



The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>16th November 2017</u> commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered a change of meeting date for the December 2017 meeting from Thursday 21st December, as previously advertised, to Friday 15th December. Local public notice has been given advising the change of date.

Council endorsed the "Strategic Community Plan 2012-2022 – Progress Report to 30 June 2017". The report outlined the achievements against the various strategies over the life of the plan, and in particular the 2016-2017 financial year. The Plan is due for its 4 year review, and consultation with the community will occur over the coming months.

The Agreement with landholders for access to water from Anderson's Bore was reviewed and renewed. Anderson's Bore is located in the south east section of the Shire, and the bore provides rural residents with access to water for servicing stock and for meeting spraying requirements.

Council considered and approved a proposed car port as an addition to an existing dwelling at Lot 144 (186) Rourke Street, Tambellup with conditions.

Quotes submitted for Tender No: 04/2017 for the Provision of Project Management Services for Flood Damage Related Reinstatement Work (WANDRRA AGRN 743) were considered and Council has awarded the tender to Les Hewer Consulting Services.

Council endorsed the specifications for replacement of the 2009 Caterpillar 12M Grader with a grader suited to Council's needs. This will be tendered through the Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) purchasing network.

Council approved an application submitted by Geraldine's Restaurant for a variation to the revised opening hours of the restaurant at Lot 25 (12) Crowden Street, Tambellup to allow opening times of 12 noon Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

WORKS

Contractors have been engaged to undertake maintenance grading in the northern section of the shire, which has allowed shire graders to work the mid-east and southern parts of the shire. Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following roads during October: Peringillup East Rd, Peringillup West Rd, Pallinup Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Wray Rd, Gillespie Rd, Martinup Rd, Beejenup Rd and Warrenup Rd.

The new Caterpillar 299D Skid Steer and 1200mm stabilizer have been delivered.

To combat the increase in mosquitoes, fogging has been continuing in both towns. It is expected that this will continue on a regular basis until conditions dry out.

ALSO FROM THE SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL

Council considered a proposal for installation of a grain sampling station at Tunney on the Albany Highway.

In previous years Co-operative Bulk Handling has had approval to install the grain sampling station during the harvest period within a parking bay area on Albany Highway in Tunney. This allowed sampling of grain prior to delivery to bulk storage facilities.

Councils approval, and use of Reserve 18335 should the sampling station cross over onto this land, has been granted for a 3 year period to enable the facility to be installed if, and when, required.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

The safety of our community during harvest and the fire season is of paramount concern, and the Chief, Deputy and Brigade Fire Control Officers communicate regularly to monitor conditions, imposing bans on harvesting and vehicle movement in paddocks when required. These calls are not made lightly, however they are essential to reduce the risk of fire in our district.

Harvest and vehicle movement bans are communicated to residents by Council in a number of ways:

Harvest Ban Hotline: Residents can phone **98251042** 24/7 to hear pre-recorded information about the status of harvest and vehicle movement bans. This is the most up to date and reliable source of information available.

Harvest Ban SMS: Residents can register their mobile phone number with the Shire, to receive notification of imposing and lifting of harvest and vehicle movement bans, road closures and other emergency information. To register your number for these notifications, please contact Kim at the Shire on 9825 3555. Please be aware that not all areas of the shire experience full mobile signal, and this may result in notifications being delayed. For this reason the SMS system should not be relied on as a sole source of information.

Local Radio: Harvest and vehicle movement ban information is broadcast on ABC radio at 10.05am, 11.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm, and on RadioWest 1071 at various times during the day. While every effort is made to ensure local information is provided to the radio stations for broadcast at these times, weather conditions can change quickly, and bans may need to be imposed at relatively short notice. Again, please do not rely on this as a sole source of information.

Residents are directed to the Harvest Ban Hotline – 98251042 – as the most up to date and reliable source of information.

If you think the weather conditions have deteriorated to the point where you feel it is unsafe to continue harvesting – make a judgement call and STOP – whether a ban has been imposed or not.



The Tambellup Bowling Club official opening day for the season was held on Saturday 14th October.



Farewell to a blooming good time

Cranbrook Motocross

This year's Motorcycling Western Australia's Volunteer of the Year award was presented to Justin Shepherd from the Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club. Following a very strong list of 12 nominations submitted by their clubs, Justin was selected by the MWA board for his exceptional dedication to the construction of the new motocross facility at Sukey Hill, Cranbrook.

As the newly elected president of the club, Justin lead by example by building the initial track in just eight days (yes not a misprint – eight days) for it to be ready for a round of the South West Interclub series. Since then Justin has spent every weekend bar two working on the Greg Moss designed track. In addition, Justin and his committee have worked with the local council to raise significant funds to construct the track, clubrooms and other infrastructure to ensure the new track at Sukey Hill becomes the benchmark in Western Australia.

President Peter Clark said of Justin's efforts "This has been an enormous effort, and while we acknowledge that there are many others that contribute to the building and running of a club, that extra effort by an individual is inspiring to others". 




