The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday <u>15th December 2016</u> commencing at 2.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

- Council considered an amendment to the 2016-2017
 Budget to accommodate construction of a new shade
 structure over the Holland Park playground. Council
 has determined to amend the 2016-2017 annual
 Budget by reallocating \$25,000 from installation of the
 soft fall at the junior playground in Diprose Park to the
 shade structure at Holland Park.
- Council's major plant replacement policy includes specifications to be provided to Council for consideration before tendering. Council endorsed the specifications as presented for a 12T Self-Propelled vibrating drum roller at the November meeting.

Council received a Gold Volunteer Employer Recognition Award at the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) 2016 Volunteer Employer Recognition Awards Ceremony at the Government House Ballroom in Perth on Friday 4th November 2016. The award was proudly accepted by Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup Chief Executive Officer Keith Williams and Works Supervisor John Farmer.

WORKS

We are looking forward to completing work to driveways and sealing on Taylor St now the wet weather has let up and things are starting to dry out. The change in weather has also allowed the gardeners to catch up on mowing and weeding around the towns.

The construction crew has been working gravel sheeting a section of Punchmirup North Road. During November, works will move to Nardlah Road to complete sealing of a section, and then back to Punchmirup North Road to complete the resheeting project.

The maintenance graders have been working in the south east part of the Shire on Toolbrunup Road where the bitumen edges are now complete. The construction grader and roller have been working on bitumen road edges in preparation for the harvest period. The Jetpacher is currently working on the bitumen network.

Flood damage crew are working on Hassell Road and work will continue over the next few weeks.

Western Power has issued a tree pruning schedule for trees under power lines in both Broomehill and Tambellup. Katanning Cherry Pickers will carry out the work while removing trees around the Broomehill pavilion and the Tambellup pavilion.

The Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup is currently sealing Nardlah Road, from Gnowangerup Road through to the sealed section in the north. Sealing of the intersection of Gnowangerup Road and Nardlah will occur once Main Roads approval is obtained. The seal is a two coat primer seal at 7 metres wide. Shire staff undertook all preparation and sealing works, with contractors assisting with the final seal. This work is funded by the Shire and Commodity Routes funding.



PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2016** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2017** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2016. Permits can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM), Cindy Pearce.

All residents should assess the fuel loads on their property, and take steps to reduce this risk well before summer. Although spraying and slashing of tall grass is an effective treatment for reducing fire risk, if it is done too late in the season the dried grass still presents as a hazard. HARVEST BANS

With harvest and the fire season upon us, all residents are reminded Council has a number of ways in which it communicates information relating to harvest and vehicle movement bans:


- SMS to your mobile phone: Is your mobile number registered with the Shire to receive this information? If not, or you need to update your information please contact Kim at the Shire on 9825 3555. (On a similar note if you no longer wish to receive these notifications please contact Kim and your number will be removed from the list.) Please be aware there are a number of mobile reception black spots in the Shire and this may result in delivery of messages being delayed. Do not rely on SMS as your only source of information.
- Radio broadcasts: Every effort is made to ensure details of harvest and vehicle movement bans are provided to RadioWest and ABC radio for broadcast, however the timing of bans being implemented often means cut off times for broadcast can be missed. ABC radio (as the emergency broadcaster) has advised the following designated times for announcement of bans:

Weekdays - 10.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm

Weekends - 12.35pm, 2.05pm.

• **Harvest Ban Hotline**: Phone <u>98251042</u> for updated information relating to the status of a harvest and vehicle movement ban. This is the most reliable source of information from the Shire.

And finally, the onus is on you as an individual to keep an eye on the weather conditions if you are harvesting or using other machinery or tools in the paddock. Step out of the header at regular intervals, monitor weather forecasts, talk to your neighbours, contact your brigade Fire Control Officer if you are concerned. Let's be safe this harvest!



Broomehill Historical Notes

West Australian Saturday July 4 1885 ETICUP NOTES

We are having delightful weather here at present and have had for some time past which has made both farmers and sheep owners to rejoice. The grass is growing like magic this last fortnight, and there is plenty of feed now for the stock. Lambing is going ahead and on some stations it is about finished; the average, so far, I believe is about 80 percent. It would have been larger but the sheep were, many of them, very poor. Ploughing is completed except on a few small farms. The early sewn crops are looking well and the acreage under cultivation far above any of the previous 7 years and should there be a good season we shall have plenty both hay and corn.

The school has made rapid strides since I last wrote; the bricks having been carted the walls soon reached their proper height, and by this time the roof is on and a good deal of the flooring laid, and we hope to see it completed shortly. It will be a good thing for this place when it is finished, and a good teacher obtained, as there are a lot of children about here who should go to school now.

