

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 18 July 2019 commencing at 4.30pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE JUNE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered a request from Gillamii Centre in Cranbrook for a financial contribution to allow Year 6 students at the Tambellup Primary School to attend an overnight camp at Barna Mia. A decision has been deferred pending further information being obtained.

Council endorsed the 2018-2019 Disability Access and Inclusion Plan Annual Report. This report outlines the progress the Shire has made towards achieving the outcomes of the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan. This year, highlights included footpath works, and in partnership with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, improved accessibility to public buildings through refurbishment and extension of the Tambellup Fire Shed.

WORKS

With the end of the financial year looming, the construction crew has been fully immersed in completion of funded road construction projects. On Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, repairs to bitumen failures have been cement stabilised, and sealing will be completed when the weather improves. Works on Flat Rocks Rd were also interrupted by wet weather early in June, and will be completed when the site dries out a little.

While the rain has been welcomed, the windy and wet conditions experienced early in the month resulted in numerous trees falling across roads, and the maintenance crew were kept busy clearing debris around the shire. The parks and gardens crew are taking full advantage of the rain (and not so cold conditions) to undertake planting of new trees and shrubs, and replanting areas in both towns. Alongside this conditions are ideal for weeds and grass to grow, so spraying and mowing is a major activity at the moment.

The Shire is working with the Broomehill Recreational Complex committee to redevelop the gardens surrounding the Broomehill Complex. This project includes the replacement of the reticulation system, and selection of plants that suit the environment but will also be low maintenance. We look forward to seeing the end product.

The development of the nature playground at the Tambellup Pavilion is ongoing. Part of the plan for the embankment east of the Pavilion includes reshaping an area to provide a rock climbing area with a slide. The rocks have been backloaded to the Oval from various Shire construction jobs in recent weeks, and the work will be completed by a contractor in coming weeks.

BULK WASTE COLLECTION

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup will be providing a bulk waste collection for Broomehill and Tambellup townsite residents on Thursday 18th and Friday 19th July 2019. The bulk waste collection is for items that are not normally collected as part of the weekly wheelie bin collection service.

All residents in the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites are invited to neatly stack bulk rubbish items out on their verge between 8th - 17th July 2019. If you are a senior resident requiring assistance to move heavy items to the verge, or if you have car bodies or other large items that you would like collected, please contact Coral at the Shire on 9825 3555 with your details by Monday 15th July 2019.

Please note:

- No paint tins
- No chemicals or other hazardous materials
- No refrigerators with doors attached
- Clean green waste will be collected however it must be separated from rubbish
- No household or food waste will be collected

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INTIATIVE

The tender for the construction of six key worker houses in Broomehill and Tambellup was advertised in May, with a good response received from the construction industry. At time of writing the tenders were being assessed for Council's consideration and awarding at an upcoming Special Council Meeting. We anticipate this process will be complete prior to the end of June or the first week in July, and works will commence shortly thereafter.

Part of the housing project includes the construction of permanent accommodation units at the Broomehill Caravan Park, to be available for CBH staff accommodation through the harvest period, and for general tourism use at other times of the year. The Shire is looking to partner with CBH to maximise the number of units that will be constructed, and discussions are ongoing.

The Shire is also working with H&H Architects to design the Independent Living Units to be constructed on the south east section of the Caravan Park lot in Broomehill. A requirement of the funding obtained for this aspect of the housing project is that these units incorporate 'ageing in place' elements in the construction. In conjunction with the Shire of Kojonup and other participating local governments, the Shire is working with a consultant engaged to ensure these elements, which include selection of floor coverings, paint finishes, tapware and appliances, are fully considered through the design process.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION - PRE PAID TIP CARDS

Residents are reminded that the purple 2018/2019 Waste Transfer Station passes expire on 31 July 2019, and will not be accepted after that date. New passes valid for 2019/2020 will be distributed with rates notices for those residents who do not receive the kerbside rubbish and recycling collections, and prepaid passes will be available to purchase at the Shire Administration offices after 1 July 2019. For more information please contact the Shire.

