The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>15th March 2018</u> commencing at 10.00am in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING

- Councillors attended a number of meetings during January and February, including a Special meeting (to adopt the Annual Report and set the date for the Annual Electors meeting), Independent Living Seniors Committee and Building Committee, and at the full Council meeting minutes and recommendations from those meetings were considered and endorsed as required.
- Council granted retrospective planning approval for the construction of a car port, verandas and a swimming pool at a property on Ettakup Rd. Residents are reminded to check with the Shire before commencing any extensions or new constructions at their property in case planning or other approvals are required.
- Council considered a request for a financial contribution to the Lions Cancer Institute's 'Special Children's Big Day Out'. A donation of \$1000 was approved, and Council will write requesting the organisers to consider holding future events within the region.
- Council received the half year report from the Community Emergency Services Manager.
- Council considered a planning application for a telecommunications tower at Lot 3606 Broomehill-Gnowangerup Rd. This is part of the mobile Black Spot program aimed at improving regional telecommunications. Adjoining landowners will be consulted for comment on the proposal.

STAFF MOVEMENTS

Our long time Broomehill office regular Siegrid Reed has recently advised of her intention to retire at the end of March. Siegrid has been with the Shire since 2006, and has provided a friendly and efficient service to our local residents and also to many visitors to the Shire. We will miss her immensely, but know she and Kevin have exciting times ahead. Good luck and happy days Siegrid!

At the Tambellup office, Customer Service Officer Marni Lloyd-Woods has accepted the position of Finance Administration Officer, vacated in January by Kathy Brigg. Congratulations Marni on taking on this new challenge!

As a result of these staff movements, we are currently advertising two staff vacancies, for Customer Services Officers in the Broomehill and Tambellup offices. We also farewelled one of our younger staff members during February. Damon Powell, who worked as part of the maintenance crew, left the Shire to concentrate on his own small business venture. We wish him well in his future endeavours.

Applications for a Horticultural Traineeship closed on 16th February. This traineeship has been partly funded by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, and will be delivered by ATC Worksmart and Southern Regional TAFE, in conjunction with the Shire. At the time of writing interviews for the applicants were being arranged, and we hope to be able to introduce our new team member in the April Topics.

ANNUAL ELECTORS MEETING

The Annual Electors meeting was held on Wednesday 21 February in the Council Chambers. A small number of residents took the opportunity to question Councillors and staff about a range of matters including future use of the old Tambellup Bowling Club, the kerbside recycling service, facilities at the Waste Transfer Stations and the road closure SMS system. Thank you to those people who attended the meeting.

ABORIGINAL SKILLS FOR LIFE INTENSIVE PROGRAM

Unfortunately this program had to be postponed, due to other commitments in the community. We have rescheduled the two days of workshops to Thursday 12 and Friday 13th April, to be held at the CRC. Anyone interested in participating is welcome to contact Pam at the Shire to register.

As advised in the last Topics, a new Manager of Works has been appointed. Peter Vlahov, who comes to us from the Shire of Wickepin, will commence duties mid-March. In the interim, John Farmer, our Works Supervisor, has been appointed to the position of Acting Manager of Works, and is coordinating the works program.

Works staff took delivery of a new Caterpillar grader during February, and the oldest member of the grader fleet was sold. The new grader will be in the care and control of our Construction Leading Hand, Ricky Riley.

The construction crew has completed a number of jobs in recent weeks, including the construct and seal of a section on South Pallinup Rd, the reseal of an 8km section of Toolbrunup Rd, stabilising and patching of a 6m section of Toolbrunup Rd, and clearing required prior to the construct and seal of a 2.2km section of Warrenup Rd.

The maintenance graders have been working mainly in the north west part of the Shire, with roads graded during February including Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Punchmirup North Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Nardlah Rd, Etna Rd, Nookanellup Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Holly East Rd, Beejenup Rd, Washington South Rd, Holding Rd, Mattiske Rd, Parnell Rd, Moore Rd, and Wandoo Rd.

