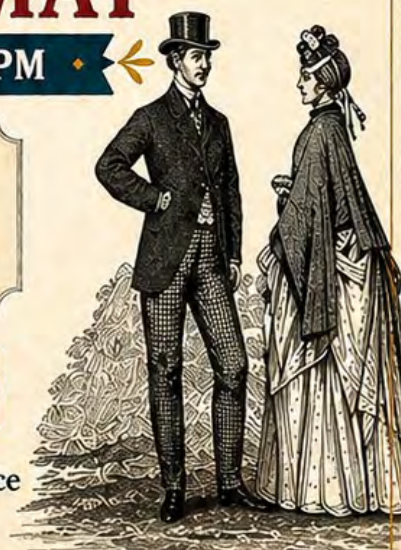

Over the Easter weekend we were fortunate to have weather that suited the repairs and painting of the Post Office roof. Sange and Ben from Kendenup worked tirelessly to make this challenging task work out — and we think the results speak for themselves.



On 27 April we hosted the first meeting to begin planning a Broomehill event for this year's Bloom Festival in spring. We're lucky to have a great number of artists and crafters in the area and are working towards creating an inviting display, along with workshops during the season. *If you'd like to get involved, let us know and we can fill you in on our progress.*

This event will form part of the Great Southern Treasures program, which some may remember had its opening in Broomehill in 2024. Last year we travelled to Ongerup for the launch — a great place to visit — and each year it moves to a different town across the region.

Tambellup Caravan Park Community Open Day a Great Success

The Tambellup community recently came together to celebrate an exciting milestone with the Community Open Day marking completion of Stage One of the Tambellup Caravan Park redevelopment.

Community members, visitors, and neighbours from surrounding shires turned out to share in the celebrations and view the park's impressive new cabins. The occasion was officially marked by a ribbon cutting ceremony, led by Shire Councillors, recognising the hard work and collaboration that have brought this important project to life.

The Open Day provided a wonderful opportunity to showcase the new accommodation and highlight what the caravan park development means for our Shire both now and into the future. The project represents a significant investment in long-term economic growth, local tourism, community pride, and helps make our region an even more welcoming destination in the Great Southern.

A special highlight of the day was the announcement of the new cabin names, following enthusiastic community engagement. Over 70 responses were received, demonstrating strong local interest and pride. The winning theme was Wildlife, with the cabins proudly named:

- Carnaby Cockatoo
- Black Swan
- Tammar Wallaby

The project is now in its final stage, with balustrading and permanent steps currently being installed. Once this work is complete, bookings for the Tambellup Caravan Park cabins will officially open - not far to go!

In the meantime, visitors looking to stay locally are reminded that Broomehill Caravan Park cabins are available for bookings. This milestone reflects what can be achieved through strong community involvement and shared vision

A planned burn was safely and successfully carried out on 10 April, thanks to the dedication and teamwork of our local volunteers and brigade members.

With 11 volunteers and 7 units on the ground, works focused on areas north and west of Broomehill Primary School. The operation was completed efficiently and under controlled conditions, delivering an important improvement to local fire preparedness.

The newly established firebreak enhances access and significantly strengthens the school's safety, particularly in the event of a fire approaching from the north-west of town. This practical measure provides valuable response time and improves protection for students, staff, and the broader community.

A heartfelt thank you goes to every volunteer who stepped away from work, businesses, and personal commitments to support this effort. Your contribution makes a real difference and highlights the strength of our community spirit.

Thank you also to the town brigade for their support during the operation and for their continued monitoring of the burn area afterward. Your ongoing commitment ensures the effectiveness and safety of this important work.

Together, these efforts help keep Broomehill safer and better prepared for the fire season ahead.

Bulk Waste Collection – Broomehill & Tambellup

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup will be conducting a Bulk Waste Collection for Broomehill and Tambellup townsites residents from **Monday 18th May - Wednesday 20th May**.

This service is for items not normally collected as part of the weekly wheelie bin service.

Who Can Participate

All residents within the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites who receive a rubbish collection service are eligible.

When to Place Items Out

Residents are invited to neatly place bulk waste items on their verge from **Monday 11 May 2026**. Items must be stacked at least 1 metre from the verge.

Please ensure waste is safely and tidily arranged.

PLEASE NOTE:

Late requests cannot be accommodated and items placed out after this time will not be collected.

