Exciting Progress at Tambellup Caravan Park

There is plenty happening at the Tambellup Caravan Park, with our new accommodation units continuing to take shape and progress moving along well.

The four-room accommodation unit has now reached the framing stage, marking an important milestone in the project. Meanwhile, the one-bedroom cabin is progressing quickly, with internal wall linings installed and painting and cabinetry works well underway.

Both units remain on track for delivery in the next two months and are expected to be ready for use shortly after installation and commissioning.

This additional accommodation will be a welcome boost for our community. The existing cabins are regularly booked out by workers, contractors and travellers, demonstrating the strong demand for accommodation in Tambellup. These new units will help meet that demand while supporting local businesses, visitors and the wider community.

Their support has played a vital role in making these new accommodation units a reality and will deliver lasting benefits for the community for many years to come.

Community Comes Together to Honour Vietnam Veteran Private Brian David Waters

On Thursday, 20 August 2026, community members and Shire Councillors gathered at Tambellup Cemetery for the Vietnam Killed in Action (KIA) Grave Site Commemoration, a moving ceremony held in remembrance of Private Brian David Waters of the 6th Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment.

The service provided an opportunity for residents, veterans, and family members to reflect on the sacrifice made by Australians who served during the Vietnam War, while paying special tribute to Private Waters, who lost his life during Operation Bribie in South Vietnam on 17 February 1967 at just 22 years of age.

A highlight of the commemoration was the attendance of members of the Waters family. Shire President, Doug Barritt extended a special welcome to Brian's nephews, John Waters and Garry Waters and his wife Donna, as well as cousin Lyndon. Their presence added a deeply personal connection to the ceremony and helped ensure Brian's service and sacrifice continue to be remembered by future generations.

During the service, attendees reflected on the significance of Vietnam Veterans' Day and the enduring legacy of those who served their country. A wreath-laying ceremony and a period of silence provided a solemn opportunity to honour Private Waters and all Australians who made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their nation.

The commemoration also recognised Brian's connection to Tambellup. Before his deployment to Vietnam, he lived and worked in the district and became part of the local community, making the occasion especially meaningful for those in attendance.

We would like to sincerely thank everyone who attended the ceremony, including veterans, community members, and the Waters family. Your presence helped make the event a respectful and heartfelt tribute, ensuring that the memory of Private Brian David Waters and the sacrifices of all Vietnam veterans remain an important part of our community's history.

