The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 21st September 2017 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council approved an amendment to the Schedule of Fees and Charges for the 2017/18 year to reflect amendments to Building Application fees as prescribed under the Building Regulations 2011 and effective from 1 July 2017.

Council considered and approved requests from the Tambellup Golf Club and the Tambellup Business Centre to grant concessions on the rate charges for the 2017/18 financial year. The Tambellup Golf Club remains the only sporting organisation within the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire that has Council rates levied against it. The Tambellup Business Centre is a not for profit organisation that provides training and assistance for small businesses, as well as assisting start-up of new businesses. The Business Centre is unique in this area and is managed by a volunteer committee made up of local and regional members, of which Council currently holds a position.

Council reviewed a number of policies including Policy 3.1 – Purchasing. The policy was amended to allow Council to establish pre-qualified supplier panels which brings the policy into line with contemporary best practice.

Council agreed to enter into a lease arrangement with the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association Inc. for the facilities at the Tambellup Sports Ground.

Council considered quotes received for the changeover of its skid steer unit, and the purchase of an additional bucket. The new unit will arrive in coming months.

WORKS

Local contractors have completed the installation of the new shade structure over the playground in Holland Park. The re-installation of swings into the playground, which were removed for access, fencing and sand soft fall is scheduled for the next week or two.

Funding received from the Southern Inland Health Initiative has enabled construction of pram ramps linking footpaths in both town centres. Three have been completed in Broomehill, and the remainder in Tambellup will be completed in coming months.

Both ovals have recently been fertilised and sprayed for broadleaf weeds. A number of staff have been busy completing landscaping and tidy up work at the Tambellup oval in readiness for the Sporting Pavilion opening on the 1st September. All dams are holding good water levels.

The construction crew continues to work on gravel sheeting on Beejenup Road. This is a carryover project from 2016/17, and works were held up with a number of wet days. They have also been doing gravel repairs on various roads, plus installing bus stops.

The maintenance graders have been working in the west section of the Shire during August, heading towards the north. Roads graded include: Paul Valley Rd, Nymbup Rd, Bessen Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Brown Rd, Peter Valley Rd, Binnup Rd, Kings Cross Rd, Batchelor Rd, Gittens Rd, Bowman Rd and Thorn Rd.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

Following the formal handing over of the new facilities from the builder, we have entered into the defects period, where an array of small tasks identified during the architect's inspection is being completed. Most of the work has been done, however we are aware there may still be issues that are not yet evident. This is standard for any new building, but we hope for tiny issues that don't impact on the use of the facilities.

Two successful planting days were held, with the community turning out on Sunday 20th August, and staff and students from the Tambellup Primary School spending the afternoon of Thursday 24th August on site. Both groups did an amazing job - taking just over an hour on each day to plant around 3000 plants in total. Shire staff will be keeping a close eye on the plants until they are settled.

As this edition of the BT Times goes to print arrangements for the opening are being finalised. This event has been extremely well supported, with the number of people planning to attend both the formal opening and the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association's dinner far exceeding expectations. Next month's BT Times will include a wrap up of the events.

It is intended that in the very near future the facilities will be formally handed over to the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association, which will be managing all the facilities including a bookings calendar for the Pavilion and Oval. More information will be provided to the community when arrangements have been finalised.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

As we move into spring, all residents are reminded the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2017**. From this date you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires, and all conditions of the permit must be complied with. Permits to burn can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager, Cindy Pearce.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2017**. No burning is permitted from this date until **14 FEBRUARY 2018**.

Copies of the 2017-2018 Fire Break Order booklet were distributed to all households by mail early in August, as well as being included with rates notices. Additional copies are available at the Shire Administration offices or the Tambellup Post Office.

- between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 14 September 2017 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, 46-48 Norrish Street, TAMBELLUP.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. (This form is available from the Returning Officer, the Western Australian Electoral Commission or the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup);
- a single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order); and
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional).

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed at elections.wa.gov.au

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered, posted or faxed to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

Community steps into gear for Cranbrook Motocross

The Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club committee has been overwhelmed by the generous country community spirit of support in the construction of its new venue Sukey Hill, since being given the okay to start development on 17th May this year.

In less than six months the club has been able to build a motocross track and venue to a very high standard ready for hosting the South West Interclub Series on Sunday 24th September. With over eighty riders expected this is set to be an exciting event for spectators and riders to see the newly developed Sukey Hill track in action.

Harvey & Ann Baxter Bulldozing (Cranbrook) along with Andrew Murray AA Contractors Australia (Frankland River) pulled out their creativity to follow track designer Greg Moss recommendations of making a technical and fun element for riders. Straw bales have been added to help define the track further by Broomehill Bulk Haulage and Gunwarrie Farms (Frankland River).

Pre track irrigation preparation has been done by Alistar McNabb – McNabb Plantation Alliance (Mt Barker) to reduce dust at events, making it safer for riders.

Elders (Cranbrook) along with Homeward Bound Fencing (Cranbrook) have created a secure premise for spectators and riders, assisting with fencing and materials to fence the venue and track. This perimeter track fence gives Sukey Hill a spectator advantage allowing people to walk or drive around the track, making it unique in the Western Australian motocross circuits.

Shire of Cranbrook have been very supportive with grant applications and construction of a venue access road. The club acknowledge that the relationship developed here has been instrumental in the success of this new facility.

Finally the club days wouldn't be complete without rider fuel at lunchtime, provided by Great Southern Mobile Butcher (Mt Barker) and Mt Barker Co-Operative.

The South West Interclub series consisting of the five clubs, Bunbury, Collie, Cranbrook, Manjimup and Southern Capes (Busselton), meet five times during the motocross season where riders battle it out for the South West title. ARE YOU BUSHFIRE READY?