Assistance & Large Items

Please contact the Shire on (08) 9825 3555 by Monday 11 May 2026, if you:

- Are a senior resident;
- Have a disability and require help moving heavy items; or
- Have car bodies or other large items you would like collected

What Can Be Collected

- General bulk household items
- Clean green waste (must be separated from other rubbish)
- Refrigerators only if they have been de-gassed and the doors have been removed

Items That Will NOT Be Collected

- Household or food waste
- Chemicals or hazardous materials
- Paint tins
- Refrigerators that are not de-gassed or still have doors attached

Why should local government bear the burden of GP provision?

The Albanese government made changes to Medicare on 1st November 2025, with an eye wateringly huge investment of \$8.5 Billion.

According to the Cleanbill 2026 Blue Report*, regional and remote communities have seen a welcome rise in bulk billing rates. But for many of my constituents, access to a GP is still limited, out of pocket costs remain high, and the burden of keeping doctors in town has quietly shifted from the federal and state governments onto those least able to afford it: local governments.

I have been receiving regular updates from the Local Government Rural Health Funding Alliance, led by six rural O'Connor Shires Lake Grace, Kojonup, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Ravensthorpe, and Narembeen who are tackling this issue head-on.

The Alliance have found that across rural and remote WA, council spending to support GP services has risen from \$7.8 million in 2021-22 to \$9.5 million in 2024-25, with 91% of that funding coming from councils with fewer than 5,000 residents.

These councils are not just topping up salaries they are providing housing, vehicles, clinic space, paying utility bills and funding administrative support simply to keep a doctor in town.

Local governments exist to deliver roads, waste services, and community infrastructure-not to underwrite the national health system. Every dollar diverted to keeping a GP practice in their community is a dollar not available to spend on roads, rubbish or recreation.

When local GP access declines, the costs do not

disappear, they shift to ratepayers.

Hospitals see increased presentations for conditions that should be managed in primary care. Ambulance services, often run by volunteers, are called on to transport patients vast distances to care.

Families end up shouldering increasing costs of transport, accommodation and unpaid care. I am aware that many O'Connor constituents, especially older people are delaying or foregoing treatment altogether.

The improvement in regional Medicare bulk-billing rates shows that targeted policy can make a difference. But policy success should also be judged by who is still paying the price?

Right now, in my electorate of O'Connor, that price is being paid by our shire councils using up to 16% of their rate revenue to cover GP costs and by patients facing higher out of pocket costs.

Regional WA deserves a health system that works by design, not one propped up by shire council budgets. Residents of O'Connor deserve so much better in the middle of a fuel and cost of living crisis.

Cricket star Jack Batchelor honoured with Ross Thompson Award

The Broomehill community gathered last weekend to celebrate local sporting hero Jack Batchelor, who was officially named the recipient of the prestigious Ross Thompson Award.

The award, presented every three years, recognizes individuals for their noteworthy contributions to the Broomehill community. While Batchelor's impact spans multiple facets of local life, it is his transformative work within the cricket community that resulted in his winning the award.

Batchelor has been a central figure in a golden era for the **Broomehill Cricket Club**, contributing to four consecutive premierships wins from the 2021/22 season through to 2024/25. His big-game temperament was first immortalized in the historic 2021/22 victory, where he was named Player of the Final.

His individual statistics have been equally dominant winning the GSCA Batting Aggregate with 561 runs, including a massive Individual score of 168. He finished as runner-up for the batting average and was named to the Team of the Season.

In the 2024/25 Season he capped off a career-best year as the **Cricketer of the Year** for both his club and the Great Southern Cricket Association. He amassed 600 runs to finish as runner-up in the batting aggregate and secured another spot in the Team of the Season.

Beyond his prowess with the bat, Jack has become a pillar of cricket development in Western Australia. Serving as the Great

Southern Cricket Association president, he has balanced executive leadership with hands-on coaching for junior, U17, and senior teams.

His commitment to the next generation includes state-level coaching, serving as Assistant Coach for the Country Colts team across the 2023/24 and 2024/25 seasons.

The Ross Thompson Award serves as a testament to Batchelor's rare ability to combine elite athletic performance with a deep sense of civic duty. As he adds this honour to his trophy cabinet, the Broomehill community is the beneficiary of a legacy built on both the scoreboard and the sidelines.
