FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Council approved a request from the organisers of the annual Daffodil Day fundraising event to waive hire fees for the use of the Tambellup Hall, and has agreed to amend Council's policy to include the event in the list of community events for which facility hire fees are waived.

Council considered a request from the Tambellup Aboriginal Progress Association for the aboriginal flag to be flown at the Shire offices. Council has determined to purchase additional flagpoles to be installed at the Broomehill and Tambellup administration offices, with the aboriginal flag to be flown during NAIDOC week each year, and the State flag at other times.

Council is required to set its meeting dates for 2017. At the October meeting, Council determined that its Ordinary Meetings will be conducted in the Tambellup Council Chambers commencing at 4.00pm on the following dates during 2017:

16 February16 March20 April18 May15 June20 July17 August21 September19 October16 November21 December

Council received the annual Auditors Report for the 2015-2016 financial year. No matters of concern were noted by the auditors. Council also adopted its Annual Report for 2015-2016. Copies of the Annual Report are available for perusal at the administration offices and also on Council's website

Council also determined that the annual Electors Meeting will be held on Thursday 8th December at 7.00pm, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. All members of the community are invited, and encouraged to attend.

Council approved a request for a CBH sampling point to be established at Reserve 18335 Albany Highway Tunney for the 2016-2017 harvest period.

WORKS

Following notification of our successful application to the Stronger Communities Programme, work has been ongoing to design a suitable shade structure to be installed over the playground in Holland Park. We are confident the design is nearly there, however the cost to construct the shelter has come in over budget and will require Councils consideration at the November meeting.

We are looking forward to completing work to driveways and sealing on Taylor St now the wet weather has let up and things are starting to dry out. The change in weather has also allowed the gardeners to catch up mowing around the towns. The construction crew has been working gravel sheeting a section of Punchmirup North Rd. During November, works will move to Nardlah Rd to complete sealing of a section, and then back to Punchmirup North rd. to complete the resheeting project.

The maintenance graders have been working in the south west part of the Shire, with the following roads being graded: Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Flat Rock Rd, Punchmirup North Rd, Punchmirup South Rd, Nookanellup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Marshall Rd, Holly Siding Rd, Warrenup Rd, Simpson Rd, Wandoo Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Johnston Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Brown Rd, Peter Valley Rd, Binniup Rd, Kings Cross Road, Batchelor Rd, Bowman Rd, Hodgson Rd, Thorn Rd, Forward Rd.

TAMBELLUP SPORTS PAVILION UPGRADE

Following last month's update, the erection of the frame for the new building during October has been swift and puts the size of the building into perspective. The design of the building allows for many energy efficiency features to be incorporated, and takes full advantage of the northerly aspect. By the time this edition of BT Times goes to print, the roof sheeting will have been installed, and also the block work for the terracing to the oval. Work will continue on installation of interior wall framing during November, with the roof providing protection from the elements.

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2016** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2017** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2015. Permits can be obtained from your Brigade Fire Control Officer, or the Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM), Cindy Pearce.

All residents should assess the fuel loads on their property, and take steps to reduce this risk well before summer. Although spraying and slashing of tall grass is an effective treatment for reducing fire risk, if it is done too late in the season the dried grass still presents as a hazard. For more information or advice on hazard reduction please contact CESM Cindy Pearce on 0417 071567.

HARVEST BANS

With harvest and the fire season upon us, all residents are reminded Council has a number of ways in which it communicates information relating to harvest and vehicle movement bans:

- SMS to your mobile phone: Is your mobile number registered with the Shire to receive this
- information? If not, or you need to update your information please contact Kim at the Shire on 9825 3555. (On a similar note if you no longer wish to receive these notifications please contact Kim and your number will be removed from the list.) Please be aware there are a number of mobile reception black spots in the Shire and this may result in delivery of messages being delayed. Do not rely on SMS as your only source of information.
- Radio broadcasts: Every effort is made to ensure details of harvest and vehicle movement bans are provided to RadioWest and ABC radio for broadcast, however the timing of bans being implemented often means cut off times for broadcast can be missed. ABC radio (as the emergency broadcaster) has advised the following designated times for announcement of bans:

Weekdays - 10.05am, 12.35pm and 2.05pm **Weekends** - 12.35pm, 2.05pm.

