These appointments are made on an annual basis by the individual brigades, which are then endorsed by the Bush Fire Advisory Committee for recommendation to Council. We thank these people for their commitment to ensuring the safety of their community.

Council endorsed the 2017/2018 Firebreak Order and Information booklet. This booklet contains important information relating to fire prevention which applies to all residents, whether you are in town or on a farm. The booklet will be distributed to all households by mail in July. A copy of the booklet will also be available on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au under Our Shire/Publications and Archives.

With work on the new Pavilion progressing, and with the intent to hand over the management of the facilities to a community committee, Council considered and endorsed a draft of the lease document that will be negotiated with the new Association.

Council considered a request from the Tambellup Cake Decorating group to waive the hire fee of the Tambellup Lesser Hall for their 'Fantasy Flowers' display to be held later in the year. The group encourages a gold coin donation from those visiting the display, and all funds received are donated to the Cancer Council's Crawford Lodge (accommodation in the city for country patients requiring cancer treatment). Rather than waive the hire fee, Council determined to make a donation of \$150 (equivalent to the hire fee) to the Cake Decorating group.

As part of the lead up to the new financial year, Council reviewed its Functional Road Hierarchy. The Functional Road Hierarchy is a tool that assists Councillors and Shire staff when —

- determining the minimum maintenance required for each category of road;
- identifying upgrade and capital work requirements;
- prioritising projects for annual budgets.

The document reflects the priorities of Main Roads 'Roads 2030' strategy and their Functional Road Hierarchy for the State, as well as local access roads. An annual review is undertaken to ensure that the priority assigned to each road is still relevant, and to make any amendments to the hierarchy that have become apparent since the last review. The document was updated to include latest traffic counts and current RAV Network categories.

THUMBS UP

To our local community groups which, through hosting of social events, demonstrate the appeal and benefits of living in a small community.

The Tambellup CRC has had a busy month during May, hosting a Mother's Day morning tea on Friday 12th May, staging the inaugural Farmers Market on Saturday 13th May and then coordinating the first of this year's 'Soup and Sweets' lunches for senior residents on Thursday 18th May. All events were well attended and we congratulate the CRC on their initiative in developing events that bring people together in a relaxed, informal environment.

The Cancer Council's 'Australia's Biggest Morning Tea' event was supported in our towns again, through a combined morning tea and market day at the Broomehill Playgroup, and morning tea prepared by junior students at the Tambellup Primary School. Unfortunately cancer is one illness that has touched most of us, and these events provide an opportunity to raise funds towards ongoing research as well as bring the community together. Well done to the Broomehill Playgroup and Tambellup Primary School!

WORKS

Sealing works scheduled for early May on Warrenup Rd and Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd were postponed due to problems with the road surfaces. These works will be rescheduled for later in the year when conditions are suitable.

Most of the works crew has been on site at construction jobs during May, including the maintenance graders, which has limited the amount of maintenance grading completed. The Jetpatcher has been carrying out bitumen repairs across the Shire's sealed road network.

Contractors continue working to repair damage from the 2016 flood event. During May, all drainage issues were completed, with gravel repairs expected to be completed during June. This will finalise the 2016 WANDRRA event.

Staff have commenced the preparation of tender documentation for the February 2017 flooding event, which has been declared eligible for funding assistance through WANDRRA. In this shire, the cost to repair damage has been estimated at \$3.5 million. Recent changes to WANDRRA guidelines provide a temporary exemption that will allow local governments to utilise their own equipment to complete reinstatement work. This will be factored in to the 2017/2018 works program.

In town, all dams have maintained high water levels leading into winter. The Water Corporation is still providing treated water for use on the Tambellup oval, and it is expected that this will continue through til early June. An application for funding has been submitted to the Department of Water for assistance to upgrade the pipeline from the CBH dam to the Complex dam in Broomehill. This will allow the solar pumps on the CBH and Bignell dams to work at the same time, increasing the amount of water able to be transferred to the Complex dam.

