The next meeting of Council will be held on <u>Thursday 18th October 2018 commencing at 4.00pm</u> in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING

Council agreed to contribute \$2000 towards the production of a coffee-table style book showcasing the stories of people living and working in the region.

A rates concession was granted to the Tambellup Golf Club for 2018-2019 on the basis that it provides a facility that is available to all members of the community and is used regularly throughout the year by both Club members, non-members and community groups.

Council granted retrospective planning approval for the development of a dwelling at Lot 2535 Paul Valley Rd.

Council considered tender submissions for the replacement of the Shire's multi-tyred roller.

WORKS

The next stage of works on Pallinup South Rd is set to commence, with vegetation clearing complete and delivery of materials to site. This job will see a 3.5km section of the road widened and sealed to 7.0 metres. A similar project will be completed on Warrenup Rd following South Pallinup Rd, with a 2.5km section being widened and sealed. Vegetation clearing in this area is yet to be competed. People travelling through these areas are asked to be mindful of workers and pay heed to speed signage in place.

The maintenance graders have been working through the middle of the Shire during late August and September, and are heading to south east parts into October. Roads graded during August and September included West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Etna Rd, Peringillup East Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Collins Rd, Des Wray Rd, Hilder Rd, Crosby Rd, Birt Rd, Paul Valley Rd, North West Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Stirling Access Rd and North Stirlings Rd.

The maintenance crew has been 'everything to everyone' during September, working on gravel and bitumen pot hole patching, sign and guidepost maintenance, repairs to town streets, and general maintenance. Drainage issues at the Broomehill Oval appear to have been resolved with the remedial works that were implemented. The parks and gardens crew has been refreshing garden beds in the townsites with new plantings and mulch, as well as keeping on top of mowing and weeding. All reticulation systems are being checked prior to summer.

SENIORS MOBILITY AND FITNESS CLASSES

Seniors – are you interested in participating in FREE exercise classes? These are held at the Tambellup Pavilion on alternate Wednesdays – 10^{th} and 24^{th} October, 7^{th} and 21^{st} November, and 5^{th} and 19^{th} December from 11.00-12.00 noon. These sessions are delivered by a qualified personal trainer, and have been organised in conjunction with the Shire of Cranbrook. DOG AND CAT REGISTRATIONS

Residents are reminded that all dog and cat registrations are due for renewal on <u>31 October</u> each year. Notification will be sent to owners of dogs and cats with registration expiring in 2018. Payment for re-registration can be made at either the Broomehill or Tambellup office. It is important to get your dog or cat registered and microchipped – this lets us reunite your family pets with you if they become lost. MOSQUITOES

And they're back! Mosquitoes are always an issue in our Shire during spring and early summer. Council baits pools of water and has commenced a fogging program of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health has advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self-draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.

The Shire was represented at the State Tidy Towns Awards, held in Perth on 21st September, being named as finalists in three categories: Community Action and Wellbeing, Environmental Sustainability and General Appearance. BROOMEHILL OFFICE HOURS

All residents are reminded the Broomehill Administration office is open from 8.30am – 4.30pm Monday to Friday, closing for lunch from 12 noon – 1.00pm each day. We also take this opportunity to remind customers that all receipting closes off at 4.00pm each day – this includes Department of Transport transactions. People presenting at the office close to 4.00pm with Department of Transport transactions may not have their business completed at that time. We understand this may cause inconvenience to the customer however staff are required to close off promptly at 4.00pm. Your cooperation in this regard will be greatly appreciated.

Residents are also reminded that payments made by EFTPOS at the Shire offices (with the exception of Department of Transport payments) will attract a surcharge of 1.2% of the value of the transaction, regardless of the card used. This fee assists to recover the cost of providing this service on a user pays basis.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are reminded the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2018**. From this date you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires, and all conditions of the permit must be complied with. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Acting CESM, Kelly MacLeod. The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2018**. No burning is permitted from this date until **14 FEBRUARY 2019**.

BUSHFIRE HAZARD REDUCTION - SPECIAL RURAL AND RURAL RESIDENTIAL LAND

The Shire has recently written to all landowners in the Special Rural and Rural Residential zoned areas of the Shire, to request action towards compliance with the following requirement of the Fire Break Order:

Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Fire Brigade Boundaries

2.0 LAND ZONED RURAL RESIDENTIAL/SPECIAL RURAL (Townsite and Suburban areas)

During the period from 31st October 2018 to 15th April 2019 inclusive you shall have fire breaks in the following positions:

2.1 Clear firebreaks not less than 2 metres completely surrounding and not more than 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land.

Minimise fire hazardous material to the satisfaction of the Chief Fire Control Officer by stocking, slashing or other means. The height of all grass on the land is to be less than 150mm in height. Properties will be inspected and orders may be issued.

