FROM THE MARCH COUNCIL MEETING

At the March mee g Council conducted a review of its 2017-2018 annual budget. The purpose of a budget review is to ensure that income and expenditure for the current year is monitored against the adopted budget and where variances have occurred, or are likely to occur, make amendments to the budget if necessary. A major consid n in the review was the redu n in direct grant funding from the State Government this year, and this has resulted in Council deferring the on of a shelter over play equipment in Diprose in Park. This project will be reconsidered during 2018-2019 budget delib ns.

Council considered and accepted a new agreement with the Department of Transport for the provision of vehicle and drivers licensing services for a further three year period.

Council approved a request from Sgt Allan Mallard from Tambellup Police to support the install on of a new agpole at the Tambellup Admin on ce, to facilitate the ying of the Aboriginal ag daily. Sgt Mallard successfully obtained funding for the purchase of two agpoles - one for the Shire office and one for the Police on and shire sta will install both.

WORKS

The impact of a fairly dry summer period is becoming evident, with dam levels in Broomehill and Tambellup generally under 50% capacity. Watering of the Tambellup oval using treated water is also due to end in coming weeks, so we hope the season opening rains are not too far away. Saying that, our ovals and parks are in good shape for this me of the year, indic ng our watering programs and infrastructure is doing the job. All dam catchments have been graded recently to enhance water harves ng. Parks and gardens st are c uing an extensive mowing program for the ovals and other areas of the townsites. They ng the Broomehill Recre onal will be Complex com ee with the implement on of new landscaping in coming weeks and also completed the landscaping around the new Tambellup St John Ambulance Sub Centre building. The construc on crew has been working on Warrenup Rd, where clearing and gravelling of a 2.2km n has been completed as part of the construct and seal project. Sealing of sec ns of Norrish St and Taylor St have been completed and the current stage of Tambellup townscape upgrade

works has been died up. In response to complaints about excessive dust on McGuire Rd, a 400 metre n adjoining the end of the seal has been stabilised and graded. Council will consider the cost of sealing this n in its

2018-2019 budget delibe ons. The inst on of the new washdown bay at the Shire depot has commenced, with the installa on of two tanks with a combined capacity of 500kL. Plumbing of the tanks to the sheds is underway, and concre ng of the washdown pad will commence in coming weeks. This system, once complete, will allow for up to 80% of the water used to wash down items of plant, to be tered and recycled through the system.

Welcome back to CRC updates.

The first 3 months of 2018 have been rather challenging with regard to staffing. Viv left us in December and, after advertising and conducting some interviews, all CRC's were made aware that there would be huge funding cuts across the CRC Network after our current funding contract with the Department of Primary Industry and Regional Development (DPIRD) ends in March 2019. Our Management Committee has decided not to appoint a new manager until after we know what our future will be beyond March 2019.

For the remainder of our contract period, the CRC will be co-ordinated by Beth, Alice and Sheree and we will endeavour to offer all current services to the community. When we know if any funding will be offered beyond March 2019, we will reassess the staffing situation at the CRC.

As we are all part-time staff and we recognise the necessity to reduce our costs, as of 1st April the Tambellup CRC will be closed on Mondays and our new opening hours will be:

Tuesday - Friday, 9.00 - 5.00. We apologise for any inconvenience that these reduced hours may cause.

SAVE OUR CRC

As we go forward into our next funding contract (hopefully!!), our CRC must prove be relevant to the Community needs. All our government funding is taxpayers money in some form and must not be wasted. The community must demonstrate a need to keep Tambellup CRC open and this can only be done by the community utilising the services on offer and coming up with new ideas to make our centre relevant. If we were to lose our government funding altogether, our CRC could not operate.

Alleen and I were invited to meet with Minister Alannah MacTiernan on Friday in Gnowangerup. Most of the smaller Great Southern CRC's were in attendance and it was made very clear that **budget cuts** were **non-negotiable**. What could be negotiated was how much funding CRC's would receive. If we are all willing to reduce costs i.e.: open less hours, utilise more volunteers or reduce staff, then hopefully no CRC would need be closed but we all need to be on the same page and be willing to work with what we are offered.

By reducing our opening hours and some of our staff hours, we believe Tambellup can still function efficiently into the future - this is preferable to being closed completely. We must also look for alternate funding streams if we wish to survive.

We need more support from our community to stay viable - there is no point having us open 4 days per week if the community does not need us, use our facility or ask for extra services and training to be offered. We are open to offering new services if there is a need that has support.

With Beth and Alice now on staff, there are 2 positions vacant on the Management Committee. We would love new members so please, if you can spare the time (we know we are all busy), put you hand up and come along to our next committee meeting on Monday 9th April at the CRC at 2.30pm - we need lots of new ideas and community input going forward.







Slow Down, Move Over Law change effective 2 March 2018

SLOMO stands for Slow Down, Move Over. The SLOMO law requires drivers to slow down around nary emergency vehicles, tow trucks, Incident Response Service vehicles and motor break-down service vehicles which are displayin shing lights while ending an incident.

This includes vehicles used by WA Police Force, St John Ambulance, Department of Fire and Emergency Services, break-down service vehicles (such as the RAC), Main Roads WA Incident Response Service and towing companies on site to salvage or tow vehicles.