Parks and gardens staff have been keeping up with mowing and weeding, and will shortly be commencing townsite weed spraying.

The installation of pram ramps at various points in the town centres will commence shortly, as part of the townscaping program. In Broomehill, these will be located at the India St/Journal St intersection, adjacent to the Henry Jones building and the Broomehill Post Office, and also at the front of the Broomehill Shire office. In Tambellup, ramps will be located on Norrish St at Henry St, Crowden St and outside the Tambellup Health Centre, and on Crowden St at the Taylor St intersection. These works have been funded by Royalties for Regions through the Southern Inland Health Initiative and will contribute to improving access to community services and facilities for people with impaired mobility.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION – PRE PAID TIP CARDS

Residents are reminded that the orange 2016/2017 Waste Transfer Station passes expire on 31 July 2017, and will not be accepted after that date. New passes valid for 2017/2018 will be distributed with rates notices for those residents who do not receive the kerbside rubbish and recycling collections, and prepaid passes will be available to purchase at the Shire Administration offices after 1 July 2017. For more information please contact the Shire.

The purpose of a Waste Transfer Station is to minimise the amount of waste going to landfill, and maximise opportunities for recycling. By sorting your load before you go to the Tip, and making sure your recyclables are clean and uncontaminated, you will be doing your bit to help our environment.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

The months of April and May have seen much activity on site. Installation of all wall and ceiling linings has been completed, verandah roof lining, downpipes and door frames were installed, and internal and external doors hung. Painters started work with a first coat on external steel, and have also commenced inside the building. We hope to see some colour on the outside in coming weeks. The installation of rock pitching to the western side of the bowling green was completed and paving in various areas has commenced. The concreting of verandahs, paths and ramps was also completed.

There is still much to be achieved through June. Aside from the external painting and the completion of the bowling green, it will be full steam ahead inside, with painting, tiling, plumbing and fitting out of changerooms and toilets, the kitchen, bar, office and kids room to be completed, as well as floor coverings and window treatments throughout. We are aware works are running a few weeks behind the program, but hope the completion is not delayed too much.

The Shire, in conjunction with the Tambellup Community Pavilion Association, will be coordinating a community planting day following handover of the site, where members of the community are encouraged to come along and help with the landscaping. More information will be provided closer to the time.

she concluded.



Rental is now \$180 per week for couples and \$160 per week for single people; consideration will be given to allowing tenants a small, quiet pet on a case by case basis and within twelve month lease terms (an extra \$10 per week is applicable for people with a pet).

Have you CLEANED YOUR FLUE??

Ash, soot and combustion residue can build up on the inside of a chimney flue and if not physically removed regularly can ignite causing a fire. In most cases you will see flames shooting out of the top of the chimney.

Volunteer Firefighters attend many of these types of fires during winter and most can be prevented by chimneys or flues being regularly cleaned.

We recommend that you check the heater, fireplace brickwork, chimney and flue before lighting the first fire of the year to make sure it is clean. This should be done for all metal flues and standard brick chimneys.

Additives can be purchased from your local hardware store to put in the fire while it is burning to help reduce residue build up in the chimney or flue.


If your fireplace chimney is brick, check that the surrounding fireplace brickwork has not cracked as this may identify a problem.

Flues going into the ceiling and roof space should have double or triple skins to stop radiant heat igniting roof timbers or cellulose type insulation.

Many fires are caused by the incorrect installation of wood heaters by the home handy man or unqualified operators. It is recommended that all wood heaters being installed and maintained should be done by a reputable business or tradesperson.

RAILWAY PROPOSALS

...Two of the proposals with which the committee are now dealing refer to the laying down of a railway from Bunbury to Eticup which would pass through a country practically unoccupied throughout, though capable of extensive settlement were only means of transit across it afforded; and in this condition has remained ever since the first settlement of the Colony.

