



The next meeting of Council will be held on Friday <u>15th December 2017</u> commencing at 3.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

The new look Council of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup met for the first Ordinary Council meeting in November, following the Local Government election and Special Council meeting to swear in new Councillors in October. The agenda was fairly light in content, providing an opportunity for the new Councillors to learn more about the meeting procedures and standing orders that steer every Council meeting.

Council is required to determine and advertise its meeting dates for the coming year. The following dates have been set for 2018: 15 February, 15 March, 19 April, 17 May, 21 June, 19 July, 16 August, 20 September, 18 October, 15 November (all Thursdays), and 14 December (Friday).

Council granted planning approval for the construction of a shed at Lot 516 Broomehill-Gnowangerup Road, Broomehill.

Council considered tenders received for the replacement of its 2009 Caterpillar 12M grader. The successful tender was submitted by Westrac, who will supply a new Caterpillar 12M grader and trade the existing grader at a changeover of \$208,275.14. Fleet management is driven by Council's ten year Plant Replacement program, and budget provision is made each year to cover costs.

Council determined to sell the skid steer 600mm profiler attachment to the Shire of Gnowangerup. This attachment is surplus to requirements following the purchase of a larger skid steer unit earlier this year.



WORKS

Roadworks are underway on Pallinup South Rd at present, to widen the seal to 7 metres. Stablising was completed mid-November and sealing was due to be completed by the end of November. A flat pack box culvert has been ordered for installation on Pallinup South Rd, to be completed during the dry period ready for the 2018/2019 construct and seal section. Similar culverts have been ordered for installation on the Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd floodway, it is planned to install these in January before stabilising areas ready for resealing.

Other roadworks planned or underway include the repair of blowouts and stabilising of patches on Toolbrunup Rd ready for resealing in December, continuation of flood restoration works on Marshall Rd and Tieline Rd and a program of maintenance works including bitumen patching, widening of culverts and construction of headwalls.

The maintenance graders are currently working from the south west part of the Shire to the north, with the following roads being graded during November: Chillicup Rd, Pindellup Rd, Warrenup Rd, Ngopitchup Rd, McGuire Rd, Nelson St, Spencer Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Hassell Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Crosby Rd, Bessen Rd, Burridge Rd, Johnston Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Wansbrough West Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Brown Rd, Peter Valley Rd, Binniup Rd, Aylmore Rd, Barrecup Rd, Kings Cross Rd, Anderson Rd, Carr Rd, Nazzari Rd, Sprigg Simpson Rd, Batchelor Rd, Dartall Rd, Gittens Rd, Newton Rd, Bowman Rd, Thorn Rd, Tallents Rd and Forward Rd.

Developing and prioritising submissions, and advocating on the Shire's behalf for the next rounds of Regional Roads Group, Commodity Route and Roads to Recovery programs have occupied a considerable amount of time for Council's Manager of Works. Successful projects will be advised in due course and these will be factored in to the 2018-2019 budget.

In the towns, trimming of trees under powerlines has recently been completed by Katanning Cherry Pickers. The parks and gardens crew has been busy keeping on top of mowing and watering, and the ovals have seen some attention with spraying for broadleaf and black beetles, fertilising and vertimowing (Tambellup Oval) completed through November. The playground in Holland Park has had new sand installed, and the fence replaced, following construction of the new shelter.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR ARRANGEMENTS

The Shire Offices will close at **12 noon** on **Friday 22nd December 2017** and reopen again at 8.30am on **Tuesday 2nd January 2018**. There will be no Vehicle or Drivers Licensing services available at either office during that period.

Council's outside staff will commence their Christmas stand down on Friday 15th December 2017. A "skeleton" crew will remain on duty to attend to any matters over the Christmas period.

Rubbish and recycling collections will be carried out as normal over the Christmas/New Year period. The weekly rubbish collection will be carried out on **Thursday 28**th **December** and **Thursday 4**th **January.** The fortnightly recycling collection will be carried out on **Thursday 21**st **December and Thursday 4**th **January.** Contractors have requested that bins be put out earlier than normal, as they may be running early.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

For up to date information on Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans:

Harvest Ban Hotline: Residents can phone **98251042** 24/7 to hear pre-recorded information about the status of harvest and vehicle movement bans. This is the most up to date and reliable source of information available.

Harvest Ban SMS: Residents can register their mobile phone number with the Shire, to receive notification of imposing and lifting of harvest and vehicle movement bans, road closures and other emergency information. To register your number for these notifications, please contact Marni at the Shire on 9825 3555. Please be aware that not all areas of the shire experience full mobile signal, and this may result in notifications being delayed. For this reason the SMS system should not be relied on as a sole source of information.

Local Radio: Harvest and vehicle movement ban information is broadcast on ABC radio at 10.05am, 11.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm, and on RadioWest 1071 at various times during the day. While every effort is made to ensure local information is provided to the radio stations for broadcast at these times, weather conditions can change quickly, and bans may need to be imposed at relatively short notice. Again, please do not rely on this as a sole source of information.

Residents are directed to the Harvest Ban Hotline – 98251042 – as the most up to date and reliable source of information. If you think the weather conditions have deteriorated to the point where you feel it is unsafe to continue harvesting – make a judgement call and STOP – whether a ban has been imposed or not.
