

FROM THE NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

- Council considered Ordinary Council Meeting dates for 2019, with the following dates set: 21 February, 21 March, 18 April, 16 May, 20 June, 18 July, 15 August, 19 September, 17 October, 21 November, 13 December (Friday). All meetings will commence at 4.30pm unless otherwise advertised.
- Council determined that the 2019 Local Government Election will be conducted by the WA Electoral Commission, as a postal election.
- Council reviewed delegations relating to the payments to creditors and payments of accounts electronically.
- Council reviewed the Agreement with landholders Dawson Patterson and Rowland Sprigg to access water from Anderson's Bore, and agreed to renew the Agreement.
- Council endorsed the reviewed Standard Operating Procedures for Bush Fire Brigades 2019. All bushfire brigade personnel should familiarise themselves with the content of this document, which is available on the Shire's website at <u>www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/shire/</u> <u>publications.php</u>.
- Council considered and approved a planning application for a garage extension to be developed at Lot 2 (14) McGuire Road, Broomehill.
- Council considered an application from CBH seeking • planning approval for two open bulkheads for grain storage on Lot 2 Nardlah Road, Broomehill, and to extend the use of two approved 'temporary' bulkheads located on Lot 4 Nardlah Road for the 2018/2019 harvest period. All Councillors declared an interest in the item, and approval was required from the Minister for Local Government for all six Councillors present to participate in the discussion and decision. Approval was granted for Crs Paganoni, Sheridan, Letter and Nazzari, however Crs Thompson and Holzknecht were not permitted to participate. Planning approval was granted for the development of the two new bulkheads, and also the extension of use for the temporary bulkheads.

WORKS

The construction crew has completed gravel sheeting and culvert works on Pallinup South Rd in preparation for sealing, and the remainder of the project is to be completed after harvest. We thank everyone for their patience while the culvert works in particular were underway. The crew has moved to Warrenup Rd to continue the reconstruct and seal of a 2.2km section.

Works to upgrade the footpath on Garrity St Tambellup have commenced with the removal of the old concrete slabs, Residents using this section of path should exercise caution while works are underway.

Spring means ongoing mowing for the parks and gardens crew, as well as seasonal pruning and mulching of garden beds in the townsites. Reticulation is being checked and repaired where necessary, and the ovals have both been sprayed for clover and black beetle. Mosquito fogging has been completed in both towns when weather conditions are suitable.

The maintenance crew has been busy with a range of general maintenance activities, including signage and guide post replacement, pot hole patching and repairs to various streets in the townsites. Work to repair several large failures on Pallinup South Rd has commenced, and motorists are asked to observe signage when travelling through the area.

The maintenance graders have been working in the south east section of the shire, with the following roads being graded during November: Beejenup Rd, Hassell Rd, Tilbury Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Aylmore Rd, Witham Rd, Sprigg-Simpson Rd, Nazzari Rd, Batchelor Rd and Hamilla Rd.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

As we head towards harvest and summer, a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

- Harvest Ban Hotline phone 98251042. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.
- Text messaging Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct. Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.
- Radio broadcasts ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.
- **Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer** contact details are noted above.
- And if all else fails make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!



The committee would like to invite all those who have shown a non binding commitment to purchase shares in the Cooperative to come along to the 'Formation' meeting.







ANZAC Townscape Plans


Council has resolved to review the adopted townscape plans for the area around the ANZAC memorial in Tambellup.

Current plans allow for a minor relocation of the war memorial and redevelopment of the area with planter boxes and paving. These plans form part of the adopted Townscape plans.

The new plans are similar to the adopted plans, however, it is proposed to move the memorial a further 7 metres to allow for an expanded area for memorial services. The memorial will be located further away from the road edge, with an 'ANZAC Square' being developed between the road edge and the relocated memorial. The memorial will also located on a higher plinth or base. Planter boxes with rosemary and roses will be located on either side of the memorial, and a rising sun motif will be laid in the paving to better recognise the significance of the memorial. Sketches have been developed to conceptually show the changes.