The purpose of a Waste Transfer Station is to minimise the amount of waste going to landfill, and maximise opportunitites for recycling. By sorting your load before you go to the Tip, and making sure your recyclables are clean and uncontaminated, you will be doing your bit to help our environment.

WHAT CAN GO INTO YOUR RECYCLING BIN

GLASS – Clean bottles and jars (lids removed)

PLASTIC – Empty bottles and containers with 1, 2, 3 or 5 printed on the bottom, plastic food wrap



PAPER - Clean, untied newspapers, paper, magazines, telephone books, envelopes with or without the window

CARDBOARD – Clean flattened boxes, pizza boxes, egg cartons, milk cartons ALUMINIUM & STEEL – Empty cans, tins, clean foil, aerosol cans LIQUID PAPERBOARD – Milk, juice and laundry detergent cartons

SES volunteers will attend as soon as possible. Assistance is prioritised, please be patient.

CLEANING UP

- . Start cleaning up around your home stack loose material such as branches and debris away from water meters, valves and telephone lines
- Call your local government to get advice about the removal of green waste and other materials such as asbestos fencing

STATE EMERGENCY SERVICE

DFES State Emergency Service (SES) volunteers help the community of Western Australia during storms and other natural hazards and emergencies

SES volunteers assist the community by

- Making temporary repairs to homes and businesses. It is your responsibility to organise permanent repairs. Contact your insurance company
- · Clearing fallen trees
- · Rescuing trapped or injured people
- · Sandbagging areas in danger of flooding
- · Assisting in relocating people

Such assistance is usually minimal in areas well prepared for storm season, which is why SES volunteers actively educate the community on ways to reduce the impact of storms on life and homes. This group of dedicated people are not paid and give up their time, often braving cold, wet, windy and dangerous conditions to come to the aid of hundreds in need of emergency assistance.

During a severe storm there may be many calls for emergency assistance so calls are prioritised. SES volunteers will attend as soon as possible.

STORM SEASON

Storms may bring heavy rain, damaging winds, lightning, hail, floods and tornados to the southern half of Western Australia between May and October each year. However storms can occur during the warmer months so it is important to stay prepared all year round.

WHAT IS A STORM?

Storms develop when warm, humid air near the ground is pushed rapidly upward into an unstable atmosphere.

WHY PREPARE FOR STORMS?

Damaging winds, flash floods, lightning, hail and tornados can cause damage to homes, cars and the environment, They can even cause injury or loss of life

Most storm damage to homes occurs from:

- . loose and broken roof materials
- · fallen trees and branches
- · flooding from blocked gutters and downpipes People can stay safe and reduce damage to their homes by being prepared.

HOW TO PREPARE

Preparing your family and home for a storm is your responsibility. If you live in a storm prone area, you should make it a priority between March and May to get your home ready inside and out. There are a few simple steps that could help you minimise damage:

- Check your roof and gutters for damage or loose material
- . Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages
- . Trim branches near your home and hire a contractor to clear trees from powerlines
- . Clear rubbish from your yard, balcony or patio and put away any loose objects
- . Prepare an emergency kit with portable radio, torch, spare batteries, first aid kit and family emergency plan
- . Ensure your family understand storms and the risks
- . Prepare an emergency plan including a relocation plan in case your home becomes flooded. Consider what you will do with your pets and know how to turn off the gas,

- Display a list of emergency phone numbers
- . Check you have adequate home and contents insurance

WEATHER WARNINGS

You can keep up to date with latest storm warnings and advice:

- through news bulletins on radio, TV or online
- on the DFES website www.dfes.wa.gov.au
- on the Bureau of Meteorology's website www.bom.gov.au or by calling their Land Weather Warnings and Flood Warnings Advice Line on 1300 659 213