• **Harvest Ban Hotline**: Phone <u>98251042</u> for updated information relating to the status of a harvest and vehicle movement ban. **This is the most reliable source of information from the Shire.**

And finally, the onus is on you as an individual to keep an eye on the weather conditions if you are harvesting or using other machinery or tools in the paddock. Step out of the header at regular intervals, monitor weather forecasts, talk to your neighbours, contact your brigade Fire Control Officer if you are concerned. Let's be safe this harvest!


Well done Broomehill Netball Team



ILLEGAL DUMPING OF WASTE

Council recently received a report from a concerned resident about illegal waste dumped in the Ngopitchup Reserve on Warrenup Road. The material was investigated as it was considered likely to contain asbestos, and after an investigation this was proven to be the case.

The material poses no immediate threat if not handled, and will soon be cleaned up. Unfortunately, in this

instance, all ratepayers will have to foot the bill, as a culprit

has not been identified.

Penalties apply for illegal dumping of any material, and anybody caught will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

Anybody with any information should contact the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup. Asbestos cannot be disposed of at the Broomehill or Tambellup land fill sites, however, both the Katanning and Kojonup sites accept appropriately treated asbestos waste.





DON'T PLAY RENOVATION ROULETTE!



NOvember is national Asbestos Awareness Month. In the lead-up to Asbestos Awareness Day (Friday 23 NOvember) all Australians especially homeowners, renovators, tradies and handymen need to 'Get to kNOw Asbestos this NOvember' by visiting asbestosawareness.com.au to learn how to protect themselves and families from exposure to dangerous asbestos fibres.

Asbestos Awareness Month aims to educate as many Australian's as possible about the dangers of asbestos and how best to manage it because Australia has one of the highest rates of asbestos related diseases in the world.

With asbestos-related diseases continuing to increase among Australians as a direct result of exposure to asbestos fibres during home renovations and maintenance, the importance of raising awareness about the dangers of asbestos and how best to manage it in and around homes and on properties, cannot be overstated!

Do you know where asbestos might be found in your home?

- 1 Do you kNOw that if your home was built or renovated before 1987 there is a high likelihood that it **WILL** contain asbestos products in one form or another?
- 2 Do you kNOw that even if your home is constructed of **BRICK** that it might contain asbestos?
- 3 Do you kNOw WHERE you might find asbestos products in your home?
- 4 Do you kNOw that asbestos was used in the manufacture of **MANY** building and home decorator products including carpet underlay and wall and floor tiles?
- 5 Do you kNOw that asbestos might be found in and around **ONE IN THREE** Australian homes?
- 6 Do you kNOw that if you disturb products containing asbestos you RISK INHALING asbestos fibres?
- 7 Do you kNOw the diseases that asbestos fibres can cause, and that they CAN BE FATAL?
- 8 Do you kNOw how to IDENTIFY asbestos products?
- 9 Do you kNOw the **PRECAUTIONS** you need to take when working with asbestos?
- 10 Do you kNOw how to **DISPOSE** of asbestos safely and legally?

If you said NO to ANY of the above you are not alone! Most Australians don't realise where asbestos might be found in their homes and the risks they take when disturbing it during renovations or maintenance.

Many wrongly believe ONLY fibro homes contain asbestos. Asbestos products can most likely be found in **ANY** Australian home built or renovated before 1987 even brick, weatherboard, fibro and clad homes.

Asbestos can be found under floor coverings such as carpets, linoleum and vinyl tiles, behind wall and floor tiles, in cement floors, internal and external walls, ceilings and ceiling space (insulation), eaves, garages, around hot water pipes, fences, extensions to homes, outdoor toilets, dog kennels and backyard sheds...it could be anywhere!

It's vital Australians take the warnings seriously, stop playing 'renovation roulette', protect themselves from asbestos fibre exposure and before renovating, visit www.asbestosawareness.com.au to Get to kNOw where asbestos might be found in and around homes and properties, the dangers of disturbing it and how best to manage it.

Australians can host a 'Blue Lamington Drive' during NOvember to raise asbestos awareness and help raise vital funds for asbestos diseases research and support by visiting www.bluelamington.com.