Council is seeking public comment on the changes to the memorial space, and comment can be made until the end of February 2019. The adopted plans and the concept sketches are available from the Shire offices in Tambellup and Broomehill. Comment can be submitted in writing on a submission form or in letter format, or emailed to the Shire at <u>mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au</u>

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY: PLANT OPERATOR/GENERAL HAND

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is seeking a team-oriented person to fill the position of Plant Operator/General Hand based at our Tambellup Works Depot.

The successful applicant, as part of a multi-skilled team, will carry out a range of duties across the organisation, including assisting to carry out road construction, drainage and road maintenance works with the operation of plant such as loaders, rollers, graders and trucks; assisting the parks and gardens team in maintenance of gardens, parks, ovals and public open spaces; and other general labouring duties within the works program. The position reports to the Works Supervisor who is responsible for day-to-day management within the Shire's Works area.

Conditions of employment are in accordance with the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Operations Collective Agreement 2016. Remuneration range is \$26.0376 - \$27.4199 per hour dependent on experience. Operations staff work a nine day fortnight with a rostered day off.

Experience in plant operation is preferred, but not essential as training will be provided. Applicants must hold at least a current WA 'MR' driver's licence as a minimum.



The local derby was held at Tambellup on Saturday 17th November with the Broomehill team finding some form and upsetting the undefeated ladder leaders (77-53).


The final round saw us travel to Nyabing and notch up another good win (78-60).

Free mammograms for KATANNING women

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Katanning. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be located at the car park behind Town Square, Clive Street from 30/11/2018 to 7/01/2019.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.

The mobile service will then be moving to {NextTown1} and {NextTown2}.

Great Southern Hearts #driveforlife

Our Son-in-law, Glenn (Yogi) Kendall was in his truck driving home across the Nullabor when he passed several trucks of hay being driven to NSW. They were paid truck drivers and the hay was being sold in NSW for \$400/bale. A few kilometres later, he phone his wife - our daughter Amanda. He said "I have a plan, put me on loud speaker so your Mum and Dad can hear. I want to organise a 100% donated feed run to the drought affected areas of NSW, but also to promote Rural Living as well as Mental and Physical health in Rural Areas. What do you think"? Our response was," It sounds good, how are you planning to go about it"? "Leave it with me" That night, while refuelling his truck he spoke to his truckie mate, Peter Wright from Kojonup. He floated the idea past Peter, and by that night they had donations coming in from all over the Great Southern for hay, sheep pellets, dog food, horse food, money and personal items. The idea became a reality. An account was set up with the Kojonup Lions Club and CWA of WA as they both had a DGR Status, so 100% of donations would go to the Fundraising. The response was enormous, and in the end they had to stop accepting donations as they didn't have enough trucks available to cart all the offered goods. Within three weeks it was organised.

On Monday 24 September in Kojonup, a huge turnout of locals waved off our convoy of four trucks with three more joining us along the way. The truckies had all donated their time and trucks. We had eight kids plus 3 caravans, Amanda and friend Holly in their ute, a Prado with the cameramen from Outback Truckers (which will be shown next year on 7Mate) and a motorhome driven by myself and husband Ken, bearing the CWA of WA Logo with Tambellup Branch on each side, (thanks to Anne-Marie Lockyer of Tambellup for providing these) we left Kojonup with \$100,000 worth of donated goods to be delivered to drought stricken areas of NSW.

A very big thankyou is extended to Alyson Cooper from Nyabing & Sue McDougall from Badgebup/Rockwell who liased with Head Office for a donation to come from Sir James Mitchell Welfare & Education Fund, I was very proud to be bearing the gifts from CWA. \$5,000 was allocated, which was turned into \$100 Visa Gift Cards, and I was able to get Woolworth's Katanning to waive the \$5.75 fee per card. Nyabing Branch generously sent a cheque to pay for the convoy's lunch one day, which we had at the Penong General Store. The Nyabing Primary School had written letters to students in the drought affected areas to be distributed. Badgebup/Rockwell sent lovely fruitcakes and Anzac biscuits, plus other monetary donations were sent direct to CWA Head Office by members of the public.