WHEN A STORM IS FORECAST

- Secure or remove loose material and rubbish from around your home or work because strong winds during storms can turn loose items into potentially deadly missiles
- . Weigh down loose objects using plastic bags filled with sand. rather than bricks that can be blown around in strong wind
- . Ensure your emergency kit is up to date
- . Ensure your pets and animals are in a safe area
- Move your vehicles under cover
- . If you are away from your home you should contact family or friends to ensure your home is secure
- . Construction site workers should put away any loose building material and secure their sheds
- . Boat owners should make sure their boats are securely moored
- . Campers should find alternative shelter

DURING A STORM

- Close your curtains and blinds and stay inside away from
- If caught outside find safe shelter away from trees, powerlines, metal objects, storm water drains, rivers and
- If boating, swimming or surfing leave the water
- If there is lightning, unplug electrical appliances and do not use landline telephones
- If there is flooding you can create your own sandbags by using plastic bags or pillow cases filled with sand
- If driving in heavy rain take extra care on the roads:
 - slow down, turn your lights on and keep a safe distance from other drivers
 - If you cannot see, pull over and park with your hazard lights on until the rain clears
 - Do not drive into water of unknown depth

AFTER A STORM

- Assess your home and property for damage
- Check on friends and neighbours to see if they need help
- · Keep children away from flooded drains, rivers, streams
- Keep away from fallen powerlines as they are dangerous and should always be treated as live
- Be careful of fallen trees and damaged buildings
- If driving slow down, keep a safe distance from other drivers and take care in areas that have been flooded

If roads are flooded do not drive into water of unknown depth and current

· Avoid gravel roads as surfaces will be slippery and muddy, and vehicles could become bogged








What is an earthquake?

An earthquake is the sudden release of energy and subsequent ground shaking from rocks breaking along a fault line under stress (usually) from plate tectonic forces.

How do we measure earthquakes?

- Earthquakes are detected by instruments called seismometers.
- Seismometers measure the intensity and duration of ground shaking generated by an earthquake.
- The arrival times of these seismic waves, and the speed at which they travel are used to determine the location of the earthquake.
- The size of an earthquake (or its magnitude) is the measure of the energy released when the fault ruptures.

Earthquake Magnitude

As magnitude increases, the strength of ground shaking, duration, and area impacted increases very quickly.

Ground shaking

Increases by 10 times for every magnitude unit.

Energy released

Increases by 32 times for every magnitude unit.

Duration of shaking

From a few seconds (magnitude 4) to several minutes (magnitude 9).

Difference between Magnitude and Intensity

- An earthquake's magnitude is related to the energy released at its epicentre.
- The intensity of an earthquake refers to the level of ground shaking at a given location.

- Earthquake intensity decreases with increasing distance from an earthquake.





Distribution of aftershocks recorded following the 16 September 2018 Lake Muir earthquake. Source: Geoscience Australia

What do we know about the Lake Muir earthquake sequence?

- The sequence began with a magnitude 5.7 main shock on 16 September 2018, which is the largest recorded earthquake in WA, south of Perth, since records began.
- A surface deformation approximately seven kilometres long has been observed from satellite imagery.
- Damage occurred to localised structures near the fault scarp and epicentre.
- Five Rapid Deployment Kits (RDKs) were installed within days of the main shock and began live streaming data back to the Geoscience Australia (GA) Operations Centre in Canberra.
- Over 700 aftershocks have been recorded, including a magnitude 4.6 on 13 October 2018 and a magnitude 5.4 on 9 November 2018.
- These events were widely felt throughout the south west of WA including parts of the Perth metropolitan area.
- The 9 November event was more widely felt and GA is investigating further to determine the rationale for this


ML 5.7 (MW 5.3) - Lake Muir, Australia 16 September 2018

Aftershock monitoring ceased in February 2019. Ongoing research will include:

- assessment of surface deformation
- precise relocation of aftershocks
- evaluate data from online felt reports.

Lake Muir Earthquake | Frequently Asked Questions



What kind of measures does Australia have in place in the event of an earthquake?

It's impossible to accurately predict exactly when and where an earthquake will occur but the history of earthquake activity in a region can tell us a lot about its potential risk for future earthquakes. GA operates and maintains the Australian National Seismograph Network to provide the emergency management sector and the public with rapid notification of Australian earthquakes of magnitude 3.5, or greater through the National Earthquake Alert Centre.

