The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>20th April 2017</u> commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered and approved with conditions an application for the development of an extractive industry for construction sand on a location on Watergarrup Rd.

Council reviewed two key strategies, the Strategic Risk Register, and the Housing and Land Strategy. These documents are part of a suite of documents that assist Council's planning processes.

Council considered an application submitted through the WA Planning Commission for the amalgamation of four lots on Nymbup Rd to create two lots.

Council considered the six month probationary review for the Chief Executive Officer which was completed by an independent HR consultant. Council approved the findings of the probationary review, and congratulated the CEO on his performance to date.

PROHIBITED AND RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD** commenced on **15 FEBRUARY 2017** and continues through until **15 APRIL 2017**. During this period you are required to obtain a permit prior to lighting any fires. Conditions noted on the permit must be strictly complied with. Permits can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM), Cindy Pearce. Please contact the Shire on 98253555 for more information.

Please note, the lighting of fires is **PROHIBITED** during the Easter period **14**-**17 APRIL 2017**.

HOLLAND PARK SHELTER

In 2016 Council was successful in its application to the Stronger Communities Program for funding to assist with the purchase and installation of a solid roofed shade structure over the play equipment in Holland Park. A company in Albany was engaged to design and manufacture the shelter in kit form, to be installed by local contractors. TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE


Construction at the Pavilion is proceeding smoothly. External cladding to the building has been installed and the upper panels will be painted in due course. Internally, gyprocking and installation of insulation has been taking place, giving a glimpse of the end product. There is still a way to go, but it appears to be moving along quite quickly.

Outside, the bowling green is taking shape, with the external block work being laid, and the sub-layers of the green installed. In coming weeks, internal wall and ceiling linings will be completed, doors and skirtings will be installed, and the installation of road base and kerbing to car park areas and rock pitching to the western side of the bowling green wall will be completed.

Running alongside the construction, the management planning for the new facilities is also underway. A committee has been established consisting of nominated representatives and proxy members of the five sporting user groups (hockey, tennis, cricket, bowls and junior football), two community representatives and Shire support.

The committee, in consultation with their respective clubs' membership, is working through various aspects of planning including establishing a new association, drafting a constitution, developing a three year management plan, working through the requirements of the Department of Racing, Gaming and Liquor to apply for a liquor license, and most importantly, making sure the arrangements that are set in place are inclusive and meet the needs of the entire community.

The committee will be hosting a 'Community Chat' on Thursday 27th April, from 6.00-7.30pm at the Tambellup Bowling Club. This forum will provide an opportunity for the community to hear first-hand how the new committee intends managing the facility, and to also ask questions! More information is provided elsewhere in this edition of BT Times.








Citizenship Congratulations


Books For Little People. . .

Smoke Alarm

Changing Your Smoke Alarm Battery

Factsheet 02

Only working smoke alarms save lives

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on the type of smoke alarm you have.

Is it time to change your battery?

Smoke alarms powered by 9V ALKALINE BATTERY require you to replace the battery every year. DFES recommends you change your battery on April 1st.

Smoke alarms powered by a 10 YEAR NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year. Do not try to remove these batteries.

MAINS POWERED (HARD WIRED) SMOKE ALARMS are powered by an external power source. These alarms also have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage. Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacement. Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery. Where you need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on April 1st.

Only working smoke alarms save lives.

You should know...

- Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- Mains powered smoke alarms may also make this low battery warning after periods of extended mains power outage. If this happens and your smoke alarm has a replaceable battery, you will need to change your battery.
- Not all smoke alarms need their battery replaced. Smoke alarms with a non-replaceable battery may have a warning that the battery is not replaceable. Always check the manufacturer's instructions before replacing the battery.
- Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a green "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- All smoke Alarms also have a red light that flashes momentarily every 40-60 seconds to visually indicate they are operating. This same red light flashes continuously when the Smoke Alarm has been activated. If there are interconnected smoke alarms the fast flashing red light will indicate which smoke alarm initiated the alarm.
- Always test that your smoke alarm is operating after replacing the battery by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone. All smoke alarms require regular maintenance. Refer to Fact sheet 4 – Smoke Alarm Maintenance for further information.
- All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years.



In the event of a fire

Smoke Alarm

Maintaining Your Smoke Alarms

Factsheet 04

Only working smoke alarms save lives

Smoke alarms require regular testing and cleaning to provide effective protection.

DFES recommends the following key smoke alarm maintenance routine:

- Test your smoke alarm every month to ensure the battery and the alarm sounder are operating. Hold down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone, then release. Use a broom handle if you cannot reach, but be careful you do not damage the smoke alarm. You may need to press the button again to turn off the alarm.
- Vacuum your smoke alarm with a soft brush attachment around the smoke alarm vents every 6 months.
 This will remove any build-up of dust and cobwebs.
- Use a surface insect spray around the smoke alarm to prevent insects from nesting inside it. Ensure you cover the smoke alarm while you spray to ensure you do not spray inside the smoke alarm.
- Never paint over or cover your smoke alarms.
- Your smoke alarm battery may need to be replaced every year, Smoke alarms with a non-replaceable battery may carry a warning that the battery is not replaceable.
 Always check the manufacturer's instructions before replacing the battery.
- Replace your smoke alarms every 10 years.

Only working smoke alarms save lives.

Did you know...

- Smoke alarms make a warning 'beep' or 'chirp' when there is a fault or when the battery is low. Before changing the battery, check with the manufacturer's instructions. The chirp may also indicate the smoke alarm has become contaminated.
- If after changing the battery the smoke alarm continues to sound a warning 'beep' or 'chirp', the smoke alarm may be faulty and require replacement.
- A licensed electrical contractor is required to disconnect or install mains powered smoke alarms, All other smoke alarm maintenance can be done by an adult.
- Mains powered smoke alarms may give a low battery warning after periods of extended mains power outage. You should be aware that rechargeable batteries may need a few days to recharge after the mains power is restored. If your smoke alarm does not have a rechargeable battery you will need to replace the battery. Check with your manufacturer if you need to replace the battery or if the unit will recharge.