PON'T PLAY RENOVATION ROULETTE! The 20 Point Asbestos Safety Check



- At least 1 in 3 Australian homes contains asbestos including brick, weatherboard, fibro and clad homes.
- Asbestos was widely used in building materials before 1987 so if your home was built or renovated before 1987 it most likely contains asbestos.
- 3. If asbestos is disturbed during renovations or mainenance your health and the health of your family could be at risk.
- 4. DIY is not recommended where asbestos is present.
- 5. When renovating or working in and around homes, if in doubt assume asbestos materials are present and take every precaution.
- 6. Dealing with asbestos is important and serious, but it's not overwhelming IT IS MANAGEABLE!
- 7. If you're not sure if asbestos is in your home you can have it inspected by a licenced removalist or a licensed asbestos assessor.
- 8. Products made from asbestos cement include fibro sheeting (flat and corrugated), water, drainage and flue pipes, roofing shingles, guttering and floor and wall coverings. It could be anywhere!
- 9. If you find asbestos in your home; Don't cut it! Don't drill it! Don't drop it! Don't sand it! Don't saw it! Don't scrape it! Don't scrub it! Don't dismantle it! Don't tip it! Don't waterblast it! Don't demolish it! And whatever you do... Don't dump it!"
- 10. If left undisturbed asbestos materials in good, stable condition are unlikely to release dangerous fibres and pose a health risk. Generally, you don't need to remove the asbestos. Paint it and leave it alone but remember to check it occasionally for any signs of wear and tear.
- 11. There are legal requirements regarding asbestos management, its removal and disposal.
- 12. While some might follow the regulations and safety requirements to remove small amounts of asbestos, the safest way to manage its removal is to retain a licenced professional asbestos removalist equipped to protect you and your family from the dangers of asbestos dust and fibres.
- 13. Where asbestos fibres are friable (loose and not bonded into building materials), ONLY licenced friable asbestos removalists are allowed to remove it.
- 14. Professional removal of asbestos is affordable. You can't afford not to use a professional!

 - a. Power tools such as electric drills, angle grinders, circular saws and electric sanders.
 - Never use high pressure water blasters or compressed air

Australian plague locust alert - 2016 spring update 2

The Department of Agriculture and Food reminds landholders and stakeholders to prepare or predicted locust activity during spring 2016 in parts of the eastern Wheatbelt and southern agricultural region.

People who observed locust activity on their properties in autumn should be particularly vigilant as it is likely egg beds were laid.

Protracted cold conditions have delayed locust hatchings, but locust activity is expected to increase during spring as the weather conditions warm.

Significant spring locust activity is expected in parts of the eastern Wheatbelt and southern agricultural region, which may result in locust bands and loose swarms. Variable hatchings are also likely to occur in other parts of the southern agricultural region and Wheatbelt.

Egg beds in Merredin are showing strong hatchings. A map of spring hatchings recorded to date is available <u>online</u>. DAFWA will begin third instar (locust stage about three weeks after hatching) surveys in the eastern Wheatbelt region next week and will continue to provide regular updates as the season progresses.

Landholders are reminded to inspect their properties for locust activity and start preparing for control if necessary to protect their assets, including crops and pastures.

Australian Plague Locust - 2016 Assistance Scheme

The Australian Plague Locust (APL) 2016 Assistance Scheme is now available to support landholders to control populations of locusts and protect their assets.

The Scheme is available to landholders and Local Government Authorities that manage land within nine shires identified as having an increased risk of APL activity in spring/summer 2016.

A State Government contribution of \$5 per hectare is open to landholders seeking to control locusts in pasture, crop, fallow, greenbelts or where locusts are on public amenities, such as ovals, through spraying with a suitable insecticide, within Ravensthorpe, Jerramungup, Gnowangerup, Lake Grace, Kulin, Yilgarn, Westonia, Mukinbudin and Nungarin shires In order to access the Assistance Scheme, landholders will be required to provide the following documentation to demonstrate financial accountability in making a claim:

- A map identifying the number of hectares and area treated,
- A tax invoice or statement proving the purchase of insecticide and/or a tax invoice or statement proving that a contractor has been engaged, and
- Track logs of the area treated to confirm application.

Any application for \$10,000 (2,000ha) or more will require verification by the Department. Photographs or videos may also be uploaded as further evidence of application. The department will also undertake a level of accountability compliance inspection.