Residents will have noticed the gravel sections on Taylor St, and at the North Terrace/Norrish St intersection at the moment. Stabilising of these sections has been completed, and sealing will be carried out at a later date, in conjunction with other scheduled sealing jobs.

The maintenance crew has been busy across a wide range of activities in recent weeks, including the installation of bus stop signs, and maintenance of culverts at various locations.

At this time of the year the main focus for our Parks and Gardens team is watering of areas in the townsites that are not able to be connected to reticulation, and also the maintenance of the reticulation systems. Both ovals have been mowed and the Broomehill tennis courts have been treated to a high pressure clean which has provided an excellent result. Our team has also undertaken landscaping at the new St John Ambulance Sub Centre in Tambellup, in time for the March 9 opening.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

For up to date information on Harvest and Vehicle **Movement Bans:**

Harvest Ban Hotline: Residents can phone 98251042 24/7 to hear pre-recorded information about the status of harvest and vehicle movement bans. This is the most up to date and reliable source of information available.

Harvest Ban SMS: Residents can register their mobile phone number with the Shire, to receive notification of imposing and lifting of harvest and vehicle movement bans, road closures and other emergency information. To register your number for these notifications, please contact Marni at the Shire on 9825 3555. Please be aware that not all areas of the shire experience full mobile signal, and this may result in notifications being delayed. For this reason the SMS system should not be relied on as a sole source of information.

Local Radio: Harvest and vehicle movement ban information is broadcast on ABC radio at 10.05am, 11.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm, and on RadioWest at various times during the day. While every effort is made to ensure local information is provided to the radio stations for broadcast at these times, weather conditions can change quickly, and bans may need to be imposed at relatively short notice. Again, please do not rely on this as a sole source of information.

Residents are directed to the Harvest Ban Hotline -98251042 - as the most up to date and reliable source of information.

If you think the weather conditions have deteriorated to the point where you feel it is unsafe to move vehicles around paddocks - make a judgement call and STOP whether a ban has been imposed or not.





TAMBELLUP VOLUNTEER FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICE

Well, 2017 was a big year for the Unit. Our big ticket item for the year was the delivery of our new 4.4 Broadacre appliance during the week before Christmas - 4000 litres on board a dual cab 4x4 Isuzu truck that will enhance firefighting and rescue capabilities well into the future. The truck is equipped with the latest in crew protection, including the external sprinkler systems, in-cab air and fire blankets and Automatic Vehicle Location system

We also received a second trailer during January. This is a purpose built rescue trailer, and has been reconditioned and reallocated from another VFES unit. The new trailer has been fitted out and is ready for action. The old trailer will be fitted out and used for SES (storm and search) response.

These new acquisitions have been extremely well received and are appreciated by the Unit, however accommodation at the Unit's shed is a problem. The truck, being higher than the old 2.4, only just fits under the roller doors, and trailer space is at a premium. The truck and old trailer are currently housed at the Business Centre on Tambellup West Rd, and we thank Trevor and the Committee for their assistance in this regard. We are currently working with DFES, the Shire and the Department of Building Maintenance and Works on options to modify the shed, to allow for all appliances and equipment to be accommodated.

Our members have participated in a number of DFES courses through the year, including Casualty Handling, Introduction to Structural Fire Fighting and Pump Operations. The last two courses were conducted in Tambellup, and allowed members to gain experience in the use of hydrants and become familiar with the new truck. We have also held Sunday morning and Wednesday night sessions through the year, with a range of activities being undertaken, including car cut-ups, burning of the green waste at the tip, and many opportunities to roll out hoses, operate the pump, draft water, extinguish mock fires, spread firefighting foam and generally practise skills that thankfully are not called in to play often. We are grateful to our more experienced members for walking us through these activities.

Members also attended the DFES Emergency Services Conference in September. The speakers over the course of the weekend were engaging and provided food for thought on the many levels of our volunteering experience, as well as operational issues.
