The next meeting of Council will be held on <u>Thursday 15th November 2018 commencing at 4.00pm</u> in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.



We were shocked and saddened to learn of the passing of our work colleague Tim Williamson as a result of a car crash on Great Southern Highway on Saturday 13th October. Tim had been with the Shire works team for almost 5 years, and during that time, had earned the respect of both the works crew and administration staff. We extend our sympathy to Tim's family and friends – he will be missed. RIP Tim.

FROM THE OCTOBER COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered and approved amendments to the 2018-2019 annual budget to correct an over estimate of the surplus carried forward from 2017-2018.

Council endorsed the Draft Strategic Community Plan 2018-2028 and determined to advertise the document for public comment during November 2018.

Council received the Great Southern Sport and Recreation Plan prepared by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, and the Great Southern Outdoor Recreation Strategy 2018-2021 prepared by the Great Southern Centre for Outdoor Recreational Excellence, and as requested, will advertise both documents for public comment during November 2018. These documents will be available on the Shire's website, and copies will be available at the Shire Administration offices, and Tambellup CRC.

Tenders for the provision of bitumen services for Council's road construction program were considered and awarded.

Council considered a proposal to amend the Restricted Access Vehicle Network assessment for Crosby and Birt Roads to RAV Network 4, and will recommend to Main Roads WA that the proposal should be approved with conditions.

Council will undertake a consultation process to obtain community feedback in relation to the proposed design of the area around the Tambellup War Memorial, as part of the townscaping project.

Council considered a request from the Department of Communities to consider development of government officers housing in Tambellup. Council will investigate this proposal further before committing.

WORKS

Following the recent review of Council's Workforce Plan and the staff changes that resulted, staff member Joshua Ford has been appointed to the new position of Technical Services Officer. Josh will be assisting the Manager of Works across a range of areas relating to the works area, including road and asset management and work planning, traffic management planning, traffic counters, Occupational Safety and Health and standpipe maintenance. He will also be providing back up operations on various machines as required.

The construction crew has been working on Pallinup South Rd where clearing works in preparation for the widening and sealing of a 3.5km section are underway. Drainage works are also underway in this area as part of the project, and contractors have advised that there may be occasions over the next few weeks where the road will be closed to all traffic. Detours will be in place, via Anderson and Tallents Rd for light vehicles and via Beejenup Rd for heavy vehicles. We will endeavour to provide as much notice of these closures as possible through the Shire's SMS service. We appreciate your patience in this regard.

Roadside vegetation pruning continues on various roads around the Shire. At the time of writing, the machine was working on West Peringillup Rd. With a full crew back on deck, the maintenance graders have been grading and gravel patching on Eureka Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Peringillup East Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Green Rd, Collins Rd, Crosby Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Sprigg Simpson Rd, Hankinson Rd and Dartnall Rd during late September and October. Bitumen patching has been completed on various roads including Tieline Rd and Pallinup Rd.

Our ovals have benefitted from the recent rain, and are in good condition. Dam levels are looking good as we move into the warmer months, and we will shortly commence using treated water to reticulate the oval and gardens in Tambellup.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN – HAVE YOUR SAY!

The Shire conducted a community consultation process earlier this year to inform the development of the Strategic Community Plan, Council's highest level document which drives the activities of the Shire over the next ten year period. Consultation methods included workshops in Broomehill and Tambellup, a postcard survey located at businesses in both communities, and a survey that was mailed out to all households and was also available through the Shire's website.

Council considered all the feedback and ideas received through these processes, and from that, the Draft Strategic Community Plan 2018-2028 was developed.

We now invite the community to have their say on the draft document – have we accurately captured the themes that came through in the consultation process? Is the Shire heading in the right direction? The draft document is available on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au, and will be mailed or emailed to those people who requested further information through the consultation process. HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

As we head towards harvest and summer, a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- Harvest Ban Hotline phone 98251042. This service
 is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers
 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date
 source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- Radio broadcasts ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer contact details are noted above.
- And if all else fails make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!



MY DAUGHTER Anna is in jail. She belongs there. She murdered an innocent person.



In jail she is finally getting the help we've begged for, for so many years. It's just a tragedy it took a man's death to get her that help. She should have been helped many, many years before it got to this point.






I have been employed with W.A Police for 17 years, and relocated to Tambellup after being promoted to Sergeant as the Officer in Charge. My Wife and I enjoy the area and have family ties to the Great Southern Region.

1/C 15895 BALL:

I have been attached to the Tambellup Police Station since the end of April 2018 previously working out of Midland Police Station. I first joint the police in October 2010 in England where I originated from. I worked for Thames Valley Police, where I met my now wife Leanda who was also a police officer. In 2015 we made the decision to move our life to Australia when the WA Police Force conducted a recruitment drive. Having no friends or family in Australia it was a big decision, but one that has been an incredible adventure so far, we were lucky enough to fall pregnant and have our little boy here (Archie). No doubt some of you will see me with my family when I'm off duty (I'm just a normal person) please say "hi" and introduce yourself.

Tambellup Police to date:

Although there is only two of us and we have a vast area to cover stretching from the Albany Highway in the East to the borders of Gnowangerup in the West, from the borders of Katanning in the North to the borders of Cranbrook in the South. If this isn't enough we have been as far afield as Mount Barker and Lake Grace assisting our colleagues when required. We may not always be at the station but if you call and we are not here it will divert to the station mobile and if we are lucky enough to be off duty it will divert to Albany who can always recall us if required.

In recent months we have had numerous burglaries, assaults, stealings, vehicle crashes, family violence and alcohol related disorder. I'm pleased to say that we have had a successful outcome to the vast majority of these, but as always there will be one or two incidents that we cannot solve, not through a lack of trying but just the evidence doesn't support a positive outcome.



WA NATS IN CANBERRA TO MEET WITH FEDERAL AG MINISTER

The Nationals WA have held talks with the Federal Agriculture Minister in Canberra encouraging him to come to Western Australia as soon as possible to meet with sheep producers and live exporters.

Spokesperson for agriculture Colin de Grussa and Roe MP Peter Rundle, whose electorate is home to the highest concentration of sheep producers in WA, visited Canberra on Wednesday to meet with Minister David Littleproud.

"The purpose of the meeting was to strongly impress upon the Minister the importance of the live sheep trade to regional Western Australia's economy," Mr de Grussa said.

"Both Peter and I told the Minister we were eager to have him come across to WA as soon as possible to meet with a number of key industry players.

"I am happy to report Minister Littleproud indicated he was very interested in coming west and we are working towards a date for that to happen."

The Nationals WA duo also met with the Deputy Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources, to be briefed on reforms within the sector.

Other issues raised during meetings included Federal funding for the extension of the State Barrier Fence.

"While in Government, The Nationals provided more than \$10.5 million through Royalties for Regions for upgrades and extensions to the State Barrier Fence," Mr Rundle said.

"This included upgrading the existing fence to wild dog standard by installing lapwire to the base of the fence and constructing the 170km 'Yilgarn Gap' between Southern Cross and Hyden.

"Now the priority is to extend the State Barrier Fence eastwards from its current termination point near Ravensthorpe, extending north around Salmon Gums and terminating east of Esperance near Cape Arid National Park."

Mr de Grussa said Minister Littleproud was very generous with his time.

"The Nationals believe face-to-face advocacy is better than the preferred method of WA's current Labor Agriculture Minister who tends to shout and stomp her feet through the media until she gets what she wants," Mr de Grussa said.

"Clearly, that approach isn't working for WA pastoralists."