PREPARING AN EMERGENCY KIT

Having an emergency kit is an important step to prepare and protect your household for an emergency such as a bushfire.

Helpful hints:

- It is important that household members work together to prepare an emergency kit for the whole household.
- Supplies should be regularly checked and stocked to ensure provisions are fresh and safe to use.
- Copy or scan important documents into a CD or memory stick to include in your kit (i.e. passports, wills, marriage and birth certificates).
- Consider how you can protect sentimental items, this may include making copies of valuable videos and photos and how to store them in an alternative location.

Before leaving your house, you should add:

- ☐ Cash, ATM cards, credit cards.
- ☐ Mobile phone and charger.
- ☐ Prepaid phone cards and coins for phone calls.
- ☐ Medications, toiletries and sanitary supplies.
- ☐ Special requirements for infants, elderly, injured and disabled.
- ☐ Combination pocket knife/multi-tool/matches.
- ☐ Important documents, valuables and photos (in a waterproof bag).
- ☐ Change of clothes for everyone, warm jumper, jacket, hats, closed foot shoes or boots.
- ☐ Food (canned or dry).
- ☐ Drinking water (at least three litres per person for three days).
- ☐ Cooking gas/sterilising utensils, portable gas stove/BBQ (container for boiling water).
- ☐ A filter mask for people who suffer respiratory conditions.

- ☐ Candles with waterproof matches.
- ☐ Woollen blankets.
- ☐ Emergency contact numbers.

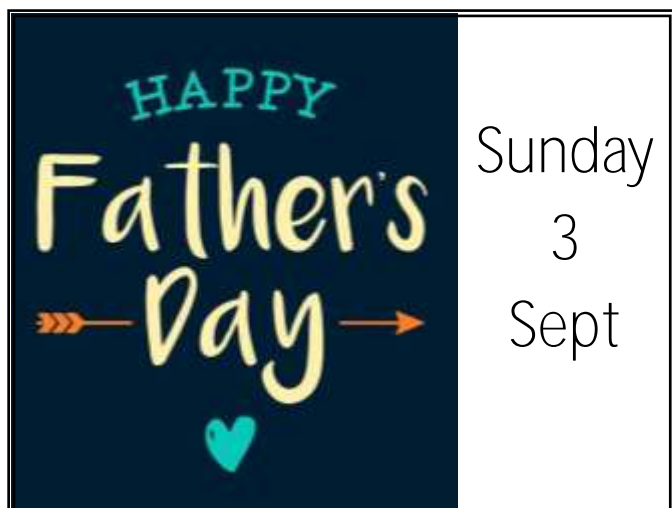

St John and CBH work to save lives

The Tambellup Community Pavilion and Bowls Club has received a life-saving defibrillator courtesy of CBH and the grain growers of Western Australia, in a partnership with St John Ambulance WA's Community First Responder program.

First Responder Program Manager Sally Simmonds said the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) gives victims of sudden cardiac arrest a much better chance of survival.

"The donation empowers people living in Tambellup as in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest, they can use the defibrillator to potentially save someone's life," she said.

"The device is very easy to use even if you haven't got any knowledge of First Aid training and we are delighted that CBH has helped us to make this important purchase."

A defibrillator is a device which delivers a therapeutic dose of electrical energy to a person's heart when it has stopped pumping.

Ms Simmonds said the AED would be registered under the St John Community First Responder Program, which means local people on the ground can help save the lives of victims of sudden cardiac arrest in the vital minutes before the ambulance arrives.

CBH Group Chairman Wally Newman said the funding was part of a total \$210,000 donated to nine different charities through the co-operative's Harvest Mass Management Scheme.

"Our scheme enables growers to forfeit grain from overloaded grain trucks, rather than having their truck turned away, with the funds raised from those tonnes going to charity," he said.

"We're pleased to be able to use the scheme to generate more funds for charities that support Western Australia's regional communities which is in addition to CBH Group's annual \$1.8 million community investment program. Our scheme also makes a significant impact in reducing overloading in a move that has been well accepted by industry/growers."

Community First Responder is a St John program that enables community members to provide help before an ambulance arrives. The First Responder system is operating in 1,000 locations across Western Australia and continues to grow.

Children need to be taught how to play!

It would be a lengthy process to complete the transfer to the Historical Society members if the Council decide to go ahead with the sale of land, though it can be transferred for a nominal cost.

It was suggested the machinery shed be screened from the highway for now. Discussions ended on the note that even if cultural significant is established the shed could still be demolished.

Open Day:- discussion to explore options for exposure. It was put forward a combined market day, garage sale and open day be held in around March/April next year, (excluding public holidays). We could advertise the event in the Countryman, Saturday's West, Talkback radio, B-T Times, Gumtree and Facebook.

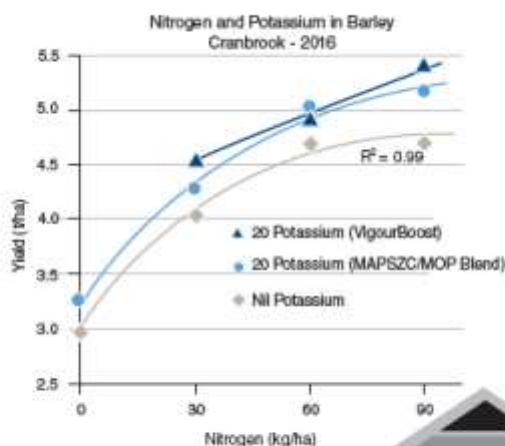

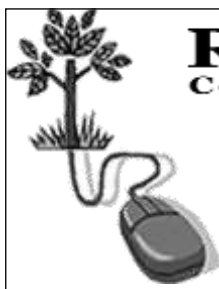