Yogi had selected areas that had not previously received feed. The support from local community groups, the CWA and Lions along the way was just incredible. Every town we arrived in welcomed us with open arms. They made morning teas, lunches, afternoon teas and dinners for us all. We had stopovers in Salmon Gums WA, Border Village SA, Ceduna SA, Mildura Vic, Balranald, Hay, Rankin Springs, Forbes and Gunnedah NSW.

We had a few special guests join us along the way. Ben Maguire of the Australian Trucking Association loaded a trailer, and travelled with us to Hay. We also had other ATA guests and Sharon & Steve from the SARTA join us in Ceduna. We almost had Prime Minister, Scott Morrison join us, but unfortunately had to withdraw at the last minute. Andrew Broad MP, Federal Member for the Mallee Region and Assistant to the Deputy Prime Minister flew himself into Hay for a catchup and organised a Facetime with the Prime Minister and the truckies.

Amanda organised her friend, celebrity actor Aaron Jeffrey (McLeod's Daughters, Wentworth, Chopper fame) join us in Mildura and travelled to Forbes where he was met by his partner Zoe Naylor and children. This caused a real buzz and a few heart flutters wherever Aaron went.

There were some hiccups along the way, when we had a truck breakdown, which fortunately was able to be fixed, followed by one of the Road Trains not being allowed past Port Augusta. This resulted in us having to leave one Trailer of hay behind for drought affected farmers in South Australia at the request of the South Australian Government. Another road train was not allowed to follow the same route as the rest of the convoy, as the driver was not accredited to drive in that part of South Australia.

The trip from Broken Hill to Balranald was heartbreaking, as the only thing surviving was the feral goat population. There was bare sand and barely a tuft of grass. Road kill along the way was dreadful, with a carcass of either a kangaroo or emu seen every couple of metres at times.

On a brighter note, we had a fantastic time in Mildura, where we had a day off and watched the West Coast Eagles defeat Collingwood in the AFL Grand Final. We were a very happy convoy as we left for Balranald the next morning. My cousin had organised a beautiful brunch for us all, and most of the town including a lot of my relations had turned out for the occasion. We were given a Police Escort out of town with sirens blaring.

Our first drop off was at Hay. They decided that although they were in drought, there were many other places worse off, and volunteered to take their feed to other parts of NSW who needed it more. We were met there by Kate Smith, a member of the Hay CWA. She had collected a large amount of household items that she wanted us to distribute in Forbes and Gunnedah.

The next stop was Rankin Springs where the CWA put on a delicious morning tea for us. They have a population of 90 people, and have just been down- graded from a Town status to a Village, as their population has dropped. If they lose any more, they are then removed as a spot on a tourist map. That morning the entire population, plus outsiders would have been there. They raised 8950 that morning to add to the fundraiser. Our next stop was Forbes which normally has a 20-22 inch rainfall, and had only had two for the year. They were suffering big time, as two years ago, they were flooded, then two years of drought. Whilst travelling, you would see bare paddocks with a tinge of green, and realise this was supposed to be a crop, or others that were maybe 5-8cm high, were still green, but would battle to get a header low enough to do anything with it, plus there was hardly any grain in the heads.

A huge turnout of locals were there waiting for us to arrive in Forbes with the feed. It was quite emotional, as people were

supposed to register to be allocated any feed, but quite a lot had not done this, and unfortunately as we only had limited feed on, they were turned away. We could have had a hundred trucks there, and it still wouldn't have been enough. It was so sad. At times, it became quite emotional, as some people were trying to take more than they should, and others who really needed if were too proud to take any.