Over the past few years the management of Special Rural and Rural Residential blocks by owners/occupiers to comply with this requirement has resulted in less than satisfactory outcomes. This year the Shire will be conducting inspections to ensure all Special Rural and Rural Residential zoned properties comply and maintain compliance throughout the required period. The Shire has power under the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to issue infringements and/or have the work required undertaken by a contractor at the owners expense if compliance is not achieved. We encourage all owners with land in Special Rural and Rural Residential areas to assess what they need to do to be compliant, undertake these works and monitor their land for bushfire hazards during the fire season. 



Thank you for your assistance in this matter.



FAUNA NOTES

Magpies – Swooping and Safety Issues

Identification and Distribution

The Australian magpie Cracticus tibicen (or Gymnorhina tibicen) is a large butcherbird with a black head, body, wing tips and tail tip with patches of white. The bill is bluegrey in colour, the legs are black and the eyes are brown. Males have a white nape, whereas females have a grey nape. Magpies are characterised by strong, rich and varied carolling.

The Australian magpie occurs throughout much of Australia, including bushland, farmland towns and other urban areas. Two of Australia's five sub-species occur in Western Australia: the western magpie Cracticus tibicen dorsalis occurs in the southwest and the black-backed magpie Cracticus tibicen tibicen is found in the central and northern regions. These two subspecies interbreed where their ranges meet. Refer to www.naturemap.dpaw.wa.gov.au to find further information on the species distribution.

Behaviour

The diet of the Australian magpie includes some plant material, but consists mainly of small animals that are found on the ground, including beetles, ants, spiders, lizards, frogs and carrion. They have very good hearing which allows them to locate lawn beetle larvae. They also eat other garden and farm pests and are valued as natural pest control agents.

Magpies breed between August and October and at least 2-3 ha (0.02-0.03km²) of territory is needed for pairs to successfully raise young. The female selects the nest site, which is usually in a tall tree, and constructs the nest from sticks lined with grass, roots and other fibres. Up to 6 eggs are laid and a new clutch may be laid if the first brood fails. The female incubates the eggs for about three weeks and feeds the chicks for about four weeks. Young magpies are forced to leave the territory by their parents within two years. They then join another group or take over a territory as part of an adult breeding pair. The young are vulnerable and many die within the first months of independence due to poor weather conditions, lack of food, road hazards and natural predators.

Magpies have a complex social structure and form tribes and flocks. Tribes consist of 2-10 birds of both sexes, which defend a territory of up to 8 ha (0.08km²). They vigorously defend this territory against other magpies because this is the area in which they obtain their food, build nests and rear their young. Flocks consist of birds that are young or too old to breed and are unable to form a tribe or gain access to a territory. These birds live in areas that do not contain sufficient water, feeding or nesting resources. The flock is nomadic as it moves from place to place in search of food.

Environmental Law

All fauna native to Australia, including fauna that naturally migrates to Australia, are afforded protection under both State and Commonwealth legislation.

Depending on the type of fauna-related activity, a licence issued by the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions may be required. It is an offence to intentionally or recklessly kill, injure, trade, keep or move them unless authorised by a permit. To obtain a licence, the applicant needs to demonstrate that all reasonable non-lethal methods have been attempted and environmental impacts have been assessed. Further information is available on the Department's website.

Magpie-Human Interactions

Magpies swoop to protect eggs and young from potential predators during the nesting season. They rely largely on intimidation to deter human intruders by flying low and fast, often clacking their bill as they pass overhead. The sound of their wings whistling past and the movement of air can be alarming, but is usually just a bluff.

FAUNA NOTES - Magpies - Swooping and Safety Issues

Like dogs, magpies seem to sense fear and may capitalise on this by pressing on with harassing any perceived threat. Occasionally, a magpie will actually strike an intruder on the head with its bill. While such strikes are rare, magpies can inflict serious injuries. Information collected at hospital emergency departments has shown that the eye was the most common target. Magpies are more likely to swoop cyclists and postal workers.

If you find a sick or injured magpie contact the <u>Wildcare Helpline</u> on (08) 9474 9055 for information on registered wildlife rehabilitators and centres who can assist you with your enquiry.

Reducing the risk from swooping magpies

If you have problems with a swooping magpie, several avenues of action are open to you. Keep in mind that the birds swoop only during the nesting and rearing period (from August to October) and each bird generally only swoops for a few weeks during this time. If we can understand the catalysts and the patterns of magpie behaviour, we can greatly reduce the risk.