In order to minimise the impact of future earthquakes, GA also develops the National Seismic Hazard Assessment (NSHA). This assessment identifies regions across Australia that are more or less likely to experience potentially damaging earthquake ground shaking. This information is important for risk management and decision making by the public, industry and government, and is used to improve building codes and standards.

Who provides the response to earthquakes in WA?

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) is the hazard management agency for earthquake. DFES maintains the emergency management arrangements for earthquakes in WA (State Hazard Plan). In the event of an earthquake, DFES issues public information and manages the response and recovery of the incident.

What is the likelihood of an even bigger earthquake occurring in the Lake Muir area following the two recent 5+ magnitude earthquakes?

The south west of Western Australia is known to be one of the most seismically active areas in Australia and has experienced several damaging earthquakes in the last 50 years. These included the 1968 magnitude 6.5 Meckering earthquake, the 1970 magnitude 5.9 Calingiri earthquake, the 1979 magnitude 6.1 Cadoux earthquake and the 2010 magnitude 5.0 Kalgoorlie-Boulder earthquake.

We would generally expect to experience a magnitude 5.0 earthquake approximately every 10 years somewhere in the south west of WA. Due to the short recording history, the chance of a larger earthquake occurring has large uncertainties. However, a magnitude 6.0 earthquake might be expected every 50 to 100 years or so. We cannot rule out the potential for a larger event to occur in the Lake Muir region, however, preliminary analysis of the local geology suggests this may be unlikely on the fault system that is presently active.

What was the purpose of the earthquake detection equipment installed by GA in the Lake Muir region?

Following the 16 September magnitude 5.7 earthquake, GA installed five RDKs to monitor seismic activity of the Lake Muir sequence, and to complement the data collected from the national network seismometers. These instruments were removed in late February 2019 and have helped GA analysts detect and locate over 780 aftershocks.

There are several scientific objectives for monitoring aftershocks following large earthquakes:

- To record precise locations of aftershocks and to better define the fault rupture plane in three dimensions.
- To monitor changes in activity to develop improved methods and models that may be used to forecast the likelihood of large aftershocks.
- To record strong ground motions from large aftershocks that will better inform the likely ground motion accelerations possible from future Australian earthquakes. This information is used to inform building codes and standards.

A decision was made to discontinue monitoring activity in March 2019 as the ongoing activity rates of small aftershocks had reduced substantially, GA will continue researching the collected data to improve the understanding of earthquake hazard in the region.

What is GA doing to improve our understanding of the earthquake hazard?

GA is integrating data and information from a variety of sources to learn more from the Lake Muir earthquake sequence. Field mapping and satellite observations are telling us about the extent of ground deformation that is possible from these moderate magnitude earthquakes. Understanding the extent of an earthquake rupture gives us information on possible damage this deformation could pose to buildings and buried infrastructure (i.e. pipelines), should a similar sized earthquake occur nearer to populated areas.

Additionally, data recorded by the temporary seismometers provides important information on how the strength of ground shaking decays with increasing distance away from the earthquake. With this information, we can develop models that can forecast the potential shaking intensities for larger earthquakes over a wide area. GA also uses "citizen science" to help calibrate these models by using data submitted through the online reporting system. Members of the public can submit a report if they've felt an earthquake via earthquakes.ga.gov.au.

Where can I go to access information about earthquakes and how do I get assistance if I'm impacted by an earthquake?

GA provides an online interactive map viewer detailing all earthquakes in the last seven days at earthquakes. qa.gov.au.

If an earthquake causes significant damage, you can keep up to date with information online via emergency.wa.gov.au, DFES Facebook or Twitter accounts, by calling 13 DFES (13 3337) or by listening to your local ABC radio station.

If your house has been badly damaged in the earthquake and you need emergency repairs, call the State Emergency Service on 132 500. If you are in a life-threatening situation, call 000.




Image courtesy of Geoscience Australia, Map showing location of Seismic Monitoring Stations around Australia