There is a good deal said about other siders stirring us West Australians up, and I think rightly too, for we have got one amongst us who is going to settle down here and teach us Eticupites what to do; he says we have been asleep all our time, and he is going to waken us up. He is what 'Bavard' in the Australasians calls an 'eye opener'. It is to be hoped that he will teach us gratis and we shall be most thankful to him for his instruction

We have had one or two sharp frosts lately, though they did not do much damage; it is to be hoped that we shall not be troubled with these unwelcome mornings very

Eticup 27th June 1885

• Daily News Tuesday 28 July 1885 NEWS OF THE DAY

The survey of the Beverley-Albany Railway is progressing at a very rapid rate, the survey party having now reached to about ten miles past Eticup, or 120 miles from Albany. The line already passed over is described as a very excellent one, the country being very level and the greatest gradient being 1 in 50. The health of the party is said to be excellent and all are anxious to expedite the laying out of the remaining portion of our "grand trunk line."

... We are glad to hear of Mr George Simpson's return to the Colony by the last English mail steamer, and wish him every success in the object of his visit - the construction of a railway from Bunbury to Eticup on the land-grant system.

LEGESLATIVE COUNCIL (BY TELEGRAPH)

FRI DAY 21ST AUGUST

The COLONI AL SECRETARY laid on the table another proposal from Mr Anthony Horden to construct a railway on the Land Grant system from Bunbury to Eticup; also a proposal from a syndicate of capitalists, through Messers Stone and Burt their Attourneys, offering to construct a railway on the same system between the same places.

West Australian Monday 31 August 1885 ETICUP NOTES

We have had some very rough weather these last three weeks till Tuesday, when the wind rose to a hurricane which continued all night with an occasional shower now and then and on Wednesday morning it commenced raining and rained all day. The place was flooded for a time and the rivers ran very high, in fact, higher than they have been for some time. Though it made the young crops and grass look yellow, it will do good for next summer, and will enable sheep owners to keep their stock at home instead of having to send them from 40 to 50 miles away. A few weeks fine weather with sun-shiny days will alter the appearance of the crops and grass no doubt. Since the rain there have been a few sunshiny days with light frosts in the mornings which, however, have not injured anything so far. Mr H Wilson and his party have been and gone, and are now camped about 30 miles from here on the Beverley side of this place. The railway line has been run through here, but leaving all the farms and homesteads on the westward side and I believe it runs within two or three chains to the eastward side of Mr

Thomas Norrish's new homestead. Mr Wilson said he had more difficulty in going through here than any other part of the line as yet. I hear it is 1,170 feet above the sea level. Ona and all regret the short stay of the party as both Mr Wilson and his assistants were well liked.

On Wednesday the 5th August, the Martinup cricketers played an eleven of the Kojonup cricketers on the Kojonup ground, but the day being a miserably wet one no stand was made by either side and the Kojonup men being better up to the game came off victorious with 9 wickets to fail in the second innings. Their supper was a grand affair, in fact too grand if anything for such an occasion. This I must say for the Kojonupites; when they do anything of the kind they do it well. I believe that the return match is to be played at Martinup next month if it can be so arranged.

Mr John Dearle, the contractor for the Mail from here round by Mooj ebup has got himself into trouble by leaving a small parcel at the Kojonup Post Office instead of bringing it to the Eticup Post Office. The parcel belonged to a man named Richards, a boot and shoemaker and its non-arrival at the proper time put him to great inconvenience. No doubt this will be a caution to the contractor of whose irregularity there are many complaints. On more than one occasion the mail has been more than one or two days behind time. I have known the mail to arrive in Kojonup on Wednesday while the mail for this place did not reach us until Friday afternoon, which I think is not much a good thing.

The School-Church is now completed and I expect the Reverend Joseph Withers will hold service in it next Sunday. It will no doubt be a good thing for the place should we get an efficient teacher.

On Rev. Withers last visit he went round to all the settlers and took all the names of the children that were fit for school. How many he got I do not know. By the number of children about he must have got a good many.

All the farmers about are either grubbing and clearing their land for fallowing or fencing and buildings are also going up. The place is evidently advancing. Colds have been prevalent of late, on account of the unsettled state of the weather. Eticup 24 August

Moss Institute team rider Jacob Daniel from Narrigon who rides for Collie Motorcycle Club also participated in the clinic. He competes in Division 125/250 Junior Lites, and is currently placed 2nd in junior lites 125cc in WA. Jacob is starting to learn advanced motocross techniques being, settling suspension and getting more drive out of corners.

All round a great informative and productive weekend of motocross riding developing skills and techniques in great company. Cranbrook Motocross looks forward to welcoming back Moss Institute team riders and the other participants when we host regional, state and national events at the newly developed Sukey Hill track.






