2017-2018 BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2017/18 Annual Budget for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup was adopted by Council at the Ordinary Meeting held on 20 July 2017. The 2017/18 budget includes provision for an increase in the Shires rate revenue of 5% across both rural UV and townsite GRV properties. Minimum rates have increased to \$455.00 per assessment. More detail on this year's budget is provided with rates notices, however highlights of the budget include:

Road Construction

Expenditure of \$2,299,900 has been allocated to various road construction projects for the year. Council will be assisted in meeting the costs of the projects with funds from the Regional Road Group, Commodity Routes, State Black Spot and Roads to Recovery programs.

The following road construction projects are planned for 2017/18-

REGIONAL ROAD GROUP

Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road – surface correction & reseal 5.62kms;

Broomehill-Kojonup Road – reseal 2.69kms;

Tambellup West Road – stabilise patches & reseal 2.02kms;

Broomehill-Kojonup Road – stabilise patches & reseal 0.25kms;

Pallinup South Road – construct & seal to 7.0m 3.00kms; Gnowangerup-Tambellup Road – install culvert at SLK 15.38:

Warrenup Road - construct & seal to 7.0m 2.20kms.

COMMODITY ROUTES

Carry over from 2016/17 Beejenup Road – vegetation widening and gravel sheet 6.82kms;

Toolbrunup Road – reseal 6.22kms.

STATE BLACK SPOT

Tambellup West Road/Warrenup Road intersection – improve sight distance

ROADS TO RECOVERY

Nardlah Road / Broomehill-Gnowangerup Road intersection – realigns & seal intersection

Plant Replacement

The 2017/18 budget proposes to changeover the following plant and equipment during the year:

- Caterpillar 12M Grader BH004;
- Caterpillar Skid Steer BHT92;
- Stabiliser attachment for Skid Steer;
 - Light vehicles (cars and utilities).

Other Projects

Tambellup Pavilion Redevelopment

Council awarded the tender for construction of the new Pavilion to Wauters Enterprises, and the tender for

installation of the synthetic bowling green was awarded to Evergreen Synthetic Grass. Howard + Heaver Architects have been engaged as project managers for the construction.

Construction of the new facility and bowling green was largely complete by 30 June 2017 and this years budget includes provision for completion of this project. The garden areas will be planted by the Community, and funding has been sought for fit out of the building. The Community Cropping Group has generously pledged funding to assist with the buildings fit out. The grand opening of the new facility is planned for 1st September.

Grant funding provided through the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) and the National Stronger Regions Fund (NSRF) is paid in instalments when agreed milestones are met. Provision for the remaining balances from these sources has been included, of which \$175,000 is from DSR and \$475,000 from NSRF.

Staff have been working closely with the newly formed 'Tambellup Community Pavilion Association Inc. to establish the governance framework and structure required for a new incorporated body. The Pavilion will be leased to this Committee, who will manage the facility after the opening.

Holland Park and Diprose Park

Fabrication of a solid roofed structure for the Holland Park playground was allocated in the 2016/17 budget and the structure was delivered in June 2016. Provision for this to be installed has been included in this budget.

A solid roofed structure will be installed over the Diprose Park junior playground area which will assist to alleviate drainage issues in this area of the park during periods of heavy rainfall.

Department of Water funded projects

Applications for funding have been submitted to the Department of Water for the following projects:

- \$61,904 for construction of a washdown bay and storage tanks at the Tambellup Depot. The total cost is estimated to be \$122,000 and a transfer from the Building Maintenance Reserve of \$35,000 will be used to partially meet Councils contribution;
- \$55,000 for construction of a new dam and to upgrade piping between existing dams at the Broomehill Recreation Complex. The total project cost is \$83,000.

Land - Acquisition and Disposal

Council resolved at a Special Meeting in May 2017 to submit a tender to purchase the four lots comprising the Tambellup Bowling Club site. Councils tender was successful and purchase of lots 5 and 6 Crowden Street and lots 8 and 19 Taylor Street is due to be settled on 30th September. Purchase of this land will be made from the Building Reserve. No future use has been determined

however discussions are ongoing.

Lot 8 Taylor Street is zoned as a residential lot which Council has determined to advertise for sale as there are no future requirements for this site. The proceeds from sale of this land will be transferred into the Building Reserve.

WA Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements – WANDRRA

Roads in the north-eastern section of the Shire incurred significant damage during a storm event that went through the lower half of the State in February 2017. The storm event was fortunately declared an eligible event for funding through WANDRRA, which will enable reinstatement works to all affected roads. Council has sought tenders from Contractors to undertake the work required, and a Project Manager has been engaged to oversee the works to completion. The estimated value of works required for reinstatement of affected roads is \$3.5 million which, aside from Council's required contribution of around \$155,000, is fully funded by the WANDRRA program.