This was my first drop off with the CWA contribution. I was met by the President Elaine Bright and Treasurer Zelma Grayson of the Forbes CWA Day Branch and gave them \$2,500 in \$100 Gift Cards for them to distribute to locals, to be spent locally. These ladies were totally overwhelmed, and tears were shed. They couldn't believe that our CWA of WA would be so generous, and to provide the Gift Cards in this manner. so locals could distribute to locals was amazing. I also gave half the fruit cakes and Anzac biscuits to them and half the letters from the students of the Nyabing Primary School to give to the four Primary Schools in Forbes. We were provided with another beautiful afternoon tea, followed by the Day & Night Branch of Forbes CWA in conjunction with their Lions Club putting on a beautiful dinner for us. They have the two Branches as this works for them. The Day Branch is the "Older Set" with approximately 30 members, and are a more formal group, and the Night Branch with approximately 20 members is the "Younger Set", the mothers and working women who can't make the day meetings, and is less formal and more social.

After Forbes, we were down to two trucks - Yogi's & Peter's. The other trucks, were all unloaded by this stage, and Yogi had organised "Back loads" for them all to help cover some of their costs, and they all started to make their way back home TO WA.

The last drop was Gunnedah, this was less hectic as we had a drop at one of the local machinery businesses, and then to a storage shed. The Aussie Helpers group handled this, and they would distribute the feed to the farmers, so we didn't have to cope with distressed people.

This was my final drop off on behalf of CWA of WA. I was met by the Treasurer Kris Scott of the Gunnedah CWA where I handed her the final \$2,500 worth of \$100 Visa Gift Cards, the balance of the fruit cakes, Anzac Biscuits and letters to their Primary Schools. Once again, this was received by a very emotional, and overwhelmed lady, who promised that

they would distribute this thoughtfully, and request that the recipients spend it locally, as its not only the farmers who were suffering, when they stop spending, then the local businesses suffer. As their branch members had spent the entire day packing hampers to distribute, Kris came alone to meet us. Their Branch had received a huge supply of food from a school in Sydney that morning, and members were exhausted, and had all gone home when she received the phone call to say we had arrived.



Earthquake



Earthquakes strike suddenly and without warning

They can strike anywhere and at any time as tectonic plates mash and grind against each other. You may think Australia is relatively safe, being in the middle of a tectonic plate, but we are actually rattled by roughly one small earthquake a day.

Earthquakes are the shaking, rolling or sudden shock of the earth's surface. Earthquakes happen along cracks (called fault lines) in the earth's surface. Earthquakes can be felt over large areas, although they usually last less than one minute. Earthquakes cannot be predicted — although scientists are working on it!

BEFORE:

- Prepare an emergency kit.
- Prepare a communication plan, make sure you have important numbers such as family and emergency contacts.
- Know the safe spots in every room – under a sturdy table or against an inside wall.
- Ask your family to hold earthquake drills – drop, cover, and hold on!

DURING:

- DROP to the ground.
- Take COVER under a sturdy table or other heavy furniture. If there is nothing to get under, cover your face and head with your arms and crouch near an inside wall.
- HOLD ON until the shaking stops.
- Stay away from windows, glass, lighting fixtures, or furniture that could fall – like bookcases.

AFTER:

- Expect aftershocks. They are usually not as strong but can cause damage.
- Open cabinets carefully.
 Objects might have moved and could fall on you.
- Wear long pants, long sleeves, and shoes to protect your skin from getting scratched by broken objects.
- Turn off electricity, gas, and water. Do not light matches. Check for gas or fuel leaks and damaged wiring.
- Unplug appliances and broken lights to prevent fire starts when the power is restored.
- Listen to the radio or television for information from authorities. Follow their instructions.

Broomehill Historical Notes

Friday September 13th 1889

Government Gazette

...Roads – The following, upon recommendation of the Kojonup Roads Board, has been declared a main road: a road, one chain wide, commencing from the end of the surveyed Kojonup-Eticup main road, and extending thence in a north-easterly direction to the Broome Hill station on the Great Southern Railway....