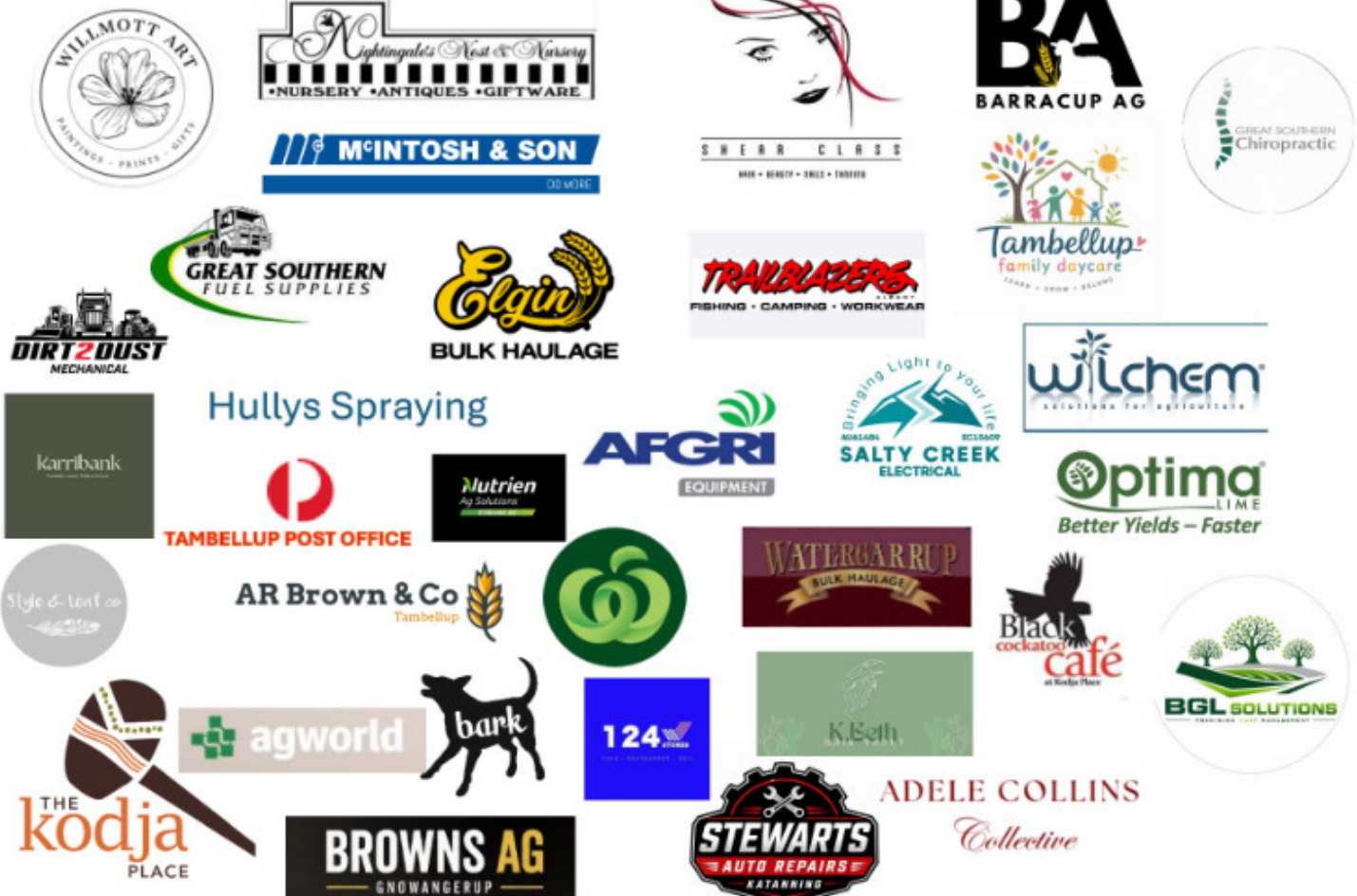

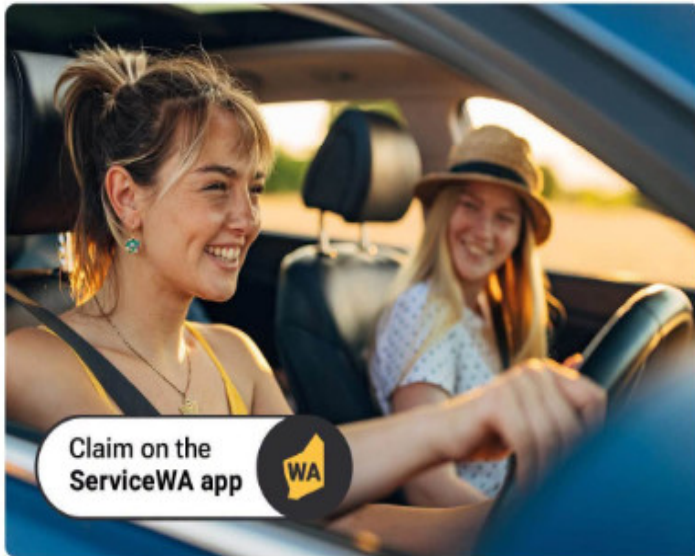

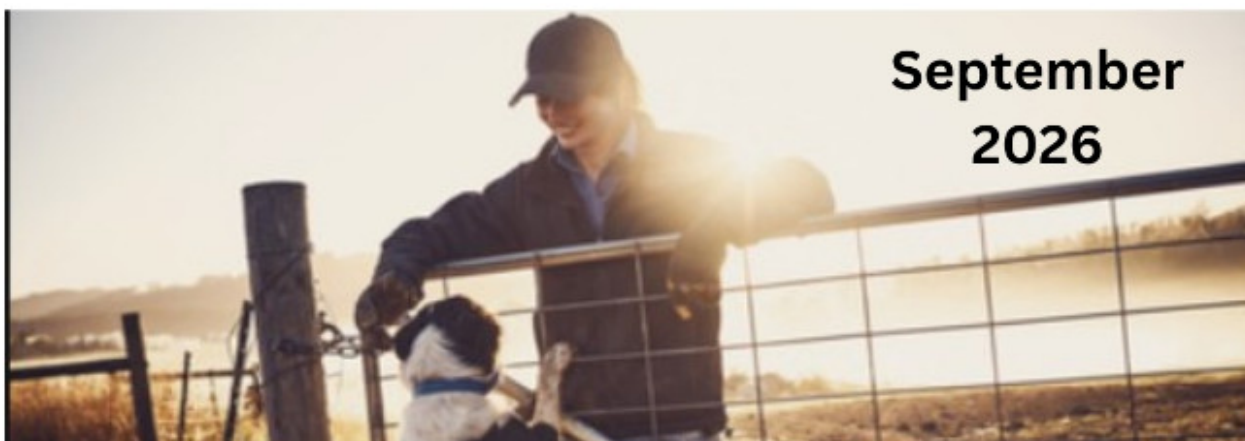

Farewell Rachael

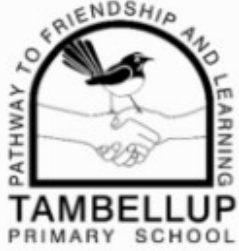
We would like to announce that our Branch Manager, Rachael Nicholls, will be transitioning to a new role within the bank network.