Conclusion

The 2017/18 budget provides for the operations of the Council for the coming financial year. The total budget for the year is \$15.6 million of which \$6.5 million (42%) will be spent on replacement, renewal or upgrade of Councils assets.

The chart below shows how funds have been allocated across the various areas of the organisation.

Transport (which includes road construction/ maintenance, plant replacement) accounts for around 66% of the overall budget; a sizeable increase from previous years however is inflated this year due to the WANDRRA funded works falling into this program.

The budget items and capital works improvements represent a significant investment in infrastructure by the Shire over the next 12 months.



WORKS - JUNE 2017

Local contractors are presently completing the installation of the new shade structure over the playground in Holland Park. The roof cladding will be installed over the next couple of weeks.





Funding received from the Southern Inland Health Initiative has enabled construction of pram ramps linking footpaths in both town centres. Three have been completed in Broomehill, and the remainder in Tambellup will be completed in coming months.

Both ovals have recently been fertilised and sprayed for broadleaf weeds. Council has made provision in this year's budget for drainage works at the Broomehill Oval, which should address the waterlogging that is currently being experienced. The Tambellup Oval is in fantastic condition at the moment, largely due to the fact that despite the lack of winter rains, the treated waste water is still online and being used to reticulate. All dams are holding good water levels.

Two projects for which funding was sought through the Department of Water are presently on hold. Council was advised in February 2017 that a funding application to install rainwater tanks and a vehicle washdown bay at the Tambellup Depot had been approved, however the new State Government is presently reassessing all funding commitments made by the previous Government. An outcome is not yet known. An application submitted earlier this year to the same program for the construction of a second dam at the Broomehill Complex and upgrade of pipelines between all Broomehill dams has also been put on hold.

The construction crew is currently working on gravel sheeting on Beejenup Road. This is a carryover project from 2016/17, and works should be complete by mid-August. From here, they will move across to Pallinup South Rd, to construct and seal a 3km section. This is the first of the 2017/2018 Regional Roads Group funded jobs.

Bitumen patching has been completed on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd. There have been some issues with recent sealing works due to the weather conditions at the time of

sealing, resulting in aggregate stripping off patches. This will be remedied when other sealing works are programmed.

Council has programmed the replacement of its skid steer with a larger unit in 2017/2018, which will include additional attachments. With purchase of the new unit planned for early in the financial year, the roads program includes up to two months' work for this machine, preparing a 5km section of Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd for resealing. These works also include the installation of a new culvert prior to resealing.

The maintenance graders have been working in the east section of the Shire during June, heading towards the south west. Roads graded include: Pallinup Rd, Heron Rd, Eureka Rd, Peringillup East Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Gillespie Rd, Martinup Rd, Beejenup Rd, Graham Rd, Fletcher Rd, Wray Rd, Marshall Rd, Collins Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Pallinup South Rd, Tilbury Rd, White Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Yetermerup Rd, Anderson Rd, Carr Rd, Hamila Rd, Winkelanup Rd and Tallents Rd.

WANDRRA

Council considered tenders for Storm Damage Restoration to roads and drainage resulting from the rainfall event in February 2017. As the event was declared a natural disaster, these works are funded by the State Government's WANDRRA program. Both tenders were awarded to local contractor Gray Carter Earthmoving.

BLOOM FESTIVAL

Thank you to those groups and individuals who responded to the call for events for inclusion in the Bloom Festival program. The Festival runs from 15th September to 15th October, with events being held across the Hidden Treasures Shires - Woodanilling, Katanning, Kojonup, Kent, Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, and Plantagenet. It's a great time of the year to be out and about in our region, and the Bloom Festival publicity will help to spread the word.

NAIDOC WEEK

Following a request from the community, Council installed additional flag poles at the Shire's administration offices, to facilitate the flying of the Aboriginal flag during significant events throughout the year, and the State flag at other times. The flagpoles were installed in time for NAIDOC Week, and Lynthia Flowers, May Penny and Ray Williams attended to witness the raising of the flag in Tambellup.





WASTE TRANSFER STATION – PRE PAID TIP CARDS

Residents are reminded that the orange 2016/2017 Waste Transfer Station passes expired on 31 July 2017, and will no longer be accepted at the Transfer Stations. New passes valid for 2017/2018 have been distributed with rates notices for those residents who do not receive the kerbside rubbish and recycling collections, and prepaid passes are available to purchase at the Shire Administration offices. Council and the committee were taken on a walkthrough of the facilities after handover, and all were impressed by the functionality of the building and the quality of the workmanship.

The landscaping of the site is still to be completed, and we will be inviting the community to participate in a planting day, once we know when the plants will be arriving. Council was notified recently that the Pavilion had been nominated to receive an Automated External Defibrillator through the St John Ambulance Community First Responder program. The program is funded by CBH through the Harvest Mass Management Scheme, whereby forfeited grain from overloaded trucks is sold by CBH and the proceeds donated to various charities, which this year included St John. The defibrillator location will be linked with St Johns system so if a call is placed through 000 for assistance at the Pavilion an ambulance will be dispatched, and the caller will be advised there is a defibrillator located in the Pavilion. This is great news, and while we hope never to have to use it, it may just come in handy! Many thanks to St John Ambulance, and the nominator.