RAILWAY DEVELOPMENT

...The Syndicate, in formulating their proposals, which with respect to compensation, as previously mentioned, have adopted the same lines as those followed by other concessionaires on the land-grant system, suggest that the line of route should follow as straight a line as practicable to Boyanup (on the Preston River), thence along the right bank of that stream for a distance of about 15 miles, then on to the Blackwood River to Kojonup, and the terminus at Eticup – the distance being about 100 miles. To the people of Bunbury itself there is one feature of special importance on sanitary grounds in the Syndicate's proposals. It is the reclamation of the marshy land on the foreshore of the Estuary, some 15 acres in extent, and for which purpose it is proposed to remove a portion of the sand dunes near the lighthouse. The scheme, as a whole, has much to commend itself to the favourable consideration of the Legislature; and we hope that the committee, in their report, will reflect the highly satisfactory approval with which the scheme has been received both by the Government and everybody outside the House.

To the Worshipful the Justice of the Peace acting in and for the District of Williams in Western Australia I, PATRICK GARRITY, MARRIED, NOW RESIDEING NEAR Eticup, do hereby give notice that it is my intention to apply for at the next licensing meeting, to be holden for this district, for a ROADSIDE HOUSE LICENSE, for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors in the house and appurtenances thereunto belonging to me, situated at Eticup, on the road from Kojonup to the Salt River, now in the course of erection, and containing three bedrooms and two sitting rooms, exclusive of those occupied by my family, and which I intend to keep as an Inn or public house, for the accommodation of travellers. I have never held a license before.

Given under my hand this 8th day of September 1885.


NEWS AND NOTES

From Eticup, under date November 13th a correspondent writes – Shearing is finished by this time and the clip has been a fairly fair one, though on some stations the sheep are rather poor considering the amount of feed there is. This shearing has been an exceptionally long one owing to wet weather which stopped operations sometimes for two or three days at a time. The rain, however, has done much good to the grass and crops. The feed is better this year than it has been for a long time past and one would think that stock of every description should be fat. Harvesting will soon commence; haymaking has already started and the barley crop is turning fast. I believe there will be a very fair yield of barley but the hay and wheat crops far below expectations, and will not be as good as they were last season. - I hear that Mr Patrick Garrity of this place is about to apply for a wayside house license. This, if obtained, will be a great convenience to travellers who now either have to depend upon the hospitality of settlers or else to camp out. Some objections are, however, raised on the ground that without Police protection in the immediate neighbourhood the sale of drink may cause trouble amongst the men. - I am glad to note that Mr Dearle has been more punctual with the mails lately. On his last trip his trap broke down about two miles from Mr Van Zuilecom's and he was obliged to bring on the mails and parcels with a pack horse. - I hear we are not to have a teacher for our school until the new year. There is a subscription list under way to purchase a harmonium for the new church. It is to be hoped success will attend this effort. - The weather has been very hot and sultry during the past few days and there is every appearance of an approaching thunderstorm.

From Eticup a correspondent writes — Sheep hunting is very common this year, or last year, I should say. The shepherds are losing sheep every week, and a man no sooner finds one lot than he has to go and look for another. — I hear our new teacher for the school is a Miss Toll from Albany. I do not know the young lady in question, but it is to be hoped she is a good teacher. — The subscription list which was underway for the purchase of a harmonium for the church is, I believe, filled up, and I am glad to see everyone come forward and subscribe so liberally towards anything of this kind. — Bush fires still rage in every direction, and are doing much harm. On Sunday last about midday a fire sprang up within ten chains of Mr T Norrish's; the wind blowing up from the westward carried it in the direction of Martinup. Though all hands were there, there were great difficulty in keeping it out of a small paddock of Mr Norrish's. After a few hours hard work it was driven off from here without doing much damage. The fire is supposed to have started from some natives huts a short distance off. — Harvesting operations are in full swing.