The West Australian Friday 29th November 1889

Albany News (By Telegraph) (From Our Correspondent)

Albany November 28

Mrs L Van Zuilecom, of Fairfield, Eticup. Died suddenly yesterday. The Ormus takes about 150 bales from this port. Miss Von Finkelstein lectures at the Town Hall tomorrow night.

Western Mail Saturday 22nd March 1890

News of the Week

A young man named Clinch, manager for Mr Garrity, at Eticup, died very suddenly at Broome Hill, last Thursday wee. A ball was being conducted at Mr Garrity's house, that night, and shortly before 11 o'clock, during one of the dances, Mr Clinch had just taken his partner back to a seat, when he fell to the ground, apparently in a fainting fit. He was removed to the open air, and restoratives applied for quite an hour, without any avail, death, it is believed, having been instantaneous. Mr Clinch, who was very generally esteemed, leaves a wife and several young children in South Australia.

The Daily News Thursday 24th April 1890

General News

... Referring to the purchase of a large block of land at Albany by Lord Brassey, the Albany "Advertiser" states – Mr John Hassell, the agent in this colony for Lord Brassey, informs us that he has completed the purchase of 15 000 acres of land at Eticup. The land selected surrounds the township of Eticup and is of good quality. Within it is situated the home farm, the Goblup estate, purchased from Lady Campbell. It is intended to fence the whole of the estate, cut it into paddocks, and supply it with water. When that is done, the estate will be cut up into farms, Mr Hassell also informs us that by this mail he received a commission to purchase 20 000 acres for a gentleman in London. This land is required for the carrying out a large settlement scheme...

The West Australian Wednesday 17th September 1890

Albany News

...The surveys of Lord Brassey's first block of 14 000 acres at Eticup has been completed. Eighty-five acres of fallow land have been sown with wheat, and the crop looks splendid and is over 2 feet high. The lambing on this property is very good, 600 lambs being dropped by 950 ewes....

Western Mail Saturday 7th February 1891

Kojonup Police Court

At the Kojonup Police Court, held on Wednesday, the 28th instant, David Reece, of Eticup, appeared to answer a charge brought against him for trespassing with horses and carts upon the lands of the West Australian Land Company, and for removing sandalwood. Mr Fenwick represented the Company. Reece admitted the charge. The Resident Magistrate, Dr Rosselloty, pointed out that the Company, in proceeding against the defendant for trespass only, were dealing most leniently. It was, he said, open to them in such cases to bring a charge for theft, when the consequences to a person placed in the position of Reece would be very serious indeed. In dealing with this case he hoped to convey a warning to others. He imposed a penalty, together with damages and costs. Amounting in all to the sum of \in 7 3s.

The West Australian Tuesday 11th October 1892

Broomehill Notes

The occasion of the departure of Mr J A Little to take a position under Messers F & C Piesse, Katanning, gave his many friends an opportunity of testifying to their sincere regard for him. On Friday the 30th, upwards of thirty assembled at the residence of Mr Nicholas, who, on behalf of all, presented Mr Little with a very handsomely illuminated address signed by many others in addition to those present. Mr Little's health was then drunk with the usual musical honours, a he having suitably responded to the toast, songs, recitations, and other contributions to the general amusement filled up a most pleasurable programme.


The crops are looking well all round the district, the rainfall having been of a most satisfactory abundance, during the past few months and a good season is expected.

Local improvements are progressing fast. In a very short time the town will possess a large hall, capable of accommodating either travelling or local companies. Mr Hack is responsible for this enterprise. The erection of a police station has also been started, and the railway platform has been improved by the addition of a new crane, which will prove of great convenience. A new brickyard has also been opened, and excellent bricks are being turned out.

Great preparations are being made for annual agricultural show on the 19th inst. New sheds have been built, and the livestock accommodation has been very materially increased. The patronage of the governor is expected to make a considerable difference in attendance, and given fine weather, a grand success must be scored. On the day following the show the Broomehill and Eticup cricket clubs will play a match at the former place.