LOCAL GOVERNMENT POSTAL ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Friday 1st September 2017

Enrolling to Vote

Local Government Elections are to be held on Saturday 21 October 2017. You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote at the election if you reside in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property within the district.

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral roll as at 5.00pm, Friday 01 September 2017. If you are not on the State Electoral roll or have changed your address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Non Resident Owners and Occupiers If you are a non resident owner or occupier of rateable property within the Shire and are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote, but must submit a Form 2 - Enrolment Eligibility Claim Form to the local government, as enrolment is not automatic.

A non resident owner who was on the last Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup local government roll continues to retain that status as long as the rateable property to which the enrolment relates is owned. An occupier does not have continuous enrolment and should contact staff at the Shire to confirm their enrolment status.

If you are not on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll and own or occupy rateable property within the Shire, you may still be eligible to vote. Please contact the Shire for details.

Enrolment Forms – Non Residents and Occupiers

Enrolment Eligibility Claim Forms can be obtained from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5.00pm, Friday 01 September 2017.



Sukey Hill a Technical Climb

Moss Institute sponsored rider, Jacob Daniels from Narrogin, visited Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club on Sunday 2nd July 2017, to test out the motocross flat track designed by Greg Moss, and give the Cranbrook DMCC maintenance team feedback on track layout and jump placement.

Jacob commented that the 2.117km Sukey Hill motocross track is unique, situated on a

very picturesque undulating site on the side of the hill from which it is named overlooking the town site of Cranbrook and farmland. The track has similarities to Manjimup MCC Cosy Creek Circuit, but with a more open track layout, as it is on a 20ha site. Jacob also said Sukey Hill has great up and down hill sections, lots of technical corners, twisty tight sections and open straits. Soil type is a liquorish all sorts, from sand, clay to heavy loam. In essence to summarise, Jacob said the track has something for all riding abilities.

The Cranbrook DMCC track maintenance team where keen to follow on from Greg Moss track design advice, seeking rider feedback on the placement and design of jumps to add technicality and influence rider speed and line.

Stage 1 of the Sukey Hill Regional Motorcycling Facility is nearing completion. The Shire of Cranbrook works team have sheeted the venue access road, Cranbrook DMCC has completed the motocross track and the tender for the two buildings being - bike waiting bay and scrutineering/first aid hut due out at the end of July. Club president Justin Shepherd said progress has been fantastic to date with all hands on deck to transform the site to a national standard facility ready for hosting the South West Interclub Series in late September, after being given the okay to start building on the 17th May.



New national safety standard for ethanol burners

This announcement is for: ConsumerProduct safety

A new national safety standard for decorative alcohol-fueled (ethanol) burners will come into effect on 15 July 2017, replacing an interim ban on the products.

The action to ensure the safety of portable table-top burners comes after reports of more than 100 injuries and 36 house fires in Australia since 2010 and at least three deaths overseas.

WA first introduced an interim ban in December 2016 after a 28 year old Safety Bay woman received serious burns to her face and upper body after an ethanol burner exploded at a backyard barbeque in October 2016.

The new standard developed by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC):

- prevents the supply of table top devices (devices which weigh less than 8 kilograms or have a footprint less than 900 square centimetres); and
- requires freestanding and fixed devices to meet a stability test, come with a fuel container with a flame arrester (or an automatic fuel pump system) and display warnings on the device about refueling hazards.

The safety standard gives suppliers three months to transition from the national interim ban to the new requirements in the safety standard. Products intended for cooking or heating are exempt.

Acting Commissioner for Consumer Protection David Hillyard said the new safety regulations will greatly reduce the risk but consumers still need to exercise caution when using any product in the home which contains flammable material.

"The ban on the particular unit involved in the recent horrendous accident in WA will remain as those burners do not comply with this new safety standard," Mr Hillyard said.

"The new standard addresses the cause of many of the incidents – re-fueling the unit from the same opening as the burner. The burner's flame is often hard to see and injuries commonly occur when consumers refuel the device when it is still lit or warm.

"This can cause a flash flame and the fuel to explode from the filler bottle. There is also a risk of the burner being knocked over, especially by children or pets, potentially causing serious burns and damage to property.

"Consumers who have purchased unsafe table top burners should cease using them immediately and return the product to the store where it was purchased for a full refund. Proof of purchase such as a receipt or a credit card/bank statement may be required."

There are tough penalties for selling products which do not comply with a safety standard. Individuals can face a maximum fine of \$220,000 and corporations face a maximum fine of \$1.1 million.


