The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>19th October 2017</u> commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

#### FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered a draft 'Fitness for Work' policy. The draft policy is based on the WALGA model policy and is considered best practice, in helping to ensure a safe working environment is maintained.

Council considered and approved a request from the CEO to be able to take the vehicle supplied as part of his contract interstate.

Council recently advertised its tender for consulting services in relation to the WANDRRA funded flood damage road reinstatement works. In considering the tenders a number of anomalies were noted in the documentation and for this reason Council determined to reject all tenders. Council has since readvertised the tender, which closes on 9<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

Council considered the CEO's twelve month performance review, noting his satisfactory performance in the role since taking over in September 2016.

#### **WORKS**

With a focus towards the end of August on getting everything ship-shape at the Tambellup Pavilion ready for the opening, the construction crew was happy to be able to go bush again - to Beejenup Rd where they have been working on widening and resheeting a section.

The Shire's maintenance graders, assisted by contractors, have been working the following roads during September: Flat Rocks Rd, Chilicup Rd, West Peringillup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills South Rd, Heron Rd, Norrish Rd, Etna Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Marshall Rd, Tieline North Rd, Curnow Rd, Thompson Rd, O'Neill Rd, Clinic Rd, Graham Rd, Pindellup Rd, Palomar Rd, Fletcher Rd, Ngopitchup Rd, Birt Rd, Poonawariup Rd, Warrenup Rd, Winspear Rd, Des Wray Rd, Bignell Rd, Noname Rd, Sorrento Rd, Komani Rd, Crosby Rd, North West Rd, Bessen Rd, Batchelor Rd and Hilder Rd

The new gardens at the oval have been mulched, and watered on a number of occasions to bed the plants in. The rain received late in September has been beneficial in this regard - and to combat the resulting increase in mosquitoes, fogging has commenced in both towns. It is expected that this will continue on a regular basis until conditions dry out.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS – 21<sup>ST</sup> OCTOBER 2017

The Shire received six nominations for the four elected member positions available in the 2017 election. The nominee's profiles are included in this edition of BT Times, and we congratulate them all for putting their hand up. The election is being conducted by the WA Electoral Commission as a postal vote, and eligible residents should shortly receive their voting package in the mail. Completed ballot papers should be returned in the envelope provided, either:

- by mail to the Electoral Commission (preferred); or alternatively
- hand delivered to the Shire offices in both Broomehill and Tambellup, where locked ballot boxes are available.

On election day, the Returning Officer will be in attendance at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, 46-48 Norrish St Tambellup, between the hours of 8am and 6pm for anyone wishing to lodge their completed ballot papers.

Please ensure if mailing your ballot papers to the Electoral Commission that they are posted well ahead of time so they are received before the election date. Experience has shown that letters can take up to a week to be delivered in Perth when posted from Broomehill or Tambellup.

Local Government is the tier of Government closest to the community - you know the nominees as members of your community - and we encourage all residents to take the opportunity to make their vote count.

#### **DOG AND CAT REGISTRATIONS**

Residents are reminded that all dog and cat registrations are due for renewal on <u>31 October</u> each year. Notification will be sent to owners of dogs and cats with registration expiring in 2017. #### RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The rain experienced recently has kept things damp for now, but the warmer weather is not far away and all residents are reminded the **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2017**. From this date you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires, and all conditions of the permit must be complied with. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager, Cindy Pearce.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2017**. No burning is permitted from this date until **14 FEBRUARY 2018**.

Property inspections have recently been completed and landowners will be contacted directly if mitigation works are required to be completed prior to the fire season. Please take the time to have a look around your home for potential fire hazards - the grass may be green right now but it doesn't take long to dry off. Now is the time to deal with it for a hassle free summer.

Copies of the 2017-2018 Fire Break Order booklet were distributed to all households by mail early in August, as well as being included with rates notices. Additional copies are available at the Shire Administration offices or the Tambellup Post Office.

....in just over twelve months - what an achievement!

With inclement weather forecast for the 1<sup>st</sup> September, preparations were made to host 200 people for the official opening of the new Tambellup Community Pavilion, followed by afternoon tea. Luckily - the storm clouds passed over at 1.30 and the sun was shining at 2.00 for the opening, which we were able to hold outside. Shire President Garry Sheridan and CEO Keith Williams welcomed everyone on behalf of the Shire and the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association and provided an overview of the project. The redevelopment of the facilities has been discussed on many occasions by the various Councils and community groups over many years, and with the availability of funding getting less with more competition for available dollars, we are fortunate to have been able to obtain the financial support required to achieve this now.

Richard Goyder, former resident and prominent businessman, was invited by the Shire to open the facilities. Richard was pleased to be asked and related a number of stories of his years in Tambellup, particularly from his primary school years.

With the opening over, the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association hosted the rest of the day and evening. Paralympian Brant Garvey, who was presented by the Tambellup Cropping Group, conducted basketball and athletics clinics, and our local hockey star Penny Squibb ran a hockey clinic on the oval. The new bowling green was tested by a number of keen bowlers, and many more simply took the opportunity to catch up with people they hadn't seen for some time. It was lovely to see so many former residents return for the opening, some of whom were involved with the development of the original facilities through the Tambellup Community Centre committee, and others who had been involved in various discussions about redevelopment over many years.

The Association served dinner to around 200 people that evening - a task that was approached with military precision by coordinators Jane Cunningham and Holly Farrell, with all clubs contributing both food and labour. The Association also ran the bar, with accredited volunteers from the clubs as bar staff. Brant Garvey spoke about his experiences growing up and developing his athletic abilities as an amputee, and we are sure everyone gained a new respect for the term 'hard work' after hearing Brant's story. Richard Goyder also spoke about some of his experiences on his journey through the business world, and in reference to his position as CEO of the AFL Commission, happily responded to some pointy football-focussed questions from the audience.

So after a fantastic launch, what is left to say - but thankyou to everyone who contributed to the development of these fantastic facilities, and the opening, in any way. There are far too many to name individually, but in particular:

From here, the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association will soon take over the management of the facilities at the Oval, once all checks and balances have been completed. We encourage all residents to support this community led organisation and help shape a sustainable future for the Pavilion.

#### **MOSQUITOES**

And they're back! Mosquitoes are always an issue in our Shire during spring and early summer. Council baits pools of water and has commenced a fogging program of the Broomehill and Tambellup townsites in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health has advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self-draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.




The Tambellup Tennis Club will be offering professional junior tennis coaching during term 4 on Saturday afternoons for approximately 6 weeks.

#### FREE TYPE 1 CHILD CAR RESTRAINT FITTER COURSE

#### **ALBANY DECEMBER 2017**

WALGA RoadWise will be running a free Type 1 Child Car Restraint Fitter Course in Albany, during December 2017.

This training aims to provide participants with the knowledge and skills to offer advice, as well as competently inspect and install child car restraints in vehicles.

Participants will become part of a statewide network of qualified Type 1 Child Car Restraint Fitters and will be able to run checking and fitting stations for their clients and community.

The course is both practical and theory, with a pre-course theory component. Participants require a minimum of \$10 million public liability cover prior to attending the course.

Should you wish to attend the course and become a Type 1 Child Car Restraint Fitter, and do not currently have insurance, please get in touch to discuss how to obtain public liability cover for the purpose.