Variable hatchings are also likely to occur in other parts of the southern agriculture region and wheatbelt. The scheme may be extended to additional shires if department survey teams identify other areas experiencing a high level of activity.

ETICUP

FROM A CORRESPNDANT

On Thursday last, 23rd April, a Cricket Match was played here between a local eleven and eleven from Kojonup, in aid of the Church and School that is in course of erection at present, which I must say is progressing favourably. The Kojonup men having arrived, a start was made at 10 am. The Kojonup

captain, having won the toss, elected to send the local men first to the wickets. The two first men made a very poor stand but after a while matters changed and when the last wicket fell the score stood at 102. Messers L Van Zuilecom, J Holland, H S Ranford and F Van Zuilecom

scorers with 9, 44, 17, 10 respectively. J Holland played a splendid innings

The Kojonup eleven now taking the willows, a very fair start was made and after one wicket had fallen luncheon was partaken of, which was provided by the ladies of Eticup who deserve the greatest thanks for the manner in which it was got up. The not out men resumed their places again at the wickets and after some smart fielding and bowling on the part of our men they were all out for 58. Messers R Krakouer and G Norrish were the only men who made a stand at all with 11 and 9 to their credit.

Our men in their second attempt were not so fortunate as in their former innings though they managed to put together 74; of this number J I Penny and H S Ranford contributed 25 and 16. The Kojonup side having now 118 to beat, matters looked rather backward for them and after a worse stand than their first innings their last wicket fell for 54, thus leaving the usually beaten men victrious for once with 64 runs to spare. Messers Thos. Norrish and T Chipper gave great satisfaction as umpires. After a very pleasant day's sport the visitors assembled at Fairfield (Mr L Van Zuilecom's) where an entertainment was given. With what was taken out on the ground and at the door the proceeds amounted to £7. I believe Mr E Treasure has also promised £5 towards the School building while others have promised smaller sums. The entertainment commenced about 9pm.

The West Australian Tuesday 23 June 1885 ETICUP NOTES

Since our entertainment of April last there has been very little to mention, as everyone is busy with ploughing and sowing which is in full swing. Judging by the number of ploughs at work there is every likelihood of a large area being under cultivation this season. The weather is not what could be desired for ploughing and sowing. The late heavy rains have made the ground quite boggy which it had not been for some years previously, and the farmers were beginning to get down hearted at the prospect of getting no crops in, but the last few days fine weather has gladdened them again. The last three mornings we have had white frosts doing a good deal of damage to the grass and young crops. On Wednesday the 20th last month about midday a terrific hurricane passed over here, uprooting large trees and stripping others of all their branches; it also gave some of the buildings a rare shaking which rather frightened the inmates. Their fears, however, were soon calmed down as it did not last more than a quarter of an hour.

Since writing last Mr H S Ranford and his party have left for the Williams River after a stay here of about five months, during which time he had been very busy laying out freehold property and marking roads

When all the blocks are fenced in, and the roads fenced off, we shall have quite a little village. I believe that one young man has just completed three miles and I hope to see many more start fencing before this winter is over. It is a great pity that a town site was not laid out here as allotments would bring a good price here now.

The school that I mentioned in my last is at a stand-still at present for

the want of more bricks. I have heard that it is to be

increased to twenty feet in height instead of eleven as proposed in the first place. I should fancy that if they wished to increase the height they ought to have thought of it before and not now when the winter has set in and everyone is busy with their ploughing and lambing. When it is done the ground will be too boggy to cart. In fact it is almost too boggy at present. We have had a visit from Mr Horace E Warburton, here lately. He is forming a company to proceed to the Ashburton River with stock, which is to be called the Ashburton Pastoral Company, Limited. It is the intention of the promoter to travel overland to his destination with the stock which will consist of about 3,500 sheep besides horses etc. The shares are £100 per share and I believe that about £1,000 worth in stock, will be sent from this little place. I wish the promoter and shareholders every success in their new enterprise.

We expect to have the railway surveyors here shortly as I hear they are camped about 22 miles from here which will make the place lively again for a while though their stay here will not be long I expect as the country is pretty level for them.

Lambing has started and is progressing favourably so far and there is every prospect of a good percentage this season. June 4th 1885
