Heritage Hounds Hear

Here's a small snapshot of Tambellup life as told to a HH about our beloved former resident, electrician, musician, Topics editor, sports enthusiast & much more, Mr Snowy Wilson, with thoughts of ANZAC Day 2026 approaching.

In 1945 at the end of the WW2, a Lancaster bomber flew from Albany following the Great Southern railway line to thank small country communities for the enormous effort they had made during the war. At each town the bomber flew low & slow dropping leaflets with messages of thanks.

Snowy had taken a pick axe to the old school oval (present day Sandalwood Villas) & marked out the exact dimensions of a Lancaster bomber so the children could see its actual size. The children were gathered at the school bomb shelter when the plane flew over. Imagine the excitement, the noise of the engine, fluttering leaflets & running to catch them.

Snowy also manned the Air Observation Post located near the Railway Station during the war. The Post was a small tin hut with a large aerial on the railway reserve opposite his shop (present day CRC). He was in charge of monitoring aircraft movements over TA & reporting to Perth.



A few days after the flyover, the town had a Sports Day on the old school oval to celebrate the end of the war. Everyone was so happy & each child received a 3 penny piece (thruppence) in celebration which was a fortune at that time. Although there were no lollies or chocolates to buy. Only pictures of them in Snowy's shop window.

Do any children present still have their thruppences? The Corner Shop Museum would be keen to know.

Tambellup Caravan Park Project Nearing Completion

The first stage of new cabins at the Tambellup Caravan Park is now in its final phase. Bookings will open shortly, with stays available from early April.

Site works are largely complete, including landscaping with over 500 native plants planted, new internal driveways and a perimeter fence underway. The amenities laundry is finished, and cabin fit-outs are well advanced.

A community open day and ribbon-cutting are being planned shortly, allowing the community and visitors to view the new facilities before opening.

This first stage delivers modern short-stay accommodation to support tourism, workers and visitors. Additional cabin stages are planned for delivery later in the year as the broader caravan park redevelopment continues.

Further updates, including the confirmed opening date and event details, will be shared soon.

Broomehill Recreational Complex Landscaping and Spectator Area Completed

We have completed landscaping and turf works at the Broomehill Recreational Complex, significantly improving the presentation of the area.

The works focused on the southern side of the complex and the area in front of the cricket pavilion, where new reticulation and freshly established lawn have created a safe and usable grassed viewing space overlooking the oval.

Additional terraced limestone block retaining walls have been installed to stabilise the slope and form informal spectator seating. New steps have also been constructed to provide safe access between the pavilion level and the playing surface.

These improvements complete the planned spectator terrace treatment for the pavilion frontage, addressing previous safety and drainage issues associated with the steep embankment while enhancing usability for events and match days.

The upgraded lawn areas are in the early stages of establishment and will continue to strengthen as the turf matures. The completed works provide a more functional, accessible and attractive spectator environment for cricket, hockey and community use at the complex.

Footpath Plan Update – Safer, More Connected Towns

The Ten-Year Footpath Plan 2026–2036 has been endorsed by Council at its February meeting. Thank you to everyone who provided feedback to help shape priorities.

The plan sets out how walking routes across Broomehill and Tambellup will be improved over the next decade to support safer, more accessible and better connected towns. It prioritises safe routes around schools, shops, community facilities and recreation areas, and identifies key gaps in the existing network. Opportunities for new off-road links will be investigated and designed before any decisions are made.

About \$1.1 million is planned for footpath improvements over 10 years, including around 13 km of new or upgraded paths and 112 new kerb ramps. Funding will come from a mix of Shire funds and external grants.
