have to face hardship alone.

A Service Built by Community, for Community

Southern Agcare is not a distant organisation operating from afar. It is owned and governed by the community through a voluntary management committee, and its team of psychologists, social workers and counsellors are deeply embedded in the regions they serve.

Their approach is deliberately different. Rather than imposing a “one size fits all” model, Southern Agcare prides itself on flexibility—meeting people where they are, both physically and emotionally. Their counsellors travel extensively, offering mobile support that reaches even the most isolated individuals and families.

At its core, the service exists to provide “hope, healing and recovery”—not just for individuals, but for entire communities.

The Reality of Rural Mental Health

Life in rural Australia carries unique pressures: geographic isolation, financial uncertainty, climate challenges, and limited access to services. These factors can take a heavy toll.

The statistics are sobering. Across Australia, nine people die by suicide every day—seven of them men. In the Wheatbelt and Great Southern regions alone,

72 lives were lost to suicide between 2019 and 2023.

Young people in regional WA are particularly vulnerable. Suicide remains one of the leading causes of death for Australians aged 15–24, and at least 40 young West Australians lost their lives to suicide in 2024 alone. In both the Great Southern and Wheatbelt, youth suicide rates remain significantly higher than state averages.

But behind every statistic is a story—and Southern Agcare sees those stories every day.

Each year, the organisation supports around 400 clients. Their needs are complex and often overlapping. In the past year alone:

- 42% of clients experienced depression, anxiety, or stress
- 22% were affected by domestic violence
- 21% faced family separation.
- 20% struggled with alcohol or other drug use
- 18% were impacted by sexual assault
- 13% were dealing with grief and loss

Issues such as eviction stress, childhood and intergenerational trauma, and strained parent-adolescent relationships are also increasingly common.

These are not isolated problems—they ripple through families, workplaces, and entire communities.

A Different Kind of Support

What sets Southern Agcare apart is not just what they do, but how they do it.

Their counsellors offer a non-judgemental space—one where people can speak openly without fear of criticism or stigma. In communities where “toughing it out” is often the norm, this kind of support can be transformative.

Clients are not treated as cases, but as people. The service takes a holistic approach, focusing on mind, body and spirit, and works collaboratively with other agencies to ensure seamless care.

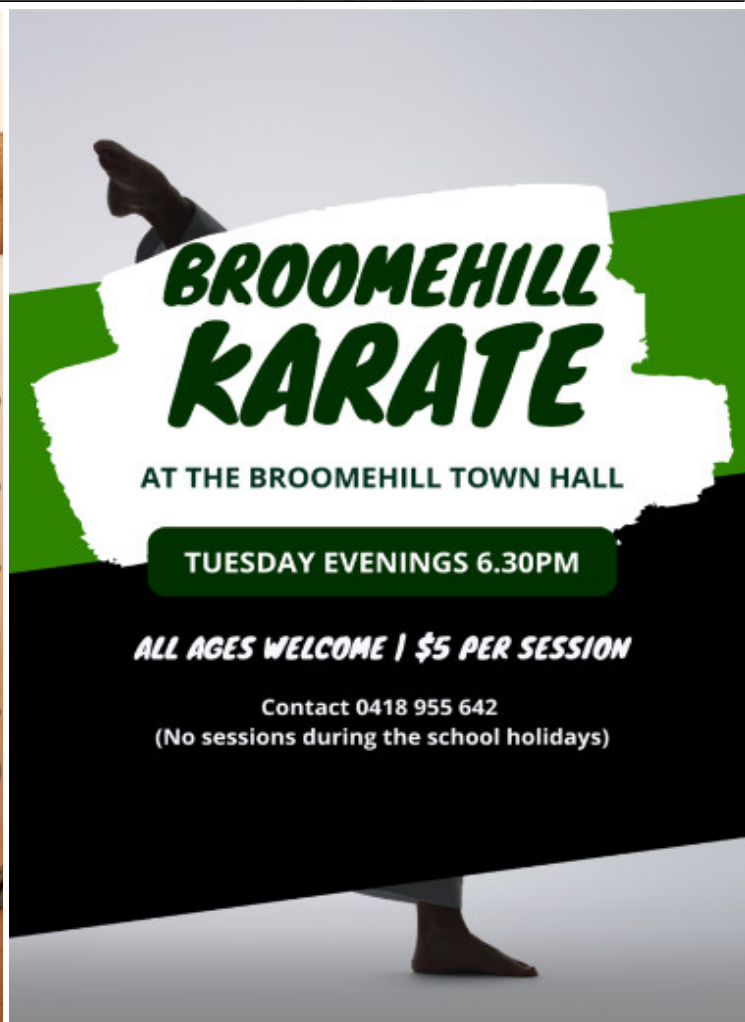