Living safely with magpies

The following steps can be followed to avoid or reduce the impact of a swooping magpie:

- Never deliberately provoke or harass a magpie. Throwing sticks or stones usually makes them more defensive. Magpies have good memories and they may continuously swoop a potential aggressor.
- Avoid areas where magpies are known to swoop. Remember, magpie hostility lasts only a few weeks and they usually only defend a small area of about 100m radius around their nest.
- Locate the bird and keep watching it when entering its territory. If it swoops, don't crouch in fear or stop: move on quickly but don't run.
- If you are riding a bike make sure you wear a helmet, and dismount and walk through nesting magpie territory.
- Wear a hat and sunglasses or carry an umbrella for protection. Magpies initially attack from behind but can swoop back around.
- · Adopt a confident stance as this can have a strong deterrent effect.

Remember that the magpies are just trying to protect their young. Learning to live alongside wildlife is an important step towards building a better living environment, and observing and listening to magpies can be an enjoyable experience.

Taking a bird or nest from the wild is illegal without a permit and while such actions may temporarily stop attacks, it is not uncommon for another nesting bird to move in. It is better to avoid the area or live with the swooping bird for six to eight weeks until the chicks learn to fly and the problem ceases.

Jessie (Lil) Lyall passed away on her 106^{th} birthday. Even though residing in Albany she always said Tambellup was home. She will be missed by so many family and friends.

Granny's Australian story began in 1922 when, as a 10 year old, she and her family came out on the Euripides from Islington, London. They landed in Albany, she remembered seeing nasturtians in flower as they came through the channel into Princess Royal Harbour.

The family moved to Pinjarra where her her father worked as a timber hand in a Mill. Granny went to live with her Aunt Chris in Perth, as the heat did not agree with her. She went to school in Victoria Park. After a few years, the family moved to Lake Grace, where Granny joined them. It was here that she met the love of her life, James Smith Lyall. She would tell us how Pop would show off to her on his motorbike. He would stand on the seat as he rode past trying to impress her. It must have worked, as they got married in 1932. Soon after they welcomed Margaret into their lives. 5 years later, Joan came along and completed their family.

They lived in Lake Grace until Pop enlisted in the Air Force during WW2 in 1940. Granny would follow Pop during the war years to Perth and then to Melbourne. When he was posted to Darwin, Granny returned to Perth to wait for him. During this time, Granny, her sister Phyllis and sister-in-law Ella took a holiday to Dunsborough, where on the promise of fresh fish, she and Phyl swam out to a fishing boat with money in their mouth, to buy fresh fish for dinner.

After the bombing of Darwin, Pop was transferred to Kalgoorlie, where the family joined him until the end of the war.

After the war, the family returned to Lake Grace, where Pop worked in the co-op and furthered his education. The family then moved to Tambellup where Pop became manager of the Tambellup Coop.

After Margaret and Joan married local farmers, Granny decided to get her licence. She was following the policeman's instructions implicitly. To the point that when he said to 'turn left here' ... she did ... down the embankment onto the Gordon River flats! But ... she still got her licence.

After grandchildren came along, she overheard one of the grandsons mention breaking a record at the school sports day. Granny said to Margaret "I hope it wasn't a good one" - she didn't understand what a record meant in sport.

One day, after watching her grandsons riding their horse, she decided she could have a go. They lent a plank up on the horse for her to get on. She was willing to have a go at most things.

Pop was a member of the Lodge in Tambellup. Granny would call it Secret Men's Business. Pam recalls Granny showing her a case and explaining the Secret Men's Business to her. The girls also remember going in to the Coop house in town and smelling roast turkey cooking. They were looking forward to tasting it, until Granny said that it was for the Lodge.

Granny's favourite foods were crabs, kunaks and prawns. She would lick her lips at the thought of a fresh feed of them.

She joined the CWA in Tambellup for a while, but left saying that they talked too much. She always referred to them as Chin Waggers - even in later years, when she rejoined the group.

As time went on Granny and Pop decided it was time to move to Bunbury and retire. During this time, they travelled to England and numerous other countries, including Canada, to catch up with relations. Some of these trips, they did with their friends, the Targets. They would often go for 6 months at a time.

The next move was to Katanning. They were only there for a short time, when Pop passed away and Granny moved to Henry Street in Tambellup. During this time, Granny and her sister Phyllis would spend alot of time visiting eachother and travelling. Carnarvon was a favourite spot for them, along with Kalgoorlie and also a trip to England.

Family was very important to Granny. She always enjoyed family events. Shopping was also a passion for her and she never said no when someone offered a trip to Katanning or Albany. Chinese takeaway was always on the menu.

Granny left an amazing legacy behind with 2 daughters, 10 grandchildren, 28 great grandchildren, 18 great great grandchildren and 4 great great grandchildren.
